PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, } By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell,

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 3 of the Public Authorities (Postponement of Elections) Act, 1942, that during a time of war the Governor, on the recommendation of the Minister and after due notice given as required by paragraph (c) of subsection (1) of the said section, may at any time and from time to time by proclamation direct that any election required by its or their governing Act or Acts to be held by any public authority or any class or classes of public authority shall be postponed for such period, not exceeding twelve calendar months as shall be specified in the proclamation; and whereas The Western Australian Onion Marketing Board as constituted under the Marketing of Onions Act, 1938, was by an Order in Council made by the Governor and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 11th day of December, 1942, declared to be a public authority under and within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Public Authorities (Postponement of Elections) Act, 1942; and whereas in accordance with paragraph (c) of subsection (1) of section 3 of the said last mentioned Act the Minister duly gave notice of his intention to recommend to me the said Lieutenant-Governor that I, by proclamation issued under the said section 3 of the said Act, shall postpone until the 30th day of September, 1943, the triennial election of the said The Western Australian Onion Marketing Board which ordinarily would have been held on the 22nd day of November, 1942, and which by inadvertence was not held on the said last mentioned date and has not yet been held; and no objection to such postponement has been made or received; now therefore I, the said

Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and on the recommendation of the Minister and in exercise of the Powers in that behalf conferred upon me by section 3 of the Public Authorities (Postponement of Elections) Act, 1942, do hereby direct that the triennial election of The Western Australian Onion Marketing Board which ordinarily would have been held on the 22nd day of November, 1942, but which has not yet been held shall be postponed until the 30th day of September, 1943.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 5 of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1942, that for the purposes of the said Act the word "town" or "townsite" means and includes, *inter alia*, any land (including privately owned subdivided land) which the Governor may see fit, as he is hereby empowered to declare by Proclamation to be a town or townsite for the purposes of the said Act; And whereas all that land situate within the Moora Road District, and more particularly described, defined and delineated in the Schedule hereto, is land

which the Governor may by virtue of section 5 of the said Act declare by Proclamation to be a town or townsite for the purposes of the said Act; now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the power conferred upon me by the said Act and of all other powers in this behalf enabling me, do hereby declare that all that land situate within the Moora Road District, and more particularly described, defined and delineated in the Schedule here-to shall be a townsite, to be known as "Moora" within the meaning and for the purpose of the Road District Act, 1919-1942.

Bounded on the northward by lines commencing at the intersection of the prolongation westward of the northern boundary of Lot 209 of Melbourne Location 908 (L.T.O. Plan 3553) with the eastern side of the Midland Railway Reserve and extending in a general easterly direction to and along northern boundaries of Lots 209, 221, 222, 165, 166 part of the western and the northern boundary of Lot 167, northern boundaries of Lots 168 and 235, a northern, a western and again a northern boundary of Lot 236 and northern and western boundaries repeatedly of Lot 237 to the northern-most corner of the last mentioned lot.

On the eastward and southward by lines commencing at the last mentioned point and extending southward along the easternmost boundary of said Lot 237 and the eastern side of Barber street to the southern side of Atbara street on the northern boundary of Lot 5 (L.T.O. Plan 3223); thence eastward along part of the northern boundary of said Lot 5 and the northern boundary of Lot 3 to the latter's north-east corner; thence southward along the eastern boundaries of said Lot 3 and Lot 4 to the latter's south-east corner; thence south-westward along the south-eastern boundaries of said Lot 4 and Lots 9, 10, 26, 27 and 98 to the southern corner of the last mentioned lot; thence north-westward along the south-western boundary of said Lot 98 to its western corner; thence south-westward to and along the south-eastern boundary of Lot 61 to its south corner; thence westward to and along the southern boundaries of Lots 62, 44 and 43 and continuing to their junction with the western side of Findlater street (L.T.O. Plans 3166 and 3140).

On the westward by lines commencing at the last mentioned point and extending northward along said side of Findlater street to the southern end of the Moora Station Yard; thence eastward along said end of station yard to the western side of Gardiner street; thence northward along said side of Gardiner street to the north-eastern corner of the station yard; thence westward along the northern end of said station yard to the western side of Tootra street; thence northward along said side of Tootra street to the starting point. (L.T.O. Plans 2909 and 2838.)

Local Authorities (Reserve Funds) Act, 1942.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 404/43.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 4 of the Local Authorities (Reserve Funds) Act, 1942, that the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Minister but subject to the requirements of the proviso to the said section, by Order in Council, authorise a local authority to establish during the present war and to maintain a reserve fund for the purpose of accumulating therein any surplus of ordinary revenue of the local authority and of applying the moneys in such reserve fund and any income or profit derived from the investment of moneys in such reserve fund in the carrying out, after the cessation of the present war, of works and undertakings authorised by the Local Government Act of the local authority which the local authority may not be able conveniently to carry out during the present war: And whereas it is desirable that such a reserve fund shall be established by the local authorities as set forth in the Schedule hereto: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting pursuant to the recommendation of the Minister and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, after being satisfied as required by the proviso to section 4 of the said Act, doth hereby authorise the local authorities as set forth in the Schedule hereto, to establish and maintain a reserve fund.

Vermin Act, 1918-1942.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 15 of the Vermin Act, 1918-1942, that for every Vermin District there shall be a board which shall consist of so many members as may from time to time be prescribed by the Governor and that such members shall be elected or appointed as in the said Act provided: And whereas by Orders in Council both published in the *Government Gazette* on the 26th day of October, 1923, the Governor constituted the Wiluna Road District a Vermin District for the purposes of the said Act to be known as the Wiluna Vermin District and also appointed and constituted a board for the said Vermin District to be known as the Wiluna Vermin Board and to consist of seven persons: And whereas by Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* on the 18th day of June, 1937, the Governor declared that as from and including the 1st day of July, 1937, the number of persons to constitute the said Wiluna Vermin Board was increased from seven to eight persons and that thereafter the said Vermin Board shall consist of eight persons: And whereas it is now deemed desirable and expedient that the number of persons which shall constitute the said Vermin Board be increased from eight to nine, and that hereafter the said Vermin Board shall consist of nine persons instead of eight persons as heretofore: And whereas it is enacted by section 27 of the said Act that when no members or an insufficient number of members have been elected to a board the Governor may at any time if he thinks fit appoint a sufficient number of persons to be members of the board in place of the members who ought to have been elected, and shall fix the date of retirement of such persons, and subject thereto the provisions of the Act relating to the retirement of members shall apply to and in respect of the members so appointed as if they had been elected as members of the board when the default or deficiency which occasioned their appointment had occurred: And whereas the number of members of the said Wiluna Vermin Board now holding office as such, and who have been elected in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, is seven members and by the operation of this Order in Council there is and will be a deficiency of two members not elected: And whereas it is deemed desirable and expedient that

such deficiency shall forthwith be made good by the immediate appointment of two additional persons as members of the said Vermin Board: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 15 and 27 of the said Act and of all other powers in this behalf enabling him, doth hereby—

- (a) As from the date of the publication hereof in the *Government Gazette* increase the number of persons to constitute the said Wiluna Vermin Board from eight to nine and declare that as from the said date the said Wiluna Vermin Board shall consist of nine persons instead of eight persons as heretofore, and
- (b) As from the date of the publication hereof in the *Government Gazette* appoint Leonard Bilston, of Barwidgee Station, and George Olsen Folvig, of Yeelirrie Station, to be members of the said Wiluna Vermin Board in addition to the seven elected members thereof now holding office, and

- (c) Declare that the said Leonard Bilston and George Olsen Folvig shall retire from office as such members aforesaid on the date of the next annual election of members of the said Wiluna Vermin Board to be held in accordance with the provisions of the said Act.

INDUSTRIES ASSISTANCE ACT, 1915-1940.

The Treasury,

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, acting pursuant to section 29 of the Industries Assistance Act, 1915-1940, has been pleased to amend the regulations made under the said Act as published in the *Government Gazette* on the 23rd day of April, 1915, the 5th day of November, 1915, and the 5th day of June, 1942, in the manner mentioned in the Schedule hereunder.

Schedule.

The above-mentioned regulations are amended by adding thereto after regulation 8 (*Gazette* 5th June, 1942), a new regulation as follows:—

9. (1) This regulation is made for the purposes of subsection (6) of section 14 of the Industries Assistance Act, 1915-1940, and shall apply only in respect of advances made out of or commodities supplied with moneys in the hands of the Commissioners of the Agricultural Bank of Western Australia which have been loaned to the State by the Commonwealth for purposes of drought relief under the Commonwealth of Australia Loan (Drought Relief) Act, 1940 (No. 71 of 1940), after the commencement of the Industries Assistance Act Amendment Act, 1940 (No. 42 of 1940).

(2) Where applications are made under this regulation the advances shall be made or the commodities shall be supplied under the provisions of the Industries Assistance Act, 1915-1940, by the Commissioners of the Agricultural Bank of Western Australia for the purposes of drought relief out of the moneys referred to in paragraph (1) of this regulation.

(3) Every application for an advance under this regulation shall be addressed to the said Commissioners, and shall be lodged with the manager of the local branch of the Agricultural Bank.

(4) The provisions of regulations 2, 4, 5, and 6 of these regulations, with such adaptations as may be necessary, shall apply and be deemed to be incorporated in and form part of this regulation.

(5) Advances approved for commodities supplied or to be supplied or for any other purpose under this regulation, including interest, shall be repayable by equal half-yearly instalments on the 30th day of June and the 31st day of December in each year over the balance of the loan period.

(6) The rate of interest payable in respect of advances made under this regulation shall be the same as that payable by the State in respect of the moneys loaned to the State by the Commonwealth as aforesaid.

(7) Interest in respect of advances made under this regulation shall be calculated as from the date when the advance is made and shall be payable on the date when the advance or any part thereof is repaid.

(8) Where in the opinion of the Commissioners it is desirable to do so, the Commissioners may at any time agree in writing with any applicant, or with any creditor of an applicant for the waiver or postponement of any charge arising under the Act, either wholly or in part, or to any basis or method of application or division of the proceeds of the realisation of any property the subject of any such charge.
