WHEREAS by sections 223 and 228 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906-1941 (6 Edwardi, No. 32), it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request of the Council, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street or way, or any place, bridge, or thoroughfare, to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and theuceforth, from the date of such Proclamation, become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force; and whereas the City of Perth Council has requested that certain land named and described in the Schedule hereunder which has been reserved for a street or way within the Municipality of

the City of Perth be declared a Public Highway: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare the said land to be a public highway, and such land shall, from the date of this Proclamation, be absolutely dedicated to the public as a highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

The Mining Tenements (War Time Exemption) Act, 1942.

PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell, TO WIT. K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

No. 664/18.

WHEREAS under the provisions of section 4 of the Mining Tenements (War Time Exemption) Act, 1942, it is enacted that during a time of war the Governor may by Proclamation, for the period mentioned in such Proclamation, waive or postpone the payment of rent on any mining tenement which is prescribed and payable under the Mining Act, 1904-1937, and exempt the holder of any mining tenement from his obligation under the Mining Act, 1904-1937, to observe comply with or perform any conditions relating to such mining tenement; and whereas a time of war now exists, to wit the War

in which His Majesty is now engaged with Germany, Italy, and Japan (hereinafter referred to as "the present War") and it is desirable to give effect to the said section 4 in relation to certain mining tenements during the present War: Now, therefore I, Sir James Mitchell, Lieutenant-Governor as aforesaid, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do by this Proclamation direct in relation to the mining tenements set out in the Schedule hereunder and for the period stated in the said Schedule that the payment of rent shall be waived and the holders of the mining tenements mentioned on the said Schedule shall be exempted from compliance with the labour covenants relating to such mining tenements.

FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934. NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Order has been issued in accordance with section 7, subsection 1 of the Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1934, which reads as follows:

A Stay Order shall direct that no action, execution, distress for rent, proceedings on default for breach of covenant under any mortgage or other security for money, or under an agreement for sale and purchase of lands, or other process or proceeding, shall be commenced or proceeded with, or put in force against the farmer or any of the farmer's assets, whether utilised in connection with or forming portion of the assets comprised in his farming order: Provided that, by leave of a Judge, any action may, notwithstanding the Stay Order, be instituted and/or carried on against the farmer but not beyond judgment.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties; and whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination; and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference; and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested the Court to declare the said agreement an Award: Now, therefore, the Court pursuant to section 63 of the Act and all other powers therein enabling it hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court:—

Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note:--Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement.")

1.—Scope.

This Award shall apply to workers employed by the Minister for Agriculture in connection with the Commonwealth Egg Drying Plant, Wellington street, Perth.

2.—Area.

This Award shall have effect over the area comprised within a radius of twenty-five (25) miles from the G.P.O., Perth.

3.—Term.

This Award shall be for a term of one (1) year.

4.—Definitions.

"Casual worker" shall mean a worker employed for less than six (6) consecutive working days.

5.—Hours

- (a) The week's work shall consist of forty-four (44) hours and except where otherwise provided, the normal hours of labour shall be eight (8) from Monday to Friday inclusive, and four (4) on Saturday.
- (b) The week's work may by agreement between any respondent and the Union be worked in five (5) days, Monday to Friday, inclusive, in which event the normal hours of labour shall be eight (8) honrs, forty-eight (48) minutes on each working day.
- (c) The hours specified in (a) and (b) shall be worked between 7.30 a.m. and 5 p.m., except on Saturdays, when work shall finish at noon. Provided that the above spread of hours shall not apply in the case of shift work.
 - (d) Lunch interval shall not exceed one (1) hour,

7.—Casual Workers.

A casual worker shall be paid at 10% over the rate prescribed for the particular worker's occupation. The contract of service shall be terminable by one hour's notice.

8.—Overtime.

- (a) All time worked in excess of or outside the usual working hours shall be paid at the rate of time and a-half for the first four hours and double time thereafter.
- (b) (1) The loading on the ordinary rate of pay for shift work shall be five (5) per cent. for afternoon shift, and ten (10) per cent. for night shift. (2) There shall be a weekly rotation of shifts.
- (c) A worker called back after completing a day's work or called out on a Sunday or holiday, shall be paid a minimum of two (2) hours at overtime rates, but if he is called out more than once within any period of two (2) hours of a call, he shall not be entitled to any further payment for time worked within the period of two (2) hours from the time when he commenced work in response to his first call.
- (d) When a worker is required for duty during any meal time whereby his meal time is postponed for more than one (1) hour he shall be paid at overtime rates until he gets his meal.
- (e) When a worker is required to continue working after knock off time for more than one hour without being notified the previous day, he shall be supplied with any meal required, or be paid one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) for such meal.
- (f) Unless otherwise agreed between the respondent and the nnion, in the case of a worker who works a five (5) day week, Monday to Friday inclusive, made under an Agreement pursuant to subclause (b) of clause 5, and who works overtime on a Saturday, for the first four (4) hours of overtime, time and a half rate and thereafter double time rate shall be paid.
- (g) For all work done on Sunday, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day, double time shall be paid with a minimum of two hours,

9.-Holidays.

- (1) (a) Subject to subclause (2) hereunder, a worker after twelve (12) months' continuous service shall be entitled to two (2) weeks' leave: Provided that Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, and Labour Day shall be taken as they come, as portion of the leave.
- (b) In addition to the specially named days in sub-clause (a) above, a worker shall be entitled after such twelve (12) months' continuous service to one (1) week's leave, such leave to be taken at the convenience of the Department: Provided, however, that the total liability of the employer for payment for the holidays mentioned in (1) hereof shall not exceed two (2) weeks' pay.
- (2) All workers other than casuals who have not (2) All workers other than casuals who have not served the full calendar year shall be entitled to the same proportion of holiday leave or payment in lieu thereof as their length of service is to the full period of leave for the twelve (12) months.

 (3) A worker dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall lose all rights

under subclauses (1) and (2) above.

- (4) At least one (1) week's notice shall be given to a worker prior to his going on his annual week's leave as mentioned in subclause (a) hereof: Provided, how-ever, that when the employer or his representative and the worker so agree a shorter notice will be sufficient.
- (5) Holiday pay shall be at the rate the worker is in receipt of at or immediately prior to the holiday being taken.

10.-Higher Duties.

- (a) A worker engaged for more than one half (1/2) of one (1) day or shift on duties carrying a higher of one (1) day or shift on duties carrying a ligher rate than his ordinary classification shall be paid the higher rate for such day or shift. If employed for one half (½) or less than half (½) of one (1) day or shift, he shall be paid the higher rate for the time actually worked: Provided, however, that acting time of less than twenty (20) minutes in any one day or shift shall not be counted. shall not be counted.
- (b) Should any worker be required to perform work in a lower grade, his wage shall not be reduced whilst employed in such capacity.

11.—Contract of Service.

- (a) All workers, except casual workers, shall be employed on a weekly engagement. Such workers must be ready and willing to work on the days and during the hours usually worked by the class of worker affected. A worker shall not be entitled to payment for any time absent from employment.
- (b) A week's notice of termination of engagement shall be given on either side. Such notice may be given on any day during the week to terminate such engageon any day during the week to terminate such engage-ment on the corresponding day of the following week or on any later day thereof. Any worker may be dis-missed peremptorily without notice for malingering, inefficiency, otherwise than through temporary illness, neglect of duty or misconduct, and shall be entitled to payment of wages up to the time of such dismissal only.
- (c) The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the union or unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

12.—Proportion of Juniors.

The maximum number of junior workers allowed to the employer shall be in the proportion of one to every three or fraction of three adult workers employed by him.

13.—Record Book.

The wages sheet of the Department shall be open for inspection at Head Office by the secretary of the union upon reasonable notice being given of his desire to

14.—Right of entry to Works.

On notifying the officer in charge, any officer of the union, authorised in writing by the president and secre-tary of such union, shall have the right to enter any place or premises during ordinary working hours wherein members of such union covered by this Award are engaged, for the purpose of conversing with or interviewing the workers in such place or premises.

Provided that such officer shall not hamper or otherwise hinder the workers in the carrying out of their work. The officer in charge shall determine whether workers are being hampered or hindered in their work.

15.—Payment of Wages.

Wages shall be paid weekly in the employer's premises, in the employer's time, and on any day other than Saturday or Sunday.

16.-Aged and Infirm Workers.

- (a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the union and the employer.
- (b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at the matter may be referred to the General Board of Reference for determination.
- (c) After application has been made to the Board, pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

17.—Posting of Award.

A copy of this Award shall be posted or exhibited by the employer on each of his works in a conspicuous place, easily accessible to the workers.

18.—Wet Pay.

Where the condition of work is such that workers are unable to avoid their clothing becoming excessively wet, they shall be supplied with protective clothing or material or be paid an allowance of 1s. per day extra.

19.—Board of Reference.

For the purpose of this Award, a Board of Reference is hereby appointed, which shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. The said Board shall have assigned to it in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the dispute the functions of:-(a) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise from time to time except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of this Award or any of them; (b) classifying and fixing wages, rates and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Award; (c) dealing with any other matter which the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.

An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.

20.—General Clauses.

- (1) No female worker shall be permitted to lift weights above shoulder height or to carry weights in the case of workers under 18 years of age in excess of 25 lbs., and in the case of over 18 years in excess of 35 lbs.
- (2) Female workers shall be allowed two rest periods daily, each of ten minutes. These periods shall be computed as time worked, and shall be allowed between 9 a.m. and 10 a.m., and 2 p.m. and 3 p.m.
- (3) Any female worker required to stand continuously on concrete floors whilst working shall be provided with proper protection under foot.
- (4) Rest rooms with locker accommodation (rooms suitable for females to change in) shall be provided.
- (5) This Award shall not in itself operate to reduce the wages of any worker who is at present receiving above the minimum rate prescribed for his or her class of work.

21.—Preference.

All workers covered by this Award are to be members of the union and if not members at the time of the making of the Award shall, within 14 days thereafter make application to the Coastal Food Manufacturers and Wholesale Mixing and Packing Establishments Employees' Industrial Union of Workers for membership.

22.—Junior Worker's Certificate.

- (1) Junior workers shall furnish the employer with a certificate showing the following particulars:—
 (a) Name in full; (b) Age and date of birth.
- (2) This certificate shall be signed by the worker.
 (3) No worker shall have any claim upon the employer for additional wages, in the event of his age being wrongly stated on this certificate.
