PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, } By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell,

JAMES MITCHELL, over the State of Western Australia
Lieutenant-Governor. and its Dependencies in the Common-
[L.S.] wealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by section 9 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-40, it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever in every or any specified portion of Western Australian waters, by means of fishing nets and fishing lines or either of such means of capture, or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: And whereas by section 10 of the said Act every such Proclamation may be revoked or varied at any time: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power thereunto me enabling, vary the Proclamation dated 6th May, 1942 (published in the *Government Gazette* of 15th May, 1942), by omitting therefrom paragraph (3) and inserting in lieu thereof the following:—

(3) The waters of the Swan River and its tributaries from a line drawn from the south-western extremity of Point Resolution to the south-western extremity of the Point Walter Jetty (situated at Point Walter) downwards to a line drawn from the western extremity of the South Mole to the western extremity of the North Mole (at Fremantle).

PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, } By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell,
TO WIT. } K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and
JAMES MITCHELL, over the State of Western Australia
Lieutenant-Governor. and its Dependencies in the Common-
[L.S.] wealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 4 of the Vermin Act, 1918-1938, that "Vermin" means and includes any animal, bird, or insect mentioned in the Third Schedule to the said Act, and such other animals, birds, or insects the names of which the Governor may by Proclamation add to the said Schedule, and that any Proclamation whereby the names of other animals, birds, or insects are added to the Third Schedule may be restricted in its operation to any portion of the State, to be defined by the Proclamation: And whereas it is deemed expedient to add to the said Third Schedule the names of the birds known as "Black Cockatoos," with intent that they shall be "Vermin" for the purposes of the said Act, but to restrict the operation of this Proclamation to those portions of the State comprised within the boundaries of the Collie Vermin District: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by section 4 of the Vermin Act, 1918-1938, do by this Proclamation add to the Third Schedule to the said Act the names of the birds known as "Black Cockatoos," with intent that they shall be "Vermin" for the purposes of the said Act; but I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall be restricted in its operation to those portions of the State comprised within the boundaries of Collie Vermin District.

FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Orders have been issued in accordance with section 7, subsection (1) of the Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1934, which reads as follows:—

A Stay Order shall direct that no action, execution, distress for rent, proceedings on default for breach of covenant under any mortgage or other security for money, or under an agreement for sale and purchase of lands, or other process or proceeding, shall be commenced or proceeded with, or put in force against the farmer or any of the farmer's assets, whether utilised in connection with or forming portion of the assets comprised in his farming business or not, during the operation of such Stay Order: Provided that, by leave of a Judge, any action may, notwithstanding the Stay Order, be instituted and/or carried on against the farmer but not beyond judgment.

NATIONAL SECURITY (INTERMENT CAMPS) REGULATIONS.

(Statutory Rules No. 7 of 1941 as amended.)

State of Western Australia.

WHEREAS it is provided by regulation 16 of the National Security (Internment Camps) Regulations that, where an internee submits a request in writing that arrangements be made for the administration of his estate during his internment, a Minister of State may by order appoint a person to administer the estate of the internee and may make provision for any matters necessary in connection with the administration of the estate, including the matters specifically referred to in regulation 16 (5) of the said regulations: And whereas the persons named in the Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as "the internees") have duly made requests as prescribed in the said regulations: Now, therefore I, Emil Nulsen, M.L.A., Minister for Justice of the State of Western Australia, acting under the authority conferred by the said regulations, do hereby make the following Order:—

- (1) The Public Trustee shall administer the estate of the said internees as if such estates were ones which the Public Trustee had been appointed to administer under and in accordance with the Public Trustee Act, 1941;
- (2) All relevant provisions of the Public Trustee Act and any regulations or Rules of Court made thereunder shall apply to the administration of the estates aforesaid;
- (3) Any payments of remuneration to the Public Trustee or of expenses incurred in connection with the administration of the estates or of the debts due and payable by the said internees may be made out of the estates or of the income thereof with respect to which any such payment is made.

19 (a). The occupier of any public house, public bar, refreshment room, boarding-house, tea-room, eating-house, drinking booth, or other public place of refreshment shall not permit the use of any drinking vessel unless such vessel is sound and free from cracks and chips.

AGREEMENT No. 17 of 1942.

(Reg. 14/11/42.)

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, this fifteenth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and forty-two, between Western Australian Nurses' Association Industrial Union of Workers, Perth (hereinafter called "the union"), of the one part, and Church of England Hospitals (Incorporated) (hereinafter called "the employer"), of the other part, witnesseth that, for the considerations hereinafter appearing, the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other, as follows:—

1.—Definition.

(a) A "trainee" shall mean a pupil nurse undergoing training in a registered training school and is an apprentice within the meaning of that term in the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941.

(b) A "registered training school" is one which is registered as a training school under the Nurses' Registration Act, 1921.

2.—Salaries.

The minimum salary per week payable to employees shall be as follows:—

3.—Hours.

(a) Forty-eight (48) hours shall constitute a week's work.

(b) Any employee who is not on duty and elects to remain on the employer's premises shall not be paid for such time.

4.—Overtime.

Work done by employees in excess of forty-eight (48) hours per week shall be paid for at the rate of time and a quarter.

5.—General.

(a) Every trainee shall be given the opportunity of securing by experience a knowledge of all hospital duties essential to her calling performed in the hospital where she is in training.

(b) A trainee shall not be required to undertake ward duty, except under the immediate supervision of a trained nurse, during the first six (6) weeks' service.

(c) Where trainees are given preliminary training before taking up ward duty, the time spent in such preliminary training shall be counted as part of the period of training.

(d) The period of training shall be such as is prescribed in the regulations issued by the Nurses' Registration Board.

(e) Any employer taking a trainee on probation shall within fourteen (14) days thereafter register such probationer by giving notice thereof to the Registrar, in writing.

(f) Within one month from the end of the period of probation an agreement in writing, as required by the Act, shall be executed and signed by the employer, the trainee, and, where the trainee is under twenty-one (21) years of age, the parent or legal guardian of the probationer. There shall be three (3) executed copies of such agreement, of which one copy shall be held by the employer, one by the trainee or her parent or guardian, and one shall be lodged with the Registrar.

(g) Trainees shall be employed for a period of three (3) months on probation; such period shall count as part of the term of service. The period of probation may be extended with the approval of the Court, but shall not exceed six (6) months in all.

(h) A trainee may be transferred from one employer to another, but notification thereof must be sent to the Registrar within fourteen (14) days of such transfer.

(i) The agreement may be cancelled by mutual consent of the parties, but notification of such cancellation must be forwarded to the Registrar within fourteen (14) days from the date thereof.

(j) The employer, with the consent of the Court, may discharge a trainee from service and cancel the agreement for misconduct or wilful disobedience or any other cause which the Court may deem sufficient.

(k) Lecture times:—Any lectures or examinations which occur normally during duty hours shall be computed as part of the working time of the trainees whose duty it is to attend such lectures or examinations and there shall be no reduction in salary in respect thereto.

(l) Trainees who do not pass their final examinations may be retained until such examinations are passed, and during such period they shall be paid at the rate provided for trainees in their final year. But such extended period shall in no case exceed twelve (12) months.

(m) The employer shall report to the Court in writing the result of all Nurses' Registration Board Examinations immediately the result is available showing—

- (i) the names of the candidates sitting;
- (ii) the training school attended;
- (iii) the result of the examinations.

This report shall be available for inspection by the union secretary or her authorised nominee.

1. By inserting after regulation 77 a new regulation, to stand at regulation 77A, as follows:—

Swine Owners not to Collect or Utilise Kitchen Refuse.

77A. No owner of swine shall, in any part of Western Australia, collect or utilise any kitchen or other refuse or pigwash from any hotel, boarding-house, military or other camp, or premises or any premises whatsoever whether *ejusdem generis* with the foregoing or otherwise.
