AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 11th day of May, 1943, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

The Land Act, 1933-1939. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corr. No. 8401/06. WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1939, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, road board, or other person or persons, to be named in the order, in trust for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 10489, at Meckering, should vest in and be held by the Meckering Road Board in trust for the purpose of Recreation Purposes: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the before-mentioned reserve shall vest in and be held by the Meckering Road Board in trust for the purpose aforesaid, subject never-theless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

The Vesting Order dated 1st December, 1926, regarding the above reserve is hereby superseded.

ORDER UNDER REGULATION 32 OF THE NATIONAL SECURITY (GENERAL) REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by regulation 32 of the National Security (General) Regulations it is provided that the Minister or any person authorised by the Minister to act under the said regulation may, if it appears to him to be necessary or expedient so to do in the interests of the Defence of the Commonwealth or the efficient prosecution of the war, or for maintaining supplies and services essential to the life of the community, make, with respect to any area, an Order as provided in subparagraphs (a), (b), (c), (d), (e), (f), and (g) of subregulation (1) of the said regulation: And whereas by authority dated the 7th day of May, 1942, the Minister duly authorised every officer who shall be holding the office or performing the duties of the office of Commander of a Lines of Communication Area to act under the said regulations: And whereas, it appears to me, Brigadier Oswald Vick Hoad, Officer Commanding Western Australia Lines of Communication Area, necessary and expedient, in the interests of the Defence of the Commonwealth and the efficient prosecution of the war, and for maintaining supplies and services essential to the life of the community, that special precautions should be taken for the security of the areas referred to in the Schedule hereto, being areas situated within the said Western Australia Lines of Communication Area, and for the regulation of the departure of persons from those areas and the entry of persons into those areas, and otherwise providing for the control, collection, removal, preparation for destruction and actual destruction of any animals or things in such areas: Now, therefore I, Brigadier Oswald Vick Hoad, the officer for the time being holding the position of Commander to authority and all other powers me thereunto enabling, do hereby order as follows:—

- 1. No person shall, without the written permission of the authorised officer:-
 - (a) depart or attempt to depart from any of the said areas;
 - (b) be in any of such areas if such person was not at the time of the commencement of this Order in such area;
 - (c) bring into any of the said areas any animal or thing or any animal or thing of the class or classes which have already been ordered by the authorised officer to be removed out of the said area or areas.
- 2. Any person or class of person within the said area when so directed by the authorised officer shall— $\,$
 - (a) within the time or times and by the route or routes specified in the direction depart from such area and go to such place or places as shall be specified in such direction;
 - (b) forthwith comply with any direction from time to time given by the authorised officer providing for the control, collection, removal, or preparation for destruction of any animals or things in his custody or control which would in the opinion of the authorised officer be useful to the enemy;
 - (c) within the time or times and by the route or routes specified in the direction remove out of the said area or areas any animal or thing or class of animals or things in his custody or control to such place or places as the authorised officer shall direct, or if such direction cannot reasonably be complied with, shall forthwith destroy or render useless such animal or thing or class of animals or things.
- 3. Every person in any of the said areas having custody or control of any animal or thing shall forthwith, when so directed and in manner directed by the authorised officer, destroy such animal of thing.
- 4. In this Order "authorised officer" means the person for the time being representing the officer commanding Western Australia Lines of Communication Area in the areas specified in the said Schedule.
- 5. The word "thing" includes any buildings, constructions, installations, works, aerodromes, road, railway, mine, reservoir and substance.

The areas referred to in this Order are as follows:—The Road Districts of—Gascoyne, Minilya, Shark Bay.
