WHEREAS by section 42 of the Native Administration Act, 1905-1941, the Governor may by Proclamation whenever in the interests of the natives he thinks fit declare any municipal district or town or any other place to be an area in which it shall be unlawful for natives not in lawful employment to be or remain: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare an area at Murrin Murrin, more particularly described in the attached Schedule, to be an area in which it shall be unlawful for natives not in lawful employment to be or remain.

Schedule.

All that area comprised within a circle having a radius of five miles from the north corner of the Post Office Reserve (Lot 54) at Murrin Murrin.

Lieutenant-Governor. and its Dependencies in the Common-
[L.S.] wealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by section 8 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1940, it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit all persons from—(a) taking fish of any speci-

fied species by any specified means of capture; (b) taking any fish whatsoever by any specified means of capture; (c) taking any fish whatsoever by any means of capture whatsoever, in any specified portion of Western Australian waters during any specified time, in any specified year or during a specified portion of any year: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the power aforesaid and of any other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets for a term of three (3) years as from and inclusive of the 1st day of January, 1943: Provided that nets of not more than fifty (50) yards in length and with meshes of not less than three (3) inches may be used in the said waters from the 1st day of December in each year until the 30th day of April in the succeeding year.

Moore River (the whole):—Situate about 45 miles north of Fremantle.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 116 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937, that during every Christmas Day, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Anzac Day, and Easter Monday, and any other day that the Governor may by Proclamation declare to be a public holiday to

be observed under the said Act, all shops (except those mentioned in the Fourth Schedule and registered small shops) shall be closed: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do by this Proclamation declare that, in addition to Christmas Day, 1942, and Saturday, the 26th day of December, 1942, Monday the 28th day of December, 1942, shall be a public holiday to be observed under the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937 throughout the State, with the intent that on the said days all shops throughout the State (except those mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the said Act and registered small shops) shall be closed; Monday the 28th day of December, 1942, shall be substituted in lieu of New Year's Day, 1st January, 1943.

Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1941.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1941, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office approved by the Minister a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under this Act to all workers employed by him, but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that he has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor may by Order in Council exempt such employer from the opera-

tion of the said section 10: And whereas The Australasian Temperance and General Mutual Life Assurance Society, Limited, of St. George's terrace, Perth, being an employer within the meaning of the said Act, and as such subject to the provisions of the said section 10, and having made application in accordance with the said Act and the regulations made thereunder for exemption from the operation of the said section 10 has proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against its said liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities, to wit, Commonwealth of Australia Consolidated Stock to the face value of £5,000 £3 7/8% maturing 15th December, 1952-4, charged with all payments to become due by it under its said liability: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby exempt the said The Australasian Temperance and General Mutual Life Assurance Society, Limited, from the operation of section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1941, for a period of one year ending on the 5th day of November, 1943.

FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Order has been issued in accordance with section 7, subsection (1) of the Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1934, which reads as follows:—

A Stay Order shall direct that no action, execution, distress for rent, proceedings on default for breach of covenant under any mortgage or other security for money, or under an agreement for sale and purchase of lands, or other process or proceeding, shall be commenced or proceeded with, or put in force against the farmer or any of the farmer's assets, whether utilised in connection with or forming portion of the assets comprised in his farming business or not, during the operation of such Stay Order: Provided that, by leave of a Judge, any action may, notwithstanding the Stay Order, be instituted and/or carried on against the farmer but not beyond judgment.

In the matter of an Award made on the 16th day of October, 1929, Numbered 9 of 1929, between The Federated Engine-drivers and Firemen's Association of Australasia West Australian Branch Association of Workers (hereinafter called "the union"), Applicant, and the Hon. the Minister for Works and other Ministers of the Crown, Respondents, and in the matter of an Application by the Hon. the Minister for Works for amendment of the said Award.

The said Board shall have assigned to it, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the dispute, the functions of:—

- (a) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise from time to time, except such as involve interpretation of the provisions of this Award or any of them;
- (b) dealing with any other matter which the Court may refer to the Board from time to time;
- (c) classifying and fixing wages, rates and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Award.

(2) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, which, for this purpose, are embodied in this Award.

NATIONAL SECURITY (GENERAL) REGULATIONS.

State of Western Australia.

Barley Board Order.

WHEREAS it is provided by Regulation 35A of the National Security (General) Regulations (as amended by Statutory Rule 1942, No. 448) that the Premier of any State, may after consultation with the Minister of State for Home Security or an officer of the Department of Home Security authorised by that Minister to act on his behalf, and with the Commandant of a Military District or an officer authorised by the Minister of State for Defence, or the Minister of State for the Army to act on behalf of such Commandant, by Order—

(c) make such provisions with respect to the rights, powers, privileges, obligations, or liabilities of the civil population or any part thereof as appears to him to be reasonably incidental to the operation of any regulation made under the National Security Act, 1939, or under that Act as subsequently amended;

(d) make such provision as he deems necessary for aiding the effective operation or giving full effect to the objects of any such regulations:

And whereas the Australian Barley Board was constituted by the Australian Barley Board Regulations (Statutory Rules 1939, No. 128) (hereinafter referred to as "the regulations"), for the purposes of the Regulations: And Whereas the State of Western Australia has been exempted from the provisions of the regulations with respect to the operations of the Australian Barley Board; Now, therefore I, John Collings Willcock, M.L.A., Premier of the State of Western Australia, being of the opinion that it is desirable to establish a Barley Board within the State of Western Australia for the purpose of aiding the effective operation and giving full effect to the object of the regulations, and having duly held the consultation aforesaid, and acting pursuant to the said Regulation 35A of the National Security (General) Regulations, do hereby make the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Western Australian Barley Board Order.

2. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—

"the Board" means the Western Australian Barley Board constituted by this Order; and

"the Minister" means the Minister for Agriculture.

3. (1) For the purpose of this Order there shall be a Western Australian Barley Board.

(2) The Board shall consist of—

- (a) one person representing the Government of the State;
- (b) one person representing the maltsters of Western Australia;
- (c) one person representing the merchants;
- (d) one person representing the exporters;
- (e) three persons representing the barley growers of Western Australia; and
- (f) one person representing the brewers of Western Australia;

who shall be appointed by the Minister by notice published in the *Gazette* and who shall hold office during the pleasure of the Minister.

(3) The person appointed to represent the Government of the State shall be the chairman of the Board.

(4) In the absence of the chairman of the Board the members present at any meeting may elect one of their number to be the chairman of that meeting.

4. The Board shall be a body corporate, with perpetual succession and a common seal. The Board shall not be deemed to represent the Crown for any purpose whatsoever.

5. (1) The Minister may, in respect of each member of the Board, appoint a person representative of the same interests as the member, to be the deputy of that member.

(2) Any person so appointed shall, in the event of the illness or absence of the member of whom he is the deputy, have all the powers of that member during his illness or absence.

(3) No such appointment of a deputy and no acts done by him as such shall in any proceedings be questioned on the ground that the occasion for his appointment had not arisen or had ceased.

6. (1) Meetings of the Board shall be held at such times and places as the Board from time to time determines.

(2) The chairman of the Board, or any four members thereof, may at any time call a special meeting of the Board.

(3) At all meetings of the Board four members shall form a quorum.

(4) At all meetings of the Board the chairman shall have a deliberative vote and, in the case of an equality of votes, shall also have a casting vote.

(5) All questions before the Board shall be decided by a majority of votes.

(6) The Board shall keep a record of its proceedings.

7. The Board may appoint any number of its members to be an Executive Committee, and may delegate to that Committee such of its powers and functions as the Board, subject to any direction by the Minister, determines:

Provided that no such delegation shall prevent the exercise of any power or function by the Board.

8. A member of the Board shall not be personally liable for any act of the Board or of the member acting as such.

9. (1) The Minister may appoint a superintendent to be the Chief Executive Officer of the Board.

(2) The Board may appoint such other officers as are necessary to assist the Board in carrying out its functions under this Order.

(3) Officers appointed in pursuance of this Order shall not be subject to the Public Service Act, 1904-1935, and shall hold office during the pleasure of the Board.

(4) The salaries and allowances of officers appointed in pursuance of this Order shall be as directed by the Minister.

10. (1) The Board may license, subject to such conditions as are specified in the license, any person, firm, company, or State authority to receive and deal with barley on its behalf and may cancel or suspend any such license.

(2) The Board may license a maltster to receive only barley which he intends to purchase from the Board for his own use, in which case that maltster shall be a licensed receiver in respect of only such barley as he so intends to purchase, and no barley shall be delivered to him other than that which he selects.

(3) Subparagraph (2) of this clause shall not be construed as limiting the power of the Board to license a maltster to receive any barley.

11. (1) There shall be payable to any member of the Board such salaries, fees, and expenses as the Governor may direct.

(2) There shall be payable to any licensed receiver, as remuneration for his services and for any facilities made available by him for the classification, storage, protection, treatment, handling, transfer, and shipping of barley, and for any expenses properly incurred by him, such amount as the Minister from time to time determines.

12. For maintaining supplies and services essential to the life of the community, the Minister may from time to time, by Order published in the *Gazette*, declare that any barley (save and except black barley, skinless barley, and such barley as the producer may require for his own use on his farm) is acquired by the Board. In addition to the powers aforesaid the Minister may, at the request of the appropriate Minister of State for the Commonwealth Government, make a similar declaration on behalf of the Commonwealth. The barley the subject of any such Order shall thereupon become the absolute property of the Board or the Commonwealth, as the case may be, freed from all mortgages, charges, liens, pledges, interests, and trusts affecting that barley, and the rights and interests of every person in that barley (including any rights or interests arising in respect of any moneys advanced in respect of that barley) are hereby converted into claims for compensation.

13. All persons having barley acquired by the Board in their possession, control, or disposal on the date of the publication of an order describing that barley shall, within fourteen days of that publication, furnish to the Board a return in accordance with Form A in the Schedule to this Order.

14. Any person having barley acquired by the Board in his possession, control, or disposal may deliver or consign that barley to a licensed receiver or, on receipt of a notice in writing from the Board requiring him to deliver or consign that barley to a licensed receiver specified in the notice, shall deliver or consign (as the case may be) the barley to that licensed receiver within the time specified in the notice.

15. Except as provided in clause 14 of this Order, or with the consent of the Board, no person shall—

(a) use or part with the possession of any barley acquired by the Board which is held in his possession; or

(b) take into his possession any barley which is the property of the Board.

16. A licensed receiver shall hold all barley acquired by the Board, which is at any time in his possession, on behalf of the Board, and shall not use or part with the possession of any such barley, except in accordance with permission or instructions from the Board.

17. (1) Upon delivery or consignment of any barley in accordance with clause 14 of this Order, every person having any right or interest in that barley may

forward to the Board a claim for compensation in accordance with Form B in the Schedule to this Order, and shall be entitled to be paid such amount of compensation as the Minister, after taking into consideration the recommendation of the Board, determines.

(2) It shall not be necessary for the Minister to make a determination in pursuance of subparagraph (1) of this clause until in his opinion a sufficient quantity of any barley acquired by the Board has been disposed of to enable the Board to make a just recommendation, but the Minister may, in his absolute discretion, make any payment on account of any claim, notwithstanding that no determination in respect of that claim has been made.

18. (1) Every contract relating to the sale or delivery of any barley acquired by the Board, entered into before the acquisition of that barley, is hereby declared to be void and of no effect, in so far as that contract has not been completed by delivery.

(2) Any transaction or contract with respect to any barley which is the subject matter of any contract or part of a contract which is hereby declared to be void shall also be void and of no effect, and any money paid in respect of any contract hereby made void or of any transaction shall be repaid.

(3) No action for the enforcement or for damages for breach of any contract of the kind specified in subparagraphs (1) or (2) of this clause, whether the contract was entered into or is to be performed in Australia or elsewhere, shall, in so far as that contract has not been completed by delivery prior to the acquisition of that barley, be brought in any Federal or State Court or Court of a Territory under the authority of the Commonwealth.

19. All persons who are parties to any contract relating to the sale of any barley, whether entered into prior to or after the date of the commencement of this Order, and which has not prior to the date of that commencement been completed by delivery, shall, within fourteen days of that commencement, or of entering into the contract, whichever is the later date, furnish to the Board a return in accordance with Form C in the Schedule to this Order.

20. Any member of the Police Force of the Commonwealth or of a State or Territory authorised so to do by the Board may, at any time in the day or night, enter and search any premises or vessel, or part thereof, where any barley acquired by the Board is or is suspected to be and, if necessary for that purpose, may break into and use force to enter such premises or vessel or part.

21. For the purposes of this Order, any person thereto authorised by the Board may, at all reasonable times, enter any premises and inspect any stocks of barley and any accounts, books and documents relating to any barley.

22. Any person having any barley the property of the Board in his possession or under his care shall exercise proper care and take all proper and reasonable precautions and do all things necessary to preserve and safeguard that barley and to keep it free from any damage or deterioration whatsoever.

23. The Board may purchase any barley, and may use or sell or otherwise dispose of any barley acquired or purchased by it as it deems necessary for maintaining supplies and services essential to the life of the community.

24. Subject to any directions of the Minister, the Board may—

- (a) purchase any barley;
- (b) sell or dispose of any barley;
- (c) manage and control all matters connected with the classification, handling, storage, protection, treatment, transfer or shipment of any barley acquired by the Board or of any barley sold or disposed of by the Board; and
- (d) do all matters which it is required by this Order to do or which are necessary or convenient for giving effect to this Order.

25. (1) The Board shall open and maintain an account at the Commonwealth Bank of Australia into which it shall pay all moneys received in respect of sales of barley or otherwise.

(2) Out of the moneys standing to the credit of the account the Board shall defray all costs and expenses of administering this Order and make all payments in respect of compensation and any other payments authorised to be made by this Order.

(3) The accounts of the Board shall show separately the receipts and payments in respect of the different grades of barley.

(4) The accounts of the Board shall be subject to audit by the Auditor General.

26. The Minister may arrange with the Commonwealth Bank of Australia for the making by that Bank of advances to the Board for use on its behalf by the Board for the purposes of this Order, and may guarantee to that Bank the repayment, out of moneys lawfully made available by the Parliament, of any advance made by the Bank in pursuance of the arrangement.

27. Any person who furnishes any return required to be furnished by this Order which is false in any particular shall be guilty of an offence against the National Security Act, 1939.

28. A licensed receiver shall not directly or indirectly offer any bribe or special inducement with the object of obtaining deliveries of barley.

29. Section twenty-nine of the Acts Interpretation Act, 1901-1937, shall apply to any reference in this Order to the receipt of any notice as if that reference were to the giving of any notice.
