THE NATIVE ADMINISTRATION ACT, 1905-1941.

Reserve 248 near Walebing-Declaration of Forbidden Settlement.

I, the undersigned, Commissioner of Native Affairs noting under the authority of regulation 107 of the Native Administration Regulations, 1938, as made and in force under the Native Administration Act, 1905-1941, do hereby declare that the settlement of natives upon the land comprised within Reserve No. 248 near Walebing is a forbidden settlement within the meaning and for the purposes of the said regulation 107, and that within one month from the date of the publication of this notification in the Government Gazette such settlement shall be removed, abandoned or pulled down and the natives of such settlement shall remove to such other part or parts of the State as have not been declared by me to be a forbidden settlement or forbidden settlements within the meaning of the said regulation 107.

### NATIONAL SECURITY (SUPPLEMENTARY) REGULATIONS.

The State of Western Australia—Hours of Opening and Closing of Establishments Order.

WHEREAS it is provided by regulation 23A of the National Security (Supplementary) Regulations (as amended by Statutory rule, 1943, No. 155), that subject to the direction of the Prime Minister the Premier of any State may by order determine the hours of opening and closing of any prescribed establishment in the State, and that an Order made under the said regulation may apply, operate, and take effect to the extents or in the manners variously mentioned in subregulation (2) of the said regulation; and whereas the Prime Minister has duly directed me to make this Order and therein to make the provisions hereinafter mentioned: Now, therefore I, John Collings Willcock, M.L.A., Premier of the State of Western Australia, acting subject to the direction of the Prime Minister as aforesaid and in exercise of the power in this behalf conferred by the said regulation 23A do hereby make the following Order:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as The Hours of Opening and Closing of Establishments Order No. 1.
- 2. (a) In relation to all Government Departments of the State within the meaning of the Public Service Act, 1904-1935, the opening hours and closing hours both in respect of the commencement and cessation of work by the persons employed therein and also in respect of the transaction of business therein by members of the public, shall, subject as hereinafter provided, be 8.45 o'clock a.m. and 4.45 o'clock p.m., respectively, on every week-day except Saturday, and 8.45 o'clock a.m. and 11.45 o'clock a.m., respectively, on Saturday when upon any of such days the Department is open for the performance of work or the transaction of business: Provided that nothing in this clause shall affect the opening hour of any department aforesaid for business which normally opens for business after 8.45 o'clock a.m., or the closing hour of any department for business which normally ceases the transaction of business on a week-day, other than Saturday, before 4.45 o'clock p.m. or on Saturday before 11.45 o'clock a.m.
- (b) Paragraph (a) of this clause shall apply to and have effect only in relation to Departments situate within the Metropolitan Area as constituted under and for the purposes of the Traffic Act, 1919-1941.
- 3. (a) In relation to retail shops, but subject to paragraph (b) hereof, the opening and closing hours in respect of the carrying on of the business therein on every week day, except Saturday, on which such shops are open for business shall be 9.30 o'clock a.m. and not later than 6 o'clock p.m. respectively, and on Saturday shall be 9 o'clock a.m. and not later than 1 o'clock p.m. respectively.
- (b) Paragraph (a) shall apply only in relation to those retail shops which are situate within that portion of the City of Perth which is more particularly described and defined in the Schedule hereunder and which are not included in any of the classes of shops specified in Parts I. and II. of the Fourth Schedule to the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937.

- 4. (a) In relation to all Government Schools within the meaning of the Education Act, 1928, and to all private schools, but subject to paragraph (b) hereof, the opening and closing hours in respect of the attendance of the pupils or students for teaching, shall, subject as hereinafter provided be on every week day on which the school is usually open 9.30 o'clock a.m. and not later than 4.15 o'clock p.m. respectively: Provided that the said hour of opening and/or the said latest hour of closing aforesaid may in the case of any particular school or schools be varied in writing by the Chairman of the Western Australian Transport Board upon application therefor in writing by the Head Master or governing body of the School seeking such variation where such Chairman is satisfied that by reason of special circumstances such variation is warranted.
- (b) Paragraph (a) shall apply only in relation to Government Schools and private Schools which are situate in the Metropolitan Area aforesaid.
- 5. This Order shall come into operation and take effect on the 4th day of October, 1943, and, subject to rescission by the Prime Minister as provided for in subregulation (5) of regulation 23A aforesaid, shall continue in operation until amended, varied or revoked by a subsequent Order.

All that portion of the City of Perth bounded by lines commencing at the western side of the junction of St. George's terrace and Milligan street and proceeding along the south side of St. George's terrace eastwards to the eastern side of Pier street; thence northwards along the eastern side of Pier street to the northern side of Newcastle street; thence westward along the northern side of Newcastle street to the western side of Lake street; thence along the western side of Lake street southward to the northern boundary of the Government railway reserve; thence along the northern boundary of the Government railway reserve; thence along the northern boundary of the Government railway reserve westwards to the western side of the Melbourne road level crossing; thence along the western sides of Melbourne road and Milligan street southward to the starting point.
