AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers, at Perth, this 1st day of March, 1944, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

Road Districts Act, 1919-1943.

Mount Marshall and Mukinbudin Road Districts— Alteration of Common Boundaries.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 3215/23.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting by and with the consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power conferred by section 8 of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1943, doth hereby alter the common boundary between the Mount Marshall and Mukinbudin Road Districts by severing that portion of the Mount Marshall Road District described in the Schedule hereto and annexing it to the Mukinbudin Road District.

Local Authorities (Reserve Funds) Act, 1942.
ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 404/43.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 4 of the Local Authorities (Reserve Funds) Act, 1942, that the Governor, may, on the recommendation of the Minister but

subject to the requirements of the proviso to the said section, by Order in Council authorise a local authority to establish during the present war and to maintain a reserve fund for the purpose of accumulating therein any surplus of ordinary revenue of the local authority and of applying the moneys in such reserve fund and any income or profit derived from the investment of moneys in such reserve fund in the carrying out, after the cessation of the present war, of works and undertakings authorised by the Local Government Act of the local authority which the local authority may not be able conveniently to carry out during the present war; and whereas it is desirable that such reserve fund shall be established by the local authorities as set forth in the schedule hereto: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting pursuant to the recommendation of the Minister and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, after being satisfied as required by the proviso to section 4 of the said Act, doth hereby authorise the local authorities as set forth in the schedule hereto, to establish and maintain a reserve fund.

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 81 of 1943.

Between Metropolitan Ladies Hairdressers' Industrial Union of Employers of W.A. and The Metropolitan Hairdressers and Wig-makers Employees' Union of Workers.

WHEREAS an Industrial Agreement, No. 1 of 1937, declared to be a Common Rule in the industry, provides inter alia that a Board, to be called "The Advisory Committee," may be appointed by the Court to advise in regard to any apprenticeship matter; and whereas the said Industrial Agreement further provides that such committee should consist of the following:—(a) some person appointed by the Court, who shall act as chairman; (b) two representatives appointed by the employers; (c) two representatives appointed by the industrial union or unions of workers in the trade; and whereas the Industrial Agreement further provides that the Advisory Committee shall have such powers and duties as the Court in each case may determine; and whereas on the 23rd day of December, 1943, the Court in pursuance of the said Industrial Agreement appointed an Advisory Committee and also appointed Reginald Arthur Wood to act as Chairman; and whereas the parties have requested the Court to define the powers and duties of the said Committee: now therefore the Court of Arbitration acting in pursuance of the said Industrial Agreement and all other powers and authorities vested in it by the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, hereby orders and declares as follows:—That the said Committee shall have the following powers and duties, without limiting the powers and duties that at any time hereafter may be conferred:—

1. To deal with all matters affecting apprentices assigned to the determination of the Committee by the Court, and in particular to perform and discharge all powers and duties in the regulations attached to the Industrial Agreement and therein to be performed and discharged by the Court, except such powers and duties as are specially assigned to the Court by the Act.

2. The Committee shall be invested with the following powers and functions in addition and without prejudice to those mentioned in (1):—(a) to endeavour to promote apprenticeships under the Industrial Agreement; (b) to draw up syllabi of training and to arrange for the periodical examination of apprentices; (c) to

enter any factory, workshop, or place where an apprentice is employed, or appoint any other person for that purpose, and inspect the conditions under which any apprentice is employed; (d) to require any employer to furnish the Committee with any specified information relating to any trade or industry subject to the Industrial Agreement, or any of the workers engaged therein, with a view to determining whether there is a sufficient number of apprentices being trained to meet future requirements and in the interests of the community; (é) to advise the Court as to all matters appertaining to apprentices.

3. A majority of the members of the Committee, one of whom must be the chairman, shall constitute a quorum. The decision of the Committee shall be the decision of the majority of the members and shall be signed by the chairman and forwarded to the Registrar. Either party, with the consent of the Court, may at any time alter its representative.
