INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT No. 13/42.

(Reg. 18/9/42.)

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, this first day of August, 1942, between the Federated Clerks' Union of Australia, Industrial Union of Workers, W.A. Branch, of the one part, and the Honourable Minister for the North-West, of the other part, whereby it is mutually agreed as follows:—

1.—Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to all employees engaged as wharfingers and/or clerks at the ports under the control of the Harbour and Light Department on the North-West Coast of Western Australia.

2.—Definitions.

“Wharfinger” shall mean and include any officer employed in charge of a berth or jetty.

“Wharfinger, Public Works supervisor,” shall mean and include any officer employed in charge of a berth or jetty and also acts as Public Works supervisor.

“Officer” shall mean any person covered by this Agreement.

“Union” shall mean the W.A. Branch of the Federated Clerks' Union of Australia, Industrial Union of Workers.

“Minister” shall mean the Minister for the North-West.

3.—Hours of Duty.

The ordinary hours of duty shall be from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays, inclusive, with an interval of one (1) hour for lunch, and from 8 a.m. to 12 noon on Saturdays.

4.—Overtime.

Overtime shall mean all time worked outside the ordinary hours of duty and all time worked on Sundays and holidays and shall be paid as follows:—

6.—Higher Duties.

Where an officer is called to relieve a wharfinger or wharfinger/Public Works supervisor for a period exceeding one (1) week he shall be paid an additional £1 5s. 0d. per week.

7.—Holidays.

The following days shall be observed as holidays and be paid for, namely, New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day.

8.—Annual Leave.

Each officer shall be granted leave of absence on full pay for three weeks in each year, same to be accumu-

lated and taken every two years. Where the period of service is less than twelve months the officer shall be entitled to holiday pay in proportion as the period of service is to the full period of twelve months.

#### 9.—Long Service Leave.

Long service leave shall be granted to all officers in accordance with the conditions applying to Government full-time wages employees generally.

#### 10.—Sick Leave.

No worker shall be entitled to payment of wages for any absence from his employment on the ground of personal ill-health for more than one (1) day per month during each year of service. Payment for absence through such ill-health shall, except as hereinafter provided, be limited to twelve (12) days in each calendar year, equivalent to two (2) weeks' wages: Provided that a worker with at least two (2) years of service who produces to his employer a medical certificate that absence from his employment on the ground of personal ill-health necessitates a longer absence than the period allowed of one (1) day per month of service shall be entitled to payment for sickness up to twenty-four (24) days in each calendar year, equivalent to four (4) weeks' wages.

Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.

No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer or his representative, of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) consecutive working days or more. No payment will be made for any absence due to the worker's own fault, neglect, or misconduct.

This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

#### 11.—Engagement.

The engagement of any officer shall be terminated by one month's notice on either side, excepting that an officer being guilty of gross misconduct or neglect of duty may be instantly dismissed or suspended and shall not be entitled to any such notice or payment in lieu.

#### 12.—Preference of Employment.

All officers shall be members of the union: Provided that any officer who at the time of engagement is not a member of such union shall become a member thereof within 14 days of such engagement, and provided also, that the union shall not refuse to accept as a member any such officer who is eligible, and applies in the manner prescribed, under the rules of the union to become a member thereof.

#### 13.—District Allowance.

District allowance as specified below shall be paid to officers stationed at:—

(a) Carnarvon, and within an area of five miles thereof .. .. .	15/-
(b) Onslow and Point Sampson and within an area of five miles thereof .. .. .	23/6

Juniors shall be paid half the adult district allowance.

#### 14.—Time and Wages Record.

Records shall be kept by the department showing the name of each officer under this Agreement, the nature of the work performed, the hours worked each day, and the amount of wages received each pay. The said record shall be open to the inspection of an accredited representative of the union during working hours.

#### 15.—Accrued Rights.

No privileges or concessions at present enjoyed by the officers shall, unless expressly provided herein be varied or cancelled solely by reason of the provisions of this Agreement.

#### 16.—Area.

The area covered by this Agreement shall be the whole of the premises controlled by, vested in, or for the time being occupied by the Harbour and Light Department at the ports on the North-West Coast of Western Australia.

#### 17.—Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be for a period of three years.

Delete the words "subclause (a)" and insert in lieu thereof the words "subclauses (a) and (i)."

Insert a new subclause, as follows:—

(3) The remaining three (3) days shall be taken between the twenty-seventh and thirty-first days of December inclusive: Provided that

if it be considered by the employer to be inconvenient to grant such three (3) days between the dates above recited, he shall notify the union in writing on or before December the eleventh, and the employer and the union shall thereupon agree upon the dates that such three (3) days shall be taken: Provided further, that the dates so agreed upon shall be such as to enable the worker to take the three (3) days due by the last day of February following.

- (4) When any of the abovenamed holidays falls on a Sunday, some other day shall be granted in lieu thereof."
