INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 8 of 1945.

(Registered 24/7/45.)

THIS Agreement made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, this 28th day of May, 1945, between the Chief Secretary of the State of Western Australia (hereinafter referred to as the Minister) of the one part, and the Western Australian Gaol Officers' Union of Workers (hereinafter referred to as the union) of the other part, witnesseth the parties hereby mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

1. That clause 9 of Agreement No. 13 of 1935 be deleted and the following clause be substituted in lieu thereof:—"The working hours shall be eight hours per day but not more than 88 hours per fortnight."

2. That clause 11A of Agreement No. 13 of 1935 be deleted and the following subclause be substituted in lieu thereof:—"All time worked in excess of the ordinary daily hours as rostered for any one shift shall be classed as overtime and paid for at the rate of time and a-half. Provided that where it is considered necessary to continue an employee on duty for not more than one hour or where the overtime is caused through the failure of another member of the staff to report for duty when rostered equivalent time off on the following day shall be allowed, failing this, the overtime rate shall be paid.

3. This Agreement shall come into force as from the 8th day of June, 1945.

4. This Industrial Agreement shall be read in conjunction with Industrial Agreement No. 13 of 1935, dated the 2nd day of May, 1935.
