DEFENCE QUARTERING ORDER.

IN pursuance of subregulation (2) of regulation 10 of the National Security (Military Forces) Regulations and in pursuance of paragraph (3) of the Defence Quartering Order I, Brigadier Oswald Viek Hoad, the Officer holding the office of Commander, Western Australia Lines of Communication Area, do hereby appoint the areas in the Schedule hereto to be Defence Quartering Areas, from the date hereof.

ORDER UNDER REGULATION 5 OF THE NATIONAL SECURITY (GENERAL) REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by Regulation 5 of the National Security (General) Regulations it is provided (amongst other things) that without prejudice to any other provision of these regulations, the Minister, if satisfied with respect to any area that it is necessary or expedient in the interest of the Defence of the Commonwealth or the efficient prosecution of the war to regulate the entry of persons into that area, may by order declare that area to be a protected area for the purpose of these regulations, and so long as the Order is in force, then, on and after such day as is specified in this Order and subject to any exemptions for which provision is made by the Order, no person who was not at the beginning of that day resident in the protected area shall be therein without the permission of such authority or person as is specified in the Order: And whereas by Instrument of Delegation dated the 7th day of May, 1942, made in pursuance of section 17 of the National Security Act, 1939-1940, John Curtin, the Minister of State for Defence, delegated to every officer who should at any time during the continuance of the delegation be holding the office or performing the duties of the office of Commander of a Lines of Communication Area the powers and functions conferred upon the said Minister by regulation 5 of the National Security (General) Regulations in relation to that Lines of Communication Area: And whereas it appears to me, Oswald Vick Hoad, Brigadier Commanding Western Australia Lines of Communication Area, necessary and expedient in the interests of the Defence of the Commonwealth and the efficient prosecution of the war, to regulate the entry of persons into the area referred to in the Schedule hereto, being an area situate within the said Western Australia Lines of Communication Area: Now, therefore I, the said Oswald Vick Hoad, acting in pursuance of the said Regulation and Instrument of Delegation do hereby order as follows:—

- (1) That the places described in the Schedule hereto shall be and are hereby declared to be protected areas generally for the purpose of National Security (General) Regulations.
- (2) That no person shall without the written permission of an authorised officer be in such area if such person was not at the time of the commencement of this Order resident in such area.
- (3) This Order shall be deemed to have commenced from the date hereof.
- (4) An authorised officer may at any time from time to time exempt any person or class of persons from the operation of this Order.
- (5) "An authorised officer" shall be such officer as shall be from time to time appointed for such purpose by any of the following persons:—

- (a) Commander Western Australia Lines of Communication Area;
- (b) Commander Fixed Defences, Fremantle, or any person for the time being administering such Command;
- (c) Senior General Staff Officer Western Australia Lines of Communication Area;

and any of the following persons shall also be an authorised officer for the purposes of this order, viz.:—

- (i) T/Major Colin Ednie Brown (WN29331) G.S.I. Western Australia Lines of Communication Area.
- (ii) Captain Joseph George Frederick Senior M.C. (W237570), Field Security Service, Western Australia Lines of Communication Area.

Schedule.

(a) All that area of land situate near the Western Australian coast off Fremantle in the State of Western Australia and known as Carnac Island and all that area of sea surrounding the said Carnac Island at a distance of three miles from every part of the coastline thereof.

(b) All that area of land situate near the Western Australian coast off Fremantle in the State of Western Australia and known as Garden Island and all that area of sea surrounding the said Garden Island at a distance of three miles from every part of the coastline thereof.

(c) All that area of land situate near the Western Australian coast off Fremantle in the State of Western Australia and known as Penguin Island and all that area of sea surrounding the said Penguin Island at a distance of three miles from every part of the coastline thereof.

ORDER UNDER REGULATION 55 OF THE NATIONAL SECURITY
(GENERAL) REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by Regulation 55 of the National Security (General) Regulations it is provided that a Minister may by order authorise subject to any restrictions and conditions imposed by the order the use of land specified therein for Naval, Military, and/or Air Force purposes during the period specified in the order; and that any such order may further provide as set out in paragraphs (a) and (b) of the said Regulation: And whereas by Instrument of Delegation dated the 18th day of September, 1942, made in pursuance of section 17 of the National Security Act, 1939-1940, Francis Michael Forde, the Minister of State for the Army, delegated to every officer who should at any time during the continuance of the delegation be holding the office or performing the duties of the office of Commander of a Lines of Communication Area the powers and functions conferred upon the said Minister by Regulation 55 of the National Security (General) Regulations in relation to that Lines of Communication Area: And whereas it appears to me, Oswald Vick Hoad, Brigadier Commanding Western Australia Lines of Communication Area necessary and expedient to authorise for purposes of training Naval, Military, and/or Air Force personnel and purposes incidental thereto the use of the land referred to in the schedule and more particularly described in plan attached hereto, being land situate within the said Western Australia Lines of Communication Area: Now therefore I, the said Oswald Vick Hoad, acting in pursuance of the said Regulation and Instrument of Delegation hereby authorise the use of the land referred to in the schedule hereto and more particularly described in plan attached hereto for purposes of training Naval, Military, and/or Air Force personnel and purposes incidental thereto from the date of the making of this order for the duration of the present war and I do hereby further order as follows:—

- (1) That the Naval, Military, and/or Air Forces of the Commonwealth and of the Allied Forces at war with the Axis powers shall be entitled to use the said land and do such acts in relation to the said land as are necessary and expedient for the purpose of training the said Naval, Military and/or Air Forces.
- (2) That the aforesaid Naval, Military, and/or Air Forces shall have power to prohibit or restrict the exercise of rights of way over the said land and any rights relating thereto which are enjoyed by any other person whether by virtue of an interest in the land or otherwise.

The Schedule.

All that area of land bounded on the north by line of Murchison River from Gantheaume Bay to Billybillong, on the east by line from Billybillong-Yalgoo-Merredin, on the south by the line of the Eastern Goldfields Railway from Merredin to Fremantle and on the west by the line of coast from Fremantle to Gantheaume Bay.

ORDER UNDER REGULATION 4 OF THE NATIONAL SECURITY
(GENERAL) REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by Regulation 4 of the National Security (General) Regulations it is provided (amongst other things) that if it appears to the Minister to be necessary or expedient in the interests of the Defence of the Commonwealth or the efficient prosecution of the war, or for maintaining supplies and services essential to the life of the community, that special precautions should be taken for the security of any place he may by order declare that place to be a prohibited place either generally or during such hours or during the existence of such circumstances as are specified in the order for the purposes of the Regulations: And whereas by Instrument of Delegation dated the 7th day of May, 1942, made in pursuance of section 17 of the National Security Act, 1939-1940, John Curtin, the Minister of State for Defence, delegated to every officer who should at any time during the continuance of the delegation be holding the office or performing the duties of the office of Commander of a Lines of Communication Area the powers and functions conferred upon the said Minister by Regulation 4 of the National Security (General) Regulations in relation to that Lines of Communication Area: And whereas by Regulation 4 (6) (b) of the National Security (General) Regulations it is provided that the Minister may, if he thinks fit, in any order made under Sub-Regulation (1) of this Regulation or by separate order, authorise any officer or person to issue permits to enter, approach, inspect, pass over or be in or in the neighbourhood of a prohibited place: And whereas by Regulation 4 (6) (c) of the National Security (General) Regulations, it is provided that the Minister may, if he thinks fit, in any order made under Sub-Regulation (1) of this Regulation or by separate order, specify an officer or person to exercise and perform the powers and functions of the officer or person in charge of any prohibited place for the purposes of these Regulations: And whereas it appears to me, Oswald Vick Hoad, Brigadier Commanding Western Australia Lines of Communication Area, necessary and expedient in the interest of the Defence of the Commonwealth and the efficient prosecution of the war that special precautions should be taken for the security of the place referred to in the Schedule hereto, being a place situate within the said Western Australia Lines of Communication Area: Now therefore I, the said Oswald Vick Hoad, acting in pursuance of the said Regulation and Instrument of Delegation do hereby order as follows:—

- (1) That the place described in the Schedule hereto is declared to be a prohibited place generally for the purpose of the National Security (General) Regulations from the date of the making of this Order.

- (2) That T/Major Colin Ednae Brown (WX29331), G.S.I. Western Australia Lines of Communication Area, is authorised to issue permits to enter, approach, inspect, pass over, or be in or in the neighbourhood of the said prohibited place.
- (3) That T/Captain Joseph George Frederick Senior, M.C. (W.237570) Western Australia Lines of Communication Area Section, Intelligence Corps, is specified as the officer to exercise and perform the powers and functions of the officer in charge of the said prohibited place for the purpose of these Regulations.

The Schedule.

All that portion of Swan Bank Road (Road No. 6330) passing along the western boundaries of Lots 537 and 536 of Swan Location 2039, and part of the western boundary of Lot 534 from the southern side of a drain reserve at the northern corner of the first-mentioned lot to an angle in the road boundary of the last-mentioned lot situate 87.8 links from its north-western corner.

FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

(No. 183 of 1942.)

In the matter of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941; and in the matter of an Industrial Dispute between the Hon. Minister for Works (Applicant) and the Coastal Dock, Rivers, and Harbour Works Union of Workers (Respondent).

Order.

The 26th day of November, 1942.

WHEREAS a dispute having arisen between the above-named parties a compulsory conference was held by the President of the Court pursuant to section 168 of the said Act: And whereas certain matters were referred into Court from the said compulsory conference: And whereas the said matters came on for hearing before the Court on the 12th and 13th days of November, 1942, and the Court, having considered submissions made by the parties through their respective agents and the oral and other evidence tendered, doth hereby order and direct that Award No. 19 of 1928 between the said parties be and the same is hereby amended as follows:—

Clause 2.—Engagement and Dismissal.

Add the following subclause, to be known as subclause (b), at the end thereof:—

- (b) When the complement is living aboard, each employee shall be entitled to a minimum of one (1) day's wages for each day of twenty-four (24) hours aboard, but such minimum shall not in any case exceed one (1) week's wages for any calendar week.

Clause 4.—Hours.

Omit this clause and insert the following in lieu thereof:—

- (a) Except where otherwise provided, the ordinary working hours for employees other than those who may be required to work seven (7) days per week shall not exceed eight (8) hours for the first five (5) days in the week and four (4) hours on Saturdays.
- (b) When a dredge is commissioned to work two or more shifts, the hours of work in each week may be varied by the Minister to the extent that the hours may be forty (40), forty-four (44), or forty-eight (48) per week: Provided that the average hours worked shall not exceed forty-four (44) per week over a period of two (2) or three (3) weeks, as the case may be.
- (c) Shift hours shall be fixed with due consideration to transport facilities for employees going to and returning from work when shifts are changed.
- (d) (i) With complement living aboard, shift hours shall be fixed with due consideration to weather conditions, commencing time being not earlier than 6 a.m. for the day shift: Provided, however, that, except in case of accident or other unforeseen circumstances, the winches on the dredge "Governor" shall cease work for a period of eight (8) hours prior to the commencement of such day shift. As regards the dredge "Matthew Flinders" the Board of Reference may determine the question of the stoppage of the winches.
- (ii) Before any alteration is made in the hour of commencement of a shift a week's notice thereof shall be given to the workers concerned.
- (e) In any week in which a holiday occurs, the number of working hours shall be reduced by eight (8) hours for such holiday.
- (f) Time shall be counted when the men are actually working or when the dredges are under way. It is agreed that stationary dredges shall not be considered under way.
- (g) The provisions of subclause (d) shall not apply when a dredge is proceeding from one port to another or is away from its home port, in which case the shifts to be worked and the times of commencement shall follow the practice in operation prior to the making of this order.

Clause 6.—Overtime.

Omit subclauses (a) and (c) and insert the following in lieu thereof:—

- (a) All time worked outside of or in excess of the usual working hours shall be paid at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours after the stopping time of shift and double time thereafter: Provided that an employee required to commence work within one and a half (1½) hours before the starting time of shift shall be paid time and a half until such starting time. When an employee is required to commence work before one and a half hours of the starting time of shift he shall be paid double time until such starting time.
- (c) When an employee is recalled to work after leaving his job he shall be paid a minimum of two (2) hours at overtime rates.

Clause 10.—Detention on Dredge.

Omit this clause and the heading and insert in lieu thereof the following:—

10.—Dredging Operations with Complement Living Aboard.

- (a) When the Minister requires the complement to live aboard a dredge he shall supply cooking utensils, a cook, and sleeping accommodation, and pay an "away from home" allowance of four shillings and sixpence (4s. 6d.) per day for every complete day, or one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per meal when the full day is not completed.
- (b) The provisions of clause 11 (e) (ii) shall apply in respect of sleeping accommodation.

- (c) The provisions of clause 11 (iv) shall apply.
- (d) Where not already provided, a hot shower and soap shall be provided for the use of employees. In the case of the dredge "Governor" this provision shall be deemed to be complied with by the provision of a cold shower and a sufficiency of hot water.
- (e) The employees on each dredge to which this clause applies may nominate from amongst their number an honorary committee of three for the purpose of supervising and checking the ordering, delivery, and receipt of commodities required for food and the payment and discharge of the accounts therefor: Provided that on any such committee one additional person may be appointed to represent the other workers not governed by the Award.

Clause 11.—Sustenance Allowance.

Add the following words before the word "employees" in line 1 of subclause (d):—

Except as otherwise provided in clause 10.

NATIONAL SECURITY (SUPPLEMENTARY) REGULATIONS.

State of Western Australia.

Intoxicating Liquor (Restriction) Order.

WHEREAS by Regulation 45 of the National Security (Supplementary) Regulations (as amended by Statutory Rule 1942, No. 132) it is provided inter alia, that notwithstanding anything contained in the law of any State, where the Premier of the State is of opinion that it is in the interests of the defence of the Commonwealth or the effectual prosecution of the war that limitations or restrictions on the sale, supply, disposal, possession, or use of intoxicating liquor in the State additional to or different from the limitations and restrictions prescribed by the laws of the State should be imposed, he may by Order published in the *Government Gazette* of the State prohibit, restrict, control, or regulate the sale, supply, disposal, possession, or use of intoxicating liquor in the State and that any such Order may be made so as to apply either throughout the State or to any area or premises therein, may make different provisions with respect to different classes of premises, may provide for exempting premises (either absolutely or conditionally) from any of the provisions of the Order, and may contain such incidental and supplementary provisions as appear to the Premier to be necessary or expedient for the purposes of the Order: And whereas I, John Collings Willcock, M.L.A., Premier of the State of Western Australia, acting by virtue of the powers conferred by the said regulation 45, made and issued an Order dated the 27th day of August, 1942, which was cited therein as the Intoxicating Liquor (Restriction) Order No. 1 and was published in the *Government Gazette* of Western Australia on the 28th day of August, 1942, and is still in force: And whereas it is now deemed desirable and expedient to amend the said Order in the manner hereinafter mentioned: Now therefore I, the said John Collings Willcock, M.L.A., Premier of the State of Western Australia, acting by virtue of the authority conferred by the said regulation 45 do hereby make the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Intoxicating Liquor (Restriction) Order No. 2 and shall be read as one with the Intoxicating Liquor (Restriction) Order No. 1 hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter referred to as the principal Order.

2. The principal Order is hereby amended by adding to paragraph 1 of clause 5 a proviso as follows:—

Provided that where the Licensing Court is satisfied upon application by the union or unions concerned that war workers are employed or engaged on overtime or shift work the finishing time of which is not within the period between ten o'clock in the morning and six o'clock in the evening upon any day in the week, the Licensing Court may in its absolute discretion and after due consideration and inquiry by notice in writing direct and empower the licensee of any licensed premises adjacent or in close proximity to the factory establishment or place where such war workers are employed or engaged to—

- (i) have or keep his licensed premises open for the sale of intoxicating liquor for consumption upon such licensed premises,
- (ii) sell any intoxicating liquor for consumption upon such licensed premises or permit or suffer any intoxicating liquor to be drunk or consumed in or upon his licensed premises for any period or periods (not exceeding 30 minutes for any one period) after the completion of any such overtime or shift work.

Any such notice shall be in such form and subject to such terms and conditions as to the Licensing Court shall seem fit.

During any period or periods in which any licensee is directed or empowered under and in accordance with this proviso to open or keep open his licensed premises only war workers as hereinafter defined shall enter upon or be admitted to such licensed premises and no licensee shall sell any intoxicating liquor or permit or suffer any intoxicating liquor to be drunk or consumed in or upon his licensed premises to or by any person other than a war worker.

For the purposes of this proviso—

“Licensing Court” means the Licensing Court as constituted under the Act.

“Union” means an industrial or trade union of employees or an association of employees registered as an organisation under the Commonwealth Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1904-1934, or under the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, of which union or organisation the membership is substantially employed or engaged in munition manufacture or other war work.

“War worker” means any person over the age of 21 years engaged or employed on munition manufacture or other war work in any factory establishment or place where more than 50 workers are so employed or engaged and who produces a certificate in the form approved by the Licensing Court signed by his employer and the secretary of the union.

Certificates issued to war workers shall not be transferable and any person who produces or uses or attempts to produce or use or is found in possession of a certificate to which he is not lawfully entitled shall be guilty of a breach of this Order and liable to a penalty accordingly.

3. This Order shall operate and have effect as from the date of the publication of same in the *Government Gazette* of Western Australia.
