AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, on the 26th day of April, 1944, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:-

The Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1941.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1941, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office approved by the Minister a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under this Act to all workers employed by him but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for insurance that such employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury, against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury, securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor may by Order in Council exempt such employer from the operation of the said section; and whereas Whittaker Bros., Ltd., of Hay street, Subiaco, being an employer subject to the provisions of the said section 10 and having duly made application in accordance with the regulations made under the said Act for exemption from the operation under the said Act for exemption from the operation of the said section 10 has proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against its liability aforesaid as an employer and that it has deposited at the Treasury, securities, to wit a fixed deposit receipt for Five thousand pounds given by the Union Bank of Australia, Ltd., of St. George's terrace, Perth, charged with all payments to become due by the said Company under its said liability: Now, therefore, said company under its said hability: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act doth hereby exempt Whittaker Bros., Ltd., of Hay street, Subiaco, from the operation of section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1941, for a period of two years commencing on the 12th day of March, 1944.

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT No. 2 of 1944. (Registered 20/4/44.)

THIS Agreement made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, this 26th day of February, one thousand nine hundred and forty-four (1944), between the Coastal Food Manufacturers and Wholesale Mixing and Packing Establishments Employees' Industrial Union of Workers (hereinafter called "the Union") of the one part, and W.A. Match Co., Limited (hereinafter called "the employer") of the other part;

witnesseth that, for the considerations hereinafter appearing, the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:

1.—Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to workers following the vocations mentioned in Clause 6 hereof in the Match Manufacturing Industry.

2.—Area.

This Agreement shall have effect over the area comprised within a radius of fifteen (15) miles from the G.P.O., Perth.

3.—Term.

This Agreement shall be for a term of one year.

4.—Definition.

"Casual worker" shall mean a worker employed for less than five (5) consecutive working days.

5.-Hours of Work.

Forty-four hours shall constitute a week's work to be Forty-four hours shall constitute a week's work to be worked in five days from Monday to Friday inclusive between the hours of 7.30 a.m. and 6 p.m. with a meal break of at least forty-five (45) minutes duration. Provided that the above spread of hours may be altered by agreement between the employer and the union for any worker or workers governed by this Agreement. In default of agreement the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for decision. A worker shall not be required to work for longer than six hours without be required to work for longer than six hours without a break for a meal.

(d) Casual workers shall be paid at the rate of ten per cent. extra.

7.—Overtime.

(a) All work performed before the usual starting time or after the usual finishing time or on Saturdays shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four hours and double time thereafter. (b) All work performed on Sunday shall be paid for at the rate of double time. (c) When a worker, without being notified on the previous day, is required to continue working after the usual knock-off time for more than one hour, she shall be provided with any meal required or shall be paid one shilling and sixpence in lieu thereof: Provided that such payment need not be made to a worker living in the same locality as the factory, who could reasonably return home for a meal.

8.—Holidays.

(a) Twelve paid holidays per annum shall be granted to each worker after twelve months' continuous service: Provided that New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day, or the days observed in lieu, shall be taken as they come, as portion of the holidays. Work performed on these days shall be raid for the thought the part of a registery the state of the part of days shall be paid for at the rate of ordinary time in addition to the weekly or casual wage. The balance of six days shall be granted as one week's annual leave at the convenience of the employer within three months of becoming due. On any other public holiday an em-ployer's establishment or place of business may be closed in which case a worker need not present herself for duty and payment for that day may be deducted, but if work be done ordinary rates shall apply. (b) In the work be done ordinary rates shall apply. (b) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, she shall only be entitled to such holidays on full pay as are proportionate to her length of service, during that period with such employer and if such holidays are not equal to the holidays given to the other workers of such employer, she shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers

of such employer are on holiday on full pay. (c) Holiday pay shall not accrue during a worker's absence from her employment for any cause whatsoever, except where such absence is on account of annual leave to which the worker is entitled under this Agreement.

(d) Any worker dismissed for misconduct or dereliction of duty, or who illegally severs her contract of service shall lose all rights under this clause.

9.—Absence through Sickness.

A worker shall be entitled to payment for nonattendance, on the ground of personal ill-health, for one-half (½) day for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to six (6) days (one week's pay) in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from her employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of her employment, or for any accident wherever sustained, arising out of her own wilful default or for sickness arising out of her own wilful default.

No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless she produces proof satisfactory to her employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

10.—Contract of Service.

(a) Except in the case of casual workers, one week's notice on either side shall be necessary to terminate the engagement. (b) Workers must be available and ready and willing to work on the days and during the hours required. A worker shall not be entitled to payment for absence from employment except as provided for in clause 9 hereof. (c) Provided that an employer may at any time dismiss a worker for refusal or neglect to obey orders or for misconduct.

11.-Proportion of Juniors.

The proportion of junior female workers to adult female workers shall be in the ratio of two junior female workers to every three adult female workers: Provided that for the purposes of this clause a junior female worker shall mean a worker under the age of 21 years and who is in receipt of less than the adult female rate.

12.-Time and Wages Record.

The employer shall keep, or cause to be kept, a record

containing the following particulars:—

(a) The name of each worker. (b) The class of work performed. (c) The hours worked each day. (d) (b) The class of The wage (and overtime, if any) paid. (e) The age of

each junior worker.
Such record shall be open to the inspection of an accredited representative of the union at all reasonable times during the ordinary office hours.

13.—Aged and Infirm Workers.

(a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the union and the employer. (b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for deter-mination. (c) After application has been made to the Board, and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for the employer at the proposed lesser rate.

14.—Posting of Agreement.

The employer shall, upon request of the union, post a copy of this Agreement in a conspicuous place in the factory, where it is easily accessible to the workers.

15.—Board of Reference.

The Court may appoint for the purpose of this Agreement a Board of Reference, which shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. The said Board shall have assigned to it in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the dispute the functions of: - (a) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise from time to time except such as involve interpretation of the provisions of this Agreement or any

of them; (b) classifying and fixing wages, rates and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Agreement; (c) dealing with any other matter which the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.

An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, which for this purpose are embodied in this Agreement.

-Junior Worker's Certificate.

Junior workers, upon being engaged, shall, if required, furnish the employer with a certificate containing the following particulars:—(i) Name in full. (ii) Age and date of birth. (iii) Name of each previous employer.

Such of the above particulars as are within the knowledge of an employer shall be endorsed on the certificate and signed by the employer upon request by the worker.

No worker shall have any claim upon an employer for additional pay in the event of her age being wrongly stated in the certificate, and she alone shall be guilty of a breach of this Agreement.

Any such certificate shall be open for inspection by the union representative during his inspection of the time and wages record.

17.—Breakdowns, etc.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the union or unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

Clause 41-Sick Leave.

Delete existing clause and insert:-

- (a) Subject to the employee producing proof of her medical unfitness for duty, sick leave with pay shall be granted on the following scale:-
 - (i) Under three (3) years' service with any one centre—one and one-quarter (11/4) days for each calendar month of continuous service: Provided that payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the employee leaves the service of the centre concerned, in the event of the employee being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.
 - (ii) Over three (3) years' service with any one centre—two (2) months on full pay.
- (b) Sick leave may be granted in one or more periods but the aggregate amount of leave on pay shall not in any one triennial period exceed the time provided for in the foregoing scale.
- (c) A "triennial period", shall be three (3) years preceding the date of the commencement of absence through illness in respect of which leave is claimed.
- (d) If sickness is due to the wilful neglect or default of the applicant, the proof whereof lies upon the employer, it shall, if granted, be without pay.

Clause 45—Salaries.

- Delete existing clause and insert:—

 (a) Salaries shall be paid at least twice per calendar month, or fortnightly, at the option of the employer: Provided that, by agreement between the employer and the union, the salary may in any particular case be paid once per calendar month.
- (b) The minimum salary per week payable to employees shall be as set out below:-

Each employee shall supply herself with sufficient uniforms to last for six months from the date of this Award and for six months from the date of entering award and for six months from the date of entering upon any new employment. The employer, if she continues in the service, shall supply her with all future uniforms required, made to accord with her measurements on a printed or typewritten chart: Provided, however, that in lieu of supplying uniforms the employer may make such allowance as may be agreed upon between the employer with the content of the supplying uniforms. the employer and the union.

Add New Clause 45C-Motor Car Maintenance. Insert:

Where an employee owns and maintains a motor car and is authorised in writing by her employer to use her motor car in the performance of her duties, she shall be paid for each mile she so uses her car, such rate as may be mutually agreed upon, not being less than threepence (3d.) per mile in the Metropolitan Area and fourpence (4d.) per mile outside that area.
