IN pursuance of the provisions of section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1940, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Western Australia, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets in any of the portions of Western Australian waters specified in the Schedule hereto from January 1, 1946, until December 31, 1948, inclusive.

#### Schedule.

(1) The whole of the waters of the Denmark River, and its tributaries, and that portion of the waters of Wilson's Inlet within a radius of half-a-mile from the

mouth of the said Denmark River.
(2) The whole of the waters of the Hay River, and its tributaries, and that portion of the waters of Wilson's Inlet east and south-east of a line drawn from the north-east corner of Plantagenet Location 1500 to the south-west corner of Plantagenet Location 3502.

(3) The whole of the waters (including tributaries) of Parry's Harbour.

(4) The whole of the waters of Bow River (near

Irwin's Inlet).
(5) Wilson's Inlet (Denmark)—All that area of Wilson's Inlet near the Channel Entrance westward of a line drawn in a generally northerly direction from the north-western corner of Plantagenet Location No. 1992 (on the southern shore of the inlet) to the south-western corner of Plantagenet Location No. 5433 (on the northern shore of the inlet).

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1940, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Western Australia, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets in any of the portions of Western Australian waters specified in the Schedule hereto for a period of three years as from the date of publication of this Proclamation in the Government Gazette.

#### Schedule.

Port Dongarra (Dongarra)—All that area of Western Australian waters at Port Dongarra (Dongarra) commencing at high-water mark at a point 200 yards north of the Dongarra jetty; thence extending in a northwesterly direction to a distance of 200 yards; thence in a south-westerly direction to a distance of one halfmile, and thence in a south-easterly direction to a point on the foreshore 200 yards south of the said jetty.

# Ports and Harbours Act, 1917. PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 2 of the Ports and Harbours Act, 1917, that it shall be lawful for the Governor by proclamation to declare that any place bounded as set out in the proclamation shall be a port or harbour for the purpose of Ordinanees 18 Victoriae No. 15 (the Shipping and Pilotage Con-solidation Ordinance, 1855) and 37 Victoriae No. 14, and by section 4 of the same Act that the Governor may by proclamation revoke or vary any proclamation issued under the said Act; and whereas by a pro-clamation issued under the said Act and published in the Government Gazette on the 16th day of November, 1917, the Governor constituted the Port of Perth with boundaries as set forth in such proclamation; and whereas it is now deemed desirable and expedient to amend the boundaries of the said Port of Perth by excising certain waters therefrom with the intent that such waters may be included in Fremantle Harbour, and to amend the proclamation hereinbefore mentioned accordingly: Now, therefore, I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 2 and 4 of the Ports and Harbours Act, 1917, do hereby amend the boundaries of the Port of Perth heretofore constituted as aforesaid by excising from the said Port of Perth those waters heretofore included therein which are contained within the boundaries more particularly described, defined and delineated in the schedule horeunder with the intent that the said waters when excised from the Port of Perth as aforesaid shall be included in and become part of the Fremantle Harbour; and I do hereby declare that the said proclamation whereby the Port of Perth was constituted as hereinbefore mentioned is hereby amended accordingly.

#### Schedule.

All that portion of the Swan River, bounded by lines starting from a point at the intersection of the H.W.M. of the right bank of the said river, with the western alignment of the new North Fremantle Traffic Bridge, and extending southerly, along the said alignment, to the H.W.M. of the left bank of the river; thence generally south-westerly downwards along the said bank, to a point situate one chain easterly from the centre-line of the Fremantle Railway Bridge; thence northerly, parallel and distant one chain from the said centre-line, to a point on the H.W.M. of the said right bank; and thence generally north-easterly, along the said right bank, to the starting point, including all banks, flats or islands exposed at high or low tides.

WHEREAS by section 10 of the Native Administration Act, 1905-194I, it is provided that the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to declare any Crown Lands to be Reserves for Natives; and whereas it is deemed desirable that a Reserve for Natives should be declared at Norseman: Now, therefore, I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare an area of 19,745 acres in the Dundas district, more particularly described in the Schedule hereto, to be a Reserve for Natives.

#### Schedule.

Bounded by lines starting at Cairn B21 on Mount Thirsty and extending south about 715 chains; thence east about 360 chains; thence in a northerly direction along the western shore of Lake Cowan to a point due east of said Cairn B21; thence west about 126 chains to the starting point. Excluding Miners' Homestead Leases Nos. 18 and 73 and all existing roads and reserves. (Native Reserve No. 22465.)

### Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note: Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement."

This Award shall apply to all persons employed in the delivery or conveyance of bread.

#### (iii) Casuals-

Casual hands shall be paid two shillings (2s.) per day in excess of the rates prescribed for weekly hands. If employed only part of the day, the extra two shillings (2s.) shall be paid. The minimum payment to a casual hand shall be for four (4) hours in any one day.

(iv) Bread carters who are required in any week to collect moneys and account for them as part of their duties, are to be paid one shilling (1s.) a week in addition to the rates before mentioned.

Forty-four (44) hours of labour, inclusive of the time necessary for stabling and loading, but exclusive of the time occupied for meals, shall constitute a week's work: Provided that, in any week where there is a holiday, the hours of duty shall be thirty-six (36) hours and forty (40) minutes, and in any week where there are two (2) holidays twenty-nine (29) hours and twenty (20) minutes shall constitute a week's work: Provided also that any hours worked on any day or days to make up the hours of duty in any week shall be worked in a continuous shift.

#### 4.—Overtime.

All overtime shall stand alone and be paid for in addition to the ordinary wage, at the rate of time and a quarter for the first two (2) hours and time and a half thereafter.

Overtime shall be paid for all time of duty:—
(a) in excess of the hours prescribed in Clause 3; or (b) after eight and one-half (8½) hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive and eight (8) hours on Saturdays; or

(c) before the prescribed starting time or after

the prescribed finishing time.

# 5.—Holiday Pay.

For all time of duty on holidays (see definitions), payment shall be made at the rate of ordinary time (one day's pay) in addition to the weekly wage, except on Good Friday and Christmas Day, when all time on duty shall be paid for at the rate of one and a half day's pay in addition to the weekly wage. Any worker required to work on a holiday shall be paid at least half a day's wage at holiday rate.

### 6.—Sunday Work.

Sunday work shall consist of attendance on horses only. All time worked on Sundays shall stand alone and be paid for at time and a half.

# 7 .- Starting and Finishing Time.

(a) The starting time or times for the purpose of calculating overtime shall be as specified by a notice kept in the time and wages book and shall be 6 a.m. or after, Mondays to Fridays inclusive, and on Saturdays 5 a.m. or after; and the finishing time 6 p.m. Mondays to Fridays inclusive, and 1.30 p.m. on Satur-

(b) Where an employer desires to vary or change the starting time or times specified in the notice prescribed by subclause (a) hereof, he shall give one week's notice of such variation or change to his workers and

alter the notice in the book accordingly.

(c) The day's work shall be deemed to commence at the time the bread carter arrives at his employer's premises and to terminate when he finally leaves them for the day.

#### 8.—Pay Day.

Wages shall in all cases be paid weekly. No employer shall hold more than one (1) day's wages in hand

#### 9.—Board and Lodging.

Except in the case of parent and son, a worker shall not board or lodge with his employer or on his pre-

#### 10.—Shortages.

A worker shall not be held responsible for shortages in money or bread, unless notified by the employer or his authorised servant in respect to same within twentyfour (24) hours of such appearing in his delivery book or bread book.

#### 11.—Shipping Trade.

The provisions of clause 7 as to starting time shall not apply to delivering to ships at Fremantle or hospitals.

#### 12.—Area.

This Award shall apply to the locality comprised within a radius of twenty-five (25) miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

#### 13.—Term.

This Award shall operate as from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after 12th December, 1945, and shall continue in force for a period of three (3) years from the date hereof, subject to the right to apply to amend in pursuance of the Act or this Award.

In the event of the holidays prescribed under The Bread Act, 1903-1938, being varied or cancelled, leave to apply to the Court for a variation of clauses 5, 15 (e) and 16 is hereby reserved to any party bound by this Award.

#### 14.—General Conditions.

- (a) A copy of this Award shall be kept in a place where the industry is being carried on where it is easily accessible to the workers.
- (b) Juniors may be employed in the following proportion: One junior to every five (5) adult bread carters employed.
- (c) Not more than one casual hand may be employed at any time, and then only where there are three (3) weekly workers employed.
- (d) Employers shall, when engaging workers, state definitely whether such worker is engaged as weekly or casual hand.
- (e) Employers shall notify their workers on the working day immediately preceding a holiday if their services are required next day. Failing such notice, the worker shall be entitled to take the holiday and to receive a full week's wage.

#### 15.—Definitions.

- (a) "Junior" shall mean any person under the age of twenty-one (21) years in receipt of less than adult
- (b) "Casual hand" shall mean a worker engaged as such, whose contract of service shall be an hourly one terminable at any time without notice.
- (c) The "Representative of the Union" shall mean any person authorised in writing by the president and secretary of the Amalgamated Road Transport Union of Workers, Perth.
- (d) "Bread carter" shall mean and include any person employed delivering or conveying bread anywhere other than at the shop or bakehouse of his employer.
- (e) "Holidays" for the purpose of this Award shall mean Anniversary Day (or the day observed in lieu), New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day: Provided that if Christmas Day, Boxing Day, or New Year's Day falls on a Sunday—
  - (i) a day shall be added to the annual holidays; and
  - (ii) no reduction shall be made to the weekly hours of labour; and
  - (iii) the day generally observed in lieu shall be regarded as an ordinary working day.

#### 16.-Annual Holidays.

All workers shall be given 11 days (1 5/6 week's pay) leave of absence on full pay after the expiration of each twelve (12) months' service. Such leave shall be given to and taken by the worker within three (3) months of becoming due. Where the engagement of months of becoming due. Where the engagement of any worker to which this subclause applies is terminated after one month's continuous service, or after any period of continuous service from the date on which the previous annual holidays became due, he shall be paid in lieu of holidays in proportion to the length of his service.

#### 17.—Payment for Sickness, etc.

A worker other than a casual hand shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance, on the ground of personal ill-health, for one half day for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to six (6) days in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

### 18.—Engagement.

One (1) week's notice at any time on either side shall be required before the engagement of any but a casual hand shall be terminated.

### 19.—Learning a Round.

An employer shall be permitted to reduce for nine (9) consecutive working days the prescribed wage by fifty per cent. (50%) whilst a worker is learning a round.

Boys helping earter (not driving): Boys shall be permitted to accompany workers on their rounds and to deliver bread on the following occasions:—

- (i) On Saturdays and double or treble days:
- (ii) for one (1) week whilst the usual driver is absent and a new worker is learning the round.

The employer shall pay for this work two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) for each day the boy is employed.

Except as to the provisions of this clause, this Award shall not apply to such boys.

#### 20.-Meal Times.

Not more than one half ( $\frac{1}{2}$ ) hour shall be deducted for meal times in any one (1) day.

## 21.—Time and Wages Book.

A time and wages book shall be kept where the worker usually commences work, which shall show the name of each bread-carter, the time he starts and finishes work each day, the number of hours worked, the amount of overtime worked, the wages paid, the worker's signature to same. The employer and the worker shall be jointly responsible for the proper posting of the book daily, except as to the finishing time, for which the worker alone shall be responsible. Such book shall be open to inspection by the secretary of the Amalgamated Road Transport Union of Workers, Perth, or any other person authorised in writing by him, during working hours.

### 22.—Board of Reference.

- (a) A Board of Reference is hereby appointed for the purposes of the Award. Such Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. There are assigned to such Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Award, the function of-
  - (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award or any of them;
    (ii) classifying and fixing wages, rates and con-

ditions for any occupation or calling not specifically

mentioned in the Award;

(iii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.

(b) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.

### 23.—Employment of Females.

The employment of females shall be prohibited except by agreement between the parties registered at the Court, or failing such agreement then at such rates of pay and on such conditions as may be determined by the Board of Reference.

Provided that nothing herein shall prevent the continued employment of such females as are employed at the date of commencement of this Award.

### 24.—Liberty to Apply.

This Award is based on conditions existing in the industry at the date hereof and liberty is reserved to either party to apply to the Court or the Board of Reference for a variation of any of the undermentioned clauses in the event of the cessation of zoning:—2—Wages; 3—Hours; 4—Overtime; 7—Starting and Finishing Times; 20—Meal Times; 15 (e) and 16—Holidays.
