AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers, at Perth, on the 18th day of November, 1942, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

Road Districts Act, 1919-1941.

Angusta-Margaret River Road District—Alteration of Common Boundary with the Nannup Road District.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 100/41.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1941, the Governor may by Order in Council sever any portion of a Road District and annex it to an existing Road District: And whereas it is desirable to sever portion of the Angusta-Margaret River Road District and annex it to the Nannup Road District: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the said Act and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby sever that portion of the Angusta-Margaret River Road District as described in the Schedule hereto and annex it to the Nannup Road District.

The area bounded on the northward by the Blackwood River, on the eastward by the present eastern boundary of the Angusta-Margaret River Road District, on the southward by the present southern boundary of the said Road District, and on the westward by the western boundary of Sussex Location 735 and its production north and south.

Leonora Road District—Redivision into Wards and Reallocation of Members.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Order has been issued in accordance with section 7, subsection (1) of the Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1934, which reads as follows:—

PUBLIC TRUSTEE ACT, 1941.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting pursuant to the provisions of section 64 of the Public Trustee Act, 1941, has been pleased to amend the regulations made under the said Act and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 26th day of June, 1942, in the manner mentioned in the Schedule hereunder.

Schedule.

The abovementioned regulations are amended by deleting the whole of regulation 6 and inserting in lieu thereof a new regulation as follows:—

6. (a) The Public Trustee shall take and retain a commission of two and one-half per centum on the corpus and five per centum on the income received in and with respect to every estate: Provided that in the case of the estate of an insane patient or incapable person—

- (i) the commission of two and one-half per centum aforesaid shall be charged only upon the gross proceeds of the assets realised;
- (ii) if the Public Trustee shall withdraw money from a current account or fixed deposit in a Savings Bank or Trading Bank, no commission shall be charged on the amount so withdrawn;
- (iii) where the estate is that of an incapacitated member of the Defence Force as constituted under the Defence Act, 1903-1939, and the incapacity has been accepted by the prescribed authority under the Australian Soldiers Repatriation Act as the result of war service, the rates of commission payable to the Public Trustee shall be reduced by half.

In time of war no commission shall be charged on the estate of any deceased member of the Defence Force as constituted under the Defence Act, 1903-1939, where the gross value of the assets of such estate does not exceed five hundred pounds, but where the gross value of such estate exceeds five hundred pounds but does not exceed one thousand pounds, there shall be charged one half of the then ruling rate or rates, and where the gross value of such estate exceeds one thousand pounds there shall be charged the full rate or rates then applicable.

(b) Rents or other income collected by agents and on which an agent's commission is charged shall be charged a rate or commission of two and one-half per centum.

- (e) Where assets outside of the State of Western Australia are received by the Public Trustee as principal administrator, the Public Trustee shall take and retain a commission of one and one-half per centum on the capital received or realised.
- (d) Where the Public Trustee is cotrustee or custodian trustee, his rate or rates of commission shall be reduced by half, in cases where the private trustees claim and receive commission under an Order of the Court.
- (e) The remuneration of advisory trustees subject to the provisions of the trust instrument (if any) shall, in the case of each estate, be such as is fixed by the Public Trustee, with the concurrence of the advisory trustees or, if they do not agree, then by the Minister.
- (f) For any matter or service not hereinbefore provided the charge of the Public Trustee shall be such as is agreed on or as in the absence of agreement the Public Trustee fixes.
- (g) There shall be a charge to cover postages in all estates where the Public Trustee obtains probate or letters of administration, in accordance with the following scale:—

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 9 of 1938.

Between West Australian Male and Female Mental Nurses' Industrial Union of Workers, Claremont, Applicant, and the Hon. Minister for Health, Respondent.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the industrial dispute between the abovenamed parties:—

Award.

1.—Term.

The currency of this Award shall be three (3) years from the commencement of the first pay period after the 30th day of October, 1942.

2.—Area and Scope.

This Award shall apply to all mental nurses who are employed in any Government Hospital, Mental Ward, or Home for Mental Cases in Western Australia which is within the jurisdiction and/or under the control of the Inspector General for Insane, but does not apply to the Hospital known as "Lennos," which is exempted from the provisions of this Award.

3.—Definitions.

(a) "Mental Nurse" means a person engaged in nursing, caring for, and/or working with insane or mental patients and who holds a mental nursing certificate, or who is in course of training for a mental nursing certificate as prescribed by the W.A. Government Regulations.

(b) "Charge Nurse" means the person who is appointed by the Inspector General in charge of any ward or wards containing mental patients.

(c) "Deputy Matron" means the person appointed to the position by the Inspector General.

(d) "Deputy Head Attendant" means the person appointed to the position by the Inspector General.

(e) "Head Attendant" means the person appointed to the position by the Inspector General.

(f) "Roundsman" or "Rounds Nurse" is the person who makes an inspection of the various wards between the hours of 8.20 p.m. and 7.30 a.m., and is the responsible person in charge, and who performs all duties as set out by the Inspector General.

(g) "Ward" means a collection of rooms set aside for the accommodation of mental patients, and which contain the necessary requirements for the care and supervision of such patients.

4.—Hours.

There shall be no fixed hours for the Head Attendant, Deputy Head Attendant, or the Deputy Matron.

The ordinary working hours for all other workers shall be eighty-eight (88) per fortnight, to be worked in eleven (11) or twelve (12) shifts: Provided, however, that as regards the Hospitals known as "Greenplace" and "Whitby" the following provisions shall apply:—

(i) "Greenplace": The ordinary working hours for the nurses employed at Greenplace shall be forty-seven (47) per week. Such nurses shall be paid an allowance of ten shillings (10s.) per week each to cover the extra hours and also any occasions when they may be called upon outside their ordinary hours of duty.

(ii) "Whitby": The ordinary working hours for workers at Whitby shall be one hundred and seventy-six (176) hours in each four-weekly period.

5.—Overtime.

All time worked in excess of the ordinary daily hours as rostered for any one shift shall be classed as overtime and paid for at the rate of time and a half.

Provided that, where the overtime is necessitated through the attendance of the staff at concerts, picture shows, or other amusements for the patients, or where the overtime is necessary through the failure of another member of the staff to report for duty when rostered, the above conditions shall not apply, and equivalent time off shall be allowed in lieu thereof: Provided, further, that the conditions of this clause shall not apply to Head Attendant, Deputy Head Attendant, or Deputy Matron, nor at Greenplace, for which provision is made in the preceding clause.

6.—Holidays.

(a) All male and female nurses, including Head Attendant, Charge Nurses, and Deputies shall be granted four (4) weeks' leave on completion of each year of service: Provided that a worker of three (3) months' continuous service shall, on termination of engagement, receive annual holidays in proportion as his period of service is to the number of days in the year.

(b) Public holidays: In addition to the foregoing annual holidays all workers shall be granted five (5) public holidays, viz. New Year's Day, Good Friday, Labour Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day, or a day in lieu thereof.

(c) Any worker who may resign or be dismissed from the service shall be entitled to payment for any holidays which may be due under this clause at the time of resignation or dismissal: Provided always, that if the worker be dismissed for any offence, no payment for annual leave or holidays will be granted for any period subsequent to the date of offence.

7.—General Conditions.

(a) While present conditions as to the number and class of patients continue there shall be two (2) nurses on night duty in the following Wards at Claremont Hospital:—No. 1 Hospital Male Ward 3; No. 2 Male Ward, No. 4 Male Ward.

(b) Every nurse shall be given the opportunity of acquiring by experience a thorough knowledge of all practical work. He or she shall be under the supervision of the respective Charge Nurse, whose duty it will be to see that he or she is properly instructed in the practical work.

(c) Wherever possible or practicable no male mental nurse shall be required to work under the orders and directions of a female mental nurse of junior status to him.

(d) No male mental nurse shall take charge in any ward in any Mental Hospital, Mental Observation Ward, or Receiving Home for Mental Cases, unless in possession of a Mental Nursing Certificate, which shall have been issued in conformity with the W.A. Government Regulations governing the issue of such certificates. The same provision shall apply as regards female nurses, when the position of the staff as regards qualifications and experience and numbers will permit.

(e) Rosters shall be for fortnightly periods.

8.—Sick Leave.

In the case of illness, provided a medical certificate is provided, full pay shall be allowed for the first fourteen (14) days of such illness in each financial year. Should a longer period of sick leave be required, the question of extending full pay will be at the discretion of the Inspector General, subject to the limitations that such pay shall not exceed the amount provided for in Public Service Regulations: Provided that no payment for sick leave will be made when the illness is due to the worker's misconduct.

9.—Travelling Time.

A worker when travelling on duty away from his or her home station or headquarters shall not by reason of such travelling suffer any interruption of the continuity of his or her pay for ordinary working hours in each day, but no overtime shall be allowed for time occupied in travelling.

10.—Travelling Allowance.

(a) Workers when travelling on duty outside the metropolitan area shall be paid a travelling allowance of ten shillings (10s.) per twenty-four (24) hours: Provided there shall be a deduction of one-fourth of the said allowance for each item of expense of breakfast, lunch, dinner or bed not necessarily incurred in any day. The allowance shall be computed from the time of leaving the worker's headquarters or home. The items of breakfast, lunch, dinner or bed will not be allowed if the worker leaves headquarters or home after or returns before 8 a.m., 1 p.m., or 6 p.m., and midnight. An additional allowance of twenty per cent. (20%) shall be allowed a worker for time spent in the area east of Merredin.

(b) If any worker, except at his own request or on account of misconduct, is required by the department to transfer to any station under the department other than his home station, he shall be paid the actual reasonable cost of the removal of his household effects, unless the department itself undertakes the removal.

(c) The maximum amount for conveyance of household effects shall be Fifteen pounds (£15).

(d) Before removal the employee shall, where practicable, obtain offers from at least two carriers, and

submit them to the Inspector General, who may authorise the acceptance of the more suitable, provided the maximum amount above stated is not exceeded.

(e) Vouchers must be produced for all sums paid.

11.—Night Duty.

Prior to going on night duty a nurse shall, wherever practicable, come off duty at 4 p.m. and go on at 11.30 p.m. the same night, provided that night duty is not to be preceded or succeeded by duty commencing after 12.30 p.m.

12.—Post-mortem Attendance.

An allowance of five shillings (5s.) and two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) respectively per body shall be made, and stimulants provided, when required for any nurse and his assistant carrying out mortuary duties in connection with post-mortem examinations.

13.—Charges Against Workers.

If a worker is formally charged under section 187a of the Larceny Act, 1903-20, with an offence, he shall be given at least twenty-four hours' notice in writing prior to the hearing in which to prepare his defence; but this shall not prejudice the power under the Act of immediate suspension. The said period of twenty-four hours may be decreased upon the written request of the person charged.

14.—Uniforms.

Uniforms shall be supplied in accordance with the present practice: Provided that the style of uniform may be altered, if so desired by the Inspector General. Uniforms to be supplied on 30th April and 31st October in each year.

15.—Emergencies.

The Inspector General and the Medical Superintendent, or whoever for the time being may be in charge of any Mental Hospital in W.A., may at his or her discretion take such measures as may in his or her opinion be necessary for the protection, safety, or welfare of the patients, the staff, or the institution, and all instructions issued in pursuance of such special measures shall promptly and faithfully be carried out by all members of the staff to whom such instructions may be issued, and this shall be done without regard to whether or not such instructions may be in accordance with this Award.

16.—Higher Duties.

Any worker called upon to perform work carrying a higher minimum than his regular pay shall be paid such higher minimum for the time engaged upon such higher work: Provided that the higher rate shall not apply unless four (4) hours in a shift are worked in the higher capacity. In cases where the higher duties are caused owing to a worker being absent through sickness, if the absent worker is in receipt of full pay, the higher rate shall not be paid for the first four (4) weeks, and during that period no extra payment shall be made to any worker for work arising out of such absence through sickness.

17.—Old and Infirm Workers.

Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the wages awarded herein may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon between the union and the Inspector General or his representative, and in default of such agreement within twenty-four (24) hours after such worker shall have applied in writing to the secretary of the union stating his desire that such wage shall be agreed upon, such wage as shall be fixed by the most convenient Resident or Police Magistrate, upon the application of such worker, after twenty-four hours' notice in writing shall have been given by him to the said secretary, who shall, if he so desires, be heard by the Magistrate upon such application. After having given notice to the secretary, and after lodging the application mentioned, and pending the Magistrate's decision thereon, the worker shall be entitled to work and be employed at that proposed lesser rate. The determination of the Magistrate shall have effect for the period of six (6) calendar months from the date thereof, and after the expiration of the said period until the rate shall have been again fixed at the instance of the said secretary in the manner prescribed. The secretary of the union may,

in writing under his hand, appoint an agent or substitute to represent the union at the hearing of the application before the Magistrate.

(b) The rates for the second, third, and fourth year's service are contingent upon the examinations prescribed in regulations being passed: Provided that, when a nurse fails in his or her examination, and later passes the examination, the year in which he or she failed shall be void regarding future increases in pay unless and until the examination is passed, and the nurse shall lose the equivalent seniority.

(c) When workers who are not entitled to board and lodging "live in" a charge of £1 6s. 1d. per week will be made for board and lodging.

(d) An allowance of 1s. 3d. per shift shall be paid to each Rounds Nurse in the Main Block between the hours of 8.20 p.m. and 7.30 a.m. and 7d. per shift shall be paid to each Rounds Nurse in X Block between 8.20 p.m. and 7.30 a.m.

(e) When on annual leave workers who are provided with board and lodging shall be granted an allowance for the period of leave at the rate of £1 6s. 1d. per week.

(f) While existing conditions continue an allowance of 6d. per shift shall be paid to nurses who at 4 o'clock p.m. take charge of the wards in Main and X Blocks, but this amount shall not be cumulative on the amounts prescribed in subclause (d).

(g) Until a special ward or wards are provided, an allowance of 6d. per shift shall be paid to all nurses in attendance on patients suffering from active venereal disease or tuberculosis cases.

(h) A telephone shall be provided for the use of the residential nurses and staff. The use of this shall be subject to such regulations as may be deemed necessary by the Inspector General.

19.—Board of Reference.

(1) For the purpose of this Award, a Board of Reference is hereby appointed, which shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. The said Board shall have assigned to it, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the dispute, the functions of:—

- (a) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise from time to time, except such as involve interpretation of the provisions of this Award or any of them;

- (b) dealing with any other matter which the Court may refer to the Board from time to time;
- (c) classifying and fixing wages, rates, and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Award.

(2) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board, in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, which, for this purpose, are embodied in this Award.

20.—Union Secretary.

The union secretary shall at all reasonable hours have access to various Institutions covered by this Award, for the collection of dues and to see that the various clauses of the Award are being observed.

He shall not enter any ward without the permission of the Medical Officer in Charge. He shall not interfere or interrupt a nurse in the course of his or her duty. The Medical Officer in Charge shall determine whether employees are being interfered with or interrupted in their work.

21.—Preference to Unionists.

All workers covered by this Award shall, within fourteen (14) days of commencing work, make application to the Applicant Union for membership.
