WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell, TO WIT. K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Goveruor in and JAMES MITCHELL, over the State of Western Australia Lieutenant-Governor. and its Dependencies in the Common-[L.S.] wealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 4 of the Vermin Act, 1918-1938, that "Vermin" means and includes any animal, bird, or insect mentioned in the Third Schedule to the said Act, and such other animals, birds, or insects, the names of which the Governor may by Proclamation add to the said Schedule, and that any Proclamation whereby the names of other animals, birds, or insects are added to the Third Schedule may be restricted in its operation to any portion of the

State, to be defined by the Proclamation: And whereas State, to be defined by the Proclamation: And whereas it is deemed expedient to add to the said Third Schedule the names of the birds known as "Black Cockatoos," with intent that they shall be "Vermin" for the pur-poses of the said Act, but to restrict the operation of this Proclamation to those portions of the State com-prised within the boundaries of the Bridgetown Vermin District and the Balingup Vermin District respectively: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Excentive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by section 4 with the advice and consent of the Excentive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by section 4 of the Vermin Act, 1918-1938, do by this Proclamation add to the Third Schedule to the said Act the names of the birds known as "Black Cockatoos," with intent that they shall be "Vermin" for the purposes of the said Act; but I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall be restricted in its operation to those portions of the State comprised within the boundaries of Bridgetown Vermin District and Balianow Vermin Vermin District and Balingup Vermin District respectively.

AT a meeting of the Board of Management of the Warren District Hospital on the 21st day of July, 1942, the following resolution was passed:—Whereas under the provisions of section 23 of the Hospitals Act, 1927, a Board may itself establish and manage a Medical Fund, the object of which shall be to secure for its subscribers medical attendance, hospital treatment, or other similar benefits; and may, by by-laws, provide for the regulation and control of such Fund: And whereas a Medical Fund has been established by the Board of Management at the Warren District Hospital: Now, therefore, the said Board of Management, acting pursuant to section 23 of the Hospitals Act, 1927, do AT a meeting of the Board of Management of the pursuant to section 23 of the Hospitals Act, 1927, do hereby make by-laws for the regulation and control of the said Medical Fund in the manner set forth in the Schedule hercunder.

WARREN DISTRICT HOSPITAL.

Hospital Fund Contributing Scheme.

PHD 1834/25

The object of the scheme is to promote a constant flow of revenue to provide modern plant and equipment and to maintain same for the relief of contributors or their dependants when under treatment from hospital charges, in whole or in part. To effect an insurance for contributors against hospital expenses.

By-laws.

1. (a) The term "subscriber" shall mean any person, male or female, who has paid his or her subscription at the rates set out in the succeeding paragraph and, in the case of a married man, paying a subscription as set out in pragraph 2 (a), the term "subscriber" shall include the husband, wife, and all dependants under the age of 16 years.

(b) The subscriber must be financial for four clear weeks before he is eligible to receive any benefits for either himself or his dependants.

(c) A subscriber must be financial for at least 12 months before being eligible to receive the concession rate for maternity cases.

(d) A contributor who received benefit under the scheme and who ceases to remain a member without having completed 12 months' continuous contributions, either before or after the benefit received, may be charged full hospital fees (less contributions paid) for treatment, etc., received.

2. (a) The subscription to be paid by a subscriber shall be 3/6d. per month, or £2 per year for a husband, wife, and all dependents under the age of 16 years.

(b) 3/6d. per month for all adult single persons.

(c) 2/6d. per month or 30/- per year for all juniors between the ages of 16 and 21.

Subscribers and their dependants will be entitled to the following benefits :-

- (a) Sixty-one days free hospital treatment for each subsoriber and each of their dependants;
 (b) half the usual hospital rate in cases of accouchments (subject to the proviso contained in clause (c), para. 1);
 (c) no charge will be made for x-ray and theatre
- fees;
- (d) free out-patient attention.

4. All benefits detailed above are only granted when the patient or the dependant is treated in the Warren District Hospital. If the Doctor recommends the trans-fer of a subscriber to the Perth Public Hospital, then the Fund will pay that hospital at the rate of 7s. 6d. per day for the number of days free treatment to which the patient is entitled under these rules. The Fund will not, however, be responsible for any fares or cost of transfer. The benefits granted by the Fund are limited to hospital accommodation and nursing and do not include Doctor's fees, medicines or drugs.

5. Subscribers shall not receive any benefits or concession in any of the following cases:-

- (1) Venercal Disease;
- (2) Disease caused by alcoholic excess or misconduct:
- (3) Workers' Compensation cases;
- (4) Infectious cases requiring removal to an infectious Ward;
- (5) Treatment for any disease from which the subscriber or his dependants are suffering at the time of joining the Fund. (Every subscriber or his dependants shall,

if required, submit to a medical examination before being accepted as a subscriber, and the cost of such medical examination shall be borne by the subscriber.)

Between Federated Clerks' Union of Australia Industrial Union of Workers, W.A. Branch, Applicant, and the Commissioners of the Fremantle Harbour Trust, Respondent.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the industrial dispute between the abovenamed parties:----

Award.

1.-Seope.

This Award shall apply to any person employed as a "shed elerk in charge" by the Commissioners of the Fremantle Harbour Trust.

2.---Definitions.

"Shed elerk in charge" shall mean and include any

"Commissioners" shall mean the Commissioners of the Fremantle Harbour Trust in office for the time being. "Union" shall mean the W.A. Branch of the Fed-erated Clerks' Union of Australia Industrial Union of

Workers. "Officer" shall mean any person covered by this

Award.

3.---Hours.

The ordinary hours of duty shall be from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays, inclusive, with an interval of one hour for lunch, and from 8 a.m. to 12 noon on Saturdays.

4.---Overtime.

(a) All such time worked between 12 noon and 1 p.m. (a) All such this worked between 12 hoon and 1 p.m. and between 5 p.m. and midnight on any of the days Monday to Friday, inclusive, at the rate of time and a half: Provided that in respect of time commencing at or between 6.30 p.m. and midnight, the minimum payment shall be as for two hours, at the appropriate rate.

(b) All such time worked between midnight and the nsual starting time, at the rate of double time, except where the period of duty commences at or within one hour and a half prior to such usual starting time, when the rate shall be time and a half.
(c) All such time worked after noon on Saturdays and all time worked after noon on saturdays.

and all time worked on Sundays and holidays, at the rate of double time.

(d) Where such time is not in continuance of time worked prior thereto but comprises or commences a new period on duty, the minimum payment in respect of paragraphs (b) and (c) hereof shall be as for four hours.

5.-Meal Allowance.

In addition to the overtime prescribed in clause 4, a meal allowance of two shillings (2s.) shall be paid to each officer concerned, in the following circumstances:--

(a) Where he is required to remain on duty after the usual finishing time and is so detained on duty for

a period exceeding one hone on any working day. (b) Where he is required to commence duty earlier (b) where he is required to commence duty earlier than two hours prior to the usual starting time on any day, or is not allowed a period of one and a half hours after the usual finishing time before being re-quired to resume duty again on any working day. (e) Where he is required on duty on other than a working day and commences at or before 12 noon or is now a Schurder at or before 12 noon or

5 p.m. or on Saturday at or before 5 p.m. and continues until or beyond 1.30 p.m. or 6.30 p.m. respectively: Provided that the actual period of duty in each case exceeds two hours.

(d) Where he is required to remain on duty during the lunch hour.

6.—Wages.

Basic wage—£4 10s. 5d. per week; margin—£3 4s. 6d. per week; ''War loading''—£0 12s. 10d. per week. The ''War loading,'' as the name implies, shall be for the duration of the war.

7.-Holidays.

The following days shall be observed as holidays and be paid for, namely—New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Pienie Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzae Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day and such other days as may be agreed upon.

8.—Annual Leave.

Each officer shall be granted leave of absence on full pay for two weeks in each calendar year, as though within the appropriate provision of the regulations of the Commissioners.

9.-Long Service Leave.

Each officer shall be entitled to long service leave as though within the appropriate provision of the regulathough within the appropriate provision of the regula-tions of the Commissioners. Any officer who resigns or is retired for any reason other than misconduct or musatisfactory service, and who has served continuously for at least twelve months next prior thereto shall be paid for long service leave pro rata to the date of resignation or retirement.

10 .- Sick Leave.

Each officer shall be entitled to sick leave with pay as though within the appropriate provision of the regulations of the Commissioners.

11.—Engagement.

(a) The engagement of any officer other than one in a temporary or relieving capacity shall be termin-able by one month's notice on either side, excepting that an officer deemed guilty of gross miscoudact or neglect of duty may be instantly dismissed or suspended, and shall not be entitled to any such notice or payment in lien.

(b) Temporary officers may be engaged on such daily or weekly rate as may be appropriate to the particular class of work, and shall be subject to one day's or one week's notice, as the case may be: Provided that any such officer engaged on a daily basis, but whose period of engagement has exceeded one week, shall be subject to one week's notice, and provided further, that the minimum wage payable to a temporary officer shall not be less than the rate prescribed for similar work under this Award

12 .--- Preference of Employment.

(a) All officers shall be members of the mion: Provided that any officer who at the time of engagement is not a member of such union shall become a member thereof within fourteen (14) days of such engagement, and provided also, that the union shall not refuse to accept as member any such officer who is eligible and applies in the manner prescribed, under the rules of the nnion, to become a member thereof.

(b) When a vacancy occurs in the position of shed clerk the respondent shall notify the secretary of the applicant union and of the Tally Clerks' Union, and shall post in the office of the Fremantle Harbour Trust, and also in some conspicuous place agreed upon by and also in some conspicuous place agreed upon by each of the said unions, a notification to the effect of the existence of such vacancy, and mentioning the date of the elosing of applications, which shall be not less than one week from the posting of such notice. All applications when received shall be submitted for the consideration of the respondent. Before any vacancy is filled due consideration shall be paid to fitness for the position, experience, and seniority of service with the Trnst.

13 .- Time and Wages Record.

Records shall be kept by the Commissioners, showing the name of each officer under this Award, the nature of the work performed, the hours worked each day, and the amount of wages received each pay. The said record shall be open to the inspection of an accredited representative of the union during working hours.

14 .- Board of Reference.

The Court hereby appoints for the purpose of this Award a Board of Reference. Such Board shall consist by the regulations. There are assigned to the Board, in the event of agreement not being arrived at between the said parties, the functions of :---

- (a) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award or any of them;
- (b) classifying and fixing of salaries, rates, and conditions for any position, occupation, or calling not specifically mentioned in the Award:

(c) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.

An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.

15.---Area.

The area covered by this Award shall be the whole of the premises controlled by, vested in, or for the time being occupied by the Commissioners.

16.-Term.

The term of this Award shall be a period of three years as from 5 p.m. the 9th day of July, 1942: Pro-vided that at any time after the expiration of twelve (12) months from the date of this Award, application may be made to the Court, by leave of the Court ob-tained by either party to the Award, for a review of any of the provisions of the Award and same may be varied by the Court varied by the Court.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties: And whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination: And whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference: And whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested the Court to declare the said agreement an Award: Now, therefore, the Court, pursuant to section 63 of the Act and all other powers therein enabling it, hereby declares the memorandum therein enabling it, hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court:---

Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note:-Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement.")

1.-Area and Scope.

(a) This Award shall apply to workers employed in the chaff cutting industry: Provided that it shall not apply to employers or their workers engaged in con-nection with chaff cutting machines, the output of which does not exceed ten (10) tons per day of eight (8) hours, nor to an employer or his workers engaged in correction with c chaff cutting machine producing shaff connection with a chaff cutting machine producing chaff to be used by the employer on his own farm: Provided further, that this Award shall not apply to any worker who is at present covered by any other Award of the Court of Arbitration or any industrial Agreement regis-tered under the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941.

(b) This Award shall have effect over the area comprised within the South-West Land Division in the State of Western Australia.

2.---Term.

This Award shall apply for a period of three (3) years from the date of delivery, subject to the rights of either party to apply to amend same in pursnance of the provisions of the Aet.

3.-Hours.

(i) Forty-four (44) hours shall constitute a week's work.

(ii) No day's work shall exceed eight (8) hours, Monday to Friday, inclusive, and four (4) hours on Saturday.

(iii) The ordinary hours of work shall be performed between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., Monday to Friday, inclusive, and between 8 a.m. and 12 noon on Saturday: Provided

that these starting and finishing times may be varied by agreement between the employer and the worker: Provided further, that the employer and the worker may mutually agree upon the time to be allowed for partaking of meals or time (if any) taken off for smoke-ohs, both of which shall be at the worker's expense.

(iv) Nothing in this clause shall apply to teamsters or cooks.

5.-Overtime.

(a) With the exception of teamsters or cooks, all work performed outside the hours specified in clause (3) hereof, or such hours as may be substituted therefor, or on any holiday prescribed in clause (6), shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half. All work on Sunday shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

(b) Should any teamster be required after 12 noon on Saturday to load with chaff or to drive a wagon so loaded, he shall be paid extra at ordinary rates for all time so worked.

6.-Holidays.

(a) Except in the case of teamsters and cooks, the following days, or the days observed in lieu, shall be allowed as holidays without deduction from the weekly wage, and any work performed on such holidays by the workers entitled to them shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half, namely:--New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Xmas Day, and Boxing Day.

(b) The work of teamsters on the holidays prescribed in subelause (a) of this clause shall be restricted to necessary attention to their horses.

(c) Cooks shall, in lieu of holidays, be allowed one (1) day's additional pay after they shall have completed two (2) months' service with the employer.

7 .--- Time and Wages Book.

(a) A Time and Wages Book shall be kept by each employer in which shall be entered :---

- (i) the name of each worker to whom this Award applies;
- (ii) the nature of the work performed;
- (iii) the hours worked each day;
- (iv) the amount of wages (and overtime if any) received each week.

(b) The employer shall be responsible for the proper posting of the book each week.

(c) The said book shall be kept available for inspection at the location of the work by the accredited repre-sentative of the union, at any time during working hours, and he shall be allowed to take necessary ex-tracts therefrom.

8.-Accommodation.

(a) Suitable tents, with flys, shall be provided by the employer for the use of the workers.

(b) Each worker shall be entitled to a stretcher, which shall remain the property of the employer.

(c) The worker shall be responsible for all damage done to the stretcher, fair wear and tear and loss or damage by storm or fire excepted.

(d) A hurricane or other suitable lamp with oil shall be provided for each tent.

9.-Orders for Payment.

The employer shall, on the order of the worker, pay out of the amount for the time being due to the worker, any union dues.

10 .- Termination of Employment.

Two (2) days' notice on either side shall be required to terminate employment.

11 .--- Payment of Wages.

When required, wages shall be paid weekly, and, on receipt of forty-four (44) hours' notice from the worker, the employer shall pay in each on the job the whole or, at the option of the worker, any portion of the wages due to such worker.

12.---Medical Chest.

An adequate first aid kit shall be provided on the job by the employers.

13.—Sundry Duties.

Pitching and striking tents, cleaning up all loose hay and chaff round the entter and travelling from one location to another, shall be included in the work paid for.

Liberty is reserved to the respondents to apply to the Court during the eurrency of this Award to amend by the addition of a clause dealing with stoppage of work owing to the breakdown of machinery or other cause.

I certify, purshant to section 63 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, that the foregoing is a copy of the Agreement arrived at between the parties mentioned above.
