PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell, TO WIT. 5 K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and JAMES MITCHELL, over the State of Western Australia Lieutenant-Governor. and its Dependencies in the Common-[L.S.] wealth of Australia.

WHEREAS, under the provisions of the Medical Act Amendment Act, 1940, where the Governor in Council is satisfied that the residents of any area are not adequately provided for in respect of medical or surgical services, the said Governor in Council may by Proclamation deelare such area to be a region within the meaning of the said Act: Now, therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor in and over the State of Western Anstralia, being satisfied that the residents of the areas specified in the Schedule hereunder are not adequately provided for in respect of medical or surgical services, proclaim the said areas to be a region under the provisions of the said Act—to be designated the Meekatharra region.

NATIONAL SECURITY (RACING RESTRICTION) REGULATIONS.

The State of Western Australia.

Declaration of Metropolitan Area and Country Area.

WHEREAS it is provided by regulation 4 of the National Scenrity (Racing Restriction) Regulations that for the purposes thereof "Metropolitan area" means an area declared by the Premier of the State in which the area is situated by notice published in the Government Gazette of the State to be a Metropolitan area, and "Country area" means an area declared by the Premier of the State in which the area is situated by notice published in the Government Gazette of the State to be a Country area: Now, therefore I, John Collings Willcock, M.L.A., Premier of the State of Western Australia, acting pursuant to the said regulations, do hereby declare that all that portion of the State of Western Australia comprised within an imaginary circle having a radius of thirty miles from the Town Hall at Perth in the said State as the centre shall be the Metropolitan area for the purposes of the said regulations and that all those portions of the said State other than the Metropolitan area hereby declared shall be a Country area for the purposes of the said regulations which shall have effect and apply accordingly.

State of Western Australia.

Municipal Councils (Postponement of Election) Order.

WHEREAS hy regulation 51 of the National Security (Supplementary) Regulations (as amended hy Statutory Rule, 1942, No. 172) it is provided that the Premier of a State, if satisfied that it is desirable so to do in the interests of the defence of the Commonwealth or the more effectual prosecution of the war, may make provision for the postponement of any election of any City Municipal District or Shire Conneil, or of any other local governing body in the State: And whereas I, John Collings Willcock, M.L.A., Premier of the State of Western Australia, am satisfied that it is desirable in the interests of the defence of the Commonwealth or the more effectual prosecution of the war, that the annual election of mayor, the conneillors, and the auditor of every municipal conneil constituted under the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906-1941, which ordinarily would be held on the fourth Saturday in November, 1942, shall be postponed: Now, therefore I, the said John Collings Willcock, acting pursuant to the said regulation 51, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be eited as the Municipal Councils (Postponement of Election) Order.

2. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906-1941, of Western Australia—

- (a) The annual election of the mayor, the conncillors, and the auditor of every Municipal Council constituted under the said Act, which ordinarily would be held on the fourth Saturday in November, 1942, is hereby postponed from the said fourth Saturday in November, 1942, until the 30th day of January, 1943, and it shall not be necessary to hold the said election on the said fourth Saturday in November, 1942—
 - Provided that-

(i) this Order may be revoked at any time during the period of such portponement by a subsequent order made under regulation 51 aforesaid, and

(ii) any subsequent Order made as provided for in paragraph (1) of this proviso may fix any date within the said period for the holding of the annual election which hy this Order is ordered to be postponed.

(b) Consequentially upon the operation of paragraph (a) of this clause, the terms of office of the mayor, the conneillors and the anditor of every municipal council which would but for this Order expire by effluxion of time on the fourth Saturday in November, 1942, shall be and are hereby extended after the said date for a period ending on the date of the completion of the postnoned annual election, when such is held, and such mayor, conneillors, and anditor shall continue to be mayor, councillors, and auditor respectively of the municipal councils of which they are now mayor, councillors, and anditor accordingly:

> Provided that nothing in this paragraph shall operate so as to extend the term of office of any other councillors or anditor of any municipal council who are not due to retire on the fourth Saturday in November, 1942.

FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Order has been issued in accordance with section 7, subsection (1) of the Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1934, which reads as follows:-

AGREEMENT No. 14 of 1942.

(Reg. 21/9/42.)

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, this 10th day of August, one thousand nine hundred and forty-two, between White Rock Quarries, John Dunstan and Son (W.A.), Limited; Mountain Quarries, Limited (hereinafter called "the employers"), of the one part, and the Australian Workers' Union, Westralian Branch, Industrial Union of Workers (hereinafter called "the union"), of the second nart witnesset that for the considerations have second part, witnesseth that, for the considerations hereinafter appearing, the parties hereto mutually eovenant and agree the one with the other as follows:---

1.-Seope.

This Agreement shall apply to the various classes of workers set out in clause 12 (Wages) hereof.

2.—Definitions.

(a) "Officer-in-charge" shall mean the Engineer or Supervisor in charge of the work.

(b) "Wet ground" shall mean ground where the water is over the worker's ankle or where in performing the work the splashing of the water and mud saturates the worker's clothing.

3.—Hours.

(a) Forty-four (44) hours shall constitute a week's work.

(b) The hours of work shall be arranged so that the worker shall work not more than eight and three-quarter hours on four days of the week and nine hours on the other day.

(e) All work shall cease not later than 5 p.m. on Friday.

4.—Overtime.

(a) All time worked outside of or in excess of the usual hours shall be paid, for the first four (4) hours after the usual stopping time, time and a half and double time thereafter: Provided that any worker called upon to start work within one and a half hours before the nsual starting time shall be paid time and a half until the usual starting time.

(b) Time and a half shall be paid for work performed during the meal hour.

(e) Double time shall be paid for work required to be done on Sunday, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, and Christmas Day.

5.---Holidays.

(a) After one (1) month's continuous service, a worker shall be allowed paid holidays at the rate of one (1) day for each month of service inclusive of the public holidays set out hereunder:--New Year's Day, Good Friday. Easter Monday. Auzae Day. Labour Day, Pienie Day, and Christmas Day.

(b) At each Christmastime all paid holidays then due shall be taken.

(e) Absence from work for any of the following reasons shall not break the continuity of the worker's service and such periods shall be considered as service for the purpose of this clause only :---

- (1) Temporary stoppage of work for the Christmas or Easter holidays: Provided that the worker reports for duty on the date fixed for the resumption of work. (2) Inelemency of weather:
- Provided that the worker is ready and willing to work, if called upon.
- (3) Leave granted by the officer in charge on account of illness or special necessity up to a period not exceeding six (6) days in any one year.

6 .- Working in Higher Grades.

(a) Any worker earrying ont work elassified at higher wininum than his ordinary rate for two (2) hours in any shift shall be paid at the mininum rate for such work for the whole of such shift: Provided that such minimum rate is not lower than such worker's regular rate of pay.

(b) If a worker is employed for less than two (2) hours in any shift at work classified at a higher minimum than his ordinary rate, such worker shall be paid his ordinary rate for the whole of such shift.

7.-Wet Ground.

Any worker working in wet ground shall be paid one shilling (1/-) per day extra.

8.-Water Supply.

A supply of boiling water for making tea shall be available each day at noon.

9.-Payment of Wages.

In the event of a worker being paid off, he shall be paid on the works at the time he is discharged, other-wise his expenses going to and from his home to collect his money shall be paid by the employer.

10.-Respirators for Dust.

Men working on plants shall, upon request, be supplied with respirators.

11.-Board of Reference.

The Court may appoint, for the purposes of this Agreement, a Board of Reference. Such Board shall consist of a chairman and two other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties.

There are assigned to such Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to this Agreement, the functions of :-

- (1) adjusting my matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of this Agreement or any of them;
- (2) elassifying and fixing wages, rates, and con-ditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Agreement;
- (3) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.

An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, which for the purpose are embodied in this Agreement.

(b) "Assistant quarryman" means a worker employed in a quarry to assist a quarryman and thereby acquire all the qualifications of a quarryman.

5.- Overtime.

(a) All time worked outside of or in excess of the usual working hours shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four hours after the usual working time, and thereafter double time: Provided that any worker called upon to start work within one hour and a half of the usual starting time shall be paid time and a half nutil the usual starting time.

6 .- Mixed Functions.

Any worker classified at a higher minimum than his ordinary rate for two hours in any day shall be paid the minimum rate for such work for the whole of that day: Provided that such minimum is not lower than such worker's regular rate of pay. If he be employed for less than two hours at work classified at a higher minimum than his ordinary rate he shall be paid his ordinary rate for the whole day: Provided that this elause shall not apply to "assistant quarymen."

7 .- Broken Time.

Should any worker not be notified before leaving work that his services will not be required on the next work-ing day, he shall be entitled to be paid if he duly presents himself for work next day at the appointed Ŧime.

S .- Sanitary Service.

Adequate sanitary conveniences shall be provided and maintained on the works by the employer.

9.-Drinking Water.

The employers shall supply good drinking water ou the works for the workers.

10 .- Boiling Water.

The employers shall have sufficient boiling water in readiness for the mid-day meal.

11 .- Board of Reference.

The Court may appoint, for the purpose of this Agree-ment, a Board of Reference. Such Board shall consist of a chairman and two other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. There are assigned to such Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to this Agreement, the functions of :---

- (1) adjusting any matters of difference which may adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of this Agreement or any of them;

AGREEMENT No. 16 of 1942.

(Reg. 21/9/42.)

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, this 21st day of August, one thousand nine hundred and forty-two, between F. H. Stevens and S. J. Faulkner (hereinafter called the "em-ployers"), of the one part, and the West Australian Timber Industry Industrial Union of Workers, South-

West Land Division (hereinafter called the "union"), of the other part, witnessell that, for the considerations hereinafter appearing, the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree, the one with the other as follows:---

1.—Area.

This Agreement shall have effect over the area comprised within the South-West Land Division in the State of Western Australia.

2.-Term.

This Agreement shall come into force as and from the twenty second day of October, one thousand nine hundred and forty-one, and shall continue in force for a period of twelve (12) months from that date.

3.-Contract of Service.

(a) The contract of service shall be a weekly one, terminable by one week's notice on either side: Provided that for the first week the engagement shall be on a easual basis (from day to day): Provided further, that the employer may summarily dismiss any worker, with-out notice, for malingering, inefficiency (otherwise than through temporary illness), neglect of duty or miscon-duct, and pay such worker up to the time of such dis-missal only.

(b) The employer shall be cutitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the nuion or unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause that the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

4.---Hours.

(a) Forty-four hours shall constitute a week's work, to be worked in five and one half days, Monday to Saturday, inclusive.

(b) The starting and finishing times for fallers may be mutually agreed upon between the employer and the unijority of the workers. Failing agreement, the starting time shall be 8 a.m., Monday to Saturday, inclusive, and the finishing time 5 p.m. Monday to Friday, inclusive, and 12 noon on Saturday. An interval not preceding one (1) have shall be allowed for hugh exceeding one (1) hour shall be allowed for lunch.

(c) The daily spread of hours for truck-drivers, load-ers and horse drivers shall be as may be mutually arranged between the employer and the workers concerned.

5.---Overtime.

(a) Fallers: All work performed beyond eight (8) hours in any one day shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first two (2) hours and double time thereafter.

(b) Truck-drivers, loaders and horse-drivers (whilst engaged driving horses only):--All work performed be-youd forty-four (44) hours in any one week shall be paid for at the rate of time and half for the first twelve (12) hours and double time thereafter.

(c) Horse-drivers grooming and feeding one or two horses outside ordinary hours shall be paid one shilling (1s.) per day extra and one shilling (1s.) for Sunday. If more than two (2) horses, the rate shall be two shillings (2s.) per day extra and two shillings (2s.) for Sunday.

(d) Work performed on Sunday, except in the case of horse-drivers grooming and feeding horses, shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

6 .- Walking Time.

(a) Time occupied by a worker walking to and from his working place, when such is situated beyond one and half $(1\frac{1}{2})$ miles from the camp, shall be paid for both ways at ordinary rates on the basis of twenty (20) minutes for each mile between the one and a half $(1\frac{1}{2})$ mile point and the working place: Provided that this elanse shall not apply to any worker who elects to live or camp elsewhere than at the campsite fixed by the employer.

7.—Holidays.

(a) Twelve (12) paid holidays per annun shall he granted each worker after each twelve (12) months' con-tinuous service: Provided always that New Year's Day,

Good Fridav, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day, or the days observed as such, shall be taken as they come as portion of the holidays. The balance of six (6) days shall be granted as annual leave, at the convenience of the employer, but shall in any event be taken within six (6) months after becoming due.

(b) 1f, in pursuance of this clause, a worker works on any of the specially named holidays named in subclause (a) of this clause, he shall be paid at double time rates.

(c) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled to such holidays on full pay as are proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such holidays are not equal to the holidays given to the other workers, he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on holidays on full pay.

(d) When a worker is dismissed for wilful miseonduct or dereliction of duty he will not be entitled to the benefits of the provisions of this clause.

(e) Holiday pay shall not accrue during a worker's absence from his work for any cause whatsoever, except:---

- (i) permitted absence through sickness;
- (ii) holidays in pursuance of this elause of the Award;
- (iii) stoppage of work owing to breakdown of machinery, but not exceeding twelve (12) days in twelve (12) months and pro rata where the service is less than twelve (12) months.

(f) The foregoing provisions shall not apply to casual workers.

8 .- Absence through Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for nonattendance, on the ground of personal ill-health, for onehalf $(\frac{1}{2})$ day for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such illhealth shall be himited to six (6) days in each calendar year. Payment herenuder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness ocentred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment, or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default, or for siekness arising out of his own wilful default.

No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof, satisfactory to his employer, of siekness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

9.-Time and Wages Record.

The employer shall keep or eause to be kept a Time and Wages Record showing the following particulars:-

- (i) The name of each worker;
- (ii) The occupation of each worker;
- (iii) The time worked by each worker;

(iv) The wages and overtime paid therefor.

This record shall be signed by the worker if correct.

Such record shall be open for inspection by the secretary of the union (or such other person authorised in writing by the union) during working hours.

10.-Under-rate Workers.

(a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage, may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed to in writing between the union and the employer.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination. (e) After application has been made to the Board, and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

11.-Board of Reference.

(a) The Court may appoint, for the purpose of the Award, a Board or Boards of Reference. Each Board shall consist of a chairman and two other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties, as prescribed by the regulations. There are assigned to each such Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Award, the functions of :--

- (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award or any of them;
- (ii) classifying and fixing wages, piecework rates, and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Award;
- (iii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.

(b) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board, in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.

12.—General.

(a) Wages shall be paid once fortnightly, in cash.

(b) No junior worker shall be employed on work covered by this Award unless such junior worker be paid the full adult rate prescribed in clause (14).

(c) Nothing herein contained shall entitle an employer to reduce the wage of any worker who at the date of this Agreement was being paid a higher wage than the minimum wage herein prescribed.

13.-Piecework.

(a) An employer may make a contract with a worker or group of workers for payment by result by piecework.

(b) All disputes between employers and workers or groups of workers, or between the employers and the nuion, concerning any matter relating to payment by results shall, in default of agreement between the employer and his workers, or between the employer and the union be referred to a Board of Reference for determination.

(e) When entering into a contract for piecework the rate of payment shall be fixed on the basis that it shall be sufficient to yield to a worker of average capacity over a period of three (3) months, if the contract were to be of that duration in the locality specified, for a full week's work of the ordinary hours as prescribed herein for day workers ten per cent. (10%) or more above the minimum time rate of pay as prescribed herein for such week's work.

A worker working under any system of payment by results shall receive or be eredited with at least the time rate of pay apportioned, if necessary. Notwithstanding anything elsewhere in this Award contained, when any question arises as to whether any pieceworker has received his time rate of pay, the total payment received by him during the past three (3) months, or during the duration of the contract for piecework, whichever period is the shorter, shall be averaged.

(d) The earnings of a pieceworker shall be increased or decreased, as the ease may be, by any increase or decrease in the basic wage as proclaimed by the Court from time to time.

(e) Where a worker works part of a week at piecework rates and part at time rates, he shall be paid so much as he is entitled to receive under piecework rates for the amount of work done and, in addition thereto, such proportionate amount at time rates of pay as preseribed in this Award for the portion of the week worked at time rates.

(f) A contract for piecework may be terminated at any time, by either the employer or the worker, in which case payment shall be made for the work done up to date.

(g) For the purpose of this clause the minimum piecework rate agreed to at the date of this Agreement, is two shillings and threepence (2s. 3d.) per ton on weighbridge weight.
