WHEREAS under the provisions of section 4 of the Mining Tenements (War Time Exemption) Act, 1942, it is enacted that during a time of war the Governor

may by Proclamation, for the period mentioned in such may by Proclamation, for the period inentified in such Proclamation, waive or postpone the payment of rent on any mining tenement which is prescribed and payable under the Mining Act, 1904-1937, and exempt the holder of any mining tenement from his obligation under the Mining Act, 1904-1937, to observe, comply with, or per-form any conditions relating to such mining tenement; and whereas a time of war now exists to wit the War in which His Noisetrie is now encaged with Germany in which His Majesty is now engaged with Germany, Italy and Japan (hereinafter referred to as "the present Italy and Japan (hereinafter referred to as "the present war") and it is desirable to give effect to the said sec-tion 4 in relation to certain mining tenements during the present war: Now, therefore I, Sir James Mitchell, Lieutenant-Governor as aforesaid, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do by this Proclama-tion direct in relation to the mining tenements set out in the Schedule hereunder and for the period stated in the said Schedule that the payment of rent shall be waived and the holders of the mining tenements men-tioned on the said Schedule shall be exempted from comtioned on the said Schedule shall be exempted from compliance with the labour covenants relating to such mining tenements.

WHEREAS under the provisions of section 10 of the Mining Act, 1904-1937, it is enacted that the Governor may by Proclamation alter or amend the boundaries of a Goldfield or District: Now, therefore, I, Sir James Mitchell, Lientenant-Governor as aforesaid, with the advice and consent of the Executive Conncil, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do by this Proclamation amend the existing boundaries of the Collie River Coal Mining District, to be as follows:—

Collie River Coal Mining District.

All that area bounded by lines starting from a point situated about 2 miles south from the south-eastern corner of Wellington Location 56 and extending north about 5½ miles to an angle in the eastern boundary of the said location; thence east 2 miles to another angle in the said boundary; thence north about 4½ miles passing through the north-eastern corner of the said location; thence east about 51/2 miles to the Collie River at its junction with the Harris River; thence continuing easterly and south easterly along the left bank of the east branch of the Collie River to its junction with the Bingham River; thence east about 6 miles; thence south about 12¹/₂ miles; thence west about 14¹/₄ miles; thence north about 5 miles; thence west about 6¹/₄ miles to the point of commencement.

The Health Act, 1911-1942.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 19 of the Health Act, 1911-1942, that the Governor may by Order in Council constitute any portion of the State, not being a municipal district, a health district with such boun-daries and by such name as may be specified in the Order, and that if the boundaries of such district are not co-terminous with a road district the local authority for wath district the nord board of the road district such district shall be the road board of the road district within the boundaries whereof the health district is situated or a local board of health constituted as in the said Act provided as the Governor may from time to time direct: And whereas prior to the year 1913 the Governor had duly in accordance with the provisions of the said Act constituted a portion of the State, being a portion of the Ashburton Road District a health dis-trict with the name of "Onslow health district" and

ABATTOIRS ACT, 1909-1941.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council acting pursuant to section 6 of the Abattoirs Act, 1909-1941, has been pleased to amend in the manner which operate and have effect in the Metropolitan District as declared under the said Act and which have been published in the *Government Gazette* on the 14th day of April, 1938, the 6th day of March, 1942, the 1st day of January, 1943, and the 10th day of March, 1944.

SCHEDULE.

The abovementioned regulations as made and in force under the Abattoirs Act, 1909-1941, and operating in the Metropolitan District are amended as follows:-

1. Regulation 34 (Gazette 14th April, 1938), is repealed and a new regulation is inserted in lieu thereof as follows:

Slanghtering of Stock except in the Abattoirs or Licensed Places Prohibited.

34 (1) A person shall not slaughter any species of stock within the Metropolitan District as from time to time declared under the Act except—(a) in the Abattoirs; or (b) in a place licensed by the Minister under regulation 37 of these regulations.

Provided that equine stock shall not be slaughtered at the Abattoirs.

(2) A person shall not slaughter in any licensed place referred to in subparagraph (b) of paragraph (1) of this regulation any species of stock other than that or those species of stock expressly specified in the license granted by the Minister in relation to such place.

2. Regulations 37, 38 and 39 (Gazette 10th Murch, 1944), are repealed.

3. A new regulation is inserted after regulation 36 (Gazette 6th March, 1942), to stand as regulation 37 as follows:-

Licenses by the Minister for slaughtering Stock.

37. (1) The Minister may, upon payment of the fee prescribed hereunder, by license under his hand according to the form No. 1 in the Appendix to these regulations authorise the slaughtering of stock generally or of any one or more particular species of stock within the Metropolitan District as from time to time declared under the Act at such place, other than the Abattoirs as is expressly named and described in the license.

(2) Where the license does not authorise the slaughtering of stock generally it shall state expressly that or those species of stock, the slaughtering of which is authorised by such license.

(3) Every license shall operate and have effect for the period of twelve months from the date of the issue thereof unless such license is sooner revoked or suspended by the Minister.

(4) Every license shall contain a provision that it is granted subject to the condition that the requirements of the Health Act, 1911-1942, and of every other statutory enactment or regulation or by law lawfully made and in force relating to slaughtering of stock and to the establishment and maintenance of places for slaughtering stock shall be duly observed and complied with with respect to the place in relation to which the license is granted and the slaughtering of stock therein, and that in the event of any non-observance of or non-compliance with any such requirement the license will be liable to be revoked or suspended by the Minister.

(5) The Minister may by writing under his hand served on the grantee of the license or sent or left at the licensed place revoke, or suspend for any period, any license granted by him under this regulation in either of the following circumstances—(a) if a species of stock, the slaughtering of which is not authorised by the license, is slaughtered at the licensed place; or (b) if the grantee of the license or the occupier of the licensed place makes default or permits or suffers default to be made in the due observance of or in compliance with any condition subject to which the license is granted as provided for in paragraph (4) of this regulation.

(6) A license granted under this regulation shall be personal to the grantee named therein and shall not be transferable.

(7) The fee payable for a license under this regulation shall be one pound one shilling.
