BUSH FIRES ACT, 1937-1942.

Prohibited Periods.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to declare, under section 9 of the Bush Fires Act, 1937-1942, that it shall be unlawful to set fire to the bush in the Municipalities and Road Districts during the periods set out in Schedule No. 1 hereunder, and to declare that the boundaries of Zone 4A shall be as defined in Schedule No. 2 hereunder.

Zone 3A—15th December, 1943, to 7th March, 1944 (inclusive)—Balingup; Capel; Greenbushes; Preston; Sussex—(except that portion of the Road District between the Caves Road and the Coast, the period for which is 10th January, 1944, to 7th March, 1944). Schedule No. 2.

along the centre of Graham road, to the centre of Road No. 7832; thence south-easterly, easterly, south-easterly, southerly, and generally easterly, along the centres of Roads Nos. 7832, 5885, and 8044, to the centre of Road No. 898; thence generally north-easterly, along the said centre, to the centre of South-Western highway; thence continuing north-easterly, along the centre of the said highway, to the centre of Spring Gully road, near the northern corner of Location 4219; thence southerly, and south-easterly along the said centre, to the centre of a one chain road extending along the northern boundary of Location 4216; thence generally easterly, along the centre of Road No. 3968, and onwards, along the centre of a one chain road, to the centre of Manjimup-Nornalup road; thence generally south-easterly, along the said centre, crossing the Shannon River, and onwards, to the northern boundary of Reserve 14145; thence easterly, along the said boundary, to the centre of the Frankland River; thence generally southerly, along the said centre, to the seashore aforesaid; and thence generally north-westerly, along the said seashore, including the islands adjacent to the starting point.
