PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell
TO WIT. K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and
over the State of Western Australia
and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is provided by Ordinance 37 Victoriæ No. 14 that the Governor may from time to time frame, vary or alter rules and regulations not repugnant to any of the provisions of the said Ordinance for the preservation of good order within all ports or harbours, or any port or harbour, to be observed by all persons whatsoever; and whereas the Governor did by Proclamation dated the 14th day of November, 1917, and published in the Government Gazette of the 16th day of November, 1917, make regulations in accordance with the said Ordinance as set forth in the Schedule to such Proclamation; and whereas it is now deemed desirable to amend the said regulations in the manner mentioned in the Schedule hereto: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by the said Ordinance, do hereby amend the said regulations in the manner mentioned in the Schedule hereto.

The Schedule.

The abovementioned regulations are amended by inserting after regulation 16 a new regulation to stand as regulation 16A as follows:—

16A. The Harbour Master is hereby authorised and required whenever in his opinion it is essential to take emergency measures for the safety of the Port and of

the vessels therein and for the preservation of life and property-

- (i) to order the master of any vessel in the Port; to scuttle such vessel forthwith, and
- (ii) to give all necessary directions in relation thereto.

If the master of any vessel neglects or refuses to obey any such order or direction the Harbour Master is hereby authorised and required to scuttle such vessel forthwith, and for that purpose the Harbour Master may call upon any officer or member of the crew of such vessel, any constable, peace officer, or other authority, or any other person to assist him in scuttling such vessel.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 3 of the Public Authorities (Postponement of Elections) Act, 1942-1943, that during a time of war the Governor on the recommendation of the Minister and after due notice given as required by paragraph (c) of subsection (1) of the said section may at any time and from time to time by Proclamation direct that any election required by its or their governing Act or Acts to be held by any public authority or any class or classes of public authority shall be postponed for such period as shall be specified in the Proclamation; and whereas Potato Growers' Advisory Committee as constituted under the Potato Growers Licensing Act, 1941, has in accordance with the provisions of the Public Authorities (Postponement of Elections) Act, 1942-1943, been declared by the Governor to be a public authority under and within the meaning and for the purposes of that Act; and whereas by Proclamations issued under section 3 of that Act and published in the Government Gazette on the 3rd day of September, 1943, and the 16th day of June, 1944, respectively, the Governor directed that the election of Potato Growers' Advisory Committee aforesaid which ordinarily would have been held on the 15th day of June, 1943, be

firstly postponed until the 15th day of June, 1944, and be secondly postponed until the 15th day of June, 1945; and whereas it being deemed expedient that the said election shall be further postponed until the 15th day of June, 1946, the Minister in accordance with paragraph (c) of subsection (1) of section 3 of the said Act has duly given notice of his intention to recommend to me the said Lieutenant-Governor that I by Proclamation issued under section 3 of the said Act shall postpone further until the 15th day of June, 1946, the election of the said Potato Growers' Advisory Committee which ordinarily would have been held on the 15th day of June, 1943, and now stands postponed as aforesaid until the 15th day of June, 1945, and no objection to such further postponement has been made or received: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and on the recommendation of the Minister and in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon me by section 3 of the Public Authorities (Postponement of Elections) Act, 1942-1943, do hereby direct that the election of the said Potato Growers' Advisory Committee which ordinarily would have been held on the 15th day of June, 1943, and which now stands postponed until the 15th day of June, 1945, shall be further postponed until the 15th day of June, 1945, shall be further postponed until the 15th day of June, 1945, shall be further postponed until

Vermin Act, 1918-1942. PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell, K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and over the State of Western Australia Lieutenant-Governor. [L.S.]

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 4 of the Vermin Act, 1918-1942, that "Vermin" means and includes any animal, bird or insect mentioned in the Third Schedule to the said Act, and such other animals, birds or insects the names of which the Governor may by Proclamation add to the said Schedule, and that any Proclamation whereby the names of other animals, birds or insects are added to the Third Schedule may be restricted in its operation to any portion of the State to be defined by the Proclamation; and whereas it is deemed expedient to add to the said Third Schedule the names of the birds, known respectively as "Galah" (Kakatoe Roseicapilla), and "Regent Parrot" (Polytelis Anthopeplus) also known as the "Smoker Parrot" with intent that they shall be "Vermin" for the purposes of the said Act, but to restrict the operation of this Proclamation to that portion of the State comprised within the boundaries of the Morawa Vermin District: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by section 4 of the Vermin Act, 1918-1942, do by this Proclamation add to the Third Schedule to the said Act the names of the birds known respectively as "Galah" (Kakatoe Roseicapilla), and "Regent Parrot" (Polytelis Anthopeplus) also known as the "Smoker Parrot" with intent that the said birds shall be "Vermin" for the purposes of the said Act; but I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall be restricted in its operation to that portion of the State comprised within the boundaries of the Morawa Vermin District.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, on the 18th day of July, 1945, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:—

Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1944.
ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1944, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insur-

ance office approved by the Minister a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under the said Act to all workers employed by him, but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability the Governor may by Order in Council exempt such employer from the operation of the said section; and whereas Bunning Brothers, Limited, a duly incorporated Company, whose registered office is situated at 49-61 Charles street, West Perth, is an employer within the meaning of the said Act, and as such is subject to section 10 of the said Act, and being desirous of obtaining exemption from the operation of the said section has, in accordance with the regulations made under the said Act, made application for such exemption and has satisfied the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against the full amount of its liability to pay compensation to all workers employed by the said Company, and has deposited at the Treasury a security, to wit, Commonwealth Treasury Bonds to the value of £5,000, charged with all payments Bonds to the value of £5,000, charged with all payments to become due by the Company under its liability aforesaid: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the said Act, doth hereby exempt the said Bunning Brothers, Limited, from the operation of section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1944 for a period compensing on the 1st day of July-1944, for a period commencing on the 1st day of July, 1945, and ending on the 30th day of June, 1947.
