PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, } By His Excellency Sir James Mitchels, TO WIT. } K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and JAMES MITCHELL, over the State of Western Australia Lieutenant-Governor. and its Dependencies in the Common-[1.s.] wealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by section 45 of the Health Act, 1911-1942, it is provided that a Local Anthority, in the exercise of its powers conferred by Part 3 of the said Act may make and levy rates of different amounts in respect of portions of its district, defined for that purpose by Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor in and over the State of Western Australia, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Connecil, do hereby by this Proclamation declare that the Kon-dinin Road Board being the Local Heelth Authority for dinin Road Board being the Local Health Authority for the Kondinin Health District may levy rates of different amounts in respect of portions of its district defined as follows :- (a) Townsites of Kondinin, Karlgarin, Hyden and Bendering; (b) The remaining portion of the said district.

AT a meeting of the Executive Conncil held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, on the 11th day of May, 1944, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued :-

Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1941.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912.1941, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office, approved by the Minister, a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under this Act to all workers employed by him, but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has de-

posited at the Treasury securities charged with all pay-ments to become due under such liability the Governor may by Order in Council exempt such employer from the operation of the said section 10; and whereas Amal-gamated Collieries of W.A., Limited, of St. George's terrace, Perth, is an employer within the meaning of the said Act, and as such is subject to the provisions of the said section 10, and has made application duly in accord-ance with the said Act and the regulations made there-under for exemption from the operations of the said section, and has satisfied the Minister that it has estab-lished a fund for insurance against its liability to pay compensation under the said Act to all workers employed by it, and has deposited at the Treasnry securities, to wit, a bond by the Bank of New South Wales of Perth, charged with all payments to become due by the com-pany under the said liability: Now, therefore, His Excel-lency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the said Act, and as such is subject to the provisions of the consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power conferred by section 10 of the said Act, doth hereby exempt Amalgamated Collieries of W.A., Limited, from the operation of section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1941, for a period of two years from and including the 1st day of March, 1944.

Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914-41. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 50/44.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 15 of the Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914-41, that any person to whom subsection (1) of that section applies may, in the circumstances specified in such subsection, apply to the Minister for a specified in such subsection, apply to the Minister for a special license under section 15 afore-said and that after notice and inquiry and in default of objection the Minister may, subject to the approval of his Commissioners submit the application to the Governor with a recommendation that the application be refused or that it be granted either wholly or in part and that the Governor may direct that a special license in a form to be prescribed by the Governor, be issued to the applicant in respect of the land and user of the water specified in the application or of so much of such land and water as the Governor thinks fit; and whereas applications have been made to the Minister by the persons named in the Schedule hereto under the provisions of the said section for the issue to each of them respectively of a special license to take and use water from the Canning River or its tributaries; and whereas all the provisions of subsections (3), (4) and (5) of the said section having been complied with the Minister has with the ap-proval of his Commissioners submitted to the Governor a recommendation that such applications be granted: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, pursuant to the recommendation of the Minister and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act doth hereby direct that such special licenses shall be issued to the applicants named in the Schedule hereto and shall be in such form and contain such conditions as for the time being are prescribed by the regulations under the said Act.

Firstly, that the said Model By-laws Series A as adopted by the said local authority for the said Wagin Health District shall be and are hereby amended as follows, that is to say:—A new by-law is inserted in section C of Part IX. of the said Model By-laws Series A after by-law 1 of the said section C as follows:— 1A. (1) It shall not be lawful for any person to establish or have a piggery at any place within that portion of the Wagin Health District which is situate within the circumference of an imaginary circle having a radius of 50 chains from the Wagin Post Office as the centre thereof. (2) A person shall not keep any swine or pigsty within that portion of the Wagin Health District in which the establishment of piggeries is prohibited by paragraph (1) of this by-law; and

Secondly, that for the purposes of by-law 3 in Part IX. (Offensive Trades) of the said Model By-laws Series A the registration fees to be prescribed in Schedule D to the said Part IX. shall be and are hereby prescribed as follows:—Fat melting or rendering establishments, fish shops, laundries, and piggeries—£1 1s. 0d. each; slaughter yards—£5; wool stores or wool scouring establishments—£2 2s. 0d.

THE ROAD DISTRICTS ACT, 1919-43. Gnowangerup Road Board.

IN pursuance of the powers vested in it by the Road Districts Act, 1919-43, the Gnowangerup Road Board, hereby makes the following by-laws for the hire, use, and management of halls and rooms, under the control of the said Board. All previous by-laws made by the Gnowangerup Road Board for the hire, control and management of halls are hereby rescinded.

Interpretation Clauses.—In the construction of these by-laws "Hirer" shall m an any person making application or arrangements for the hire of any hall, room, furniture, or crockery, or to whom the use of same is granted; "Board" shall mean the Gnowangerup Road Board; "Building" shall mean any hall, room, corridor, or any part of any hall or room under the control or management of the Gnowangerup Road Board.

1. The rent of any hall or any part thereof, or furniture, or crockery, shall be such as may be prescribed from time to time, 2. Applications for the hire of any building, furniture, or crockery shall be made in writing to the Secretary of the Board not less than 24 hours before the time such building, furniture, or crockery is required. The name and place of abode of the actual responsible person or persons hiring the building, furniture, or crockery shall be given in such application.

3. The hirer shall be responsible for any damage to the building, fittings, furniture, or crockery while in his use or charge, and shall pay to the Board the amount of such damage as assessed by the Board.

4. The hirer shall, when the use of any hall crockery is allowed, as soon as possible after the term of engagement, deliver all such crockery in a clean and sound condition, and any article not accounted for or in a cracked condition must be paid for at current rates.

5. The Board reserves the right to refuse to let any building, furniture, or crockery to any applicant for the hiring of same, without assigning any reason for such refusal.

6. The Board may at any time cancel any arrangement made for the hiring of any building, furniture, or crockery.

7. In the event of two or more applications being made for the hire of any building, furniture, or crockery for the same date and hour, the Board may, without considering the priority of application, determine to which applicant the building shall be granted.

8. The hirer of the building shall comply with the provisions of the Health Act, Entertainments Act, and any other Act in force for the time being applicable to such hiring and use of buildings. If in the opinion of the Board all the necessary actions have not been taken to comply with the provisions of the Acts abovementioned, the Board may at any time prior to or during the term of the engagement, forbid and prevent the use of the building. In the event of the use of any building being forbidden or prevented under this bylaw, the hirer shall forfeit the full amount payable for the hire of the building as if the hire had been duly fulfilled and the Board shall not be responsible to the hirer for any loss or damage incurred by the hirer.

9. No spirituous liquors, wine, ale, or other intoxicating drink shall be brought into or consumed in any building during the term of engagement, except when permitted by the Board in writing.

10. Dogs, whether under control or otherwise, will not be allowed to enter any building.

11. No person shall in any part of any building enter or be—(a) allowed to enter in any part of any building while intoxicated; (b) guilty of any misbehaviour whatever.

12. No person shall—(a) damage, mark, or deface any wall or other part of any building; (b) use profane or improper language in any building or within hearing of persons using same; (c) stand, loiter, or cause any obstruction whatsoever in the passage-ways of any building.

13. No offensive impersonations or representations of living persons or any thing calculated to produce a riot, disturbance, or breach of the peace shall be permitted in any building.

in any building. 14. The hirer of any building shall be responsible for—(a) maintaining good order and enforcing these by-laws; (b) any damage done to any building, fittings, fixtures, furniture, crockery ware, or other property of the Board.

15. No person shall remove or replace any electrical fitting without the permission of the Board.

16. The secretary or other duly authorised officer of the Board, or a police constable, shall be permitted to have ingress to any building or any part thereof during the term of the engagement, and every facility shall be given them for the enforcing of these by-laws.

17. Hirers may decorate any hall, using only fixtures specially provided for that purpose, and no person shall drive a nail into any part of the walls, windows, doors, floor, etc., or otherwise deface the building.

18. Decorations may be done in daylight free of charge, when the hall is not otherwise engaged, and at such times as the Board may permit. If the decorations are done at night, such charges may be made as the Board determines. All decorations must be removed from the premises within 24 hours from the commencement of the hiring period.

19. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these by-laws, or commits or permits any breach thereof, shall be deemed to be guilty of an offence against these by-laws, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for each offence.

MOTOR VEHICLE (THIRD PARTY INSURANCE) ACT, 1943.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council acting under the authority of section 28 of the Motor Vehicle (Third Party Insurance) Act, 1943, has been pleased to make under and for the purposes of the said Act the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereunder.

SCHEDULE.

Motor Vehicle (Third Party Insurance) Act, 1943—Regulations. 1. These regulations may be cited as the Motor Vehicle (Third Party Insurance) Act Regulations, 1944.

ilet negulations, 1914.

2. In these regulations the term "Committee" means the committee appointed and constituted under section 26 of the Act.

3. These regulations are divided into Parts as follows:-

- Part I: rr. 4 to 20—Transaction and conduct of business by the Committee. Part II: rr. 21 and 22—Notices, claims, etc.
 - Part III: rr. 23 and 24-Miscellaneous.

Appendix—Forms.

Part I .- Transaction and Conduct of Business by the Committee.

4. (a) For the purposes of this Part—"Ordinary Meeting" means a meeting of the Committee for the transaction of the ordinary business of the Committee; "Special meeting" means a meeting of the Committee to consider special business, the nature of which is stated in the notice to members of such special meeting. (b) Ordinary meetings shall be held at such intervals and at such times as the Committee may by resolution from time to time fix and determine. (c) A special meeting shall be held—(i) Whenever the Minister or the chairman directs; or (ii) Whenever any three members of the Committee, by a requisition in writing addressed to the chairman request that a special meeting shall be held.

5. (a) Notice of every ordinary and of every special meeting of the Committee shall be given or sent, either by post or otherwise, to every member of the Committee by the secretary, and, where any meeting is adjourned for any period exceeding six days, notice of such adjourned meeting shall be given or sent in the manner aforesaid. (b) Such notice shall be not less than three clear days.

6. (a) At all meetings of the Committee the chairman shall preside if present. (b) In the absence of the chairman, or, if he retire from the meeting one of the members present, to be chosen by the members present, shall preside at such meeting.

7. All meetings of the Committee shall be held at such place as the Committee may by resolution from time to time appoint and as the Minister may approve.

8. Four members of the Committee, provided they include either the Auditor General or the Manager of the State Government Insurance Office, one member appointed as representing owners of motor vehicles and one member appointed as representing approved insurers, shall form a -quorum thereof.

9. (a) When at any ordinary meeting a quorum is not present within half an hour after the time fixed for the commencement of the meeting, the meeting shall stand adjourned for seven days. (b) If at any such adjourned meeting a quorum be not present within half an hour after the time fixed for the commencement of such meeting the members then present shall constitute a quorum for such meeting. (c) When at any special meeting called by the Minister or the chairman a quorum be not present within half an hour after the time fixed for the commencement of such special meeting, the provisions of paragraphs (a) and (b) of this regulation shall with such adaptations as may be necessary, applv in relation to such special meeting. (d) When at any special meeting called on the requisition of three members a quorum be not present within half an hour after the time fixed for the commencement of such special meeting, such special meeting shall lapse. (e) Notwithstanding that at any ordinary or special meeting a quorum is not present, the names of those members who are present at such meeting shall be recorded in the minute book.

10. No business shall be transacted at any special meeting other than that for which such special meeting has been called.

11. (a) The order of business at ordinary meetings shall be as follows:— (i) Confirmation of minutes of previous meetings; (ii) Consideration of business arising out of minutes; (iii) Correspondence; (iv) Motions; (v) Notices of motion; (vi) General Business. (b) In the event of any member having urgent business to place before the meeting, he may move the suspension of paragraph (a) of this regulation and if such motion be agreed to by a majority of the members present, such business shall take precedence over all other business for that meeting.

12. (a) Any member who wishes to have rescinded any resolution carried at any previous meeting shall give to the secretary of the Committee in writing at least seven days' notice of his intention to move at a meeting of the Committee that the said resolution be rescinded. (b) Particulars of such notice of motion shall be furnished to members in the notice of the meeting at which the motion for rescission of the resolution will be moved.

13. A member when speaking at a meeting shall not digress from the subject of the debate.

14. A motion once moved shall not be withdrawn except with the consent of the majority of the members present at the meeting.

15. Any number of amendments may be proposed on a motion before the meeting. Provided that when more than one amendment is moved the question shall first be put on the last amendment, then on the next in succession, and so on until all the amendments are voted on and lastly on the original motion, in the reverse order in which they were moved.

16. Unless seconded neither a motion nor an amendment shall be discussed by any member other than the mover or be put to the meeting by the chairman.

17. When an amendment is carried the motion as amended thereby shall become the substantive motion upon which further amendments may be moved before it is finally dealt with.

18. When submitting a motion or an amendment to the meeting the chairman shall put the question first for the affirmative and then for the negative.

19. Any question before the meeting may be decided on the voices unless the chairman calls for a show of hands.

20. (a) All questions before the meeting shall be decided by the votes of a majority of the members present at the meeting and when so decided shall be deemed to be the decision of the whole Committee. (b) In the case of an equality of votes the motion shall be lost.

Part II .- Forms, Notices, Claims, etc.

21. The instruments or documents referred to and required under the various sections of the Act respectively mentioned in the first column of the Table hereunder, and described in the second column of such Table, shall be in the forms contained in the Appendix to these regulations specified respectively in the third column of the said Table.

22. (1) Every policy of insurance issued by an approved insurer under and for the purposes of the Act shall be in a form and contain provisions which are approved by the Committee.

(2) Every approved insurer shall, before commencing to issue policies of insurance under and for the purposes of the Act, submit to the Committee for approval two copies of a specimen policy which such approved insurer intends to issue under and for the purposes of the Act.

(3) When the Committee approves of a specimen policy submitted by an approved insurer under paragraph (2) hereof, the Committee shall cause one copy thereof to be filed for purposes of record, and shall endorse on the other copy a memorandum to the effect that such specimen policy of insurance is approved by the Committee for use by the approved insurer who has submitted the same, and shall return such copy endorsed as aforesaid to such approved insurer.

(4) When a form of policy of insurance for use by an approved insurer has been approved by the Committee, the approved insurer shall not make any alteration in or addition to such approved form without first obtaining the approval of the Committee in respect of such alteration or addition.

(5) Paragraphs (2) and (3) hereof with such adaptations as may be necessary shall apply in relation to the application for and granting of its approval by the Committee to the making of any alteration in or addition to a form of policy of insurance which has already been approved by the Committee.

Part III .--- Miscellaneous.

23. (a) Whenever any motor vehicle in respect of which a license has been issued and is current is sold or otherwise disposed of by the owner thereof, notice of such sale or disposal shall be given in writing to the approved insurer by whom such vehicle is insured under the Act within seven days noxt following the date of such sale or disposal. (b) Such notice shall be given by the owner of the vehicle, and also by the agent when such sale or disposal is effected by an agent of the owner of the vehicle. (c) The notice shall be in the form No. 22 in the Appendix to these regulations. (d) Any person who contravenes this regulation shall be guilty of a breach of these regulations. Penalty—Five Pounds. 24. The sum to be paid under section 12, subsection (1), paragraph (b), subparagraph (iii), to any person who conveys in his vehicle an injured person from the place of the accident shall be computed at the rate of one shilling per mile of the nearese practicable route from the place of the accident to the place to which the injured person is conveyed, with a minimum payment in any event of two shillings. Provided that if the injured person can with safety to himself and without unreasonable delay or inconvenience be conveyed along part of the said route upon a railway, the person so conveying the injured person in his vehicle as aforesaid shall be entitled to receive and shall be paid a sum at the rate aforesaid only in respect of that part of the route from the place of the accident to the nearest point on such railway at which the injured person can be placed on a train for further conveyance.
