PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, } By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell,

WHEREAS it is provided by the Game Act, 1912-13, that the Governor may by proclamation declare from time to time that any bird or animal indigenous to Western Australia shall be at all times strictly preserved, either generally throughout the State or in any one or more portions thereof, and that the Governor may in like manner exempt from the operations of any such declaration under the said Act any defined locality: And whereas by a Proclamation dated the 30th day of July, 1924, it is provided that the portions of the State and localities defined in the Schedule thereto shall be a Reserve for Grey Kangaroos, known scientifically as *macropus giganteus*: And whereas it is desirable to exempt from the operations of the said Proclamation a defined locality: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, in exercise of the powers aforesaid, do hereby, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, exempt from the operations of the aforesaid Proclamation and the declaration contained therein all those localities mentioned and defined in the Schedule hereto as from the date of the publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* until the 31st day of December, 1942.

Schedule.

Wellington Mills Area: All that portion of land situate within a circle containing a radius of 10 miles, its centre being the north-western corner of Wellington Location 1904, on which Location is situate the Mill site at Wellington Mill.

Land Drainage Act, 1925-1941.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 707/42.

WHEREAS by section 60 subsection (1) of the Land Drainage Act, 1925-1941, it is enacted that subject to the provisions of the said Act the Hon. Minister shall have power to construct works for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas it is provided by section 60 subsection (2) of the said Act (as amended by section 4 of the Land Drainage Act Amendment Act (No. 43 of 1941) that the Governor may exempt works, the estimated cost of which does not exceed five hundred pounds (£500), from the operation of section 60 of the said Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in the exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act and all other powers in this behalf enabling him, doth hereby exempt from the operations of section 60 of the Land Drainage Act, 1925-1941, all works the estimated cost of which does not exceed five hundred pounds (£500) which the Minister may from time to time find it necessary to carry out, either alone or in connection with other works, in the course of exercising the powers conferred on him by section 60 of the said Act.

The Government Tramways Act, 1912, and the Public Works Act, 1902.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 2 of the Public Works Act, 1902, that a tramway is a public work for the purposes of the said Act and by section 11 of the said Act that the Governor may by Order in Council authorise the Minister to undertake, construct, or provide any public work: And whereas it is enacted by section 3 of the Government Tramways Act, 1912, that the Minister may, pursuant to any Order in Council whereby the construction of tramways is authorised, construct such tramways on roads, and in relation thereto may do and perform all the acts, matters, and things in the said section 3 mentioned: And whereas it is enacted by section 2 of the said Government Tramways Act, 1912, that all tramways the property of the Government and declared by the Governor by Order in Council to be a Government tramway shall be Government tramways within the meaning of this Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said two Acts respectively, doth hereby authorise the construction of the trackless tramway as described in the Schedule hereto: And doth hereby declare that the said trackless tramway when so constructed as aforesaid shall be a Government tramway under and for the purposes of the Government Tramways Act, 1912:—

The Schedule above referred to.

Commencing at a point at the intersection of the eastern alignment of Keane street with the northern alignment of Cambridge street, a distance of 5 miles 19 chains 91 links from the commencement of the Wembley Route at Trafalgar road; thence proceeding along Cambridge street in a westerly direction to the terminus at the intersection of Lissadell and Cambridge streets a distance of 31 chains 63 links from the point of commencement at Keane street.

The return journey will proceed along the same street as described above but in the opposite direction, making a total distance of 63 chains 26 links or thereabouts and more particularly delineated on tramway plans.

FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Order has been issued in accordance with section 7, subsection (1) of the Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1934, which reads as follows:—

A Stay Order shall direct that no action, execution, distress for rent, proceedings on default for breach of covenant under any mortgage or other security for money, or under an agreement for sale and purchase of lands, or other process or proceeding, shall be commenced or proceeded with, or put in force against the farmer or any of the farmer's assets, whether utilised in connection with or forming portion of the assets comprised in his farming business or not, during the operation of such Stay Order: Provided that, by leave of a Judge, any action may, notwithstanding the Stay Order, be instituted and/or carried on against the farmer but not beyond judgment.

THE HEALTH ACT, 1911-1937.

Resolution—Bassendean Road Board.

WHEREAS under the provisions of section 321 of the Health Act, 1911-37, the Governor may cause to be prepared Model By-laws for all or any of the purposes for which by-laws may be made by a local authority under any of the provisions of the Act: And whereas a local authority may of its own motion by resolution adopt the whole or any portion of such by-laws, with or without modification: And whereas Model By-laws, described as Series “A,” have been prepared in accordance with the said section and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 8th day of April, 1927, and amended by notice published in the *Government Gazette* from time to time thereafter: Now, therefore, the Bassendean Road Board, being a local health authority within the meaning of the Act, and having adopted with or without modification the Model By-law made under the said Act and published in the *Government Gazette* from time to time, doth hereby amend by-law No. 29 of Part I. of the Model By-laws by altering the figure 20 in the second line of paragraph “B” to read 30, and by the addition of the following paragraphs, to be known as paragraph “e” and “f” respectively:—

(e) No person shall keep more than 50 head of fowls or turkeys, or 50 pigeons, or 12 ducks or 12 geese, upon any residential lot of land of an area of $\frac{1}{4}$ of an acre or less. In respect of a residential lot of land exceeding $\frac{1}{4}$ of an acre in area, no person shall keep any poultry in excess of the numbers enumerated above without having first received the written approval of the local health authority specifying the number of head of poultry which may be kept thereon.

(f) The floors of the poultry pens shall be constructed of cement, trowelled to a smooth finish, and laid with a fall of 1 in 50 to the front. The fences of the poultry runs shall be constructed of 6ft. galvanised wire netting, supported by uprights of 3in. x 2in. jarrah, or equivalent thereof, set at 8ft. centres with 2ft. in the ground.

LAND DRAINAGE ACT, 1925-1941.

By-laws.

PART I.

1.—Interpretation.

(a) The words "board," "district," "drain," "main drain," "occupier," "owner," "ratepayer," "watercourse," "works," "works or drainage works," shall have the meanings severally attached to them in the Land Drainage Act, 1925-1941, or any amendment thereof.

(b) "Minister" shall mean the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage acting in the exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on a Board in respect of each of the drainage districts to which these by-laws apply respectively.

PART II.—PROTECTION OF WATER, GROUNDS, WORKS, ETC., FROM TRESPASS AND INJURY.

2.—Unauthorised Entry.

Trespassing within the fenced-off ground adjacent to or reserved for drainage works, or the entering without proper authority upon any works not open to the public, is prohibited.

3.—Camp Fires.

Camping or lighting of fires on any Government Drainage Reserve, except on land set apart for such purposes, is prohibited.

4.—Native Flora.

The removal, plucking, or damaging of any wildflower, shrub, bush, tree, or other plant growing on any land reserved for or vested in the Minister within the drainage district is prohibited.

5.—Endangering Works.

No vehicle, conveyance, or animal shall be driven, taken, or ridden in such a manner as to endanger or damage any works, or shall cross the same, except at places where crossings have been provided.

6.—Rubbish.

No person shall cast away, throw, or deposit on any works any rubbish of any kind; or carry on any operations, or do any act which creates or tends to create any nuisance on any works, and no occupier shall allow any sullage from his land to enter in or upon any works.

7.—Unauthorised Water.

No person shall take or use or cause to be taken or used any water from any works without the Minister's authority.

8.—Interference with Works.

No person, without the Minister's authority, shall interfere in any way with any works or do anything likely to interfere with such works.

9.—Animals Straying.

No person owning or having the right of control of any animal shall drive or allow the same to stray upon any works. In the event of any contravention of this by-law the person guilty of such contravention shall, in addition to the penalties prescribed in by-law No. 12 hereunder, be liable for all damage that may thereby be caused to such works.

10.—Bathing.

No person, except with the express permission of the Minister first had and obtained, shall bathe in any drains, watercourses, or other works within the drainage district.

PART III.

11.—Drainage Rate.

(1) For the purpose of the drainage rate to be imposed under the Act, the financial year shall be the year ending on the thirty-first day of December.

(2) Every drainage rate shall be made and levied for the current year ending on the thirty-first day of December next ensuing.

PART IV.

12.—Breach of By-law—Penalties.

Any person committing a breach of any of the foregoing by-laws, or who shall refuse or neglect to obey any injunction in any such by-law, or to comply with any requirements therein contained, shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds, and, in the case of a continuing breach, a further penalty not exceeding five pounds for each day the offence continues after notice has been given by or on behalf of the Minister to the offender.

Schedule of Amendments.

Clause 1.—Term of Award.

This clause is amended by the addition of the following words:—"Liberty is reserved to either party bound by this Award to apply to the Court at any time for any variation or addition to the wages schedule."

Clause 3.—Interpretations.

This clause is amended by the addition of the following words:—

"Process worker" means a worker engaged on repetition work on any automatic, semi-automatic, or single purpose machine, or any machine fitted with jigs, gauges, or other tools rendering operations mechanical, or in the assembling of parts of mechanical appliances

or other metallic articles so made, or any repetitive hand processes, whilst employed on munitions of war as defined in National Security Regulations.

Clause 13.—Payment for Sickness.

This clause is amended by the addition of the following words at the end thereof:—

Note.—An apprentice entitled to tradesmen's rate by National Security Regulations is to be paid sick pay in accordance with Apprenticeship Regulation 6 of Apprenticeship Regulations applying to this Award.

Clause 38.—Hours of Duty.

This clause is amended by the addition of the following subclauses:—

- (c) The ordinary hours of duty in the Midland Junction Workshops, other than for shift work, shall be between 7.0 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. except—
 (i) on Saturday, when the work shall finish at noon;
 (ii) where the Commissioner and the union mutually agree on some other starting and finishing time.
 (d) By agreement between the Commissioner and the union the hours for shift work may be worked on the basis of eighty-eight (88) hours per fortnight, with one week of forty (40) hours and one week of forty-eight (48) hours.

Clause 41.—Shift Work.

This clause is amended by omitting subclauses (a), (b), and (c) and inserting the following in lieu thereof:—

- (a) The Commissioner may, if he so desires, work any part of his establishment on shifts, but before doing so shall give notice of his intention to the union.
 (b) Work other than day shift shall not be recognised as afternoon or night shift unless in either case five (5) consecutive afternoons or nights are worked, but shall be deemed to be overtime; on completion of the fifth (5th) consecutive afternoon or night's work the worker shall be deemed to have been employed on afternoon or night shift, as the case may be, during the preceding four (4) afternoons or nights, and thereafter during any subsequent consecutive afternoons or nights he is so employed.
 (c) The loading on the ordinary rates of pay for shift work shall be as follows:—
 (i) Where the worker concerned is not in receipt of a war loading:—All shifts except the day shift shall be paid for at the rate of time and a quarter. For the purpose of this subclause day shift shall be construed to mean the ordinary working shift ending at or before 6.0 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays and 1.0 p.m. on Saturdays.
 (ii) Where the worker concerned is in receipt of a war loading:—Except as provided in subclause (f) the loading on the ordinary rates of pay for shift work shall be, on afternoon shift—ten per cent. (10%) and on night shift—fifteen per cent. (15%).
 (d) The sequence of shift work shall not be deemed to be broken under the preceding paragraphs (b) and (c) by reason of the fact that the works are closed on a Sunday or on any public holiday.
 (e) Overtime on afternoon or night shifts shall be calculated on the basis of the rate paid for afternoon or night shift respectively.
 (f) Workers employed on shift work shall, as far as practicable, change shift every alternate pay period. Any worker employed on shift work who does not change to day shift within four weeks shall thereafter be paid at the rate of time and a quarter while continuing to work other than day shift.

Apprenticeship Regulations.

Clause 6: Add the following subclauses:—

(vi) An apprentice entitled by National Security Regulations to be paid the full tradesman's rate shall, when absent from the workshop during working hours for the purpose of attending technical school classes, only be paid for such portion of the time he is so absent as is represented by the proportion that the fifth-year apprenticeship rate as prescribed by this Award bears to his full tradesman's rate.

(vii) An apprentice entitled by National Security Regulations to be paid the full tradesman's rate shall, when entitled to sick pay in accordance with this clause, only be paid for such portion of each day as is represented by the proportion that the rate of wage prescribed in this Award for the year of apprenticeship in which the apprentice is serving when the sickness occurred bears to his full tradesman's rate for that day.

Clause 20: Add the following subclauses:—

(b) Provided that the Commissioner may, with the consent of a committee of three consisting of a representative of the Commissioner, a representative of the union concerned, and the Industrial Registrar as chairman, take on new apprentices up to the proportion of one to each journeyman employed.

(c) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Award to the contrary, if through lack of work the Commissioner is unable at any time to find employment and training for an apprentice, and if a transfer to another employer cannot be arranged, the obligations and duties imposed by the indenture may, with the concurrence of the apprentice and his guardian and the union, be suspended for a period agreed upon, or if no such agreement is arrived at, may be cancelled by a Committee, consisting of the Industrial Registrar, as Chairman, and one representative of the Commissioner, and one representative of the union. The onus of proof of circumstances justifying such cancellation shall be on the Commissioner.

(d) This provision shall be deemed to be included in all contracts of apprenticeship now existing and also in all future contracts entered into.
