ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.R. 23/43.

WHEREAS the enactment contained in section 74 of the Constitution Act, 1899, by which the appointment of all public officers under the Government of the State is vested in the Governor in Council does not apply to minor appointments, which by Order in Council are vested in Heads of Departments or other officers or persons within the State; and whereas it is desirable that the appointment of Foremen and all other persons employed at a daily rate of wage on works under the control of the Commissioner of Main Roads should be vested in John Campbell King and John James Greenway Punch: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby vests in John Campbell King and John James Greenway Punch, and any person or persons

appointed to temporarily act in their place, the appointment of foremen and all persons employed on such works at a daily rate of wages.
