WHEREAS by section 9 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1940, it is provided that the Governor may by Procamation prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever, in every or any specified portion of Western Australian waters, by means of fishing nets and fishing lines, or either of such means of capture, or by fishing lines, or either of such means of capture, or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenaut-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, prohibit the taking, by means of fishing nets, of any fish whatsoever in the Western Australian waters of Sharks Lake, situated about eight (8) miles from the Town of Esperance in the Esperance (8) miles from the Town of Esperance, in the Esperance Land District, for a period of two (2) years from the 1st day of April, 1943, inclusive.
