ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 4 of the Local Authorities (Reserve Funds) Act, 1942, that the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Honorary Minister but subject to the requirements of the proviso to the said section, by Order in Council, authorise a Local Authority to establish during the process. to the said section, by Order in Council, authorise a Local Authority to establish during the present war and to maintain a reserve fund for the purpose of accumulating therein any surplus of ordinary revenue of the Local Authority and of applying the moneys in such reserve fund and any income or profit derived from the investment of moneys in such reserve fund in the carry. ing out, after the cessation of the present war, of works and undertakings authorised by the Local Government Act of the Local Authority which the Local Authority may not be able conveniently to carry out during the present war; and whereas it is desirable that such reserve fund shall be established by the Local Authorities as set forth in the Schedule hereto: Now therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting pursuant to

the recommendation of the Honorary Minister and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, after being satisfied as required by the proviso to section 4 of the said Act, doth hereby authorise the Local Authorities as set forth in the Schedule hereto, to establish and maintain a reserve fund. #### COAL MINE WORKERS (PENSIONS) ACT, 1943.

Treasury Department, Perth, 28th June, 1944.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, acting in exercise of the power conferred by section 37 of the Coal Mine Workers (Pensions) Act, 1943, and upon the recommendation of the Coal Mine Workers' Pensions Tribunal constituted under that Act, has been pleased to make under and for the purposes of the said Act the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereunder.

#### Schedule.

#### COAL MINE WORKERS (PENSIONS) ACT, 1943-REGULATIONS.

#### Preliminary.

- 1. These regulations may be cited as "The Coal Mine Workers (Pensions) Regulations, 1944" and shall come into operation on the first day of July, 1944.
- 2. These regulations are divided into parts as follows:—Part I.—Duties of Mine Workers and Owners; Part II.—Retirements and suspension of dates of retirements; Part III.—Pensions; Part IV.—The Fund; Part V.—Contributions; Part VI.—Miscellaneous.
- 3. (a) In the regulations, unless the context otherwise indicates, the several terms defined in section 2 of the Coal Mine Workers (Pensions) Act, 1943, shall have the meanings respectively assigned to them, and in addition—"the Act" means the Coal Mine Workers (Pensions) Act, 1943, and any Act amending the same, and all Proclamations and Orders in Council thereunder; "Dependant" means any of the persons mentioned in subsection (1) of section 9 of the Act in respect of whom a mine worker is eligible for an addition to his pension; "the Fund" means the Coal Mine Workers' Pensions Fund established under the Act; "Pension Fortnight" means the fortnight which will end on 14th July, 1944, or each succeeding fortnight, unless otherwise directed by the Tribunal.
- (b) For the purpose of paragraph (c) of subsection (1) of section 9 of the Act a "female relative" of a mine worker shall be construed to mean such relative of a mine worker who is totally or mainly dependent on his earnings, as may be approved by the Tribunal.

#### Part I.

#### Duties of Mine Workers and Owners.

4. Every mine worker and every person who may hereafter become a mine worker shall within 14 days of the coming into force of these regulations, or of the date of his becoming a mine worker, as the case may be, complete in detail, sign and deliver to the owner by whom he is employed a return of employment as prescribed in the form of Appendix No. 1 of these regulations.

Mine Worker to furnish documentary evidence of the dates of birth of himself and dependants and of marriage.

5. Every mine worker shall, if and when required by the Tribunal so to do, furnish to the Tribunal in such form as the Tribunal may specify documentary evidence of his own age and the ages of his dependants, and, if he is married, of his marriage.

#### Absence from State.

6. Any mine worker who leaves his employment and departs from the State of Western Australia for any purpose other than war service as referred to in subsection (1) of section 3 of the Act shall, within 30 days after his return, notify the Tribunal in writing of the dates between which he was so absent from Western Australia, and, if during such absence he was engaged in employment, the name and address of his employer, the class of such employment, and the period during which he was employed.

## Absence on War Service.

7. Any person who has been absent from his employment in Western Australia upon war service as referred to in subsection (1) of section 3 of the Act shall within 30 days after his discharge from such war service, notify the Tribunal in writing of the dates between which he was so absent from his employment.

Workers' Compensation or Damages claimed independently of Workers' Compensation Act.

- 8. (a) Every mine worker who has been incapacitated by injury shall within 30 days after he becomes aware that his claim for compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1941, or his claim for damages made independently of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1941, has been admitted, notify the Tribunal in writing of such admission.
- (b) The dependant of any mine worker shall within 30 days after he becomes aware that a claim by such dependant for compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1941, or for damages claimed independently of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1941, in respect of the death or incapacity of any mine worker has been admitted, notify the Tribunal in writing of such admission.

## Notification of Accident.

9. Every owner shall within 14 days after the occurrence of any accident whereby any mine worker employed by such owner is killed or injured at any mine of the owner furnish or cause to be furnished to the Tribunal full written details of such accident including the date thereof, whether the mine worker was killed

or injured, the amount of compensation being paid or payable under the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1941, and in the case of injury the nature of same and the period or anticipated period of incapacity as a result of such accident.

Owner to forward returns of employment to Tribunal.

10. Every owner shall within 14 days of the receipt by him from any mine worker of a return of employment, as required under regulation 4 of these regulations, forward it to the Tribunal.

#### Owner to furnish general information.

11. Every owner shall, within 14 days after being required in writing by the Tribunal so to do, furnish or cause to be furnished to the Tribunal such information (including documentary evidence) in respect of any mine worker then or theretofore employed by him as the Tribunal may from time to time deem necessary to enable the Tribunal to record the career of or to consider an application for a pension from such mine worker.

#### Record of Employment.

- 12. (a) Every owner who employs any mine worker shall keep at his place of business, or, if he has more than one place of business, at the place of business where the mine worker is employed, proper records in which he shall record or cause to be recorded the following particulars in respect of each mine worker employed by him:—
  (i) Full name; (ii) Date of birth; (iii) Date of commencement of employment; (iv) Date of cessation of employment; (v) Reason for cessation of employment;
- (vi) Number of days actually worked.
- (b) Within seven days of any owner ceasing to employ a mine worker, such owner shall furnish or cause to be furnished to the Tribunal a statement in writing setting forth the name in full of the mine worker whom he has ceased to employ, the date of cessation of employment and the reason therefor, and shall, unless otherwise directed by the Tribunal, annex to such statement a copy of the record of employment of the mine worker concerned kept by the owner in accordance with this regulation.

#### PART II.

Retirements or Suspension of Dates of Retirement.

Owner to notify Date of Retirement of Mine Worker.

13. Every owner shall within seven days after the retirement of any mine worker of or above the age of 60 years employed by him furnish or cause to be furnished to the Tribunal a statement in writing setting forth the name of the mine worker concerned, the place of employment and the date of retirement of such mine worker and any other information required by the Tribunal for the purposes of the Act.

#### Application for Suspension of Date of Retirement.

- 14. (a) An application for the suspension of the operation of subsections (1) and (2) of section 5 of the Act requiring the retirement of mine workers of or above the age of 60 years may be made by:—(i) A mine worker or mine workers, or (ii) An owner or owners, or (iii) An industrial or trade union of employees or an association of employees referred to in paragraph (g) of subsection (1) of section 2 of the Act.
- (b) Every such application shall be in writing and shall set forth the reasons therefor and shall be lodged with the Tribunal not less than 30 days prior to the date upon which the mine worker mentioned in such application would in the ordinary course of events retire, or, if more than one mine worker is mentioned in such application, not less than 30 days prior to the date upon which the first of such mine workers would in the ordinary course of events retire.

## Certificate of Exemption.

15. Every Certificate of Exemption issued by the Tribunal in pursuance of the provisions of subsection (4) of section 5 of the Act shall be as prescribed in the form of Appendix No. 2 or Appendix No. 3 of these regulations, whichever of the two appendices shall be applicable.

#### PART III.

#### Pensions.

#### Application for Pension.

16. Every application for pension shall be lodged with or forwarded to the Tribunal and shall be in the form or to the effect of the forms of the Appendices numbered four to eight of these regulations as is appropriate to the application, and there shall, in verification of the statements in such application, be furnished by the applicant to the Tribunal such documents or other information as the Tribunal may require.

#### Notification of Allowance or Disallowance of Pension.

17. The Tribunal shall notify every applicant for a pension under the Act of its decision and, where any application is referred to the Court of Arbitration constituted under the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, the reasons for such reference.

## Notification by Pensioners or Others.

(a) Every mine worker or other person to whom a pension has been awarded shall within seven days after the death or the attainment of the age of 16 years or the cessation of dependency of any dependant in respect of whom any amount is payable as an addition to his pension furnish to the Tribunal a statement in writing signed by such mine worker or other person setting forth the name of the dependant and the date of the death, attainment of the age of 16 years, or cessation of dependency (as the case may be) of such dependant.

- (b) Every widow or other female to whom a pension has been awarded in pursuance of section 10 of the Act shall within seven days after her remarriage or marriage (as the case may be) furnish to the Tribunal a statement in writing signed by such widow or other female setting forth the name in which the pension was granted to her and the date of her remarriage or marriage (as the case may be).
- (c) Any person who has been awarded a pension under the Act or to whom such pension is paid shall furnish to the Tribunal such information for the purposes of the Act as the Tribunal may from time to time require.

#### Disclosure of other Pensions, Allowances or Earnings Received.

19. Every person to whom a pension is payable under the Act shall make full and complete disclosure to the Tribunal in relation to any amounts which, by the Act, are directed to be deducted from the pension so payable and shall make such disclosure in such manner and at such times as the Tribunal may direct either generally or in any particular case or class of case.

Determination of Period of Disqualification where Damages received or recovered by Mine Worker or by Dependant independently of Workers' Compensation Act.

- 20. (a) The period of disqualification under subsection (4) of section 10 or under subsection (3) of section 12 (as the case may be) shall be determined as follows:—The period shall be the period during which, if a pension had been awarded and paid as from the date upon which compensation in respect of the injury to or death of the mine worker (as the case may be) becomes payable, the total sum paid to the mine worker or the dependant as pension (including any additional amount in respect of dependants) would have been equal to that part of the damages which is apportioned by the Court before which the damages are recovered as compensation for such injury or death.
- (b) Where the mine worker would be entitled to damages independently of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1941, the disqualification shall continue until he makes a claim for such damages, and thereafter until such disqualification ceases to have effect pursuant to clause (a) of this regulation.

#### Payment of Pensions.

- 21. (a) The date from which a pension under the Act shall commence shall be either—(i) The day following the date of retirement or death, or (ii) The day following the date of expiration of the period equivalent to paid leave granted to a mine worker or his dependants before or after the date of retirement or the date of death (as the case may be) and/or the date of expiration of the period of disqualification prescribed in section 10 or section 12 of the Act, whichever date is the later.
- (b) Where a mine worker has been granted a pension and is re-employed as a mine worker the pension payable to such mine worker shall be cancelled for the period he is so employed and contributions shall be payable for such period.
- (c) Pensions shall be payable in each alternate week on such day as the Tribunal may from time to time determine.
- (d) The amount of pension in respect of one day shall be one-twelfth of the fortnightly amount of such pension.
- (e) Pensions shall be paid by means of cheques crossed "not negotiable" and made payable to order.

## Change of Address of Pensioner.

22. Any person to whom a pension has been awarded shall within three days after any change in his address notify the Tribunal of such change of address and of the address to which all payments and communications should in future be addressed.

#### PART IV.

#### The Fund.

23. Debits against the Fund shall be made only upon the certification of the Chairman or other Certifying Officer of the Tribunal. Payments from the Fund shall be by cheques signed by the officers of the Treasury Department who are from time to time authorised to sign cheques.

#### PART V.

#### Contributions-Estimate of Requirements.

24. Before the Tribunal makes an estimate of the amount required by the Fund as specified in section 21 of the Act, the Government Actuary for the time being shall furnish to the Tribunal not later than the 28th day of February in each year an estimate of the amount which he cousiders should be provided as a reserve in connection with the Fund for such period, and the Tribunal shall take into consideration such estimate when making the estimate for such period.

Basis of Assessment of Contributions by Individual Mine Owners.

25. The basis upon which the contributions of individual owners shall be assessed shall be as follows:—Each owner shall for any year for which the Tribunal has estimated the total amount of contributions necessary to be paid to the Tribunal pay twice the amount of the contributions payable by the mine workers employed by such owner in such year.

Manner of Payment of Contributions by Individual Mine Owners.

26. (a) Within three days (or such further time as the Tribunal may approve) after each pay-day on which in accordance with the notification received by him from the Tribunal under regulation 28 he is required to deduct from each mine worker employed by him the amount of such mine worker's contribution, every owner shall forward to the Tribunal an amount equal to twice the total of the contributions paid for each such fortnight by the mine workers employed by him in that fortnight. The first of such pay-days shall be the seventh day of July, 1944.

Basis of Assessment of Contributions by Individual Mine Workers.

27. The basis upon which the contributions of individual mine workers shall be assessed shall be as follows:—The Tribunal shall as soon as practicable after making in pursuance of section 21 of the Act an estimate of the amount required by the Fund for any period as prescribed by the said section 21 determine the average number of mine workers who were employed by all owners during the 12 months ended on the 31st day of December immediately preceding that period. The amount of the contributions payable under the Act by all mine workers during that period shall be divided by the said determined average number of mine workers, and the figure arrived at shall, subject to Regulation 28 (a), be the contribution payable by each individual mine worker during that period.

Manner of Payment of Contributions by Individual Mine Workers.

- 28. (a) All contributions of mine workers shall be payable by fortnightly instalments and the amount of each fortnightly instalment shall be the amount ascertained by dividing the amount of the contribution payable by a mine worker during any period by the number of complete fortnights in that period: Provided that if the amount so ascertained is not comprised of an equal number of threepences the amount shall be increased to the next three-pence.
- (b) The Tribunal as soon as practicable after the determination by the Tribunal of the contribution payable by each individual mine worker during any period shall notify each owner in writing of the amount thereof, the amount of the said fortnightly instalments and the period during which such contribution and fortnightly instalments shall be payable by individual mine workers.
- (c) The amount of the fortnightly instalments from time to time payable by each individual mine worker, so assessed and notified by the Tribunal shall be deducted by each owner on each pay-day from the amount payable by such owner to any mine worker employed by him, the first of such deductions to be made from the wages paid on the seventh day of July, 1944.
- (d) Within three days (or such further time as the Tribunal may approve) after the deduction by any owner of the amount of any fortnightly instalment payable by a mine worker, such owner shall complete and forward to the Tribunal a return of mine workers' contributions in such form as the Tribunal shall direct and shall with such return forward to the Tribunal all instalments of mine workers' contributions deducted or collected by him.
- (e) Where a person, after the commencement of Part IV of the Act, is employed as a mine worker, the initial contribution payable by such mine worker shall be for the full period of the pension fortnight in which his employment commences.
- (f) Before a pension under the Act shall become payable, contributions shall be paid by a mine worker up to and including the pension fortnight immediately preceding the pension fortnight in which the commencing date of the pension falls; Provided that, in the case of the death of a mine worker, contributions shall not be payable after the pension fortnight immediately preceding the pension fortnight in which the death of such mine worker occurred.

Unpaid Contributions due by Mine Workers.

29. Where through no fault of a mine worker his contributions fall into arrear, the Tribunal on his application may permit the amount of such arrears to be paid in instalments or in such other manner as it may determine and the Owner shall deduct the whole or such portion of the arrears as authorised by the Tribunal from the amount payable to such mine worker on one or more pay-days.

Payment of Contributions by Unemployed Mine Workers.

30. Any mine worker shall, during any period he is not employed as a mine worker, pay to the owner by whom he was employed immediately prior to his becoming unemployed as a mine worker the fortnightly instalments payable by such mine worker in pursuance of the Act and these regulations.

#### PART VI

Miscellaneous-Penalty for Breach of Regulations.

31. Any owner, mine worker or other person who fails, neglects or refuses to comply with the provisions of these regulations or any of them shall be guilty of a breach of these regulations and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty

Forms.

32. The forms set forth in the Appendix to these regulations with such modifications as the circumstances may require shall be used for the purpose for which the same are respectively applicable: Provided that no form shall be deemed to be invalid if it is to the effect of the prescribed form with such modifications as the circumstances may require.

WHEREAS Award No. 38 of 1936 as amended between the above parties provides inter alia that a Board to be called "The Advisory Committee" may be appointed by the Court to advise in regard to any apprenticeship matter; and whereas the said Award, as amended, further provides that such committee should consist of the following: - (a) Some person appointed by the Court who shall act as chairman, (b) two representatives appointed by the employers, (c) two representatives appointed by the industrial union of workers in the trade.

And whereas the Award further provides that The Advisory Committee shall have such powers and duties Advisory Committee shall have such powers and duties as the Court in each case may determine; and whereas on the 16th day of May, 1944, the Court in pursuance of the said Award appointed as The Advisory Committee, the following:—Reginald Arthur Wood, Esq.—Chairman; R. E. Marsh, Esq. and G. C. Cahill, Esq.—Workers' Representatives; E. A. Leahey, Esq. and J. Hamilton, Esq.—Employers' Representatives.

And whereas the parties have requested the Court to define the powers and duties of the said Committee: Now, therefore, the Court of Arbitration acting in pursuance of the said Award and all other powers and authorities vested in it by the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, hereby orders and declares as follows:— That the said Committee shall have the following powers and duties, without limiting the powers and duties that at any time hereafter may be conferred:—

- 1. To deal with all matters affecting apprentices assigned to the determination of the Committee by the Court, and in particular to perform and discharge all powers and duties in the regulations attached to the Award and therein to be performed and discharged by the Court, except such powers and duties as are specially assigned to the Court by the Act.
- 2. The Coumittee shall be invested with the following powers and functions in addition and without prejudice to those mentioned in (1):—(a) to endeavour to promote apprenticeships under this Award; (b) to draw up syllabi of training and to arrange for the periodical examination of apprentices; (c) to permit in any special circumstances the taking or employment of an appren-

tice by an employer, notwithstanding that the quota fixed by the Award in any particular case may be exceeded; (d) to enter any factory, workshop, or place where an apprentice is employed, or appoint any other person apprentice is employed, or appoint any other person for that purpose, and inspect the conditions under which any apprentice is employed; (e) to require any employer to furnish the Committee with any specified information relating to any trade or industry subject to this Award, or any of the workers engaged therein, with a view to determining whether there is a sufficient number of apprentices being trained to meet future requirements and in the interests of the community; (f) to advise the in the interests of the community; (f) to advise the Court as to all matters appertaining to apprentices.

3. A majority of the members of the Committee, one of whom must be the chairman, shall constitute a quorum. The decision of the Committee shall be the decision of the majority of the members and shall be signed by the chairman and forwarded to the Registrar. Either party, with the consent of the Court, may at any time alter its representative.
