The Land Act, 1933-1937. PROCLAMATION

(Resumption)

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell, TO WIT. K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

Corr. No. 6245/21.
WHEREAS by section 11 of the Land Act, 1933-1937, the Governor may resume, for any of the purposes specified in section 29 of the said Act, any portion of land held as a Grazing Lease: And whereas it is deemed expedient that the portion of Grazing Lease 68/637, as described hereunder, should be resumed for one of the purposes specified in paragraph L of section 29 of the said Act, that is to say, for Gravel Quarry: Now, therefore I, Sir James Mitchell, Lieutenant-Governor as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation resume portion of Grazing Lease 68/637 for the purpose aforesaid.

Schedule.

That portion of Grazing Lease 68/637, containing 39 acres 1 rood 8 perches (surveyed as Victoria Location 9704, as shown on Diagram 44311).

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, on the fourth day of March, 1943, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1941.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1941, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated

insurance office, approved by the Minister, a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under the said Act to all workers employed by him, but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor may by Order in Council exempt such employer from the operation of the said section: And whereas the Bank of New South Wales, of St. George's terrace, Perth, in the State of Western Australia, being an employer within the meaning of the said Act, and having made application in accordance with the regulations made under the said Act, has proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that as such employer it has established a fund for insurance against its liability aforesaid, and has deposited at the Treasury securities, to wit, a bond of five thousand pounds, given by the said Bank, charged with all payments to become due and payable by the said Bank under its said liability: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby exempt the said Bank of New South Wales as such employer aforesaid from the operation of section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1941, for a period of one year computed from and including the 31st day of March, 1943.

Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1941. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1941, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office, approved by the Minister, a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under this Act to all workers employed by him, but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor

may by Order in Council exempt such employer from the operation of the said section 10: And whereas Amalgamated Collieries of W.A., Limited, of St. George's terrace, Perth, is an employer within the meaning of the said Act, and as such is subject to the provisions of the said section 10, and has made application duly in accordance with the said Act and the regulations made thereunder for exemption from the operations of the said section, and has satisfied the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against its liability to pay compensation under the said Act to all workers employed by it, and has deposited at the Treasury securities, to wit, a bond by the Bank of New South Wales of Perth, charged with all payments to become due by the company under the said liability: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power conferred by section 10 of the said Act, doth hereby exempt Amalgamated Collieries of W.A., Limited, from the operation of section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1941, for a period of twelve months from and including the 1st day of March, 1943.

WHEREAS under the provisions of subsection (3) of section 481 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906-1941, the Governor may at any time remove an auditor on the petition of the Council: And whereas a petition has been received from the Wagin Municipality praying that the auditor elected to that Council (Mr. M. S. Ward) be removed for the reasons following:—1, That he has enlisted in the Royal Australian Air Force and has been posted to a distant station; 2, that he has not resigned; 3, that it is desirable that another auditor shall be elected forthwith: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby remove Mr. Murray Sowden Ward from the office of auditor to the Wagin Municipality for the abovenamed reasons.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 4 of the Local Authorities (Reserve Funds) Act, 1942, that the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Minister, but subject to the requirements of the proviso to the said section, by Order in Council, authorise a local authority to establish during the present war and to maintain a reserve fund for the purpose of accumulating therein any surplus of ordinary revenue of the local authority over expenditure at the end of each financial year of the local authority, and of applying the moneys in such reserve fund, and any income or profit derived from the investment of moneys in such reserve fund in the carrying out after the cessation of the present war of works and undertakings, authorised by the Local Government Act of the local authority which the local authority may not be able conveniently to carry out during the present war: And whereas it is desirable that such a reserve fund shall be established by the Narrogin Road Board: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting pursuant to the recommendation of the Minister, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, after being satisfied as required by the proviso to section 4 of the said Act, doth hereby authorise the Narrogin Road Board to establish and maintain a reserve fund, and doth hereby specify under section 7 of the said Act that the amount of such surplus revenue to be paid into such reserve fund shall be £200 under and for the purposes of the said Act.

WHERAS it is enacted by section 4 of the Local Authorities (Reserve Funds) Act, 1942, that the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Minister, but subject to the requirements of the proviso to the said section, by Order in Council, authorise a local authority to establish during the present war and to maintain a reserve fund for the purpose of accumulating therein any surplus of ordinary revenue of the local authority over expenditure at the end of each financial year of the local authority, and of applying the moneys in such reserve fund, and any income or profit derived from the investment of moneys in such reserve fund in the carrying out after the cessation of the present war of works and undertakings, authorised by the Local Government Act of the local authority which the local authority may not be able conveniently to carry out during the present war: And whereas it is desirable that such a reserve fund shall be established by the Dandaragan Road Board: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting pursuant to the recommendation of the Executive Conneil and in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, after being satisfied as required by the proviso to section 4 of the said Act, doth hereby authorise the Dandaragan Road Board to establish and maintain a reserve fund, and doth hereby specify under section 7 of the said Act that the amount of such surplus revenue to be paid into such reserve fund shall be £750 under and for the purposes of the said Act.

BUSH FIRES ACT, 1937.

BY-LAWS of the Wiluna Road Board relating to the establishment, maintenance, and equipment of Bush Fire Brigades for the Road District of Wiluna.

Establishment of Brigade.

1. On the resolution of the Board to establish, main-1. On the resolution of the Board to establish, maintain and equip a Bush Fire Brigade under the provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1937, and regulations thereunder, the Brigade shall be formed in accordance with these by-laws; and a name shall be given to the Brigade and application accompanied by a copy of these by-laws shall be made to the Minister for Lands for its registration accordingly.

A Bush Fire Brigade may be established for the whole of the road district or for any specified area thereof. Provided that, unless the resolution of the Board establishing a Bush Fire Brigade specifies therein only a part of the district as the area for which such Brigade is established, the Brigade shall be deemed to be established for the whole of the said road district.

Appointment of Officers.

- 2. The Board shall appoint a captain, a first lieutenant, a second lieutenant and such additional lieutenants as it shall deem necessary to act as officers of the Brigade, and who, in the Board's opinion, have the necessary qualifications and knowledge of the district required in such capacities.
- 3. The secretary of the Board or such other person as the Board may appoint, shall be the secretary of the Brigade.
- 4. The Board may appoint an Equipment Officer, who shall be responsible for the custody and maintenance in good order and condition of all equipment and appliances acquired by the Board for the purposes of the Brigade. Such officer may station such equipment at a depot approved by the captain where, if possible, motor trucks can easily be called upon. If there are more than one such depots in the area, the Equipment Officer shall appoint at such depot a person to look after the equipment and have it ready for immediate use when required.
- 5. The Board shall appoint Bush Fire Control Officers in accordance with the requirements of the district and may prescribe the area over which each such officer shall have jurisdiction. The employment, dismissal and payment for services of persons (other than officers) employed for duties under this Act, shall be vested in the chairman and secretary of the Board conjointly.

Duties of Officers.

6. The duties of all officers appointed under these by-laws shall be as laid down in the provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1937, and each officer so appointed shall be supplied with a copy of the Act and regulations. The captain shall when so directed by the Board instruct all land owners or occupiers to plough a break or breaks on all cleared land under pasture.

Membership of Brigade.

- 7. (1) The membership of a Bush Fire Brigade may consist of the following:—(a) Subscribing members; (b) Fire fighting members; and (c) Associate mem-
- (2) Subscribing members shall be those persons being interested in forwarding the objects of the Brigade, pay an annual subscription to the funds of the Brigade at the following rates:
 - s. d. (i) Owner or occupier of land within the Brigade Area—minimum subscription
 - (ii) Other persons—a minimum subscription of

- (3) Fire fighting members shall be those persons, being able-bodied men over 18 years of age who are willing to render service at any bush fire when called upon, and who sign an undertaking in the form contained in the First Schedule to these by-laws.
- (4) Associate members shall be those persons who are willing to supply free motor transport for fire fighting or equipment, or are prepared to render other approved assistance, and who sign an undertaking in the form contained in the Second Schedule to these by-laws.
- (5) No fees or subscriptions shall be payable either by fire fighting members or associate members, and the curolment of persons as such members shall in every case be subject to the approval of the Board.
- (6) A subscribing member shall be eligible for enrolment as a fire fighting member.

Finance.

8. The expenditure incurred by the Board in the purchase of equipment, etc., payment for services and generally for the purposes of this Act, shall be a charge on the ordinary revenue of the Board, but the secretary shall keep a separate record of the expenditure incurred under this Act.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, this tenth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and forty-three (1943), between the Western Australian Barmaids and Barmen's Union of Workers (hereinafter called "the union), of the one part, and Dora Marsden Fielding (Geraldton Hotel), Clement Hale Penniment (Great Northern Hotel), Ethel May Daly (Railway Hotel), Dudley Sandford Nevile (Freemasons' Hotel), John Shea (Club Hotel), Leonard Wisely Shepheard (Victoria Hotel), Nicholas Georges Pilatis (Shamrock Hotel), Hotel Proprietors (hereinafter called "the employers"), of the other part: Witnesseth that, for the considerations hereinafter appearing, the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

1.—Area.

2.—Definitions.

In this Schedule and unless the context otherwise indicates, and without limiting the ordinary meaning of the term, "barmaid" or "barman," means any person over the age of twenty-one (21) years employed in the sale of liquor by retail in any hotel licensed under a Publican's General License, Hotel License, or Wine and Beer License: Provided that any employee other than a barmaid or barman may sell liquor for not more than two (2) hours per day between the hours of five (5) p.m. and eight (8) p.m.

3.—Wages.

(b) The margins above the basic wage per week shall be:—

- (c) Provided that, in respect to any basic wage variation which may occur from time to time, the total wage prescribed for a barmaid shall be adjusted so as to equal the prescribed wage for a barman, and the prescribed margin for a barmaid shall be deemed to have been increased or decreased accordingly.
 - (d) Wages shall be paid weekly.
- (e) Where the Board of Reference or the union grants a permit for the employee to lodge and/or board on the premises of the employer, the sum of £1 8s. 7d. may be deducted from the hereinbefore stipulated wages for board and lodging charges.
- (f) The board and lodging allowance prescribed in subclause (e) of this clause shall vary proportionately with the rise or fall in the basic wage.

4.--Hours.

Forty-four (44) hours shall constitute a week's work.

5.—Overtime.

- (a) All work done in excess of forty-four (44) hours in any one week or nine (9) hours in any one day shall be paid for at the rate of time and one-third. Such overtime rates shall stand alone and be paid for separate and apart from the week's wages.
- (b) All work done on Christmas Day, Good Friday, and Sunday shall be paid for at the rate of three shillings and sixpence (3/6) per hour or portion of an hour, in addition to the weekly wage. All work done on Anzac Day and Labour Day shall be paid for at the rate of time and one-third: Provided that Anzac Day remains as at present, virtually a Sunday in the trade. Should the present conditions under which it is honoured be altered, then the provision for payment of time and one-third for that day be discharged automatically from this Agreement.

Any overtime worked on Labour Day and Sunday shall stand alone and be paid for separately and apart from the ordinary week's wages.

6.—Spread of Shifts.

Spread of shifts shall not exceed thirteen (13) hours per day, to be worked in not more than three (3) periods.

7.—Mealtime.

A barmaid or barman shall be allowed at least one (1) hour between the hours of twelve (12) noon and two (2) o'clock in the afternoon for dinner, and on every evening, when required to work after half-past six (6.30), at least half an hour between the hours of five (5) p.m. and seven (7) p.m. for tea, for barmaids and barmen living in and at least one (1) hour where they live off.

8.—Holidays and Annual Leave.

(a) A barmaid or barman shall be entitled to two (2) weeks' leave on full pay, after the expiration of each twelve (12) months of service. Such leave may be applied for at any time after it becomes due, and in no case shall the money be paid instead of the holiday.

Any worker who shall have served one (1) month or over and whose contract of service shall have been terminated by either party for any cause other than misconduct before the annual holiday became due, shall be entitled to receive a proportionate allowance of holiday pay for the time actually served.

A worker dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his or her contract of service shall lose all rights under this clause.

Holiday pay shall not accrue during a worker's absence from his or her employment for any cause whatsoever.

(b) The weekly half-holiday shall commence not later than one-thirty (1.30) o'clock on some one week day in each week. Should it be agreed that a barmaid or barman shall work on their half-day off, they shall be paid a day's pay extra for same.

9.—Residence.

Except as hereinbefore provided no barmaid or barman shall board and/or reside upon the premises of the employer by whom she or he is employed.

The above shall not apply to:-

- (a) Any harmaid or barman who is the daughter or son of the licensee of the hotel in which she or he is working;
- (b) Any hotel for which the Board of Reference or the union grants a permit for an employee or employees to lodge and/or board, on the premises of the employer.

10.—Board of Reference.

The Board of Reference shall consist of the secretary of the Licensed Victuallers' Association, Geraldton, the secretary of the W.A. Barmaids and Barmen's Union, with the Industrial Registrar or Clerk of the Arbitration Court as chairman.

11.—Uniforms.

Where the employer insists upon a barmaid or barman wearing a uniform whilst at work, the employer shall provide and maintain same in a reasonable state of cleanliness.

12.-Race, Show, Sports, and Casual Hands.

A barmaid or barman employed in booths on race-courses or at show grounds, or as an extra hand at hotels, shall be paid at the rate of twenty-five shillings (25/-) per shift of not more than eight (8) hours. Where a licensed house is situated near an evening place of anusement, a casual barmaid or barman may be employed at the rate of five shillings and threepence (5/3) per hour, with a minimum payment of ten shillings and sixpence (10/6).

All work done in excess of eight (8) hours in any one day shall be paid for at the rate of time and one-third.

The rates prescribed herein shall vary with the rise or fall in the basic wage to the extent of one forty-fourth (1/44th) of such rise or fall for each hour.

13.—Termination of Employment.

Twenty-four (24) hours' notice of termination of employment shall be given by either side.

14.—Record Book.

(a) Each employer shall keep or cause to be kept at his business premises Record Books, in which shall be entered the name of each worker, the time each worker commences and ceases work each day, the total number of hours, and the amount of overtime worked, the time worked on Christness Day, Good Friday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, and on any Sunday, and the amount of wages and overtime paid and the worker's signature for the same.

- (b) The worker and the employer shall be jointly responsible for the proper posting of the Record Books daily.
- (c) Such Record Books shall be so kept as to be open to and available for inspection by an accredited representative of the union during business hours.

15 -Roster

- (a) A roster of the working hours of all barmaids and barmen shall be kept in the principal bar.
- (b) For the purpose of calculating payment and rostering, the time of ceasing work shall be and mean the time when the barmaid or barman has completed all work behind the bar, whether such essation is later than the statutory closing time or not.

16.—Posting of Agreement.

Each employer shall keep on some portion of his business premises a copy of this Schedule of Wages and working conditions, where it shall be open to the inspection of the worker at all reasonable times.

17.--Absence through Sickness.

A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance, on the ground of personal ill-health, for one-half (½) day for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to six (6) days in each calendar year. Payment hercunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment, or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause, unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to the absence in fact. titled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

18.—Term.

This Agreement shall operate for a period of three (3) months as from the thirteenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and forty-two.
