WHEREAS it is enacted by section 4 of the Local Authorities (Reserve Funds) Act, 1942, that the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Honorary Minister but subject to the requirements of the proviso to the said section, by Order in Council, authorise a local authority to establish during the present war and to maintain a reserve fund for the purpose of accumulating therein any surplus of ordinary revenue of the local authority and of applying the moneys in such reserve fund and any income or profit derived from the investment of moneys in such reserve fund in the carrying out, after the cessation of the present war, of works and undertakings authorised by the Local Government Act of the local authority which the local authority may not be able conveniently to carry out during the present war; and whereas it is desirable that such reserve fund shall be established by the local authorities as set forth in the schedule hereto: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting pursuant to the recommendation of the Honorary Minister and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, after being satisfied as required by the proviso to section 4 of the said Act, doth hereby authorise the local authorities as set forth in the schedule hereto, to establish and maintain a reserve fund.

THE NOXIOUS WEEDS ACT, 1924. Mullewa Road Board.

MULLEWA Road Board, being a Local Authority within the meaning of and for the purposes of the Noxious Weeds Act, 1924, hereby makes the following by-laws in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred by section 26 of the said Act, such by-laws to be in addition to any by-laws already made, in exercise of the said powers.

- 1. The local inspector appointed by the Board under the said Act may by notice in writing served on the owner or occupier of land upon which any noxious weeds are growing or present declare such land to be land from which noxious weeds may be likely to spread.
- 2. After such service of notice and during such time as any noxious weeds or the seeds of noxious weeds shall remain growing or present on such land, or until such time as the said inspector shall otherwise direct (whichever shall be the shorter period) the owner or occupier so served shall take each and all of the following measures (in addition to any others which he shall under liability to take) to prevent the spread of noxious weeds:—(a) He shall retain on such

land all livestock which shall be upon the same at the time of service of such notice, and shall not remove or permit the removal or escape from the said land of any such livestock or any wool, or skins of any such livestock: Provided, however, that it shall not be an offence against this by-law if such owner or occupier (as the case may be) removes any such livestock, wool or skins in strict accordance with the provisions of any permit in writing given by the said inspector and deals with the same in the manner directed in such permit. (b) He shall retain on the said land all wheat and other cereals and all produce and sacks which shall be upon the same at the time of the service of such notice (whether the same, being wheat, cereals or produce shall then have been harvested or gathered in or not) and he shall not remove or permit the removal from the said land of any such wheat, cereals, produce or sacks. Provided, however, that it shall not be an offence against this by-law if such owner or occupier (as the case may be) removes any such wheat, cereals, produce or sacks in strict accordance with the provisions of any permit in writing given by the said inspector and deals with the same in the manner directed in such permit. (c) He shall prohibit and prevent the bringing or straying on to such land of any livestock not thereon at the time of such service, and shall take precautions and steps as shall reasonably be necessary for the purpose of preventing the entry of livestock on such land.

- 3. At any time and from time to time after the giving of the notice provided for in the last preceding by-law, the said inspector may enter upon the land the subject thereof and muster, count, take particulars of and (if thought fit) mark in such distinguishing manner as he shall consider requisite all, or any, of such livestock, cereals, produce and sacks upon such land, and no person shall obstruct or interfere with such inspector in the exercise of the powers hereby granted to him.
- 4. Any person who commits any breach of the above by-laws numbered 1 to 3 inclusive shall be guilty of an offence, and he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

TRAFFIC ACT, 1919-1941.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, acting in exercise of the power conferred by section 46 of the Traffic Act, 1919-1941, has been pleased to amend the Traffic Regulations, 1936, made under and for the purpose of the said Act and published in the Government Gazette on the 26th day of August, 1936, and amended from time to time thereafter, in the manner mentioned in the Schedule hereunder.

Schedule.

New regulations to stand as regulations 285A, 285B, 285C and 285D are inserted after regulation 285 as follows:—

- 285A. No person shall—(a) enter or mount upon any omnibus which is on any road unless he is an employee of the owner of the omnibus, or a passenger or about to become a passenger in such omnibus; or (b) hold on to or hang from any external part of an omnibus when it is on any road; or (c) ride upon the roof or any part of an omnibus not intended for occupation by a passenger when such omnibus is on any road; or (d) enter into or depart from or attempt to enter into or depart from an omnibus when such omnibus is in motion on any road.
- 285B. No person shall wilfully prevent or obstruct a passenger from entering into or departing from an omnibus. Provided that this by-law shall not apply to an employee of the owner of the omnibus or any other person who prevents or attempts to prevent a person from entering into or departing from an omnibus when such omnibus is in motion.
- 285C. (1) No person shall enter an omnibus which is on any road, or, if he has entered such omnibus, shall refuse to depart therefrom when he is informed by an employee of the owner of the omnibus that the omnibus is already fully loaded with passengers. (2) Any person who refuses to depart from an omnibus when requested to do so by an employee of the owner of the omnibus may be removed from the omnibus by such employee, who may use such force against the said person as is reasonably necessary to effect such removal.
- 285D. No person, other than an employee of the owner of an omnibus carrying out his duties on such omnibus, shall stand in or on any internal part of an omnibus when a seat therein is available to him, and he is requested by any employee aforesaid not to stand as aforesaid.
