A proviso is added to the item which reads "Service of Summons or other process or document (not otherwise specified)" as follows:—Provided that where an attempt to effect any such service is unsuccessful, and the Clerk of the Court is satisfied that such failure to effect such service was not due to any fault of the bailiff and that a further attempt to effect such service is necessary, and so certifies in writing under his hand, an additional fee similar in amount to the fees respectively prescribed under this item for a first attempt to effect service as aforesaid shall be payable to the Bailiff for and in respect of the subsequent attempt to effect such service.

2. A proviso is added to the item which reads "Executing any warrant" as follows:—Provided that where the bailiff requires the assistance of another officer or person in the execution of a warrant and the Clerk of the Court is satisfied that such assistance is necessary and so certifies in writing under his hand, an additional fee similar in amount to the fees respectively prescribed under this item shall be payable to the Bailiff to cover the expense incurred by the Bailiff in obtaining such assistance.

3. The item which reads "For keeping possession under a warrant of execution a sum as may be allowed by the Clerk not exceeding per day 10s. or on Goldfields or north of 20° of south latitude, not exceeding per day 15s." is amended by substituting "15s." for "10s." and "£1" for "15s." where they appear in lines 2 and 3 of the said item respectively.
