WHEREAS it is enacted by section 25 of the Pharmacy and Poisons Act, 1910-1937, as reprinted under the Amendments Incorporation Act, 1938, that the Governor may by Proclamation declare any article to be a poison within the meaning of the said Act, and may revoke or vary any Proclamation made under the said section by a subsequent Proclamation; and whereas the Governor has under and in accordance with the said section from time to time proclaimed certain articles to be poisons as aforesaid; and whereas it is now deemed desirable and expedient to add to such poisons declared as aforesaid: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power conferred upon me in that behalf by section 25 of the said Act, do hereby declare that the article specified in the Schedule hereunder shall be deemed a poison within the meaning of the Pharmacy and Poisons Act, 1910-1937, and that the name thereof shall be inserted in Part II. of the Fifth Schedule to the said Act.

Schedule.

The description of the article declared aforesaid as a poison and to be inserted in Part II. of the Fifth Schedule to the Act is as follows:—“Paradichlorbenzene and solutions thereof when sold as a moth killer or insecticide.”

WHEREAS it is provided by section 213 of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1942, that a road board may adopt in any area defined for that purpose by Proclamation the system of valuation on the annual value; and whereas it is desired to enable the Murray Road Board to adopt the system of valuation on the annual value on that portion of the District described in the schedule hereto: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare:—(1) That the Murray Road Board may adopt the system of valuation on the annual value on that portion of the District described in the Schedule hereto, and may impose rates on the rateable land within such areas on the annual value thereof, in accordance with the relative provisions of the said Act and any Proclamation heretofore or hereafter issued thereunder and for the time being in force. (2) That part of the Schedule to the Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* on the 28th day of October, 1932, page 1629, relating to the North Dandalup Prescribed Area in the Murray Road District is hereby repealed, and to sign the Proclamation.

Schedule.

Murray Road District—Description of Special Area.

All those portions of Cockburn Sound Location 16 bounded by lines commencing on the eastern side of the South-Western Railway Reserve at the north corner of Lot 41 of said location (L.T.O. Plan 737A) and extending south-eastward along the north-eastern boundary of said lot and the north-eastern boundaries of Lots 105 to 100 (L.T.O. Plan 1964) to the western side of the Perth-Bunbury Main Road at the eastern corner of the last mentioned lot; thence south-westward along said side of said road to the southern corner of Lot 58; thence north-westward along the south-western boundaries of Lots 58 and 57 and 7 to 1 (inclusive) to

the eastern side of said Railway Reserve; thence north-eastward and northward along said side of said Railway Reserve to the starting point.

WHEREAS under the provisions of section 4 of the Mining Tenements (War Time Exemption) Act, 1942, it is enacted that during a time of war the Governor may by Proclamation, waive or postpone the payment of rent on any mining tenement which is prescribed and payable under the Mining Act, 1904-1937, and exempt the holder of any mining tenement from his obligation under the Mining Act, 1904-1937, to observe, comply with, or perform any conditions relating to such mining tenement; and whereas a time of war now exists, to wit the War in which His Majesty is now engaged with Germany, Italy, and Japan (hereinafter referred to as "the present War"), and it is desirable to give effect to the said section 4 in relation to certain mining tenements during the present War: Now, therefore I, Sir James Mitchell, Lieutenant-Governor as aforesaid, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do by this Proclamation direct in relation to the mining tenements set out in the Schedule hereunder and for the period stated in the said Schedule that the payment of rent shall be waived and the holders of the mining tenements mentioned on the said Schedule shall be exempted from compliance with the labour covenants relating to such mining tenements.

Public Authorities (Postponement of Elections) Act, 1942.

[L.S.] } wealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 3 of the Public Authorities (Postponement of Elections) Act, 1942, that during a time of war the Governor, on the recommendation of the Minister and after due notice given as required by paragraph (c) of subsection (1) of the said section, may at any time and from time to time by Proclamation direct that any election required by its or their governing Act or Acts to be held by any public authority or any class or classes of public authority shall be postponed for such period, not exceeding 12 calendar months as shall be specified in the Proclamation; and whereas Potato Growers' Advisory Committee as constituted under the Potato Growers' Licensing Act, 1941, was by an Order in Council made by the Governor and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 25th day of June, 1943, declared to be a public authority under and within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Public Authorities (Postponement of Elections) Act, 1942; and whereas in accordance with paragraph (c) of subsection (1) of section 3 of the said last mentioned Act the Minister duly gave notice of his intention to recommend to me the said Lieutenant-Governor that I, by Proclamation issued under the said section 3 of the said Act, shall postpone until the 15th day of June, 1944, the election of the said Potato Growers' Advisory Committee which ordinarily would have been held on the 15th day of June, 1943, and which by inadvertence was not held on the said last mentioned date and has not yet been held; and no objection to such postponement has been made or received: Now therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and on the recommendation of the Minister and in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon me by section 3 of the Public Authorities (Postponement of Elections) Act, 1942, do hereby direct that the election of Potato Growers' Advisory Committee which ordinarily would have been held on the 15th day of June, 1943, but which has not yet been held shall be postponed until the 15th day of June, 1944.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth on the 23rd day of August, 1943, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:—

Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1941.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1941, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office approved by the Minister a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under this Act to all workers employed by him, but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability the Governor may by Order in Council exempt such employer from the operation of the said section; and whereas Midland Railway Company of Western Australia, Ltd., of Midland Junction, Western Australia, being an employer within the meaning of the said Act and having duly made application in accordance with the said Act and the regulations made thereunder for exemption from the operation of the said section 10 has proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against the liability aforesaid and that it has deposited at the Treasury securities, to wit, a Fixed Deposit Receipt, No. 241, for five thousand

pounds issued to the Company by the English, Scottish and Australian Bank, Limited, of Midland Junction aforesaid, charged with all payments to become due under the said liability in connection with the Railway Department of the said Company: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby exempt Midland Railway Company of Western Australia, Limited, aforesaid, from the operation of section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1941, insofar as relates to workers employed in or in connection with the Railway Department of the said Company for the period commencing on the 8th day of August, 1943, and ending on the 7th day of August, 1945.

MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF COLLIE.

The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906-1938—Amendment of By-laws.

P.W. 148/39.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Municipal Council of Collie hereby orders as follows:—Having adopted the 11th Schedule to the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906-1938, as its by-laws (*Government Gazette*, 24th March, 1932), a new by-law, Numbered 49, for prescribing and regulating the manner and mode of keeping dogs and of keeping and depasturing goats, and the driving of goats through or over any streets, has been adopted to take effect on and from the publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

49. No owner or keeper of any dog or dogs shall permit the same upon any street, road, right-of-way or reserve within the municipality at any time or times unless the same are under proper control of the keeper thereof, and upon a leash attached to the collar around the dog's neck and held by the owner or keeper thereof at all times whilst such dog is permitted to be upon any such street, road, right-of-way or reserve within the municipality.

No goat shall be permitted upon any street or reserve within the municipality at any time unless it is under the control of the owner or keeper thereof by means of a leash attached to a collar around its neck and held by the owner or keeper thereof.

All straying dogs and goats found unattended and not under the proper control of the owners or keepers thereof upon the roads, streets, right-of-ways or reserves within the municipality may be collected and destroyed, in addition to which the owners or keepers thereof are liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 13 of 1942.

Between Hospital Employees Industrial Union of Workers, W.A. Coastal Branch, Applicant, and the Board of Management, Perth Dental Hospital, Respondent.

WHEREAS the Court, pursuant to section 63 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, declared a memorandum No. 13 of 1942, filed in the office of the Clerk of the Court on the 23rd day of December, 1942, to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court; and whereas such memorandum (hereinafter referred to as "the Award") provided that the Court may on the application of the parties, appoint an Apprenticeship Board for the purpose of dealing with all matters

affecting apprentices assigned to the determination of the Board by the Court, and in particular to perform and discharge all powers and duties in the Apprenticeship Regulations and therein to be performed and discharged by the Court, except such powers and duties as are specially assigned to the Court by the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941; and whereas the Award further provided that such Board should consist of the following:—(a) A Chairman to be appointed by the Court, and (b) Representatives of the employers and the workers respectively, one or two on each side as may be decided by the Court; and whereas on the 11th day of August, 1943, the Court, in pursuance of the Award, appointed as such Apprenticeship Board as aforesaid the following:—Mr. Reginald Arthur Wood (Chairman); Messrs. C. H. Terry and K. J. James (employ-

er's representatives); G. J. Watkins, and L. G. Severn (workers' representatives): Now therefore the Court of Arbitration, acting in pursuance of the Award and all other powers and authorities vested in it by the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, hereby orders and declares as follows:—That the said Board shall have the following powers and duties without limiting the powers and duties that at any time hereafter may be conferred:—

1. To deal with all matters affecting apprentices assigned to the determination of the Board by the Court, and in particular to perform and discharge all powers and duties in the Apprenticeship Regulations contained in the Schedule to the Award and therein to be performed and discharged by the Court, except such powers and duties as are specially assigned to the Court by the Act.

2. The Board shall be invested with the following powers and functions in addition and without prejudice to those mentioned in (1):—

- (a) to endeavour to promote apprenticeships under the Award;
- (b) to draw up syllabi of training and to arrange for the periodical examination of apprentices;
- (c) to permit in any special circumstances the taking or employment of an apprentice by an employer, notwithstanding that the quota fixed by the Award in any particular case may be exceeded;
- (d) to enter any factory, workshop, or place where an apprentice is employed or appoint any other person for that purpose and inspect the conditions under which any apprentice is employed;
- (e) to require any employer to furnish the Board with any specified information relating to any trade or industry subject to the Award, or any of the workers engaged therein, with a view to determining whether there is a sufficient number of apprentices being trained to meet future requirements and in the interests of the community;
- (f) to advise the Court as to all matters appertaining to apprentices.

3. A majority of the members of the Board, one of whom must be the chairman, shall constitute a quorum.

4. The decision of the Board shall be the decision of the majority of the members and shall be signed by the chairman and forwarded to the Registrar.

5. Either party, with the consent of the Court, may at any time alter its representatives.

AGREEMENT No. 10 of 1943.

(Reg. 6/8/43.)

THIS Agreement made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, this 26th day of July, one thousand nine hundred and forty-three, between the Honourable Minister for Labour, on behalf of the Government of Western Australia, of the one part, and The West Australian Cleaners, Caretakers, Lift Attendants, and Watchmen's Industrial Union of Workers (Perth) of the other part, whereby it is mutually agreed by and between the parties hereto as follows:—

The provisions of this Agreement shall not come into operation until the date on which the granting of long service leave, suspended under a decision of Cabinet, dated the 30th January, 1942, is restored.

1. All female cleaners in the employ of the Government who have then served continuously for ten or more years on the basis of 25 hours or over per week, or who at any time thereafter complete ten years' continuous service after attaining the age of eighteen years will be entitled, subject to the following regulations, to three months' long service leave, to be granted at the convenience of the Department.

2. They will be similarly entitled to a further period of three months' long service leave for ten years' continuous service, in accordance with paragraph 3 hereof; and to a further period of three months for seven years' subsequent continuous service; and thereafter to a further period of three months' long service leave in respect

of each seven years' subsequent continuous service. The words "continuous service" do not include the period during which a worker is on long service leave or any period exceeding two weeks a worker is absent without pay.

3. The qualifying period for the second grant of long service leave will, without regard to the grant of the first period of such leave, commence as follows:—

To workers of ten or more years' service at the date of the said restoration—the date of the said restoration.

To workers of less than ten years' service at the time of the said restoration—the date on which they complete ten years' continuous service.

4. Any public holidays occurring during the period in which a worker is on long service leave will be calculated as portion of the long service leave, and extra days in lieu thereof shall not be granted.

5. Long service leave is granted solely for recuperative purposes. No worker in the employ of the Government is to undertake during long service leave, without the consent of the Secretary for Labour, any form of employment for hire or reward. Contravention of this regulation will be followed by dismissal.

6. A worker dismissed from the service shall not be entitled to payment in respect of long service leave other than for leave that had accrued due to her prior to the date of the offence for which she was dismissed.

7. Workers may be paid their wages in advance, at their permanent classified rate of pay, for a period equivalent to the leave taken.

8. Any worker who is eligible for three months' long service leave and who resigns or is retired from the service shall be paid for such long service leave due.

9. A worker who retires at the age of 60 or at any time thereafter up to the age of 65, or who is retired on account of incapacity due to old age, or through ill health, or as the result of an accident, and who has served continuously for at least twelve months next before such retirement, shall be paid for long service leave *pro rata* to date of retirement.

10. If a deceased worker who had served continuously for at least twelve months next before her death leave children, mother or invalid sister who were dependent upon her, payment of any long service leave accrued due and in addition *pro rata* long service leave up to date of such worker's death shall be granted to such dependants.

11. During the period of long service leave district allowances will not be paid except when the family or dependants of the worker remain in the district.

12. A worker whose service is broken owing to the exigencies of her particular work, for a period not exceeding two weeks, shall in respect of such period be deemed on "leave without pay."

13. Whenever possible not less than one month's notice will be given each worker prior to the date on which her long service leave is to commence.

14. This Agreement shall apply to all female cleaners employed by the Government on the basis of 25 hours or over per week, and shall operate over the area comprised within the State of Western Australia.

15. The term of this Agreement is three years from the date hereof.
