## PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell, K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

No. 633/32.

WHEREAS by section 9 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1940, it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever, in every or any specified portion of Western Australian waters, by means of fishing nets and fishing lines, or extraction of the control of the c either of such means of capture, or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—That all those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets for a period of three years as from the date of the publication of this Proclamation in the Government Gazette:-

#### Schedule.

Salt River (or Pallinup Estuary) :- The whole of the waters of Salt River (or Pallinup Estuary);

Bremer (or Wellstead) Estuary:—The whole of the waters of Bremer (or Wellstead) Estuary,

State of Western Australia.

Lighting Restriction Order.

WHEREAS it is provided by regulation 35A of the National Security (General) Regulations (as amended by Statutory Rule 1941 No. 287) that the Premier of any State may, after consultation with the Minister of State for Home Security or an officer of the Department of Home Security authorised by that Minister to act on his behalf and with the Commandant of a Military District, or an officer authorised by the Minister of State for Defence, or the Minister of State for the Army to act on behalf of such Commandant, by Order—

- (a) direct any total or partial "black out," and may prohibit or regulate the display of lights of any description within the State; and
- (b) make such provision as he deems necessary to protect the persons and property of the civil population in that State or any part thereof in case of emergency—

and that all persons within such State or part thereof (as the case may be) to which any such Order shall apply shall comply with the requirements of that Order: And whereas I, John Collings Willcock, M.L.A., Premier of the State of Western Australia, acting under the authority conferred by the said regulation 35A made and issued an Order which was dated the 21st day of May, 1942, cited as the Lighting Restriction Order and published in the Government Gazette of Western Australia on the 22nd day of May, 1942, and is still in force: And whereas it is now deemed desirable and expedient to revoke the said Order and in lieu thereof to make and issue this present Order: Now, therefore I, the said John Collings Willcock, M.L.A., Premier of the State of Western Australia, being of the opinion that an emergency exists and having held the consultation aforesaid, and acting pursuant to the said regulation 35A, do hereby make the following Order—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Lighting Restriction Order No. 2.
- 2. The Lighting Restriction Order made under regulation 35A aforesaid dated the 21st day of May, 1942, and published in the Government Gazette on the 22nd day of May, 1942, is hereby revoked.

3. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires

"Armed Forces" means any of the Armed Forces of His Majesty the King or of any Power which is allied or associated with His Majesty

in any war in which His Majesty is engaged;
"Civil Defence Council" means the Civil Defence Council in Western
Australia as constituted by the Civil Defence (Emergency Powers)

Act, 1940, of that State;
"Commissioner of Police" means the Commissioner of Police of Western Anstralia.

4. This Order shall not apply to-

(a) any light displayed by any member of the Armed Forces acting in the

course of his duty as such;
(b) any light displayed with the consent of the Naval Board from a lighthouse or other structure on shore, or from a light vessel or other floating structure, being a light provided solely for the guidance of shipping;

(c) navigation lights displayed on ships under the instructions or with the consent of the Naval Board; and

- (d) navigation lights displayed on aircrafts or other lights displayed at aerodromes in accordance with instructions given by or on behalf of the Minister of State for Air.
- 5. In the event of hostile attack or the apprehension of hostile act, the display of any light the display of which would otherwise be lawful under the provisions of this Order may be, and, if so requested by the Civil Defence Council, shall be prohibited or restricted by the Commissioner of Police, or any member of the Police Force of Western Australia acting under his general or special direction; and it shall not be lawful for any light to be displayed in contravention of any such prohibition or restriction.
- 6. Subject to clauses 7 to 13, both inclusive, of this Order, during the period between sunset and sunrise
- (1) A person shall not cause or allow in any part of the State described in the Schedule to this Order—
  - (a) any light to be emitted from or by any fire, lamp, sign or other device which is not inside an enclosed building;
  - (b) any light to be emitted from any shop window or any window in which are shown goods for display or sale to the public or any window which may be or is generally used to show goods for display or sale to the publie; or

(c) any light inside any building to be displayed, unless—

(i) the blinds, curtains or shades in all windows, doors, sky-lights, and other openings of the room or part of the building where and other openings of the room or part of the building where
the light is displayed are fully drawn over such windows,
doors, sky-lights or other openings; or
(ii) such windows, doors, sky-lights, and other openings are otherwise obscured so as to prevent the display of the light
through the same; or

(iii) such light, including any glass forming portion of such light or portion of the fitting surrounding such light is screened so as to prevent the display of the light through any of the windows, doors, sky-lights and other openings aforesaid—and in any case, so that no direct light is shown outside the building.

- (2) In the case of a building situate in any part of the State within a distance of three miles from high-water mark on any part of the sea coast of the State of Western Australia, a person shall not cause or allow—
  - (a) any light to be emitted from or displayed inside such building contrary to the provisions of paragraph (1) of this clause where the same are

applicable; or
(b) any light to be emitted from or displayed inside such building in a manner which permits such light or any reflection from such light to be seen from the sea.

7. The provisions of clause 6 of this Order shall not apply to-

(a) public street lighting;

- (b) lights on vehicles, except when such vehicles are inside an enclosed building;
- (c) lights which in the opinion of the Commissioner of Railways in the State are necessary for the safe working of the Government Railways or of the Government Tramways;

(d) lights which are essential for the purposes of-

- (i) the loading and unloading of ships; (ii) rescue, demolition, fire fighting, first aid work or any civil defence service;
- (iii) repair work carried out by or on behalf of any public authority

Provided any such lights as are mentioned in the foregoing paragraphs of this clause are screened, so far as is practicable, so that no direct light is east above the horizontal, and they do not emit light of an intensity measured at ground level greater than one foot candles when a hostile attack is not taking place or impending, or greater than 0.002 foot candles during a period between the sounding of an "air raid warning" signal, and the sounding of the "raiders passed" signal.

(e) any light displayed in and for the purpose of any illuminated sign indicating the position or direction of a police station, fire station, first aid post, hospital or of a depot or building used by a civil defence service or of a public air raid shelter: Provided that in any case aforesaid the sign is screened so that no direct light is cast above the horizontal, and the light is so dimmed that while clearly legible at a distance of 100 feet the sign is not visible at a distance of 250 feet;

(f) any light cansed by burning the bush (including burning bush to make charcoal) as and when permitted under the provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1937-1940;
(g) any lights caused by burning waste or refuse at a timber mill; and (h) any lights used on tractors when engaged at night in farming operations.

tions.

8. The following lights may be displayed for the guidance of traffic on roads:-(a) a light in a traffic signal, provided it is screened to the satisfaction of the

Commissioner of Police;

Commissioner of Police;

(b) red lights indicating an obstruction or excavation upon or near a road, provided each light is of a candle power not exceeding 1.0 and the lights are screened so that no direct light is cast above the horizontal and no appreciable illumination is produced upon the ground;

(c) lights for the illumination of any road, provided each lighting fitting complies with the requirements of the British Standard Specification No. BS./ARP37, or with such alternative requirements as may be approved from time to time by the Civil Defence Council.

- 9. (1) Light may be displayed from hand lamps or hand torches if and so long
  - (a) the light is displayed from a hand lamp which complies with the requirements of the British Standard Specification No. BS./ARP 3; or
     (b) the light emitted from the hand lamp or torch is dimmed by a sheet of
  - newspaper or its equivalent; and
  - (c) the aperture through which the light is emitted does not exceed one inch in diameter; and
    (d) the light emitted is white and is at all times directed downwards.

- (2) Light may be displayed from a hurricane lamp, provided the lamp is so screened that no light is emitted upwards and no more light is emitted in any other direction than is reasonably necessary.
- 10. A person shall not, during the period between sunset and sunrise, operate any tram or trolley bus or omnibus on any road or in any part of the State described in the Schedule to this Order unless the lights in such tram, trolley bus, or omnibus comply with such conditions as are laid down or specified from time to time by the Civil Defence Council.
- 11. (1) Subject to paragraph (2) of this clause, during the period between sunset and sunrise, a person shall not in any factory situate in any part of the State described in the Schedule to this Order cause or allow any light to be emitted from or by any fire, lamp, sign, or other device from which any light whatsover can be seen from outside the factory.
- (2) The Civil Defence Council, or any inspector or officer of the Civil Defence Council authorised by it in that behalf, may grant permission for the display at any factory of such lights as are necessary for the performance of urgent work in connection with the prosecution of the war.
- (3) The Civil Defence Council may give directions as to the type, kind, and arrangement of lights to be used in any factory or class of factory which is affected by this clause; and any inspector or officer appointed by such Council may enter into and inspect any factory to ascertain whether or not such directions are being complied
- (4) The owner and occupier of any factory shall cause the standard of ventilation in that factory to conform with the minimum adequate standard of ventilation prescribed in the Emergency Report No. 1, Industrial Health in War, published by His Majesty's Stationery Office, London, 1940.
- (5) In this clause the term "factory" shall have the same meaning as that assigned to it in the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937, of the State of Western Australia.
- 12. A person shall not, during the period between the sounding of the "air raid warning" signal and the "raiders passed" signal cause or allow any light to be emitted from any enclosed building.
- 13. (1) Whenever I, the said Premier, by a notice in writing shall direct that during any period and in any part or parts of the State specified in such notice no light shall be emitted from any fire, lamp, sign, or other device, whether the same is not inside or is inside any enclosed building, and while such notice remains unrevoked, a person in any enclosed building affected by such notice shall not cause or allow any light to be emitted from such enclosed building contrary to the requirements of such notice.
- (2) Any notice referred to in paragraph (1) of this clause shall operate as from the date specified therein for the coming into operation thereof.
- (3) Every such notice shall be deemed to have been published sufficiently for the information of the public when it is published in the Government Gazette, or in any newspaper circulating in the part or parts of the State specified in the notice, or is broadcasted by means of wireless transmission.
- (4) Every such notice may be directed to the public generally or to a particular person or to particular persons:

Provided that, when a notice is directed to a particular person or to particular persons, the notice may be served upon him or them by delivering the same personally or by sending it by post to the last known place of abode of the person or persons concerned, in a prepaid addressed envelope.

(5) The production of any Gazette or newspaper in which a notice has been published, or of a certificate signed by the manager of the broadcasting station over which the notice has been broadcasted, or of a copy of the notice as given under this clause shall be *prima facie* evidence of the giving of such notice and the publication thereof in accordance with the provisions of this clause.

14. This Order shall come into operation and have effect as from the date upon which publication thereof is made in the Government Gazette of Western Australia.

and that all persons within such State or part thereof (as the case may be) to which any such Order shall apply shall comply with the requirements of that Order: And whereas I, John Collings Willcock, M.L.A., Premier of the State of Western Australia, whereas 1, 30nh Collings whicher, all L.A., Fremer of the State of western Australia, acting under the authority conferred by the said regulation 35A made and issued an Order which was dated the 21st day of May, 1942, cited as the Lighting of Motor Vehicles Order and published in the Government Gasette of Western Australia on the 22nd day of May, 1942, and is still in force: And whereas it is now deemed desirable and expedient to revoke the said Order and in lieu thereof to make and issue this present Order: Now therefore I, the said John Collings Willcock, M.L.A., Premier of the State of Western Australia, being of the opinion that an emergency exists and having held the consulta-tion aforesaid and acting pursuant to the said regulation 35A do hereby make the following Order-

- This Order may be cited as the Lighting of Motor Vehicles Order No. 2.
- 2. The Lighting of Motor Vehicles Order made under regulation 35A aforesaid, dated the 21st day of May, 1942, and published in the Government Gazette on the 22nd day of May, 1942, is hereby revoked.
- 3. Subject as in this Order otherwise provided, this Order shall operate and have effect throughout the State of Western Australia.
  - 4. (1) In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires-
    - "Armed Forces" means the Armed Forces of His Majesty the King or of any power which is allied or associated with His Majesty the King in any war in which His Majesty the King is engaged;
    - "Approving authority" means the Commissioner of Police in the State of Western Australia;
    - "Authorised dual-purpose lamp" means a lamp with one or more globes or inflorised dual-purpose lamp. means a lamp with one or more globes of filaments, the power of which lamp may either exceed or not exceed seven watts, emitting a white light to the front of the motor vehicle and complying with the following conditions—

      (a) the front of the lamp shall be fitted with a mask which allows light to be emitted through more than one aperture;

      - (b) one of those apertures shall be circular and one inch in diameter; (c) the brightness of the last-mentioned aperture shall not be more than twenty candles per square foot, when the higher degree of power is employed in the lamp, and the light emitted through such aperture, when the lower degree of power is employed in the lamp, shall be clearly visible at a distance of thirty yards

but not visible at a distance of three hundred yards;
(d) the lamp shall be such that, if the said aperture were totally obscured and the higher degree of power were always employed in the lamp, the lamp would comply with the definition of an

authorised headlamp herein; and
(e) no light shall be emitted from the lamp except through the mask; The term also includes any other lamp which in the opinion of the approving authority complies substantially with the foregoing requirements of this definition;

"Authorised front lamp", means an authorised dual purpose lamp, an authorised indicating lamp, an authorised headlamp, or an authorised parking lamp:

"Authorised headlamp" means a lamp with a filament of a power exceeding seven watts, emitting a white light to the front of the motor vehicle, and complying with the following conditions-

(a) the front of the lamp shall be fitted with a mask which allows light to be emitted through one or more apertures;

(b) in the case of an essential service vehicle within the meaning of paragraph (2) of clause 13 of this order, provision is made whereby one or more of the said apertures may be instantly covered so as to reduce the intensity of the illumination from the lamp on a vertical surface at any point ten feet from the lamp from four foot candles to 2.5 foot candles;

(c) except in the case of an omnibus, no light shall reach the ground at any point nearer than ten feet from the lamp or five times the height of the bottom of the lamp above ground level which-

ever is the less;

(d) no light shall be projected above the horizontal when the motor

vehicle is standing on a level surface;
(e) the light emitted shall be diffused by the insertion in the mask of a screen of some diffusing material or by other similar means;

(f) subject to paragraph (b) hereof and clause 13 hereof, the intensity of illumination on a vertical surface at any point ten feet from the lamp shall not exceed four foot candles with all apertures open or uncovered;

(g) no light shall be emitted from the lamp except through the

mask; and

(h) any mechanical or electrical device for moving the head lamp

shall be rendered inoperative.

The terms also includes any other lamp which in the opinion of the approving authority complies substantially with the foregoing requirements of this definition.

- "Authorised lamp" means an authorised dual purpose lamp, an authorised head lamp, an authorised indicating lamp, an authorised parking lamp, an authorised stop lamp, or an authorised tail lamp;
- "Authorised indicating lamp" means a lamp with a filament of a power exceeding seven watts, emitting a white light to the front of a motor vehicle, and complying with the following conditions—

(a) the front of the lamp shall be fitted with a mask which allows light to be emitted through more than one aperture;
(b) one of these apertures shall be circular and one inch in

- diameter;
- (e) the brightness of the last-mentioned aperture shall be not more than twenty candles per square foot;
- (d) the lamp shall be such that if the said aperture were totally obscured the lamp would be an authorised head lamp; and
  (e) no light shall be emitted from the lamp except through the
- mask.

The term also includes any other lamp which in the opinion of the approving authority complies substantially with the foregoing requirements of this definition.

"Authorised parking lamp" means a lamp with a globe of a power not

exceeding seven watts which-

- (a) emits a white light to the front of the motor vehicle through a single aperture of one inch in diameter in such a way that the light emitted is clearly visible at a distance of thirty yards but is not visible at a distance of three hundred
- yards; and (b) does not emit any light in any direction from any other aperture;

"Authorised stop lamp" means a lamp with a globe of a power not exceeding seven watts which-

(a) emits a red or amber light displayed for the purpose of intimating the intention of the driver to stop or slow down

the motor vehicle on which it is fitted;

- (b) emits that light to the rear of the motor vehicle through a single aperture of one inch in diameter in such a way the light emitted is clearly visible at a distance of thirty yards but is not visible at a distance of three hundred yards;
- (e) does not emit any light in any direction from any other aperture.

"Authorised tail lamp" means a lamp with a globe of a power not exceed-

ing seven watts which-

(a) emits a red light to the rear of the motor vehicle through a single aperture of one inch in diameter in such a way that the light emitted is clearly visible at a distance of thirty yards but is not visible at a distance of three hundred yards; and

(b) does not emit any light in any direction from any other aperture:

Provided that a lamp shall not be deemed to be other than an authorised tail lamp by reason only that it is combined with an authorised stop lamp.

- "Bieyele" includes a tricycle drawn or propelled or capable of being propelled by human power, and any mechanically propelled bicycle the cylinder capacity of the engine of which does not exceed 200 c.c., unless it is fitted with an authorised head lamp, an authorised dual purpose lamp, or an authorised indicating lamp;
- "Constable" includes any member of the Police Force of the Commonwealth, any member of the Police Force of Western Australia, and any Peace Officer appointed in pursuance of the Peace Officers Act, 1925, of the Commonwealth;

- "Motor cycle" means any motor vehicle having only two wheels;
- "Motor vehicle" means any vehicle propelled or capable of being propelled or drawn along a road or on rails by electricity, steam, gas, oil, or internal combustion or by any means other than human or animal power, and includes any trailer, fore-ear, side-ear or other vehicle or device attached thereto or drawn thereby but does not include any train, train, trolley bus, or bicycle;
- "Prescribed area" means that portion of the State of Western Australia comprised between high-water mark along the whole of the coastline of such State and an imaginary line running parallel with such high-water mark and ten miles distant therefrom, and, includes such other portions of the State as may by notice issued under this Order be declared to be part of the prescribed area.

- "Public place" includes—

  (a) any public highway, road, street, footway, footpath, court, alley, passage, motor drive, or thoroughfare, notwithstanding that it is formed on private property;
  - (b) any park, garden, foreshore, reserve, place of public resort or open space; and

(e) any pier, jetty, or wharf.

## (2) In this Order-

(a) any reference to lamps of a particular wattage shall be deemed to include references to lamps which are not electric but emit the same amount of light as an electric lamp of that wattage; and

(b) any reference to legibility, visibility, or inconspicuousness shall be construed as a reference to legibility, visibility, or inconspicuousness in the dark, in the absence of moonlight, fog. mist, or rain, and with all lights in the vicinity extinguished.

- 5. A person shall not in any public place within the prescribed area between the hours of sunset and sunrise, drive or be in charge of any motor vehicle which is equipped with any lamp fitted on the exterior of such vehicle other than an authorised lamp, unless the globe or other source of illumination has been removed from that lamp.
- 6. A person shall not at any time in any public place within the prescribed area between sunset and sunrise drive or be in charge of any motor rehicle which is equipped with a lamp having on it a mask which does not conform to a sample which has been approved by the approving authority.
- 7. (1) A person shall not, between sunset and sunrise, drive any motor vehicle in any public place within the prescribed area unless that motor vehicle carries and displays-

(a) two authorised dual purpose lamps; or(b) (i) two authorised head lamps; and

(i) two authorised head lamps; and
 (ii) two authorised parking lamps.
 Provided that this subparagraph shall not apply to any motor vehicle carrying and displaying authorised head lamps fitted with masks approved by the approving authority and manufactured at the date when this Order comes into operation; or

 (c) two authorised indicating lamps together with two authorised parking

lamps to be used only when so required by clause 9 or clause 13 of this

Order; and

(d) one authorised tail lamp. Provided that, if any motor vehicle is required under the Traffic Act, 1919-1941, of this State to display any light by reason of the fact that the motor vehicle is carrying an overlanging or projecting load, it may display one or more additional authorised tail lamps to indicate the rear extremity of the projecting load.

(2) A person shall not, between sunset and sunrise, drive any motor cycle in any public place within the prescribed area unless that motor cycle carries and displays—

- (a) one authorised dual purpose lamp; or (b) one authorised head lamp fitted with a mask approved by the approving authority and manufactured at the date when this Order comes into operation; and
- (c) one authorised tail lamp.
- 8. A person shall not in any public place within the prescribed area drive or be in charge of any motor vehicle on which more than two authorised tail lamps and two authorised stop lamps are alight at any one time.
- A person who is in charge of a motor vehicle in any public place within the prescribed area shall not, except-

(a) while the motor vehicle is in motion; or(b) while the motor vehicle is stationary, owing to the exigencies of the traffic, or in order to comply with any traffic signal or direction, or for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers-

cause or permit any light to be displayed from any authorised head lamp or authorised indicating lamp, or the higher power to be used in an authorised dual purpose lamp.

- 10. (1) A person shall not, between sunset and sunrise in any public place within the prescribed area drive or be in charge of any motor vehicle, other than an omnibus, which displays in its interior any light which is visible outside the motor vehicle, unless the motor vehicle is in an enclosed building.
- 2) The interior of an omnibus may, between sunset and sunrise, be illuminated by such lighting as is approved by the Commissioner of Police or any constable acting under his general or special direction.
- 11. (1) The Commissioner of Police, or any constable acting under his general or special direction, or any Commonwealth officer (as defined in the National Security Act, 1939-1940), may give directions prohibiting or restricting the movement of any

motor vehicles or class of motor vehicles to, from, or in any part of the State, or may direct the removal of any motor vehicle or class of motor vehicles from any part of the State.

- (2) The driver or person in charge of any motor vehicle affected by any direction given in pursuance of this clause shall comply with such direction.
- 12. The Commissioner of Police, or any constable acting under his general or special direction, or any Commonwealth Officer aforesaid may, and shall, if requested so to do by the Civil Defence Council in this State, in the event of hostile attack or the apprehension of hostile attack, give directions prohibiting or restricting the display of any light on any motor vehicle the display of which would otherwise be lawful under the provisions of this Order.
- 13. (1) A person in charge of any motor vehicle (not being an essential service vehicle within the meaning of clause 15 of this Order) which is in any public place in any part of the State in which the "air raid warning" signal is sounded at any time shall, during the period between the sounding of such "air raid warning" signal, and the sounding of the "raiders passed" signal—

(a) extinguish and keep extinguished the front lamps (whether authorised

- front lamps or other lamps) on that motor vehicle; and
  (b) cause the vehicle to remain stationary in a position in such public place which is least likely to render that motor vehicle an obstruction to trassic in such public place.
- (2) A person in charge of any motor vehicle which is an essential service vehicle within the meaning of clause 15 of this Order and which is in any public place in any part of the State in which the "air raid warning" signal is sounded at any time shall, during the period between the sounding of such "air raid warning" signal and the sounding of the "raiders passed" signal—

(a) cause the front lamps on the vehicle to be converted instantly into authorised front lamps, if they are not already authorised front lamps;

(b) cause the intensity of illumination from the authorised front lamps on the vehicle on a vertical surface at any point ten feet from the lamp to be so reduced as to be not greater than 2.5 foot candles.

14. Any constable may take into custody any motor vehicle which in his presence displays or emits any light in his opinion contrary to this Order, and may keep such motor vehicle in his custody until the condition leading to the breach of this Order has been remedied.

Provided that-

- (i) the vehicle shall be released by the constable as soon as is convenient to him after the vehicle can lawfully be driven without lights; and
- (ii) the detention of a motor vehicle under this clause shall not exceed sixteen hours in any one occasion.
- 15. (1) While a motor vehicle is being used as an essential service vehicle-
  - (a) subject to the approval of the approving authority, there may be displayed in or on the vehicle as a sign indicating the purpose for which the vehicle is being used, and through a circular aperture one inch in diameter, an orange light the colour of which conforms to British Standard Colour No. 57 orange, but so that such light is just visible at a distance of fifty yards;

    (b) there may be used in or on the vehicle in addition to or in substitution

(b) there may be used in or on the vehicle in addition to or in substitution for the sign or light mentioned in subparagraph (a) hereof any sign indicating the character of the vehicle which a vehicle of that type ordinarily carried in peace time, but so that the illuminated portion of the sign is just legible at a distance of fifty yards;
(c) notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in this Order, where the vehicle is equipped with authorised dual purpose lamps, the orange light mentioned in subparagraph (a) hereof may be displayed through the circular aperture in such lamps in lieu of the white light as specified in the definition of authorised dual purpose lamp in clause 3 of this Order: this Order:

Provided that, in such case the brightness of such orange light shall be such that it is visible at a distance of thirty yards and not visible at a distance of three hundred yards when the higher power in the lamp is used.

- (2) For the purposes of paragraph (1) of this clause "essential service vehicle" means a police vehicle, a post office vehicle, a fire service vehicle, an ambulance vehicle, or a vehicle used for any civil defence purpose, or any public utility vehicle.
- (3) A person shall not have in his possession or control or use or enter or occupy any motor vehicle upon which is displayed any light or sign mentioned in paragraph (1) of this clause, or any light or sign resembling such light or sign, unless the vehicle belongs to or is appropriated for the use of any of the civil defence services and is being used with due authority for official purposes.
- (4) All the provisions of paragraph (1) of this clause shall apply, notwithstanding that the essential service vehicle is used within the prescribed area.
- 16. A light may be displayed in a taximeter cab used within the prescribed area for the purpose of an illuminated sign indicating that the vehicle is a taximeter cab plying for hire, but so that such light shall be just visible at a distance of one hundred
- 17. (1) A person shall not manufacture, and no such person shall sell or offer for sale, any mask or type of mask which makes or purports to make, or may reasonably be assumed to purport to make any lamp comply with the provisions of this Order regarding an authorised dual purpose lamp, an authorised indicating lamp, or an authorised headlamp without the written consent of the approving authority, which consent may be withdrawn by the approving authority at any time, and may be subject to such conditions as the approving authority specifies.

- (2) Every mask so manufactured, sold, or offered for sale shall have shown thereon in a clear and indelible manner-
  - (a) the name or trade mark of the manufacturer; and
  - (b) the month and year of manufacture.
- 18. (1) A person shall not display or cause or allow to be displayed upon any motor vehicle, except a motor vehicle belonging to or appropriated for the use of the Armed Forces, the Defence Services identifying light as hereinafter defined, or any light so resembling such light as to be likely to deceive.
- (2) A person shall not have in his possession or control or use, or enter or occupy any motor vehicle upon which is displayed the Defence Services identifying light, or any light resembling such light, unless such vehicle belongs to or is appropriated for the use of the Armed Forces and is being used with due authority for official purposes.
- (3) The Defence Services identifying light means a circular azure light one inch in diameter, the colour of which conforms to the British Standard Colour No. 4 azure.
- 19. (1) A person shall not drive, be in charge of, or leave any motor vehicle in any public place within the prescribed area, not being formed on private property, between sunset and sunrise, unless it has white paint or other white material not less conspicuous than white paint applied or affixed in a strip of an even width of not less than three inches along the bumper bars, running boards, and the lower edges of the mudguards. Where the vehicle has humper bars, running boards, and mudguards the paint or other material shall be applied or affixed thereto. Where the vehicle has no bumper bar or running board or mudguard, the paint or other material shall be applied or affixed in a position on such vehicle applied to that of or affixed in a position on such vehicle approximating as nearly as possible to that of bumper bars, running boards, and mudguards.
- (2) Any such white paint, white material, or white surface aforesaid shall be maintained in a clean condition and unobscured.
- 20. A person shall not, between sunset and sunrise, within the prescribed area, drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding twenty miles per hour: Provided that nothing in this clause shall apply to a motor vehicle which is being used by a constable or Commonwealth Officer or a member of the Civil Defence Forces, or a person engaged in any civil defence service in the exercise of his duty.
- 21. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in any law of the Commonwealth or of the State of Western Australia, or any regulations made under any such law providing for the lighting of motor vehicles, no person in charge of, driving, riding, propelling or using a motor vehicle in any part of the State shall be guilty of an offence in respect of the lighting of such vehicle, if the lights carried thereon are not in accordance with the requirements of any such law or regulation by reason only of the fact that they are screened or dimmed in the manner and to the extent required by this Order.
- (1) Any constable may by notice in writing addressed to an owner of any motor vehicle require that owner to produce the vehicle at the police station nearest to his place of abode, or at such other place as is specified in such notice, at the time mentioned in such notice, for the purpose of having the lighting of the vehicle tested in order to ascertain whether it complies with the provisions of this Order, and the owner shall, on service of such notice, comply with any requirement contained therein.
- (2) A notice issued in pursuance of this clause shall be deemed to have been served on the owner if the notice is delivered to him personally or posted to him at his last known place of abode in a prepaid addressed envelope.
- (3) Paragraph (1) of this clause shall only apply to a motor vehicle which is commonly used or likely to be used in the prescribed area, and, where the motor vehicle is not already fitted with authorised lamps as required to be fitted on a motor vehicle when the same is used in the prescribed area, it will be sufficient for the purposes of this clause if the owner satisfies the constable that he has immediately available and capable of being fitted instantly to the motor vehicle such masks or lamps as are required for the due compliance with the provisions of this Order when the vehicle is used in the prescribed area. used in the prescribed area.
- 23. (1) Where any motor vehicle is alleged to have been concerned in the commission of any contravention of this Order, the owner of the vehicle, or the person in whose name the vehicle is registered, or the person having custody of the vehicle, shall give such information as he is required to give by any constable as to the identity of the driver or person in charge of the vehicle at the time of his alleged contravention.
- (2) It shall be sufficient defence in proceedings against any person for failure to comply with the requirements of this clause if that person proves to the satisfaction of the Court that he did not know and could not with reasonable diligence have ascertained who was the driver or person in charge at the time when the alleged contravention was committed.
- 24. Any direction which any person is authorised to give in pursuance of this Order-
  - (a) may be given, either verbally or in writing, by telephone, telegraph, or in such other manner as that person deems sufficient to bring the direction to the notice of any person affected thereby;
    (b) may be given so as to operate for any period or periods, or for any time or times, or in any part or parts of the State; and
    (c) may contain such incidental and supplementary directions as appear to the person giving the direction to be necessary or expedient for the purposes of the direction

  - of the direction.
- 25. Any certificate signed or purporting to be signed by the approving authority to the effect that any type of mask has or has not been approved by him or that he has or has not given his consent to the manufacture, sale, or offering for sale by any person of any mask or type of mask shall be prima facio evidence of the facts stated therein.
- 26. Nothing in this Order shall apply to any motor vehicle while it is being used for the purposes of the Armed Forces, and any such vehicle while it is driven

by or is in charge of a member of the said Armed Forces may display any light required or authorised to be displayed by the Naval Board, the Military Board, or the Air Board, as the case may require.

- 27. (1) Notwithstanding that a motor vehicle is not commonly used or likely to be used within the prescribed area, and for that reason the owner thereof has not fitted the vehicle with authorised lamps as required to be on a motor vehicle when the same is used within the prescribed area, the owner of the vehicle shall—
  - (a) at all times have and keep in such vehicle ready for instant use such masks and other fittings as may be necessary to convert the lamps on the vehicle into authorised lamps; and
  - (b) at all times keep and maintain such masks and fittings in good and serviceable condition.
- (2) Any constable may at any time in any public place require the person in charge of a motor vehicle in such public place and not fitted with authorised lamps to satisfy him that in relation to such motor vehicle the requirements of paragraph (1) of this clause are being duly complied with.
- (3) Where the person in charge of a motor vehicle fails to comply with the requirements of paragraph (2) of this clause he shall be guilty of a contravention of this Order, notwithstanding that he may not be the owner of the vehicle.
- 28. (1) Whenever I, the said Premier, by a notice in writing shall declare that during any period stated in the notice any part or parts of the State specified in the notice and not already comprised in the prescribed area as defined in clause 4 of this Order shall be included in and form part of the prescribed area aforesaid, and while such notice remains unrevoked by me such part or parts of the State shall, for all the purposes of this Order become and be and remain a part of the prescribed area as from the date when such notice shall come into operation.
- (2) Any notice referred to in paragraph (1) of this clause shall operate as from the date specified therein for the coming into operation thereof.
- (3) Every such notice shall be deemed to have been published sufficiently for the information of the public when it is published in the Government Gazette of the State or in any newspaper circulating in the part or parts of the State specified in the notice or is broadcast by means of wireless transmission.
- (4) The production of any Gazette or newspaper in which a notice has been published or of a certificate signed by the manager of the broadcasting station over which the notice has been broadcasted, or a copy of the notice as given under this clause, shall be prima facic evidence of the giving of such notice and the publication thereof in accordance with the provisions of this clause.
- 29. This Order shall come into operation on the day upon which publication thereof is made in the Government Gazette of Western Australia.
