WHEREAS by section 45 of the Health Act, 1911-1942, it is provided that a local authority, in the exercise of its powers conferred by Part III. of the said Act may make and levy rates of different amounts in respect of portions of its districts defined for that purpose by

proclamation: Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor in and over the State of Western Australia, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby by this Proclamation declare that the Moora Road Board being the local health authority for the Moora Health District may levy rates of different amounts in respect of portions of its district defined as follows:—All Rural Wards, Townsites of Miling, Coomberdale, Bindi Bindi, Gabalong and Watheroo.

## FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Order has been issued in accordance with section 7, subsection (1) of the Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1934, which reads as follows:—

A Stay Order shall direct that no action, execution, distress for rent, proceedings on default for breach of covenant under any mortgage or other security for money, or under an agreement for sale and purchase of lands, or other process or proceeding, shall be commenced or proceeded with, or put in force against the farmer or any of the farmer's assets, whether utilised in connection with or forming portion of the assets comprised in his farming business or not, during the operation of such Stay Order: Provided that, by leave of a Judge, any action may, notwithstanding the Stay Order, be instituted and/or carried on against the farmer but not beyond judgment.

#### COLLIE LOCAL HEALTH AUTHORITY.

The Health Act, 1911-1942—Amendment of By-laws. WHEREAS under the provisions of the Health Act, 1911-1942, a local authority may make by-laws, and may amend, repeal, or alter any by-laws so made: Now, therefore, the Municipal Council of Collie being a local health authority within the meaning of the said Act, doth hereby amend its by-laws as follows:—

##### Part VII.—Food.

The following new clause to be inserted:—

11. (a) No person shall permit to enter or remain upon any premises used for the storage, manufacture, preparation, or packing of food for sale, any dog of which he is the owner or which is for the time being under his control.—Penalty £20.
