Reserve for Natives at Udialla.

PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell, K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and over the State of Western Australia Lieutenant-Governor. and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by section 10 of the Native Administration Act, 1905-1941, it is provided that the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to declare any Crown lands to be Reserves for Natives; and whereas it is deemed desirable that a Reserve for Natives should be declared at Udialla: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare an area of 3,083 acres, 3 roods, 32 perches, more particularly described in the Schedule hereto, to be a Reserve for Natives.

Native Reserve No. 22504—Udialla (Natives) (Udialla Agricultural Area)—Lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10

and 17 (3,083 acres, 3 roods, 32 perches). (Diagram O.P. Perth 981, Plan Udialla Agricultural Area.)

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, on the 20th day of February, 1946, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1944. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1944, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office approved by the Minister a policy of insurance

for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under the said Act to all workers employed by him, but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury, securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor may by Order in Council exempt such employer from the operation of the said section; and whereas the Bank of New South Wales, of St. George's terrace, Perth, in the State of Western Australia, being an employer within the meaning of the said Act, and having made application in accordance with the regulations made under the said Act has proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that as such employer it has established a fund for insurance against its liability aforesaid, and has deposited at the Treasury securities, to wit, a bond of five thousand pounds, given by the said Bank, charged with all payments to become due and payable by the said Bank under its said liability: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby exempt the said Bank of New South Wales as such employer aforesaid from the operation of section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1944, for a period of two years computed from and including the 31st day of March, 1946.

Pilotage Charges.

WHEREAS pursuant to section 2 of Ordinance 37 WHEREAS pursuant to section 2 of Ordinance 37 Victoriae No. 14, a scale or list of Pilotage Charges under and for the purposes of the Port Regulations made under the said Ordinance was made and promulgated by notice published in the Government Gazette on the 28th day of July, 1933, and amended by notice published in the Government Gazette on the 19th day of July, 1935; and whereas it is deemed desirable and expedient to further amend the said scale or list of Pilotage Charges by making special provision for Pilotage Charges from the Outer Harbour provision for Pilotage Charges from the Outer Harbour to the Inner Harbour at Geraldton: Now therefore notice is hereby given that His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power conferred by the said Ordinance has been pleased to amend the said scale or list of Pilotage Charges in the manner hereinafter mentioned and to declare that the said amendment shall have effect as from

the date of the publication of this Notice in the Government Gazette, that is say:—

A new Item 4a is hereby inserted after Item 4 of the said scale or list of Pilotage Charges as follows:

4a. Pilotage Charges from the Outer Harbour to the Inner Harbour at Geraldton shall be at the rate of one penny per ton on the gross registered ton-nage of each vessel, to cover both inward and outward pilotage, but so that the minimum charge shall be £2 and the maximum charge shall be £10.

Regulations for the Guidance of Surveyors. Amendment of Regulations 168 to 172A inclusive.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council acting pursuant to the provisions of the Land Act, 1933-1939, has been pleased to amend in the manner mentioned in the Schedule bereunder regulations 168 to 172A (both inclusive) of the regulations as made under the said Act for the Guidance of Surveyors and published in the Government Gazette in particular on the 24th December, 1931, and the 2nd March, 1934.

SCHEDULE.

The abovementioned regulations are amended as follows:-

- 1. Regulations 168 to 172 (both inclusive) (Gazette 24/12/1931) are repealed, and new regulations are inserted in lieu thereof as follows:-
- 168. The fees payable to Contract Surveyors for surveys carried out under the regulations, will be at the following rates:-
 - (i) For the determination of true azimuth on isolated blocks, or at (a) intervals of about three miles on continuous surveys, or for checking patent discrepancies, or
 - (ii) For the determination of latitude when necessary-Ten shillings for each complete set of observations approved by the Surveyor General.
 - (b) For the obliteration of permanently marked boundaries or road lines-Eight shillings per mile.
 - (c) For each reference mark as prescribed in Clause 47 of the General Regulations-Three shillings.
 - (i) For the actual length of all new boundaries surveyed and marked-One shilling and three pence per chain.
 - (ii) For each tree referred to in Regulation 107-One shilling.
 - (e) For the actual length of all old boundaries, or portions of old boundaries, ranged, chained and corrected when the Surveyor General is satisfied that the work was necessary-One shilling and three pence per chain when an interval of fifteen or more years has elapsed since a previous survey of the boundary, and-Nine pence per chain when the interval that has elapsed exceeds two years, but is less than fifteen years. In addition payment at the rates prescribed in subsection (f) will be made for all old marks renewed or replaced.
 - (f) For each new angle, post or peg, or old post or peg renewed on rural surveys and on suburban lots over five acres-

Posts as prescribed in General Regulations 38a, 41. 43, and in Departmental Regulation 87 Pegs as prescribed in General Regulations 38b, 45 Pegs as prescribed in General Regulations 38c, 46 3 0 Posts as prescribed in General Regulation 42 0 Spikes as prescribed in General Regulation 42 or when used to renew old reference marks on rural surveys, to mark important intersections, or to fix old corners not previously referenced

In the case of new work in rural lands, extra payment will not be made for reference marks at corners or for the marks prescribed in General Regulation 40.

- (g) (i) For tie lines, feature surveys, river and all other traverses—Nine pence per chain.
 - (ii) For each marked tree as prescribed in Regulation 98-Three shillings.
- (iii) For each post and cairn as prescribed in Regulation 99—Seven shillings and six pence.
- (h) (i) For trial lines run with theodolite and chain, when in the opinion of the Surveyor General it has been necessary to clear both the trial line and the permanent boundary—Nine pence per chain.
- (ii) For the verification chainage referred to in Regulation 50—Two pence per chain.
- (i) For travelling from Perth, or from the Surveyor's headquarters to the site of the first survey carried out, and thereafter from job to job if more than four miles apart:—
- (i) When the distance does not exceed 100 miles: for a Surveyor with one employee—One and nine pence per mile. For a Surveyor with two employees—Two shillings per mile. For a Surveyor with three employees—Two shillings and three pence per mile. Other cases by special arrangement.
- (ii) When the distance exceeds 100 miles, each mile up to 100 will be paid for at the above rates, and each mile in excess of 100 will be paid for at three-fourths of those rates. Distance between jobs must be measured in a direct line, and if a survey is in any way continuous or connected, a travelling allowance will not be paid.
- (j) For roads, 1s. 4d. per chain when marked on one side only in the same manner as other boundaries and 2s. 6d. per chain when marked on both sides. No charge will be allowed for measuring secant distances or cross widths when marking roads.
- (k) Clearing a hill, marking by a post, erecting a cairn and pole, and taking a round of angles therefrom, as set out in Regulation 100, when the Surveyor General considers the procedure justified, shall be considered to constitute one day's work for a Surveyor and party, and shall be paid for at the rates prescribed in the next following subsection.
- (1) When the work carried out by a Surveyor, or Surveyor and party, is paid for at a daily rate, that rate shall be:
 - (i) For a Surveyor employed on office work—£2 5s. per working day.
 - (ii) For a Surveyor and one employee-£4 4s. per working day.
 - (iii) For a Surveyor and two employees-£5 8s, per working day.
 - (iv) For each additional employee-£1 4s, per working day.

Provided that these amounts will vary by 1s., 2s., 3s., and 1s. per working day respectively with every variation of 5s. per week from the present metropolitan basic wage of £5 6s. 1d. per week.

In addition the Surveyor will be allowed the actual expenses incurred in providing the necessary posts, pegs and spikes.

- (m) For preliminary traverse surveys of timber areas, roads, natural and other features effected with a chain and prismatic compass, 3d. per chain may be allowed when, in the opinion of the Surveyor General, such traverses were necessary and when the field notes of such surveys are lodged.
- 169. The fees payable to Contract Surveyors for the work involved in the classification and valuation required under Departmental Regulation 143 will be at the following rate:—
 - (a) For the actual length of internal compass traverse lines and of previously surveyed boundaries for which the necessary information has not been supplied—1½d. per chain. The intervals between traverse lines will depend on the nature of the country to be classified; but a sufficient number should be run to ensure that the classification is accurate. When a Surveyor, after consulting the applicant, arrives on the ground for the purpose of effecting the survey of a selection, and is unable to proceed with the survey because the boundaries as applied for do not include the land required, and it is impracticable to amend the selection to include the desired area, or when a Surveyor is engaged on work of such a nature that, if it were paid for at the schedule rates, it would not recompense him for actual outlay and loss of time, the Surveyor may be paid for the loss of time involved at a rate per hour, to be derived from the rates prescribed in Regulation 168 (1) and calculated on the basis of a 44 hour week.

In addition the prescribed rates for travelling will be paid and the Surveyor will be re-imbursed for any outlay involved in the provision of posts, pegs, and spikes.

171. When marking town and suburban lots, the Surveyor will be employed under the daily rates prescribed in Regulation 168 (1) or under a special agreement.

When the work is carried out under the daily rates, posts, pegs and spikes will be supplied by the Surveyor General.
