PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell, K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and over the State of Western Australia Lieutenant-Governor. [L.S.]

WHEREAS by the Motor Vehicle (Third Party Insurance) Act, 1943, it is provided that the said Act shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by proclamation: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, do hereby with the advice and consent of the Executive Council proclaim that the Motor Vehicle (Third Party Insurance) Act, 1943, shall come into operation on the 1st day of July, 1944.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell,
K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and over the State of Western Australia wealth of Australia.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1940, I, the Lieutenant Governor of the State of Western Australia, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever in those portions of Western Australian waters specified in the Schedule hereto by means of fishing nets, for the term of three months from May 1, 1944, inclusive. The Proclamation dated December 23, 1942 (published in the Government Gazette of January 1, 1943), relating to the prohibition of the use of fishing nets in the waters of Nornalup Inlet, Walpole Inlet, Deep River and Frankland River is hereby revoked.

SCHEDULES.

Schedule 1:—The whole of the waters of the Frankland River, extending from its source to its mouth, and also to include that portion of the waters of Nornalup Inlet lying eastwards of a line extending north from Survey Mark J.3.

Schedule 2:—The whole of the waters of Walpole Inlet, including also all affluent waters thereto, and extending to Nornalup Inlet, and lying northwards of a line extending east from the southernmost corner of Nelson Location 8409.

Schedule 3:—The whole of the waters of the Deep River, extending from its source to its mouths, and also to include that portion of the waters of Nornalup Inlet bounded by lines starting from a point on the high water mark of the north-western shore of the said Inlet, and situate east of Survey Mark G.38, and extending south-easterly to the easternmost point of Newdegate Island, thence generally south-westerly, along the north-western shore of the said Island, to its westernmost point; thence west-south-westerly, to a point on the said high water mark, situate on the southernmost bank of the said Deep River, and thence generally north-easterly, along the said north-western shore of the Inlet, to the starting point.
