WHEREAS it is enacted by section 3 of the Marketing of Eggs Act, 1938-1939, that the Governor may, whenever requested so to do by a petition signed by not less than fifty producers carrying on the business of producing eggs, issue a Proclamation fixing the day for the taking of a poll of the producers so carrying on business in Western Australia, on the question whether a Board shall be constituted: And whereas I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, have, by a petition signed by not less than fifty producers carrying on the business of producing eggs, in accordance with the said section been requested to fix the day for the taking of a poll of the producers so carrying on business in Western Australia on the question whether a Board shall be constituted: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power conferred upon me by the said Act, do hereby fix the 21st day of April, 1943, for the taking of a poll of the producers carrying on the business of producing eggs in Western Australia on the question whether a Board shall be constituted under and for the purposes of the Marketing of Eggs Act, 1938-1939.

FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Order has been issued in accordance with section 7, subsection (1) of the Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1934, which reads as follows:—

A Stay Order shall direct that no action, execution, distress for rent, proceedings on default for breach of covenant under any mortgage or other security for money, or under an agreement for sale and purchase of lands, or other process or proceeding, shall be commenced or proceeded with, or put in force against the farmer or any of the farmer's assets, whether utilised in connection with or forming portion of the assets comprised in his farming business or not, during the operation of such Stay Order: Provided that, by leave of a Judge, any action may, notwithstanding the Stay Order, be instituted and/or carried on against the farmer but not beyond judgment.
