Pig Industry Compensation Act, 1942.

PROCLAMATION

Lieutenant-Governor. and its Dependencies in the Common-
[L.S.] wealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by section 15 of the Pig Industry Compensation Act, 1942, it is provided that, in respect of every sale of any pig or carcass there shall be payable stamp duty of such amount as the Governor may by Proclamation prescribe: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor do hereby, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, proclaim that stamp duty payable on every sale of any pig or carcass shall be threepence for every pound or part of a pound exceeding ten shillings— (a) of the amount of the purchase money in respect of one pig or one carcass sold singly; or (b) of the total amount of the purchase money in respect of any number of pigs or carcasses, as the case may be, sold in one lot: Provided that the stamp duty in respect of the amount of the purchase money of any one pig or any one carcass, as the case may be, whether sold singly or as part of a lot, shall not exceed two shillings and sixpence.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 9 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1940, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Western Australia, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever, by means of fishing nets, in any of the portions of Western Australian waters specified in the Schedule hereto from the 1st day of January, 1943, until the 31st day of December, 1945, inclusive:—

Schedule.

(1) The whole of the waters of the Channel Entrance to Peel's Inlet (Mandurah) bounded on the north by a line drawn in an easterly direction from the extremity of the western point of entrance (at the bar) to a point on the mainland on the eastern shore, and on the south by lines drawn in an easterly direction from the south-eastern corner of Murray Location No. 5 to the southern extremity of Channel Island; thence to the south-western extremity of Creery Island and by its southern foreshore to the eastern extremity of that island; thence by a line drawn in a north-easterly direction to a point on the foreshore of the mainland.

(2) The whole of the waters of the Serpentine River (including estuaries, tributaries, lakes and lagoons the waters of which during any time of the year have access directly or indirectly to the sea) lying north, east, and south-east of a line drawn from a point on the eastern foreshore of Peel's Inlet situated east of the southern-most point of Goongoolup Island and extending in a westerly direction half-a-mile; thence in a northerly direction to the foreshore of Peel's Inlet to a point lying west of the western side of the entrance to the Serpentine River.

(3) The whole of the waters of the Harvey River and that portion of the Harvey Estuary south of a line, being the prolongation easterly to the eastern shore of the estuary of the northern boundary of Murray Location No. 479.

WHEREAS by section 42 of the Native Administration Act, 1905-1941, the Governor may by Proclamation, whenever in the interests of the natives he thinks fit, declare any municipal district or town or any other place to be an area in which it shall be unlawful for natives not in lawful employment to be or remain: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare an area at Malcolm, more particularly described in the attached Schedule, to be an area in which it shall be unlawful for natives not in lawful employment to be or remain:—

Schedule.

All that area comprised within a circle having a radius of five miles from the north-west corner of the Malcolm Post Office site (Malcolm Lot 30).

WHEREAS by section 9 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-40, it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever in every or any specified portion of Western Australian waters, by means of fishing nets and fishing lines or either of such means of capture, or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever, by means of fishing nets, in any of the portions of Western Australian waters specified in the Schedule hereto, for a period dating from the 1st day of March, 1943, until the 31st day of December, 1945, inclusive:—

First Schedule.

All that area of Western Australian waters in Cockburn Sound commencing at a point on the foreshore one

hundred and fifty (150) yards north of Robb's Jetty and extending to a point on the foreshore one hundred and fifty (150) yards south of the said jetty, and extending into the waters aforesaid to a distance of a quarter of a mile from high-water mark.

Second Schedule.

That area of Western Australian waters in Cockburn Sound commencing at a point on the foreshore one hundred and fifty (150) yards north of the jetty fronting Douro road, South Fremantle, to a point on the foreshore one hundred and fifty (150) yards south of the said jetty, and extending into the waters aforesaid to a distance of a quarter of a mile from high-water mark.

Infectious Diseases.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 3 of the Health Act, 1911-1937, that the term "Infectious Disease" means and includes certain specified diseases, and also any other disease which the Governor may declare to be an infectious disease for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas it is desired to so declare the disease known as dengue fever: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare the disease above-mentioned, that is to say, dengue fever, to be an infectious disease for the purposes of the Health Act, 1911-1937.

The Land Act, 1933-1939.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corr. No. 3760/19.

WHEREAS by section 34 of the Land Act, 1933-1939, it is made lawful for the Governor by Order in Council, without issuing any deed of grant, to place any reserve under the control of any municipality, road board, or other person or persons as a Board of Management, and to empower such Board to make, repeal, and alter by-laws for the control and management of such reserves, and prescribe fees for depasturing thereon, and for other purposes, such by-laws to be approved by the Governor and published in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve A17241, for Common, near Mullewa, should be placed under the control of the Mullewa Road Board as a Board of Management: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby place the before-mentioned reserve under the control of the Mullewa Road Board as a Board of Management, and doth empower such Board to make, repeal, or alter by-laws for the control and management of the said reserve; for prescribing fees for depasturing thereon; for directing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and disposed of, and to impose penalties not exceeding in any case £5 for any breach thereof, and £2 a day for a continuing breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate.

Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1941.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1941, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office approved by the Minister a policy of

insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under this Act to all workers employed by him, but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor may by Order in Council exempt such employer from the operation of the said section: And whereas The National Bank of Australasia, Limited, of St. George's terrace, Perth, being an employer within the meaning of section 10 of the said Act and as such subject to the provisions of the said section 10, has duly, in accordance with the regulations made under the said Act, made application for exemption from the operation of section 10 aforesaid, and has proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against its said liability under the said Act, and has deposited at the Treasury securities, to wit, a bond for £5,000, charged with all payments to become due under the said liability: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby exempt the said The National Bank of Australasia, Limited, from the operation of section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1941, for a period of one year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1943.
