FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Order has been issued in accordance with section 7, subsection (1) of the Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1934, which reads as follows:—

A Stay Order shall direct that no action, execution, distress for rent, proceedings on default for breach of covenant under any mortgage or other security for money, or under an agreement for sale and purchase of lands, or other process or proceeding, shall be commenced or proceeded with, or put in force against the farmer or any of the farmer's assets, whether utilised in connection with or forming portion of the assets comprised in his farming business or not, during the operation of such Stay Order: Provided that, by leave of a Judge, any action may, notwithstanding the Stay Order, be instituted and/or carried on against the farmer but not beyond judgment.

LAND OPEN FOR SELECTION.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that the areas scheduled hereunder are available for selection under Part V. of the Land Act, 1933-1939, and the regulations appertaining thereto, subject to the provisions of the said Act.

Applications must be lodged at the Land Agency Office as specified hereunder not later than the date specified, but may be lodged before such date, if so desired.

All applications lodged on or before such date will be treated as having been received on the closing day, and if there are more applicants than one for any block, the application to be granted will be determined by the Land Board. Should any lands remain unselected such will continue available until applied for or otherwise dealt with.

If a Land Board sitting becomes necessary, the applicants for the blocks will be duly notified of the date, time, and place of the meeting of the Board, and there shall be an interval of at least three days between the closing date and the sitting of the Board.

If an applicant wishes to appear before the Land Board in person he may apply to the Head Office or to the Clerk in Charge of any of the District or Branch Land Offices for a certificate to the Railway Department which, on presentation at the nearest Railway Station will entitle him to a Return Ticket, at Concession Rates, to the place where the Board will sit, available for seven days from the date of issue.

The selector of a Homestead Farm from any location must take the balance thereof, if any, under Conditional Purchase.

THE ROAD DISTRICTS ACT, 1919-1941.

Swan Road Board By-laws.

WHEREAS, under the provisions of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1941, the Board of any road district is empowered to make by-laws for any of the purposes mentioned in the said Act, the Swan Road Board doth, in the exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every power enabling it in this behalf, hereby make the following by-law:—

1. In these by-laws, subject to the context, "Board" means the Swan Road Board.

"Cattle" means and includes horse, mare, gelding, colt, filly, ass, mule, bull, ox, steer, cow, heifer, calf, foal, sheep, pig, and goat.

"Owner" means the owner or the person entitled to or having the possession of the cattle or animal and reputed to be the owner thereof.

The following words shall have the meanings prescribed by section 5 of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1941:—"Public place," "Reserve," and "road."

2. Subject as hereinafter provided, no cattle shall be permitted to enter or be in or upon any road, public place, land, reserve, drain, building, structure, work, or thing vested in, belonging to, or under the control of the Board.

3. The owner of any cattle so entering or being in or upon any such road, public place, land, reserve, drain, building, structure, work, or thing shall be liable upon conviction to the penalty hereinafter prescribed.

4. If any such cattle, whilst entering or being in or upon any such road, public place, land, reserve, drain, building, structure, work or thing shall be in the charge or under the control of any person other than the owner, such person shall be liable to the penalty hereinafter prescribed.

5. Nothing in the foregoing by-laws contained shall be deemed to affect or render liable to conviction the owner or any person in charge or having the control of any cattle which shall be *bona fide* driven or led by

any person along or upon any road vested in or under the control of the Board, and not feeding, depasturing, grazing, roaming, loitering, or doing damage thereon.

6. No animal shall be:—(a) permitted to stray upon any road; or (b) driven or ridden on any road whilst suffering from any infectious or contagious disease.

7. The owner of any animal so straying, driven, or ridden, and any person driving or riding any such animal, shall, upon conviction, be liable to the penalty herein-after prescribed.

8. The penalty to be imposed upon a defendant convicted of an offence against any of the foregoing by-laws shall be:—(a) for a first offence, a sum not exceeding £10; (b) for a second or subsequent offence, a sum not being less than £10 or more than £20.

THE ROAD DISTRICTS ACT, 1919-1942.

Nungarin Road Board.

By-laws for the Hire, Use, and Control of the Nungarin Hall.

IN pursuance of the powers vested in it by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1942, the Nungarin Road Board hereby makes the following by-laws for the hire, use, and control of the Nungarin Hall.

By-laws numbered 107 to 114 entitled "Road Board Halls" are hereby rescinded.

Interpretation Clauses:—In the construction of these by-laws "Hirer" shall mean the person making the application or arrangements for the hire of the hall, room, furniture, or crockery or to whom the use of same is granted; "Board" shall mean the Nungarin Road Board; "Building" shall include the hall, rooms, corridor, or any part of the Nungarin Hall.

1. The rent of the hall or any part thereof, or furniture, or crockery, shall be such as may be prescribed from time to time.

2. Applications for the hire of the building, furniture, or crockery shall be made in writing to the secretary of the Board not less than twenty-four hours before the time such building, furniture, or crockery is required.

The name and place of abode of the actual responsible person or persons hiring the building, furniture, or crockery shall be given in such application.

3. The rent of the building, furniture, or crockery shall be paid at the time of the application for the hire of such building, furniture, or crockery is made.

4. The hirer shall be responsible for any damage to the building, fittings, furniture, or crockery while in his use or charge, and shall pay to the Board the amount of such damage as assessed by the Board.

5. The Board may at any time demand that the hirer shall, prior to the term of his engagement, deposit an amount estimated to cover any damage that might occur during the term of such engagement.

6. The hirer shall, when the use of the hall crockery is allowed, as soon as possible after the term of engagement, deliver all such crockery in a clean and sound condition, and any article not accounted for or in a cracked condition must be paid for at current rates.

7. The Board reserves the right to refuse to let the building, furniture, or crockery to any applicant for the hiring of same, without assigning any reason for such refusal.

8. The Board may at any time cancel any arrangement made for the hiring of the building, furniture, or crockery.

9. In the event of two or more applications being made for the hire of the building, furniture, or crockery for the same date and hour, the Board may, without considering the priority of application, determine to which applicant the hall shall be granted.

10. The hirer of the building shall comply with the provisions of the Health Act, Entertainments Act, and any other Act in force for the time being applicable to such hiring and use of buildings.

If in the opinion of the Board all the necessary actions have not been taken to comply with the provisions of the Acts abovementioned, the Board may at any time prior to or during the term of the engagement, forbid and prevent the use of the building.

In the event of the use of the building being forbidden or prevented under this by-law, the hirer shall forfeit the full amount payable for the hire of the building as if the hire had been duly fulfilled, and the Board shall not be responsible to the hirer for any loss or damage incurred by the hirer.

11. No spirituous liquors, wine, ale, or other intoxicating drink shall be brought into or consumed in the building during the term of engagement, except when permitted by the Board in writing.

12. No person shall smoke tobacco, cigars, cigarettes, or objectional substance, or strike or otherwise ignite any light in the building during any dance, ball, or public entertainment, or at any gathering of persons in the building, whether such persons have been admitted by payment of money or otherwise, except at a banquet or smoke social where those present comprise men only.

13. Dogs, whether under control or otherwise, will not be allowed to enter the building.

14. No person shall in any part of the building enter or be—

- (a) allowed to enter in any part of the building while intoxicated;
- (b) guilty of any misbehaviour whatever.

15. No person shall—

- (a) damage, mark, or deface any wall or other part of the building;
- (b) use profane or improper language in the building or within hearing of persons using same;
- (c) stand, loiter, or cause any obstruction whatsoever in the passage ways of the building.

16. No offensive impersonations or representations of living persons or anything calculated to produce a riot, disturbance, or breach of the peace shall be permitted in the building.

17. The hirer of the building shall be responsible for—

- (a) maintaining good order and enforcing these by-laws;
- (b) any damage done to the building, fittings, fixtures, furniture, crockery-ware, or other property of the Board.

18. No person shall remove or replace any electrical fitting without the permission of the Board.

19. The secretary or other duly authorised officer of the Board, or a Police Constable, shall be permitted to have ingress to the building or any part thereof during the term of the engagement, and every facility shall be given them for the enforcing of these by-laws.

20. Hirers may decorate the hall, using only fixtures specially provided for that purpose, and no person shall drive a nail into any part of the walls, windows, doors, floor, etc., or otherwise deface the building.

Decorations may be done in daylight free of charge, when the hall is not otherwise engaged, and at such times as the Board may permit. If the decorations are done at night, such charges may be made as the Board determines.

All decorations must be removed from the premises within twenty-four hours from the commencement of the hiring period.

21. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these by-laws, or commits or permits any breach thereof, shall be deemed to be guilty of an offence against these by-laws, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for each offence.
