WHEREAS under the provisions of the Medical Act Amendment Act, 1940, where the Governor in Council is satisfied that any hospital within the meaning of the Mental Treatment Act, 1927, is not adequately provided for in respect of medical or surgical services, the said Governor in Council may, by Proclamation, declare such hospital to be a region within the meaning of the said Act: Now, therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor in and over the State of Western Australia, being satisfied that the Claremont Mental Hospital is not adequately provided for in respect of medical or surgical services, do hereby proclaim the said hospital, together with the whole area of the reserve on which it is erected, to be a region under the provisions of the said Act, to be designated the Claremont Mental Hospital region.

WHEREAS by the Native Administration Act, 1905-1941, it is provided that the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to declare any Crown Lands to be Reserves for Natives; and whereas it is deemed desirable that a Reserve for Natives should be declared at Badjaling: Now, therefore I, James Mitchell, Lieutenant-Governor as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare a Reserve of 1066 acres 3 roods 25 perches at Badjaling, more particularly described in the Schedule hereto, to be a Reserve for Natives.

Schedule.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the southern corner of Avon Location 9223 and extending north-easterly along the south-eastern boundary of said location and onwards to the western-most corner of location 20693; thence south-easterly along the south-western boundaries of locations 20693 and 25212 to the southern corner of the latter location; thence south-westerly and south-easterly along the sides of a one chain road to the northern side of a

one chain road along the northern side of the railway reserve (Quairading to Bruce Rock); thence generally westerly along said northern side of railway reserve to the eastern boundary of Badjaling Townsite Reserve; thence northerly and westerly along boundaries of the said Townsite Reserve to the north-eastern side of a road along the north-eastern side of the No. 2 rabbit-proof fence; and thence north-westerly along said side of road to the starting point. Excluding location 20880 (15175) and road approach thereto.

WHEREAS by section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1940, it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever, in every or any specified portion of Western Australian waters, by means of fishing nets and fishing lines, or either of such means of capture, or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, prohibit the taking, by means of fishing nets, of any fish whatsoever in the Western Australian waters of Sharks Lake, situated about eight (8) miles from the town of Esperance in the Esperance Land District for a period of one (1) year from April 1, 1945, inclusive.

WHEREAS under the provisions of section 4 of the Mining Tenements (War Time Exemption) Act, 1942, it is enacted that during a time of war the Governor may by Proclamation, for the period mentioned in such Proclamation, waive or postpone the payment of rent on any mining tenement which is prescribed and payable under the Mining Act, 1904-1937, and exempt the holder of any mining tenement from his obligation under the Mining Act, 1904-1937, to observe, comply with, or perform any conditions relating to such mining tenement; and whereas a time of war now exists to wit the war in which His Majesty is now engaged with Germany, Italy, and Japan (hereinafter referred to as "the present war") and it is desirable to give effect to the said section 4 in relation to certain mining tenements during the present war: Now, therefore I, Sir James Mitchell, Lieutenant-Governor as aforesaid, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do by this Proclamation direct in relation to the mining tenements set out in the Schedule hereunder and for the period stated in the said Schedule that the payment of rent shall be waived

Between The Western Australian Clothing and Allied Trades' Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, Applicant, and Parrants, Ltd., and others, Respondents.

HAVING heard Mr. E. Phillips on behalf of the abovenamed applicant, and Mr. F. S. Cross on behalf of the abovenamed respondents, the Court hereby orders and declares that Agreement No. 13 of 1941 between the abovenamed parties, having the effect of an Award pursuant to section 65 of the Act, be and the same is hereby amended as follows:—

Clause 5.—Holidays.

Omit subclause (a) hereof and insert in lieu thereof the following:—

(a) Each worker (other than a casual worker) shall be entitled to twelve (12) days' holiday on full pay for each year of service. Such holiday shall be granted in the following manner:—

Subject as hereunder provided, the following nine (9) days, or the days observed in lieu, shall be taken as they occur, namely, New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Anzac Day, Foundation Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day.

The remaining three (3) days shall be taken between the twenty-seventh and thirty-first days of December, inclusive: Provided that, if it be considered by the employer to be inconvenient to grant such three (3) days between the dates above recited, he shall notify the Union in writing on or before December the eleventh, and the employer and the Union shall thereupon agree upon the dates that such three (3) days shall be taken: Provided further, that the dates so agreed upon shall be such as to enable the worker to take the three (3) days due by the last day of February following.
