RECLASSIFICATION OF THE TEACHING STAFF.

THE State Arbitration Court, with the concurrence of His Honour the Chief Judge of the Commonwealth Arbitration Court, has now given the necessary consent to the correction of anomalies in relation to the salaries of the Teaching Staff of the Education Department.

The proposed reclassification as published in this issue of the Government Gazette is subject to appeal to the Teachers' Appeal Board, provided that existing Australian standards are not to be departed from.

RECLASSIFICATION OF THE TEACHING STAFF OF THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT FROM 1st JULY, 1946.

This classification of teachers has retrospective effect from the 1st day of July, 1946, and replaces the old salary scale:-

Basic Wage Adjustment.

(1) The salary scales shown in the reclassification have been fixed in relation to the annual equivalent of the weekly basic wages declared by the Industrial Court of Arbitration of W.A. This classification is based on an annual equivalent of £261.

- (2) The salary scales for adult male teachers shown below shall be subject to adjustment at the rate of £5 per annum for every variation, either up or down, of 1s. 11d. per week in the basic wage, except that teachers whose salary is in excess of £700 per annum will be subject to adjustment only when the basic wage fluctuation represents in the aggregate, either up or down, an amount of 7s. 8d. per week, an adjustment of £20 per annum shall be made.
- (3) Male junior teachers whose salary rates are less than the basic wage shall be adjusted pro rata with the adult male minimum rate, calculated to the nearest £1.
- (4) No male teacher of the age of 21 years shall receive less than the basic wage rate.
- (5) Teachers located in an area for which an independent basic wage has been declared higher than the Metropolitan basic wage shall be paid the difference between such basic wage rates as an allowance, calculated to the nearest £5.
- (6) The salary scale for female teachers shall be subject to adjustment at the rate of 80 per cent. to the nearest £1 of any adjustment applicable to male teachers.

Conservator'') of the other part, witnesseth that it is mutually agreed between the parties hereto as follows:—

1.-Area and Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to all officers who occupy or whose duties are such that they should occupy any of the positions on the staff of the Conservator as are the subject of section 2 of this Agreement.

Officers who remain more or less continuously in Districts during the Fire Season, because of the duties associated with Fire Control, receive extra leave for one week, and £18 per annum more salary (equivalent to 6s. 11d. per week in the case of Assistant Foresters and Forest Assistants on a weekly salary of the basic wage plus a margin).

All officers, irrespective of their duties and of the special conditions stated above, may be called upon to engage in actual fire suppression as required. This must be regarded as part of the ordinary duty of all members of the Field Staff.

3.—Progression from Minimum to Maximum of Class.

Subject to good conduct, diligence and efficiency to the satisfaction of the Conservator, officers shall proceed from the minimum to the maximum of the class by annual increments.

4.—Basic Wage.

The salary rates contained herein have been calculated on the basic wage declaration made by the Industrial Court of Arbitration of Western Australia and applying as at 1st January, 1946, in the Agricultural Areas as defined by the said Act and such salary rates shall be subject to adjustment by adding or subtracting, as the case may be, the difference per annum to the nearest pound (£1) between the basic wage applying in that area as at 1st January, 1946, and the basic wage declared thereafter from time to time for that area by the said Court.

Salaries of officers located in an area for which an independent basic wage has been declared shall be adjusted by a corresponding increase or decrease equal to the difference between these separate declarations and that for the Agricultural Areas above referred to.

For the purpose of this adjustment the annual basic wage shall be calculated by multiplying the weekly rate by fifty-two and one-sixth $(52\ 1/6th)$.

Provided that officers attached to Classes 1 and 2 as constituted by section 2 of this Agreement shall not be subject to the provisions governing the one pound

multiple as herein provided for, but shall be paid in accordance with the actual basic wage as declared by the Court of Arbitration from time to time.

5.—Attachment to Classes.

Forthwith upon completion of this Agreement the Conservator will cause to be published in the Government Gazette a classification of the officers concerned, which shall show his attachment of the officers to the classes constituted by section 2 of this Agreement.

Officers who consider they have been attached to the incorrect classes by the Conservator may then exercise their rights of appeal to the Public Service Appeal Board.

6.-Maintenance of Salaries.

Nothing in this Agreement shall lower the rate of salary any officer was in receipt of at the coming into force of this Agreement.

7.—Resident Officers.

A Forester's work lies in the forest, A member of the Field Staff shall be required to be resident at his District Centre and, in the case of a married manlive with his family.

8.—Term of Agreement.

This Agreement shall be for a term of five (5) years commencing from the 1st January, 1946. Provided that either party to the Agreement may, after the 1st
