WHEREAS by section 45 of the Health Act, 1911-1942, it is provided that a Local Authority, in the exercise of its powers conferred by Part 3 of the said Act may make and levy rates of different amounts in respect of portions of its district, defined for that purpose by proclamation: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor in and over the State of Western Australia, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby by this Proclamation define the following portions of the Lake Grace Road Board Health District wherein rates of different amounts in respect of the said

portions of such district may be levied—(1) Lake Grace, Lake Biddy, Newdegate, Lake King and Lake Varley; (2) Other areas.

Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1941.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1941, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office, approved by the Minister, a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under the said Act to all workers employed by him, but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury, securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor may by Order in Council exempt such employer from the operation of the said section 10; and whereas Australian Mutual Provident Society, Western Australia Branch, being an employer and as such subject to the said section 10, has duly, in accordance with the regulations, made application for exemption from the said section, and has satisfied the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against the said liability, and has deposited at the Treasury a security, to wit, Certificate of Title Volume 478, Folio 98, in which is comprised an estate in fee simple in all that piece of land being portion of Perth Town Lot G1, charged with all payments to become due under the said liability: Now,

therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby exempt the said Australian Mutual Provident Society, Western Australia Branch, from the operation of section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1941, during the period of two years commencing on the 18th day of November, 1943.
