INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT No. 3 of 1943.

Berthing Master's Assistant, Fremantle Harbour Trust.
 (Reg. 6th May, 1943.)

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925, of Western Australia, this first day of January, 1943, between the Commissioners of the Fremantle Harbour Trust, of the one part, and the Merchant Service Guild of Australia, Western Australian Section, Union of Workers, Fremantle, of the other part, witnesseth as follows:—

1.—Area and Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to the berthing master's assistant in the employ of the Fremantle Harbour Trust, and shall operate over that area within the boundaries of the Port of Fremantle vested in the Commissioners of the Fremantle Harbour Trust.

2.—Definitions.

"Employers" means the Fremantle Harbour Trust and includes the Commissioners constituted under the Act and in office for the time being.

"Employee" means any person employed under the provisions of this Agreement.

3.—Hours of Duty.

The employee shall be available for duty at any hour of the day or night on each and every day in each week, as required by the exigencies of the service, or as de-

manded by the employers or their representatives: Provided that in each fortnightly period the employee shall be allowed special leave, with pay for two complete days of 24 hours, which may be consecutive, excepting during such period as the employee shall be on sick, annual, or long service leave.

4.—Meal Hours.

The hours stated hereunder shall be observed as the regular meal times, but should the requirements of the service interfere with these hours, work shall be performed or continued until completed, when a clear hour for each meal shall be allowed:—Breakfast—7 a.m. to 8 a.m.; dinner—noon to 1 p.m.; tea—5 p.m. to 6 p.m.

5.—Rate of Pay.

Basic wage—£4 17s. 9d. per week; margin over basic wage—£4 11s. 1d. per week.

6.—Annual Leave.

At the completion of twelve months' continuous service, the employee shall be granted leave of absence on full pay for a period of thirty days. Such leave shall at all times be taken at the convenience of the employers.

7.—Long Service Leave.

After each seven years' continuous service the employee shall be granted three months long service leave

on full pay, but periods of absence on long service leave shall not count as service qualifying towards the next grant of such leave.

8.—Contract of Service.

The employee shall be deemed to be engaged on a monthly basis, and one month's notice shall be given on either side to terminate such engagement: Provided that the employee may be instantly suspended or dismissed, without notice, for insobriety, misconduct, or neglect of duty.

9.—Uniforms.

The employers shall provide the employee with uniforms free of cost after each eight months' continuous service, an oilskin coat and sou'-wester each year, and a greatcoat every four years. Uniforms shall belong to the employers and shall be worn by the employee when on duty. Should the service of any employee terminate within one month from the date of issue of uniforms or any portion of them, all the issue last made to the employee shall be returned to the employers before the employee shall be entitled to be paid any moneys which may be due to him.

10.—Sick Leave.

(a) When the employee is incapacitated through sickness or injury other than that arising out of or in the course of his employment, he may be granted sick leave with pay for a period of or periods not exceeding in the aggregate one month in any year, upon production within 48 hours of the commencement of any such period of absence of a medical certificate as to his incapacity.

(b) Where such incapacity arises through the wilful act or misconduct of the employee, or where a medical certificate is not furnished as required, or where the employee has already had sick leave with pay for a period of or periods aggregating one month during the preceding twelve months, the employee shall not be entitled to any pay for the period he is absent from duty.

(c) Upon the period of absence in any instance exceeding one month, or, in the case of paragraph (b) hereof, immediately the employee absents himself the contract of service shall be deemed to have been terminated without requiring further notice by the employers, who shall thereby be relieved of any further obligation to the employee: Provided that any such period of incapacity may, at the discretion of the employers, be regarded as leave without pay.

11.—Sickness or Accident when on Duty.

(a) Where the employee in the course of his employment and while on duty or acting under the instructions of the employers receives an injury or contracts any sickness which incapacitates him from duty, he shall be entitled to receive, in addition to the benefits prescribed under the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1924, the difference between the compensation provided for under that Act and the wages prescribed in this Agreement, for a period not exceeding three months.

(b) All amounts payable under this clause shall be paid in the manner provided for the payment of wages.

12.—Term.

This Agreement shall operate for a period of twelve months, and shall take effect as from and including the 1st January, 1943.

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT No. 4 of 1943.

(Reg. 6/5/43.)

Lotteries Commission Clerical Staff.
Industrial Agreement.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, this 1st day of March, 1943, between the Federated Clerks' Union of Australia, Industrial Union of Workers, W.A. Branch (hereinafter called the "Union"), of the one part, and the Lotteries Commission of Western Australia (hereinafter referred to as the "Commission"), of the other part, whereby the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree as follows:—

1.—Area and Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to the clerical staff of the Lotteries Commission occupying the positions enumerated in the Salaries Schedule employed, within radius of fifteen (15) miles of the G.P.O., Perth.

2.—Hours.

Thirty-eight hours shall constitute a week's work, to be worked between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays, inclusive, and from 9 a.m. and 12 noon on Saturdays.

3.—Overtime.

(a) All time worked outside the ordinary hours shall be deemed overtime and shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half. All time worked on Sundays and holidays as prescribed herein shall be paid for at double time.

(b) Only overtime duly authorised by the secretary to the Commission prior to its being worked will be paid for.

4.—Meal Allowance.

When a clerk is required to work after 6 p.m. any night, Mondays to Fridays, inclusive, and after 1 p.m. on Saturdays, he or she shall be paid 2s. for each meal in addition to the overtime referred to above.

5.—Holidays.

The following days shall be observed as holidays and be paid for namely:—New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Anzac Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Foundation Day, Labour Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and Show Day (after 12 noon).

6.—Annual Leave.

(a) Employees shall be entitled to two weeks leave on completion of twelve months' continuous service.

(b) Should an employee's services be terminated after one month's continuous service and before the completion of twelve months he shall be granted holiday pay in proportion to the length of service rendered.

7.—Long Service Leave.

Long Service Leave shall be granted in accordance with the conditions applying to Government full-time wages employees current at the time such leave is granted under this Agreement: Provided, however, that should the Commission cease to exist before the accruing rights in regard to long service leave come to fruition, then the Commission shall be under no liability at all in the matter of long service leave.

8.—Sick Leave.

On production of adequate medical certificate or other evidence accepted as satisfactory by the Commission, sick leave with pay, as under, shall be granted—

(a) to employees with over six months' continuous service and up to eighteen months—a total of two weeks on full pay;

(b) to employees with over eighteen months' continuous service but under three years—two weeks on full pay and two weeks on half pay;

(c) to employees with three years' continuous service and for each subsequent triennial period after the expiration of the first three years—one month on full pay.

9.—Contract of Service.

Engagement shall be terminable by one month's notice on either side, such notice to expire on the usual pay day, excepting that an employee deemed guilty

of gross misconduct or neglect of duty may be instantly dismissed and shall not be entitled to any notice or payment in lieu:

Provided also that during the first month's service the engagement shall be on a weekly basis.

10.—Reference.

On leaving the employ of the Commission, all clerks shall be given a reference setting out length of service and duties performed.

11.—Preference.

Preference of employment shall be given to members of the Federated Clerks' Union of Australia, W.A. Branch: Provided that any person in the employ of the Commission who is not already a member shall become a member within fourteen days.

12.—Board of Reference.

It is agreed that a Board of Reference be appointed. Such Board shall consist of a chairman and one representative nominated by the Commission and one representative nominated by the union.

The chairman shall be the Industrial Registrar or some other person nominated by the Court of Arbitration.

There are assigned to such Board, in the event of disputes arising and no agreement being arrived at between the parties to this Agreement, the functions of—

(a) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise out of this Agreement between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of any of the provisions of the Agreement;

(b) deciding any other matter that the Commission may refer to the Board.

The decisions of the Board shall be recorded in writing, and such decisions shall be conclusive. A signed copy of the decisions shall be forwarded to each of the parties.

The decision of the Board shall be the decision of the majority.

13.—Under-rate Workers.

Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum rate of wage herein prescribed may be employed at a lesser rate of wage, to be agreed upon in writing between the worker and the secretary of the union, or, in default of such agreement, within twenty-four hours after such worker shall have applied in writing to such secretary stating his desire that such wage be agreed upon, such wage shall be fixed by the most convenient Industrial Magistrate, upon application of such worker, after twenty-four hours' notice in writing shall have been given by him to the said secretary, who shall, if he so desires, be heard by the magistrate upon such application.

After having made application to the secretary, and after lodging the application to the Magistrate, and pending the decision therein in either case, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed by the employer at the proposed reduced wage.

The determination of the Magistrate shall have effect for six calendar months from the date thereof and after the expiration of the said period until the wage shall be again fixed in the manner prescribed at the instance of the said secretary.

The secretary may by writing under his hand appoint an agent or substitute to represent the union at the hearing of any such application before the Magistrate.

14.—Time and Wages Record.

A record shall be kept showing the name of each worker under the Agreement, the nature of the work performed, the hours worked each day, and the amount of wages received each pay. The said record shall be open to the inspection of an accredited representative of the union during working hours.

15.—Salaries.

Basic wage—Males £4 17s. 9d.; females £2 12s. 9d.

(a) The classifications and salaries payable shall be in accordance with the Schedule A annexed hereto.

(b) When an officer is not receiving the prescribed maximum, such maximum shall be reached by annual increments in accordance with the grades indicated within the salary ranges.

(c) Advancement within the prescribed ranges, however, shall in all cases be subject to the approval of the Commission and to the receipt of satisfactory reports regarding the officer's conduct, diligence, and efficiency during the previous twelve months.

16.—Higher Duties.

When an employee is called upon to perform the duties of a position carrying a higher minimum value than his own position for a period exceeding one week, he shall be paid the difference between his own salary and the minimum of the higher position for the whole time he is acting in such position.

17.—No Reduction.

The wage of any employee who is paid at a higher rate than that prescribed at the date of this Agreement shall not be reduced solely by reason of this Agreement.

18.—Term.

This Agreement shall operate for three years from the date hereof: Provided that any increases in salary payable hereunder shall operate as from the seventh day of December, 1942.
