Land Tax-Notice to Make Returns.

NOTICE is hereby given that every person who was at noon on the 30th day of June, 1944, the owner, within the meaning of the said Act, of any land whatsoever in Western Australia and who is liable to land tax, is hereby required to make and furnish to me at the office of the Commissioner of Taxation, Perth, on or before the 31st day of August, 1944, a land tax return in the prescribed form. Wanneroo Road Board—Additions to By-laws.

By-laws for the Management and Use of the Wanneroo Road Board Hall.

P.W. 1557/30.

WHEREAS by the Road Districts Act, 1919-42, the road board of any district is empowered to make by-laws for all and any purpose in the said Act mentioned, the Wanneroo Road Board, in pursuance of the powers invested in the said board under and by virtue of the said Act, and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following by-laws:—

Interpretations.

1. In these by-laws the interpretations set out in the Road Districts Act, 1919-42, shall apply, in addition to which the following terms shall unless the context otherwise indicated, bear the meaning set against them in the Road Districts Act, or respectively that is to say:— "The Act"—The Road Districts Act, 1919-42 and all amendments thereto which may hereafter come into force; "Board"—The Wanneroo Road Board; Secretary—The secretary of the Board. All other interpretations to be as prescribed in the Road Districts Act or other Acts or regulations thereunder.

Control of Road Board Hall—Application for Hiring of Building.

2. Application shall be made to the secretary, who shall issue a receipt for all moneys relating to such hire, and such hire fee shall be paid in advance by the applicant.

Persons Hiring.

3. The name and place of abode of the actual person or persons hiring the building and effects shall be given at the time application is made.

Hire Fees and Charges.

4. The fees and hire charges shall be as set out in the Schedule to these by-laws,

Hours of Hiring.

5. The hours for which the building or part thereof may be hired shall be:—(a) day, 9 a.m. to 6 p.m.; (b) evenings, 6 p.m. to midnight; (c) extension of time may be granted upon payment of the prescribed fee to the secretary in which it shall be necessary to obtain authority from the Police or other authority having jurisdiction.

Decoration of Building.

6. Hirers may decorate the building, using only those 6. Hirers may decorate the building, using only those fixtures that are especially provided for the purpose, and no person shall drive a nail into any part of the walls, windows, doors, floors, etc., or otherwise deface the building. All decorations must be done during daylight, otherwise a charge of two (2) shillings per hour or part thereof shall be made for the use of the lighting. All decorations used in connection with any entertainment that the removed from the promises and dispressed of the must be removed from the premises and disposed of to the satisfaction of the secretary within 24 hours from the commencement of the hiring period: provided that the consent of the secretary shall be obtained for the decorations to remain.

Deposits.

7. The Board may at any time demand that the hirer shall, prior to the term of engagement, deposit an amount estimated to cover the cost of any damage that might occur during the time of hiring and/or to cover the cost of removal and disposal of any decorations not so removed by the hirer within the specified time stated in the preceding section.

Right to Let or Hire.

8. The Board shall have the right to let or hire, or refuse to let or hire, any part or all of the building, fix-tures, furniture, or fittings, etc., to any applicant with-out assigning any reason for so doing.

Cancellation of Hire.

9. The Board may at any time cancel any agreement made for the hiring of any part or all of the building, fixtures, furniture, or fittings, etc., by giving such reasonable notice in writing as may be possible, but which shall not be less than seven (7) days.

Discretion of Hire.

10. The Board may, without considering priority of claim of any applicant, determine to which applicant the hire of the building or part thereof shall be granted, in the event of two or more applicants desiring to hire such building or part thereof at the same time and date.

Compliance with Acts of Parliament and Regulations.

11. The hirer of the building or part thereof shall comply with the provisions of the Health Act, Entertainment Tax Act, Performing Rights Association Act, or any other Act and/or regulation in force for the time being and applicable to such hiring and use of the building. If, in the opinion of the Board all necessary actions have not become the complex with the color. sary actions have not been taken to comply with the said Acts or any other Act in force, the Board may at any time prior to or during the term of engagement forbid and prevent the use of such building or part thereof. The hirer must accept full responsibility, in the event of any dispute arising in connection with the provisions of necessities under this by-law or the non-compliance therewith therewith.

Hire Fees upon Breach.

12. In the event of the use of the building or any part thereof being forbidden or prevented under the last preceding section, the hirer shall forfeit the full amount of hire paid, and the board shall not be responsible to the hirer for any loss or damage incurred or sustained.

Spirituous Liquors, etc.

13. No spirituous liquors, wine, beer, stout, cider, sherry, etc., shall be brought in and consumed in any part of the building during the term of engagement or period of hire, except by written consent or permission of the Board.

No Smoking.

14. No person shall smoke any tobacco, cigar, cigarette, or other objectionable substance, nor strike or otherwise ignite any light in any part of the building during any ball, dance, or any entertainment, or at any gathering of persons in the said building, whether such persons have been admitted by payment of money or otherwise, except at a banquet or smoke social where those persons present comprise men only. 15. No male person, except children under the age of seven years accompanied by females, shall enter any place set aside for the use of females.

Refusal of Admittance.

16. No offensive person or offensive impersonation or representation of living persons, or anything calculated to produce a disturbance, riot, or breach of the peace, shall be permitted in or about the premises.

Conduct of Entertainment.

17. No person shall in any part of the building or premises: -(a) enter or be allowed to enter, whilst intoxicated or under the influence of drink; (b) be guilty of any misbehaviour whatsoever; (c) use profane or improper language; (d) damage, mark, inscribe, indite, or deface any wall or other part of the building. Any person who does or suffers to be done any such damage, whall be lightly to part the cost of such damage, in additional to the cost of such damage. shall be liable to pay the cost of such damage in addition to any penalty imposed by these by-laws; (e) stand, loiter, or cause any obstruction whatsoever in the exits or passage-ways; (f) gamble or play pitch and toss or any other game of chance. Any person so doing shall disperse upon being requested so to do by the secretary or other authorised person or police constable.

Responsibility of Hirer.

18. The hirer of the building or any part thereof shall be responsible for:—(a) maintaining good order and the due observance of these by-laws by persons in or about the building; (b) any damage to the building, fixtures, fittings, furniture, etc., or other part or parts of the property.

Authorised Persons.

19. The secretary of the Board, or other person authorised by the Board, or any police constable, shall have access and ingress to the building or any part thereof at all times, and every facility shall be afforded by the hirers for enforcing due observance of these by-laws.

Third Schedule.

Scale of Contributions to the Compensation Funds.

- 1. The contributions to be paid by dairymen to the Dairymen's Compensation Fund shall be one thousandth part of a penny per gallon of milk and one thousandth part of a penny per gallon of cream produced for sale in the metropolitan area.
- 2. The contributions to be paid by milk vendors to the Milk Vendors' Compensation Fund shall be one thousandth part of a penny per gallon of milk and one thousandth part of a penny per gallon of cream sold in the metropolitan area.
- 3. The contributions to be paid to the Milk Vendors' Compensation Fund by those holding a license to treat milk shall be one thousandth part of a penny per gallon of milk and one thousandth part of a penny per gallon of cream treated for sale in the metropolitan area.
- 4. The said fees shall be paid at or within seven (7) days after the end of every calendar month and shall be based upon the amount of milk and/or cream produced, sold, or treated during the preceding calendar month.
