Midland Junction Municipality.

Amendment of Health By-laws.

WHEREAS Model By-laws have been prepared in accordance with the provisions of section 295 of the Health Act, 1911-1942, and published in the Government Gazette on the 8th April, 1927; 20th October, 1933; 5th October, 1934; 1st February, 1935; 12th February, 1937; 2nd July, 1937; 15th October, 1937; 29th April, 1938; 8th July, 1938; 29th September, 1939; 19th February, 1943: And whereas the Midland Junction Municipal Council, being the local health authority under the provisions of the said Act, do by resolution published in the Government Gazette on the 14th May, 1937, and on subsequent dates thereafter, adopt, either wholly or in part, Model By-laws to be its by-laws: Now, therefore, the Midland Junction Municipal Council, being the local health authority for the Midland Junction Health District, doth hereby amend such by-laws in the following manner:—

- (1) By amending the adoption of Model By-laws as appearing in the *Government Gazette* of 14th May, 1937, by deleting the date "8th April, 1926," appearing in the seventh line of the adoption, and substituting therefor, "8th April, 1927."
- (2) Add a new by-law after by-law 7 of Part 7 of the by-laws to read as by-law 7A, as follows:—
 - 7A. The occupier of premises shall comply with all such directions as shall be given in writing by an inspector for the purpose of protecting all food for sale from contamination by flies or dust.

HOSPITALS ACT, 1927.

Yarloop Hospital Board—Amendment of By-laws. Resolution.

THE by-laws for the control of the Medical Fund of the Yarloop Hospital, as made by the Yarloop Hospital Board of Management under section 23 of the Hospitals Act, 1927, and published in the Government Gazette on the 24th day of October, 1941, are amended as follows:—

By-law (1)—The whole of this by-law to be deleted and the following by-law substituted:—

(1) The term "Subscriber" shall mean any person, male or female, who is financial and has paid his or her subscription at least two weeks prior to seeking any benefits or privileges, and shall include, so far as benefits are concerned, all dependants of the subscriber.

By-law (5)—The following proviso is to be added to this by-law:—

Provided that hospital treatment as an indoor patient shall be limited to six months' treatment in any one year for a subscriber or any one of his dependants.

By-law (7)—Additional subclause to be added:—

(n) Disease or conditions which, in the opinion of the Fund Medical Officer, existed prior to the subscriber or the dependant becoming a member of the Fund.

BUSH FIRES ACT, 1937.

BY-LAWS of the Meekatharra Road Board relating to the establishment, maintenance, and equipment of Bush Fire Brigades for the Road District of Meekatharra.

Establishment of Brigade.

1. On the resolution of the Board to establish, maintain and equip a Bush Fire Brigade under the provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1937, and regulations thereunder, the Brigade shall be formed in accordance with these by-laws; and a name shall be given to the Brigade and application accompanied by a copy of these by-laws shall be made to the Minister for Lands for its registrative recordingly. tration accordingly.

A Bush Fire Brigade may be established for the whole of the road district or for any specified area thereof. Provided that, unless the resolution of the Board establishing a Bush Fire Brigade specifies therein only a part of the district as the area for which such Brigade is established, the Brigade shall be deemed to be established for the whole of the said road district.

Appointment of Officers.

- 2. The Board shall appoint a captain, a first lieutenant, a second lieutenant and such additional lieutenants as it shall deem necessary to act as officers of the Brigade, and who, in the Board's opinion, have the necessary qualifications and knowledge of the district required in such capacities.
- 3. The secretary of the Board or such other person as the Board may appoint, shall be the secretary of the Brigade.
- 4. The Board may appoint an Equipment Officer, who shall be responsible for the custody and maintenance in good order and condition of all equipment and appliances acquired by the Board for the purposes of the Brigade. Such officer may station such equipment at a depot approved by the captain where, if possible, motor trucks can easily be called upon. If there are more than one such depots in the area, the Equipment Officer shall appoint at such depot a person to look after the equipment and have it ready for immediate use when required.
- 5. The Board shall appoint Bush Fire Control Officers in accordance with the requirements of the district and may prescribe the area over which each such officer shall have jurisdiction. The employment, dismissal and payment for services of persons (other than officers) employed for duties under this Act, shall be vested in the chairman and secretary of the Board conjointly.

Duties of Officers.

6. The duties of all officers appointed under these by-laws shall be as laid down in the provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1937, and each officer so appointed shall be supplied with a copy of the Act and regulations. The captain shall have full control over the members of the Brigade whilst engaged in fire fighting and shall issue instructions as to the methods to be adopted by the figure. In the absence of the protection adopted by the firemen. In the absence of the captain, the first lieutenant; and, in the absence of the first, the second lieutenant or senior officer of the Brigade present at the fire shall exercise all the power and duties of the captain. The captain shall when so directed by the Board instruct all land owners or occupiers to plough a break or breaks on all cleared land under pasture.

Membership of Brigade.

- 7. (1) The membership of a Bush Fire Brigade may consist of the following:—(a) Subscribing members; (b) Fire fighting members; and (c) Associate mem-
- (2) Subscribing members shall be those persons who, being interested in forwarding the objects of the Brigade, pay an annual subscription to the funds of the Brigade at the following rates:
 - s. d. (i) Owner or occupier of land within the Brigade Area-minimum subscription Ωf 10 0
 - (ii) Other persons—a minimum subscription of . .
- (3) Fire fighting members shall be those persons, over 18 years of age who are willing to render service at any bush fire when called upon, and who sign an undertaking in the form contained in the First Schedule to these by-laws.
- (4) Associate members shall be those persons who are willing to supply free motor transport for fire fighters or equipment, or are prepared to render other approved assistance, and who sign an undertaking in the form contained in the Second Schedule to these
- (5) No fees or subscriptions shall be payable either by fire fighting members or associate members, and the enrolment of persons as such members shall in every case be subject to the approval of the Board.
- (6) A subscribing member shall be eligible for enrolment as a fire fighting member.

Finance.

8. The expenditure incurred by the Board in the purchase of equipment, etc., payment for services and generally for the purposes of this Act, shall be a charge on the ordinary revenue of the Board, but the secretary shall keep a separate record of the expenditure incurred under this Act. Meetings of Brigade.

9. The Bush Fire Brigade shall neet on the third Saturday of each and every month or at such more frequent times as shall be deemed necessary by its officers.

These by-laws, under the Bush Fires Act, 1937, were passed by a resolution of the Meekatharra Road Board (a local authority under the provisions of such Act) at a meeting held at Meekatharra on the 23rd January, 1943.

(Meat Industry Award No. 10 of 1939.)

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

Whereas the Court, pursuant to section 63 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, declared a memorandum No. 10 of 1939, filed in the Office of the Clerk of the Court on the 1st day of August, 1941, to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court: And whereas such memorandum (hereinafter referred to as "the Award") provided, inter alia, that a Board, to be called the "Advisory Committee," may be appointed by the Court to advise in regard to any

apprenticeship matter: And whereas the said Award further provided that such Committee should consist of the following-

(a) some person appointed by the Court who shall act as chairman;
(b) two representatives appointed by the employers;

(c) two representatives appointed by the industrial union or unions of workers in the trade:

And whereas the Award further provided that the Advisory Committee shall have such powers and duties as visory Committee shall have such powers and duties as the Court in each case may determine: And whereas on the 26th day of February, 1943, the Court, in pursuance of the said Award, appointed as such Advisory Committee as aforesaid the following—Reginald Arthur Wood, Esq. (chairman); O. P. Dedman, Esq., and C. King, Esq. (employers' representatives); J. Sampey, Esq., and C. F. Baker, Esq. (workers' representatives): And whereas the parties have requested the Court to define the powers and duties of the said Committee: Now, therefore, the Court of Arbitration, acting in pursuance of the said Award and all other powers and authorities vested in it by the Industrial Arbitration Act. 1912-1941, hereby orders and declares as follows:— Act, 1912-1941, hereby orders and declares as follows:— That the said Committee shall have the following powers and duties without limiting the powers and duties that at any time hereafter may be conferred :-

- 1. To deal with all matters affecting apprentices assigned to the determination of the Committee by the Court, and in particular to perform and discharge all powers and duties in the regulations attached to the Award and therein to be performed and discharged by the Court, except such powers and duties as are specially assigned to the Court by the Act.
- 2. The Committee shall be invested with the following powers and functions in addition and without prejudice to those mentioned in (1):—
 - (a) to endeavour to promote apprenticeships under the Award;
 - (b) to draw up syllabi of training and to arrange for the periodical examination of apprentices;
 - (c) to permit in any special circumstances the taking or employment of an apprentice by an employer, notwithstanding that the quota fixed by the Award in any particular case may be exceeded;

(d) to enter any factory, workshop, or place where an apprentice is employed or appoint any other person for that purpose and inspect the conditions under which any apprentice is

employed;

- (e) to require any employer to furnish the Committee with any specified information relating to any trade or industry subject to the Award, or any of the workers engaged therein, with a view to determining whether there is a sufficient number of apprentices being trained to meet future requirements and in the interests of the community;
- (f) to consider and implement schemes for the institution of scholarships and/or prizes;
 (g) to advise the Court as to all matters apper-
- taining to apprentices.
- A majority of the members of the Committee, one thom must be the chairman, shall constitute a whom quorum.
