THE ARCHITECTS' BOARD OF W.A.

The Architects' Act, 1921.

WHEREAS by the Architects' Act, 1921, the Architects' Board of W.A. thereby constituted is empowered, with the approval of the Governor in Council, to make and prescribe by-laws; and whereas it is desirable to amend the by-laws: Now, therefore, the Board doth hereby amend the by-laws in the manner following:—

That by-law 25 (b) to be revoked and the following inserted in lieu thereof:—(b) Four months before the first day fixed for the examination one subject for a design problem will be announced by the Board. The problem announced must be worked up by the candidate at leisure and shall consist of plans, elevations, sections, a sketch perspective, a sheet of details and full size mouldings illustrating construction and architectural treatment as for a contract drawn to a larger scale and a shaded drawing from the round of some feature in design. These drawings must be lodged at the office of the Registrar, addressed to the Board, two weeks before the first day fixed for the examination. Candidates must insert and sign a statement on each drawing submitted that such drawing is his own work. Note: The Board may select any particular style.

That section (viii) of by-law 26 be deleted and the following inserted in lieu thereof:—(viii) History of Architecture: Candidates will be required to have a sound knowledge of this subject.

That section (ix) of by-law 26 be deleted and the following inserted in lieu thereof:—(ix) Architectural Design: A design problem shall be announced only in the examination room and shall be worked out there over a period of three examination days as fixed by the Board.
