FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934. NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Order has been issued in accordance with section 7, subsection (1) of the Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1934, which reads as follows:—

THE following amendment of the Supreme Court Rules is published for general information.

The Honourable Sir John Alfred Northmore, K.C.M.G., Chief Justice; The Honourable John Patrick Dwyer, and The Honourable Albert Asher Wolff, Puisne Judges of the Supreme Court of Western Australia, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers contained in the Supreme Court Act, 1935, and the Escheat (Procedure) Act, 1940, and of every other power them in this behalf enabling, amend the Supreme Court Rules of 1909 by adding thereto a new Order, as hereinafter mentioned, to stand as Order seventy-five, and declare that such Order shall come into operation forthwith, upon publication thereof in the Government Gazette.

#### ORDER LXXV.

(0.75.)

Applications under the Escheat (Procedure) Act, 1940.

- 1. Every application shall be made by notice of motion to a Judge in Chambers and shall be supported by an affidavit setting out fully the circumstances of the ease and the grounds upon which the Order is applied for.
- 2. Every application shall be intituled "In the Matter of......deecased Ex Parte The Crown."
- 3. Notice of any application in the form in the Schedule hereto shall be published in accordance with the provisions of section 5 of the Escheat (Procedure) Act, 1940.
- 4. (a) Upon the hearing of any application, such evidence shall be adduced as the Judge may require.
- (b) The Judge may direct an inquiry to be held into all such matters as he may consider necessary, and may prescribe the steps to be taken for that purpose.
- 5. Any person who claims title to or any lawful interest in or right to the property or premises concerned may attend on the return day and be heard personally or may be represented by solicitor or counsel. Any such person shall file an affidavit verifying his claim. If the Judge is satisfied on reading such affidavit that prima facie the claimant has a bona fide interest in the property concerned, he may order an issue to be tried in Court, but otherwise the Judge shall make an Order in terms of the motion, or such other Order as the justice of the case may require.
- 6. An Order of Escheat shall be in the form in the Schedule hereto. The order shall be scaled and shall be marked with the name of the Judge by whom it is made.
- 7. On hearing an application the Judge may make an order for payment of costs out of the estate or property concerned and such costs shall be taxed and allowed in accordance with the scale of costs in Appendix N.: Provided that no costs shall be allowed to any person making an unsuccessful claim to the property unless the Judge shall certify that there were substantial grounds for making such claim.
- 8. The fees  $t_0$  be paid in respect of applications under this Order shall be in accordance with the scale in the appendix hereto.

### ORDER LXXVI.

### (0 76.)

Applications under the Public Trustee Act, 1941.

- 1. An application by the Public Trustee under section 10 for an Order to Administer the estate of an intestate shall be in the Form No. 1 in the Schedule hereto and shall be supported by an affidavit setting forth—
  - (a) the death of such person and the date and place thereof;
  - (b) that he died intestate;
  - (c) particulars of the next-of kin resident within the jurisdiction, so far as is known to the Public Trustee;
  - (d) the grounds on which the application is based;
  - (e) the value of the real and personal estate of the deceased situate in Western Australia, so far as is known to the Public Trustee.
- 2. An Order to Administer may be as shown at the foot of Form No. 1 in the said Schedule.
- 3. An application by the Public Trustee for an Order to Administer with the Will annexed shall be in Form No. 2 in the Schedule hereto and shall be supported by an affidavit setting forth—
  - (a) the death of such person and the date and place thereof;
  - (b) that the Will (which shall be annexed to the affidavit) is believed to be the true and last Will of the deceased and unrevoked;
  - (c) names, addresses, and occupations of the executors appointed;
  - (d) names, addresses, and occupations of the subscribing witnesses;
  - (e) grounds on which the application is based;
  - (f) value of the real and personal estate of the deceased situate in Western Australia, so far as is known to the Public Trustee.
- 4. An Order to Administer with the Will annexed may be as shown at the foot of Form No. 2 in the said Schedule.

- 5. Applications to the Court under the provisions of section 12 of the Public Trustee Act, other than applications by the Public Trustee, shall be made by motion supported by affidavit filed in the Registry at least two clear days before the application comes on to be heard. Notice of such motion, together with a copy of the affidavit, shall be served upon the Public Trustee.
- 6. The authority referred to in subsections (1), (2), and (3) of section 12 shall be in Form No. 3 in the Schedule hereto.
- 7. The filing by the Public Trustee of any application for an order under section 10 of subsection 1(f) shall be sufficient evidence to the Court of the death of the deceased person with respect to whose Will or estate such application is filed, and in such case it shall not be necessary for a death certificate to be produced to the Court.
- 8. Claims and complaints under section 28 of the Public Trustee Act shall be brought by summons before a Judge in Chambers and shall be supported by affidavit. All parties interested shall be served with a copy of such summons and affidavit, and such parties may appear in opposition, either personally or by counsel, or solicitor.
