PROCLAMATION.

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, { By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell, TO WIT. { K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and JAMES MITCHELL, over the State of Western Australia Lieutenant-Governor. and its Dependencies in the Common-[L.S.] wealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by regulation 2 of the Building Regulations contained in the Second Schedule of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1943, it is provided, in reference to buildings on any block of land laid out for building, that the area allotted to any building, and the open space used in connection with such building shall together be not less than the area for the time being fixed by Proclamation as the minimum area to be allotted to any building in the locality (defined in the Proclamation) in which such building is to be erected; and whereas a Proclamation was issued under the said Act and published in the Government Gazette on the 12th August, 1932, page 1121, fixing an area of not less than 9,900 square feet as the area to be allotted to every building and the open space to be used therewith in the Peppermint Grove Road District; and whereas it is deemed expedient to vary the said area as fixed by the said Proclamation and in lieu thereof to provide for the minimum area of every here thereof to provide for the minimum area of every building intended to be or capable of being used as a dwelling house and of the open space exclusively belong-ing thereto in the locality forming part of the Pepper-mint Grove Road District which is bounded on the north by the southern alignment of Johnston street from its intersection with Stirling highway to the intersection of that alignment with the western alignment of Palmerston street proceeding in a southerly direction along that street, proceeding in a southerly direction along that alignment to the southern boundary of the Peppermint Grove Road District; thence following the said southern boundary in a westerly direction to the intersection of that boundary with the eastern alignment of Stirling highway; thence proceeding in a northerly direction along Stirling highway to the starting point, which locality is referred to as Locality "A"; and also to provide for a different minimum area of every building intended to be or capable of being used as a dwelling house and the open space exclusively belonging thereto in the locality of the Peppermint Grove Road District excluding therefrom the said Locality "A" forming the remaining portion of the said Road District: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting by and with the consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke the said Proclamation of the 12th day of August, 1932, and doth by this Proclamation declare (1) that the minimum area to be allotted to every building intended to be or capable of being used as a dwelling house and the open space exclusively belonging thereto in the said Locality "A" in the Peppermint Grove Road District shall be an area of not less than 3,648 square feet, and (2) that the minimum area to be allotted to every building intended to be or capable of being used as a dwelling house and of the open space exclusively belonging thereto in the locality of the Peppermint Grove Road District, exclud-ing therefrom the said Locality " Λ ," shall be an area of not less than 9,900 square feet.

of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act. namely:-

Metropolitan Water Supply Improvements and Extensions.

Mundaring Road District.

Proposed water supply improvements and extensions at Swan View, as shown in red on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A., No. 6781.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 4th day of September, 1945.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 19 of the Health Act, 1911-1944, that the Governor may by Order in Council constitute any portion of this State, not being a municipal district, a health district within such boundaries and by such names as may be specified in the Order, and may abolish any such district, or alter the boundaries of any such district; and whereas by Order in Council dated the 10th May, 1923, as published in the *Government Gazette* of the 17th May, 1923, the Townsite of Lake Grace was declared a Health District to be known as the Lake Grace Health District; and whereas it is desired to extend the said Health District: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by sec-tion 19 of the Health Act, 1911-1944, doth hereby extend the said Health District to embrace the Townsites of Lake Biddy, Newdegate, Lake King and Lake Varley.
