PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA. } By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell,
TO WIT. } K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and
JAMES MITCHELL, over the State of Western Australia
Lieutenant-Governor. and its Dependencies in the Common-
[L.S.] wealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 8 of the Prisons Act, 1903-1918, that the Governor may by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare—(a) any building, enclosure, or place to be a gaol, and (b) any police station or lock-up to be a police gaol, and in like manner may discontinue and close any gaol or police gaol: And whereas by a Proclamation dated the 28th day of May, 1942, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 5th day of June, 1942, the building and premises situate in York, upon York Town Lot No. 7 and part of York Town Lot No. 6, theretofore a police station, and declared to be and used as a police gaol under and for the purposes of the said Act were discontinued and closed as such police gaol, and in lieu thereof were declared to be a gaol under and for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas, as it is deemed desirable and expedient to discontinue and close the said gaol and in lieu thereof to declare the said building and premises to be a police gaol: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by section 8 of the Prisons Act, 1903-1918, do hereby discontinue and close as a gaol the building and premises situate in York upon York Town Lot 7 and part of York Town Lot 6, heretofore declared to be and used as a gaol for the purposes of the said Act, and in lieu thereof do hereby declare that the said building and premises, now being used as a police station or lock-up, to be a police gaol under and for the purposes of the Prisons Act, 1903-1918.

WHEREAS by sections 223 and 228 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906-1941 (6 Edwardi, No. 32), it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request of the Council, by notice in the *Government Gazette* to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street or way, or any place, bridge, or thoroughfare to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway, within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the City of Perth has requested that certain land named and described in the Schedule hereunder, which has been used for a street or way within the City of Perth, be declared a public highway: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare the said land to be a public highway, and such land shall from the date of this Proclamation be absolutely dedicated to the public as a highway, within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force:—

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers, at Perth, this 27th day of November, 1942, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:—

The Forests Act, 1918.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Forests File 236/39.

WHEREAS by the Forests Act, 1918, it is provided that the Governor may by an Order in Council declare any Crown lands as Timber Reserves, within the meaning and for the purpose of that Act, or may revoke in whole or part any such reservation: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby par-

tially revoke Timber Reserve No. 116/25, at Palgarup, by excising therefrom the area described hereunder.

ORDER UNDER REGULATION 4 OF THE NATIONAL SECURITY (GENERAL) REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by regulation 4 of the National Security (General) Regulations it is provided (amongst other things) that if it appears to the Minister to be necessary or expedient in the interests of the Defence of the Commonwealth or the efficient prosecution of the war, or for maintaining supplies and services essential to the life of the community, that special precautions should be taken for the security of any place, he may by Order declare that place to be a prohibited place, either generally or during such hours or during the existence of such circumstances as are specified in the Order for the purposes of the Regulations: And whereas by Instrument of Delegation dated the seventh day of May, 1942, made in pursuance of section 17 of the National Security Act, 1939-1940, John Curtin, the Minister of State for Defence, delegated to every officer who should at any time during the continuance of the delegation be holding the office or performing the duties of the office of Commander of a Lines of Communication Area the powers and functions conferred upon the said Minister by regulation 4 of National Security (General) Regulations in relation to that Lines of Communication Area: And Whereas by regulation 4 (6) (b) of the National Security (General) Regulations it is provided that the Minister may, if he thinks fit, in any Order made under subregulation (1) of this regulation, or by separate Order, authorise any officer or person to issue permits to enter, approach, inspect, pass over, or be in or in the neighbourhood of a prohibited place: And whereas by regulation 4 (6) (c) of the National Security (General) Regulations, it is provided that the Minister may, if he thinks fit, in any Order made under subregulation (1) of this regulation, or by separate Order, specify an officer or person to exercise and perform the powers and functions of the officer or person in charge of any prohibited place for the purposes of these Regulations: And whereas it appears to me, Oswald Vick Hoad, Brigadier Commanding Western Australia Lines of Communication Area, necessary and expedient, in the interests of the Defence of the Commonwealth and the efficient prosecution of the war, that special precautions should be taken for the security of the places referred to in the Schedule hereto, being places situate within the said Western Australia Lines of Communication Area: Now, therefore I, the said Oswald Vick Hoad, acting in pursuance of the said regulation and instrument of delegation, do hereby order as follows:—

- (1) that the places described in the Schedule hereto are declared to be prohibited places generally for the purpose of the National Security (General) Regulations from the date of the making of this Order;
- (2) that temporary Major Colin Ednie Brown (WX29331), G.S.I., W. Aust. L of C Area, is authorised to issue permits to enter, approach, inspect, pass over, or be in or in the neighbourhood of the said prohibited places;
- (3) that Temporary Captain Joseph George Frederiek Senior M.C. (WX237570), W. Aust. L of C Area Section, Intelligence Corps, is specified as the officer to exercise and perform the powers and functions of the officer in charge of the said prohibited places for the purpose of these regulations.

The Schedule.

All that area of land and water contained within the following boundaries as defined by a line commencing at a point on the seacoast in Mangles Bay at a distance of 10 chains east of the Peron House Jetty and proceeding thence in a general south-westerly direction on a bearing of 214deg. 0min. to cut the coastline in Shoalwater Bay; thence southerly along the coastline as defined at low water mark to Mersey Point; thence due south for a distance of 1 mile 40 chains; thence due west for a distance of 3 miles 32 chains; thence in a general north-westerly direction on a bearing of 351deg. 30min. for a distance of 17 miles 30 chains; thence due east for a distance of 7 miles; thence in a general south-easterly direction on a bearing of 174deg. 30min. for a distance of 11 miles 20 chains; thence in a general south-westerly direction to the point of commencement, as referred to in Lands and Surveys Department Litho. Plans 341 A/40 and 341 D/40.

The abovementioned by-laws of the Trustees of Kalgoorlie Public Cemetery are amended as follows:—

1. By-law No. 8 is deleted and a new by-law is inserted in lieu thereof as follows:—

8. (1) The hours for burials shall be as follows:—

- (a) Monday to Friday, both inclusive, during the months September to April, both inclusive—9 o'clock a.m. to 6 o'clock p.m.;
- (b) Monday to Friday, both inclusive, during the months May to August, both inclusive—9 o'clock a.m. to 5 o'clock p.m.;
- (c) Saturday, throughout the year—9 o'clock a.m. to 2 o'clock p.m.

(2) No interment shall be allowed on any Sunday, except when it is certified by a medical officer of health that, for hygienic reasons, or by the chairman of the Trustees of the Cemetery that for religious reasons it is necessary or advisable that an interment shall take place on a Sunday.

5. The members of the Potato Growers Advisory Committee established under section 4 of the Act shall be entitled to and shall be paid out of the special account, referred to in the said section, fees and allowances in return for their services as such members in accordance with the following scale:—

(a) A sitting fee of £1 1s. per day or part of a day for attendance at meetings of the Committee;

(b) A travelling allowance at the rate of £1 1s. per day, and proportionately for part of a day when the member is travelling to and from meetings of the Committee or is otherwise engaged on the business of or for the Committee;

Provided that this paragraph shall not apply to the time taken in travelling to and from meetings of the Committee, if the member resides in the town or city in which the meeting is held or at any place within a radius of fifteen miles from such town or city;

- (c) The actual cost of travelling from the home of the member to the place where the meeting of the Committee is held and of returning to his home:
- Provided that such cost shall not exceed the fare for a similar journey by train, tram, or omnibus, which is available and is the smaller fare;
- (d) Whenever by the direction of the Committee the member makes any inspection or performs any other service for the Committee under and for the purposes of the Act or regulations, the member may, if the Committee by resolution so approves, be granted a fee, by way of remuneration for his services in respect of each day or part of a day during which the services are performed, such amount not exceeding £1 1s. as the Committee by its resolution aforesaid may determine.
