The Medical Act Amendment Act, 1940.
PROCLAMATION

Western Australia, By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell, TO WIT.

JAMES MITCHELL,
Lieutenant-Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Medical Act Amendment Act, 1940, where the Governor in Council is satisfied that any hospital within the meaning of the Mental Treatment Act, 1927, is not adequately provided for in respect of medical or surgical services, the said Governor in Council may, by Proclamation, declare such hospital to be a region within the meaning of the said Act: Now, therefore, I the Lieutenant-Governor in and

over the State of Western Australia, being satisfied that the hospital known as "Heathcote" is not adequately provided for in respect of medical or surgical services, do hereby proclaim the said hospital, together with the whole area of the Reserve on which it is erected, to be a region under the provisions of the said Act, to be designated the "Heathcote" region.

Given under my hand and the Public Seal of the said State, at Perth, this 23rd day of May, 1944.
