AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers, at Perth, this 29th day of September, 1943, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

Native Administration Act, 1905-1941.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 63, subsection (4) of the Native Administration Act, 1905-1941 that where it appears that any native has in pursuance of any tribal custom committed an offence against another native, then the Court may in the case of a charge which under the Criminal Code may involve punishment of death or imprisonment without the option of a fine for any period in excess of ten years, sentence the offender to any term of imprisonment of not more than ten years with hard labour or order that the offender be banished from his country and kept during the Governor's pleasure in prison or in some place reserved by the Governor for native prisoners under sentence of banishment; and whereas the native, to wit, Senneka alias Smiler, having been found guilty of the wilful murder of another native, to wit, Cronjie alias Bunki, was in accordance with the said section ordered to be banished from the country and to be kept during the Governor's from the country and to be kept during the Governor's pleasure in prison or in some place reserved by the Governor for native prisoners under sentence of banishment; and by an Order in Council dated the 27th day of September, 1940, was ordered to be kept at the Moola Bulla Native Station, a place reserved by the Governor for native prisoners under sentence of banishment until the Governor by a further Order in Council shall other-wise direct; and whereas it is now deemed desirable that the said native shall be released: Now, therefore, that the said native shall be released: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act and of all other powers in this behalf enabling him doth hereby order and direct that the said native, Senneka alias Smiler, now being detained at the Moola Bulla Native Station under and in accordance with the Order

in Council hereinbefore mentioned, shall forthwith on the publication of this Order in Council in the Govern-ment Gazette be released and discharged from the said Moola Bulla Native Station.

SCALE OF ALLOWANCES TO WITNESSES.

First Schedule-Resolution.

That the Articles of Association be amended as follows:-

84. In Article 84, after the word "twelve" add the following: "until the handing over of the management and control of the Company to the growers (hereinafter referred to as 'the handing over to the growers') in accordance with the Deed of Trust dated the twentyfourth day of October, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, between the Company and James Lampard Paton (hereinafter called 'the Deed of Trust') after which the number shall be nine.''

Insert the following new Articles after Article 84, namely:-

84a. For the purpose of the handing over to the growers and thereafter the directors shall be elected on the following basis:—(i) The State shall be divided into five districts each containing approximately the same number of shareholders. The method of division shall be a function of the directors and may be varied from time to time as may be considered necessary. (ii) One director shall be elected to represent each such district by the shareholders having their main wheatgrowing interests in such district. Such directors shall be known as district directors. (iii) The qualification for a district director shall be that he is a shareholder and has his main wheatgrowing interests in the district for which he is a candidate. (iv) Four directors shall be elected by all the shareholders. Such directors shall be known as State directors. (v) The qualification for a director elected under paragraph (iv) of this Article shall be that he is a shareholder.

84b. For the purpose of electing directors, the directors shall cause the necessary district rolls to be prepared prior to each election and shall make the district rolls available for inspection by shareholders at the premises of the Company's country caretakers or agents within each district. An appeal may be lodged against the omission or inclusion of any name or names up to the time and date of the close of nominations and the directors shall investigate any such appeal or appeals and they may add or delete any such name or names to or from the rolls and close the said rolls. Upon Upon the closure of the rolls by the directors the said rolls shall be final and binding for such election.

86. Delete the whole of Article 86 and substitute:

Should any casual vacancy occur among the directors the remaining directors shall have power to fill up such vacancy by appointing a qualified person but any person so chosen shall hold office only until the close of the next ordinary general meeting when he shall retire but

shall be eligible for re-election if properly qualified.

89. Delete Article 89 and substitute:—One district director elected under paragraph (ii) of Article 84a and one director elected under paragraph (iv) of Article 84a shall retire each year. The directors to retire shall be those who have been longest in office since their last election. As between directors of equal seniority the directors to retire shall be selected by lot. A retiring director shall be at any time eligible for re-election if properly qualified. Directors shall be elected each year to fill the vacancies so caused and also vacancies caused by the retirement of directors appointed under Article 86 and any casual vacancies,

90. Delete Article 90 and substitute:-The method of election of directors shall be by postal ballot conducted on such basis of preferential voting as the Company may from time to time determine in general meeting and shall be carried out as follows:—(a) The directors shall appoint a returning officer each year prior to the holding of an election for the purpose of conducting the ballot, taking charge of the voting papers and counting the votes cast at such an election. The returning officer shall declare the result of the ballot at the ordinary general meeting in the year of election and such declaration by the returning officer shall be final and conclusive. At the time of the appointment

of the returning officer the directors shall also fix the time and date for the closing of nominations and for the closing of the poll. (b) The returning officer shall at closing of the poll. (b) The returning officer shall at least 14 days before the close of nominations cause an advertisement to be inserted in "The West Australian," "Wheatgrower" and "Primary Producer" newspapers and/or such other papers as the directors may determine from time to time advising shareholders that a ballot is to be held, stating the vacancies that are occurring and are to be filled at the election and calling for nominations for the said vacancies from those eligible to stand for election and date. ible to stand for election and stating the time and date on which nominations will close. (c) A candidate for election as a director must be nominated by five shareholders other than himself who are eligible to vote in respect of his candidature. Nomination papers shall be in such form as may be prescribed by the directors and shall be signed by the nominators and by the candidate and shall be lodged with the Company prior to the closing of nominations. (d) At any election of direcfor more than one position. (e) Upon the close of nominations the returning officer shall have the necessary ballot papers prepared and shall post a paper or papers to each shareholder eligible to vote at the election together with a notification of the hour and date of the close of the poll and such directions for the completion of ballot papers as may be deemed necessary by the Board. Such ballot paper or papers shall also be accompanied by a stamped addressed envelope for the return of the completed paper. (f) The voting papers shall be printed substantially in or to the effect of the following form: of the following form:-

(g) Where two or more persons are shareholders in respect of a share or shares issued in their joint names then the person whose name appears first on the scrip for such share or shares shall be the only person en-titled to vote in respect of such share or shares. (h) Attorneys and proxies shall not be eligible to vote at an election of directors and unless a corporation's common seal is affixed to the lower part of a ballot paper such voting paper shall be deemed invalid. (i) If there be no more duly qualified candidates for any election than vacancies to be filled no ballot shall be held and the Chairman of the Annual Meeting shall at such meeting declare such candidates elected. (j) A retiring director shall remain in office until the close of the ordinary General Meeting notwithstanding the declaration of the election of his successor. (k) Each candidate for election as a director may at his own expense either her present himself or appoint another member to be be present himself or appoint another member to be present at the examination of the voting papers and

the counting of votes by the returning officer.

91. Delete Article 91 and substitute:—Should any candidate for the position of director die or otherwise become ineligible for election between the time of closing nominations and the posting of ballot papers to share-holders the returning officer upon being satisfied that such an event has occurred shall have the candidate's name removed or struck off the ballot papers. And should any candidate die or otherwise become ineligible for election between the posting of the ballot papers to the shareholders and the declaration of the poll then upon satisfying himself that such is the case the returning officer when counting the votes shall disregard all votes allocated to such candidate and distribute such votes amongst the other candidates in the order of preference indicated by the voter upon his ballot paper.

92. Delete Article 92 and substitute:—For the pur-

pose of the first election of directors in connection with

the handing over to the growers every grower who is eligible to become a shareholder under clause 5 of the Deed of Trust shall for the purpose of all articles dealshareholder (but so that paragraph (g) of Article 90 shall nevertheless apply as if the scrip for the shares had been issued). The returning officer appointed for the said election shall declare the result of the poll at the Extraordinary General Meeting to be held in accordance with the Deed of Trust and the elected candidates shall take office at the close of such meeting.

An Agreement under seal made this day One thousand nine hundred and fortythree between Co-operative Bulk Handling Limited, a Company duly registered under the Companies Act 1893 as amended by the Companies Act Amendment Act 1929 as an enter by the Companies Ret 1328 and having its registered office at 569 Wellington Street, Perth, in the State of Western Australia (hereinafter called "the Company") of the one part and James Lampard Paton formerly of Saint George's House, Saint George's Terrace, Perth, in the said State, now of Pastered House Scient Cooper's Terrace, Porth, of Saint George's Terrace, Po toral House, Saint George's Terrace, Perth, aforesaid as Trustee and Agent for and on behalf of the "Growers" as defined in the Deed of Trust hereinafter referred to (the said James Lampard Paton being here-inafter called "the Trustee") of the other part.

Whereas:-

(a) This Agreement is supplemented to an Agreement under Seal dated the twenty-fourth day of October One thousand nine hundred and thirty-three made between the parties hereto (hereinafter and in the Bulk Handling Act 1935 referred to as "the Deed of Trust'

(b) The Directors of the Company recently resolved in pursuance of clause 4 of the Deed of Trust that the management and control of the business of the Company should be handed over to the growers (as defined in the Deed of Trust) in October One thousand nine hundred

and forty-three.

(c) In order to effect such handing over the Company will shortly comply with the provisions of clause 5 of the Deed of Trust and cause to be allotted and issued to growers the shares therein mentioned and would then (save as varied by these presents) have to comply with the provisions of clauses 6 and 7 of the Deed of Trust which read as follows:—6. Within twenty-eight days after the issue of the shares mentioned in clause 5 hereof an extraordinary general meeting of the Company shall be convened and held. The notice paper convening the meeting shall intimate to the shareholders that the Directors of the Company then in office will resign at such meeting in favour of a new Board of Directors to be convenited by the shareholders and the Directors to be appointed by the shareholders and that the business of the meeting shall be (inter alia) to elect Directors in the place of those resigning. 7. At the meeting mentioned in clause 6 hereof the directors of the Company shall resign and shall forthwith transfer their qualification shares to such person as shall be nominated by the shareholders then present. The said nominated by the shareholders then present. The said shareholders shall then elect a new Board of Directors. Any of the resigning Directors who are growers holding shares issued under clause 5 hereof shall be eligible for re-election.

(d) Clause 21 of the Deed of Trust empowers the (d) Clause 21 of the Deed of Trust empowers the Trustee at any time or from time to time at the reasonable request of the Company to vary the terms of the Deed of Trust and enter into any agreements therefor but so that the Deed of Trust shall not be so modified or altered under such clause as to relieve the Company from liability in regard to the toll credits or any of them or to be inconsistent with the ground achieve or substance of the Company's arrenge. general scheme or substance of the Company's arrangements with the growers as evidenced by the Deed of Trust.

(e) Following their resolution to hand over the management and control of the business of the Company to the growers the directors of the Company in response to requests of organisations representing growers of wheat in the said State decided with the approval of the Trustee to vary the method of electing the new Board of Directors as prescribed by clauses 6 and 7 of the Deed of Trust. In consequence of such

decision the Articles of Association of the Company were amended at an extraordinary general meeting of the Company recently convened for such purpose and the amendments were approved by the Governor as required by section 12 of the Bulk Handling Act, 1935. Such amendments provide (inter alia) for the division of the State into certain districts and for the election by postal ballot of District and State Directors who will take office at the close of the extraordinary general meeting of the Company to be convened and held in terms of clause 6 of the Deed of Trust.

(f) The Company has now requested the Trustee to enter into these presents for the purpose of varying as necessary the provisions of clauses 6 and 7 of the Deed of Trust.

Now these presents witness and it is hereby agreed

by and between the parties hereto as follows:—
1. Clauses 6 and 7 of the Deed of Trust are hereby varied so that they shall read as follows:-6. in twenty-eight days after the issue of the shares mentioned in clause 5 hereof an extraordinary general meeting of the Company shall be convened and held. The notice paper convening the meeting shall in addition to other necessary items of business intimate to the shareholders that such of the directors of the the shareholders that such of the directors of the Company then in office as shall not have been elected for a fuither term in accordance with the Articles of Association of the Company will resign at such meeting and that the directors have determined under Article 93 of such Articles that the resigning direc-

tors shall vacate office at the close of such meeting. 7. The directors to resign as indicated in clause 6 hereof shall prior to the meeting mentioned in such clause deliver their written resignations as required by the said Article 93 and they and the other directors of the Company then in office shall forthwith after the said meeting transfer their original qualification shares to such person as shall be nominated by the shareholders then present.

2. As varied as aforesaid the Deed of Trust and every clause thereof shall continue in full force and

effect.

Between Coastal Bag, Sack and Textile Manufacturers' Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, Appli-cant, and Harris Scarfe & Sandovers, Ltd., McLean cant, and Harris Scarfe & Sandovers, Ltd., McLean Bros. & Rigg, Ltd., J. Gadsden Pty., Ltd., Joyce Bros., Attwood Motors (1934), Ltd., and T. Graham, Respondents.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties; and whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination; and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference; and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested the Court to declare the said agreement an Award: Now therefore, the Court, pursuant to section 63 of the Act and all other powers therein enabling it hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court:—

Memorandum of Agreement.

- (1) Scope: This Agreement shall apply to all workers who are employed in the manufacture of jute, hessian, calico and stockingette bags, water bags, tents, sian, cance and stockingette bags, water bags, tents, tarpaulins, blinds and covers: Provided that it shall not apply to workers who are at present provided for in any Award of the Court of Arbitration of Western Australia or in any Industrial Agreement registered in accordance with the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-
- (2) Area:—This Agreement shall apply over the area comprised within a radius of fifteen (15) miles from the General Post Office, Perth.
- (3) Term:—The term of this Agreement shall be three (3) years from its date.
- (4) Hours:—Forty-four (44) hours shall constitute a week's work, which may be worked in five (5) or five and one half (5 $\frac{1}{2}$) days at the option of the

The ordinary day's work shall be performed between the hours of 7 a.m. and 6 p.m., Monday to Friday, in-clusive, and between 7 a.m. and 1 p.m. on Saturday.

- (5) Overtime:—(a) All time worked before the usual starting time or after the usual finishing time shall be deemed overtime and be paid for at the rate of time and a half. (b) All time worked on Sunday or the holidays prescribed in clause (6) hereof shall be paid for at the rate of double time.
- -(a) Subject to subclause (c) of this (6) Holidays:-(b) Holidays:—(a) Subject to subclause (c) of this clause the following days, or the days observed as such, shall be granted as they occur, and be paid for, namely: New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day. (b) A holiday of one (1) week shall be granted to each worker on completion of each year of service. (c) In the event of a worker being in the employ of an employer when any of the abovenamed holidays occur he shall only be entitled to such holidays on full pay as are proportionate to his length of service with such employer, and if such holidays are not equal to the holidays given to the other workers, he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on holidays on full pay. (d) Holiday pay shall not accrue during a worker's absence from his employment for any cause whatsoever. (e) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall lose all rights under this clause.
- (7) Time and Wages Record:—The employer shall keep or cause to be kept a record wherein shall be entered: (a) The name of each worker. (b) The nature of his employment. (c) The total hours worked each day. (d) The wages and overtime (if any) received therefor. (e) The age of each junior worker.

The employer shall be responsible for the proper posting of the record each week, which shall be signed weekly only if correct, by the worker. Such record shall be open for inspection at the factory office by a duly accredited representative of the union during working hours.

- (8) Contract of Service: -One (1) week's notice on either side shall be necessary to terminate the contract of service: Provided that an employer may at any time summarily dismiss a worker for misconduct or refusal or neglect to obey orders.
- (9) Meal Money: When a worker without being notified on the previous day is required to continue working after the usual knock-off time for more than one (1) hour he shall be provided with any meal required shall be paid one shilling and sixpence (1/6d.) in lieu thereof.
- (10) Payment for Sickness: A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one half (½) day for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill health shall be limited to six (6) days in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment or for any accident wherever sustained arising out of his own wilful default or for siekness arising out of his own wilful default.

No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a Medical Certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

- (11) Representative Interviewing Workers: -In the case of a disagreement existing or anticipated concerning any of the provisions of this Agreement, an accredited representative of the union shall be permitted to interview the workers during the recognised meal hour on the business premises of the employer, but this permission shall not be exercised without the consent of the employer more than once in any one (1) week.
- (12) Board of Reference:—(a) The Court may appoint for the purpose of this Agreement a Board or Boards of Reference. Each Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties.

There are assigned to each such Board in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Agreements, the functions of—(I) Adjusting any the Agreements, the functions of—(I) Adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Agreement or any of them; (II) Classifying and fixing wages, rates and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Agreement; (III) Deciding any other matters that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time. (b) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Industrial Arbitration Act. 1912. tions prescribed in the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, which for this purpose are embodied in the Agree-

(c) After application has been made to the Board and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be paid the proposed basic rate.
- (15) No Reduction:—Nothing herein contained shall entitle an employer to reduce the wage of any worker who at the date of this Agreement was being paid a higher rate of wage than the minimum prescribed for his class of work.
- (16) Junior Workers' Certificate:—Junior workers upon being engaged shall furnish the employer with a reproduction the all previous employer with a certificate showing the following particulars:—(a) Name in full; (b) Age and date of birth; (c) Name of each previous employer; (d) Length of service with each previous employer. This certificate shall be signed by the worker.

No worker shall have any claim upon an employer for additional wages in the event of the age or experience of the worker being wrongly stated on the certifi-cate. If any worker shall wilfully mis-state his age or experience in the above certificate he alone shall be guilty of a breach of this Agreement.

- (17) Higher Duties:—A worker who is required to do work which is entitled to a higher rate under this Agreement than that which he usually performs shall be entitled to payment at the higher rate while so employed.
- (18) Shift Work:—(a) When shift work is worked, the starting and finishing times may be fixed from time to time by Agreement in writing between the employer and the union, or failing agreement, by the Board of Reference. (b) No worker under sixteen (16) years of age shall be employed as a shift worker.
- (19) Breakdown, etc.:—The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed, because of any strike by the union or unions affiliated

with it or by any other association or union or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot

reasonably prevent.
