WHEREAS by sections 223 and 225 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906-1943 (6 Edward, No. 32), it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request of the Council, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street or way, or any place, bridge, or thoroughfare, to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation, become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of

CONSTITUTION ACTS AMENDMENT ACT, 1899 (AS AMENDED BY THE CONSTITUTION ACTS AMENDMENT ACT AMENDMENT ACT (No. 4), 1945).

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council acting pursuant to section 41A of the Constitution Acts Amendment Act, 1899 (as amended by the Constitution Acts Amendment Act Amendment Act (No. 4) 1945), has been pleased to make under and for the purposes of the said Act the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereunder.

Schedule.
Regulations.

1. In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires—"the Act" shall mean the Constitution Act Amendment Act, 1899 (as amended by the Constitution Acts Amendment Act Amendment Act (No. 4) 1945).

"Committee" shall mean a Select Committee (whether a Select Committee of either House or a Joint Select Committee).

"Place of domicile" shall mean the town or locality in which a member is for the time being residing.

"Member" shall mean a member of the Legislative Council or of the Legislative Assembly who is appointed a member of a Committee or Royal Commission.

"Metropolitan Area" shall mean an area having a radius of 15 miles from the General Post Office, at Perth.

"To reimburse" shall mean to pay, under and for the purposes of section 41A of the Act, an expenses allowance for and in respect of expenses which may necessarily or reasonably be incurred while travelling within the State in connection with or incidentally to the discharge of duties as a member of a Committee or Royal Commission and the terms "reimburse" and "reimbursement" shall have corresponding meanings.

2. Subject as hereinafter provided a member shall be reimbursed in accordance with the following rates:—

3. (a) For the purpose of computing reimbursement the daily rate shall represent the total cost of three meals and a bed during each day of travelling so that the cost of any one meal or the cost of a bed shall represent one quarter of the daily rate.

(b) Reimbursement in respect of the first meal or bed after a member's departure from his place of domicile or the last meal or bed before his return to his place of domicile shall be determined according to the time of his departure from or return to his place of domicile as follows:—A member shall be reimbursed the cost of breakfast if his return is later or his departure earlier than 8 a.m.; lunch, if his return is later or his departure earlier than 1 p.m.; dinner, if his return is later or his departure earlier than 6 p.m.; and a bed, if his return is later than 11 p.m.

4. When a sleeping berth is provided for the accommodation of a member he shall not be reimbursed the cost of a bed unless he has necessarily incurred expense elsewhere in respect of a bed for a portion of the same night.

5. When a member, whose place of domicile is within the metropolitan area, is required to travel outside the metropolitan area in connection with or incidentally to the discharge of his duties as a member of a Committee or Royal Commission he shall be reimbursed from the time of his departure from his place of domicile to the time of his return to his place of domicile. Provided that a member whose place of domicile is within the metropolitan area shall not be reimbursed while travelling within the metropolitan area.

6. When a member, whose place of domicile is outside the metropolitan area, is required to leave his place of domicile and travel to another part of the State in connection with or incidentally to the discharge of his duties as a member of a Committee or Royal Commission he shall be reimbursed as follows:—

(a) If he is travelling outside the metropolitan area he shall be reimbursed for the period of his absence from his place of domicile.

(b) If he is travelling to the metropolitan area he shall be reimbursed only for the period of his absence from his place of domicile which is in excess of the time he is necessarily absent therefrom for the purpose of attending Parliament during every day Parliament is sitting.

7. A member shall not be reimbursed unless such reimbursement has been approved by the Committee or Royal Commission of which he is a member and such approval is certified under the hand of the Chairman thereof.

8. A member of the Executive Council with the designation "Honorary Minister" shall be reimbursed for and in respect of expenses which may necessarily or reasonably be incurred by him while travelling in connection with or incidentally to, the discharge by him of his duties as such member of the Executive Council in accordance with the following rates:—

(a) While travelling within the State but outside the metropolitan area, £1 5s. per day to be computed in accordance with the provisions of regulation 3 of these regulations. Provided that when a Ministerial car is used actual out-of-pocket expenses only shall be paid.

(b) While travelling in any part of the Commonwealth other than the State of Western Australia, £2 2s. per day. Provided that while travelling on board ship to any part of the Commonwealth or by train between Perth and Adelaide, an amount equal to 30 per cent. of the first class boat or rail fare (calculated on the cost of a fare for a single journey) only shall be paid.

THE HEALTH ACT, 1911-1944.

The City of Perth.

The Health By-laws (Amendment).

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Health Act, 1911-1944, a local authority may make by-laws and may amend, repeal or alter any by-laws so made: Now, therefore, the Council of the City of Perth being a local authority doth hereby order that the by-laws made by it under the said Act and gazetted on the 24th day of December, 1925 (as altered by an amendment gazetted on the 23rd day of February, 1945), be amended as follows:—

Schedule A to Part 1 is amended by the deletion of paragraph (c) thereof and the substitution of a new paragraph in lieu thereof as follows:—

s. d.

“(c). For the removal of food waste or fish offal, per bin not exceeding 3 cubic feet capacity, per removal 1 0
or per week (whichever shall be the greater) 3 0”

Passed by the Council of the City of Perth at the ordinary meeting of the Council held on the 18th day of November, 1946.

The abovementioned Jetties Act Regulations, 1940, are amended as follows:—

1. By adding to Part III. thereof after regulation 105 a new subdivision C comprising the following new regulations:—

C.—Regulations and Charges for the Use of Mooring Springs.

105A. The master of a vessel when berthing such vessel at any public jetty under the control of the Department at which mooring springs are provided by the Department, for the safe berthing of vessels, shall use the mooring springs so provided.

105B. The master or owner of any such vessel shall pay to the Department the charges for the use of such springs prescribed in Appendix I. to these regulations.

105C. The Officer in Charge shall decide the number of springs which shall be used by the master of a vessel for the berthing thereof and he may at any time require such additional mooring springs to be used as appears to him to be necessary.

105D. The springs available for use on the jetty shall be picked up by the master of the vessel from where they are located on the jetty, and a receipt for same shall be given by or on behalf of the master to the Officer in Charge.

105E. The master of a vessel who uses such mooring springs shall cause them to be laid in position and replaced after use, and in the event of the master not replacing them after use, an officer of the Department may replace them at the expense of the master or owner of such vessel.

105F. A person shall not, unless authorised by the Officer in Charge, approach within twelve feet of any bollard, or any other part of such public jetty to which any mooring spring or rope is fastened.

105G. The master, owner, or agent of any vessel using such mooring springs shall be responsible:—

(a) for the maintenance of such springs in good order and condition whilst they are in his possession;

(b) shall deliver such springs, after use, to the Officer in Charge in good order and condition;

(c) shall pay the cost of any damage caused to such springs as a result of such use.

105H. The master of a vessel when transferring the vessel from one berth to another may remove any mooring springs used for mooring such vessel to the new berth, but he shall in any event replace such springs after use in their original position or as the Officer in Charge may direct.

2. By adding to Appendix I. under the heading "Carnarvon Jetty" after the paragraph relating to Berthage Dues, a new paragraph as follows:—

Hire of Mooring Springs:—Thirty shillings (30s.) per spring per day or part thereof exceeding twelve hours. For periods not exceeding twelve hours, the charge shall be fifteen shillings (15s.) per spring.

BUSH FIRES ACT, 1937-1945.

By-laws of the Cuballing Road Board relating to the Establishment, Maintenance and Equipment of Bush Fire Brigades for the Road District of Cuballing.

Establishment of Brigade.

1. On the resolution of the Board to establish, maintain and equip a Bush Fire Brigade under the provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1937-1945, and regulations thereunder, the Brigade shall be formed in accordance with these by-laws; and a name shall be given to the Brigade and application accompanied by a copy of these by-laws shall be made to the Minister for Lands for its registration accordingly.

A bush fire brigade may be established for the whole of the road district or for any specified area thereof. Provided that, unless the resolution of the Board establishing a bush fire brigade specifies therein only a part of the district as the area for which such brigade is established, the brigade shall be deemed to be established for the whole of the said road district.

Appointment of Officers.

2. The Board shall appoint a captain, a first lieutenant, a second lieutenant and such additional lieutenants as it shall deem necessary to act as officers of the Brigade, and who, in the Board's opinion, have the necessary qualification and knowledge of the district required in such capacities.

3. The secretary of the Board or such other person as the Board may appoint, shall be the secretary of the Brigade.

4. The Board may appoint an equipment officer who shall be responsible for the custody and maintenance in good order and condition of all equipment and appliances acquired by the Board for the purposes of the Brigade. Such officer may station such equipment at a depot approved by the captain where, if possible, motor trucks can easily be called upon. If there are more than one such depots in the area, the equipment officer shall appoint at each depot a person to look after the equipment and have it ready for immediate use when required.

5. The Board shall appoint bush fire control officers in accordance with the requirements of the district and may prescribe the area over which each such officer shall have jurisdiction. The employment, dismissal and payment for services of persons (other than officers) employed for duties under this Act, shall be vested in the chairman and secretary of the Board conjointly.

Duties of Officers.

6. The duties of all officers appointed under these by-laws shall be as laid down in the provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1937-1945, and each officer so appointed shall be supplied with a copy of the Act and Regulations. The captain shall have full control over the members of the Brigade whilst engaged in fire fighting and shall issue instructions as to the methods to be adopted by the firemen. In the absence of the captain, the first lieutenant; and in the absence of the first, the second lieutenant or senior officer of the Brigade present at the fire shall exercise all the power and duties of the captain. The captain shall when so directed by the Board instruct all land owners or occupiers to plough a break or breaks on all cleared land or land under pasture.

Membership of Brigade.

7. (1) The membership of a bush fire brigade may consist of the following:—(a) subscribing members; (b) fire fighting members; and (c) associate members.

(2) Subscribing members shall be those persons, who, being interested in forwarding the objects of the Brigade, pay an annual subscription to the funds of the Brigade at the following rates:—

(i) owner or occupier of land within the Brigade area—minimum subscription of	10 0
(ii) other persons—a minimum subscription of	5 0

(3) Fire fighting members shall be those persons, being able-bodied men over 18 years of age who are willing to render service at any bush fire when called upon, and who sign an undertaking in the form contained in the First Schedule to these by-laws.

(4) Associate members shall be those persons who are willing to supply free motor transport for fire fighters or equipment, or are prepared to render other approved assistance, and who sign an undertaking in the form contained in the Second Schedule to these by-laws.

(5) No fees or subscriptions shall be payable either by fire fighting members or associate members, and the enrolment of persons as such members shall in every case be subject to the approval of the Board.

(6) A subscribing member shall be eligible for enrolment as a fire fighting member.

Finance.

8. The expenditure incurred by the Board in the purchase of equipment, etc., payment for services and generally for the purposes of this Act, shall be a charge on the ordinary revenue of the Board, but the secretary shall keep a separate record of the expenditure incurred under this Act.

9. Meetings of Brigade—As considered necessary.

These by-laws under the Bush Fires Act, 1937-1945, were passed by a resolution of the Cuballing Road Board (a local authority under the provisions of such Act) at a meeting held at Popanyinning on 5th October, 1946.

By-laws of the Dowerin Road Board relating to the Establishment, Maintenance and Equipment of Bush Fire Brigades for the Road District of Dowerin.

Establishment of Brigade.

1. Appointment of Officers.

The employment, dismissal and payment for services of persons (other than officers) employed for duties under this Act, shall be vested in the chairman and secretary of the Board conjointly.

Duties of Officers.

6. The duties of all officers appointed under these by-laws shall be as laid down in the provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1937-1945, and each officer so appointed shall be supplied with a copy of the Act and

Regulations. The captain shall have full control over the members of the Brigade whilst engaged in fire fighting and shall issue instructions as to the methods to be adopted by the firemen. In the absence of the captain, the first lieutenant; and in the absence of the first, the second lieutenant or senior officer of the Brigade present at the fire shall exercise all the power and duties of the captain. The captain shall when so directed by the Board instruct all land owners or occupiers to plough a break or breaks on all cleared land or land under pasture.

Membership of Brigade.

7. (1) The membership of a bush fire brigade may consist of the following:—(a) subscribing members; (b) fire fighting members; and (c) associate members.

(2) Subscribing members shall be those persons, who, being interested in forwarding the objects of the Brigade, pay an annual subscription to the funds of the Brigade at the following rates:—

(i) owner or occupier of land within the Brigade area—minimum subscription of	10	0
(ii) other persons—a minimum subscription of	5	0

(3) Fire fighting members shall be those persons, being able-bodied men over 18 years of age who are willing to render service at any bush fire when called upon, and who sign an undertaking in the form contained in the First Schedule to these by-laws.

(4) Associate members shall be those persons who are willing to supply free motor transport for fire fighters or equipment, or are prepared to render other approved assistance, and who sign an undertaking in the form contained in the Second Schedule to these by-laws.

(5) No fees or subscriptions shall be payable either by fire fighting members or associate members, and the enrolment of persons as such members shall in every case be subject to the approval of the Board.

(6) A subscribing member shall be eligible for enrolment as a fire fighting member.

Finance.

8. The expenditure incurred by the Board in the purchase of equipment, etc., payment for services and generally for the purposes of this Act, shall be a charge on the ordinary revenue of the Board, but the secretary shall keep a separate record of the expenditure incurred under this Act.

Meetings of Brigade.

9. The Board shall meet annually and on as many other occasions as considered necessary.

These by-laws under the Bush Fires Act, 1937-1945, were passed by a resolution of the Dowerin Road Board (a local authority under the provisions of such Act) at a meeting held at Dowerin on 9th November, 1946.

By-laws for the Regulation of Parking of Caravans.

A.P.W. 958/40.

THE Perth Road Board, under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1943, and all other powers enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following by-laws:—

1. In these by-laws the term "caravan" shall include any vehicle designed or fitted as a habitation for any person or capable of being used for dwelling or sleeping purposes.

2. No person being the owner, hirer, licensee, or person in control of a caravan shall permit such caravan to be occupied or used as a habitation or as a dwelling or for sleeping purposes within the district of the Perth Road Board at any time during the period of the year from the month of May inclusive to the month of September inclusive.

3. No person being the owner or occupier of any land within the district of the Perth Road Board shall permit any caravan occupied or used as a habitation or as a dwelling or for sleeping purposes to be parked

or to remain stationary on such land at any time during the period of the year from the month of May inclusive to the month of September inclusive.

Caravan Licenses.

4. No person being the owner, hirer, licensee or person in control of a caravan shall permit such caravan to be occupied or used as a habitation or as a dwelling or for sleeping purposes within the district of the Perth Road Board at any time during the period from the month of October inclusive to the month of April next following inclusive unless he is the holder of a Caravan License for that period issued by the Perth Road Board.

5. The following conditions shall govern the issue of Caravan Licenses by the Perth Road Board.

(a) A separate license shall be issued in respect of each caravan.

(b) The caravan in respect of which the license is issued shall be licensed in accordance with the provisions of the Traffic Act, 1919-1941.

(c) The license shall be in force for a period ending on the 30th day of April next following the date of issue of the license unless previously cancelled by the Perth Road Board.

(d) The license shall be in the form of the First Schedule hereto or as near thereto as the circumstances permit.

(e) A fee of five shillings shall be paid to the Perth Road Board in respect of each license.

Caravan Park Licenses.

6. No person being the owner or occupier of any land within the district of the Perth Road Board shall permit any caravan occupied or used as a habitation or for dwelling or sleeping purposes to be parked or to remain stationary on such land at any time during the period from the month of October inclusive to the month of April next following inclusive unless he is the holder of a Caravan Park License for that period issued by the Perth Road Board in respect of such land.

7. The Caravan Park License shall be in the form in the Second Schedule hereto or as near thereto as the circumstances permit and shall specify the area in respect of which the license is issued and the number of caravans permitted to be parked in such area.

8. The Perth Road Board shall have power to grant a Caravan Park License upon the condition that the area in respect of which the license is granted shall be fenced within a time specified by the Board from the granting of the said license.

9. The holder of a Caravan Park License shall provide the following facilities in the area in respect of which the license is issued:—

(a) Sanitary conveniences for the separate use of the occupants of caravans on the following scale:—

One caravan—one earth closet or one water closet.

Two to five caravans—one earth closet and urinal for men and two earth closets for women, or one water closet for men and one water closet for women.

Six to ten caravans—two earth closets and urinal for men and two earth closets for women, or two water closets for men and two water closets for women. In areas where scheme water is available, sanitary conveniences shall be connected to the sewerage system or a septic tank provided.

(b) Cooking facilities for the occupants of caravans.

(c) Bathrooms and laundries on the following scale:—

One to two caravans—one bathroom and one laundry consisting of not less than one copper and two washing troughs.

Three to five caravans—two bathrooms for each sex and one laundry consisting of not less than one copper and two washing troughs.

Six to ten caravans—two bathrooms for each sex and one laundry consisting of not less than two coppers and four washing troughs.

(d) A separate rubbish bin for each caravan.

10. (a) Where the entrance to a caravan parking area is from a paved public road the holder of the Caravan Park License in respect of that area shall construct a paved crossing place from the public road to the entrance of the parking area.

(b) Where the entrance to a caravan parking area is from an unpaved public road which is paved at the entrance of the caravan parking area after the issue

of a Caravan Park License the holder of the Caravan Park License shall within three months of the completion of such paving construct a paved crossing place from the public road to the entrance of the parking area.

11. The holder of a Caravan Park License shall ensure that:—

(a) Caravans are so parked in the area in respect of which the license is issued that a clear space of not less than 15 feet is left between each caravan and that no caravans are parked within 20 feet of any dwelling.

(b) All liquid waste and rubbish is disposed of promptly, and the area in respect of which the license is issued is in a clean and hygienic condition; and

(c) No nuisance or annoyance is caused to owners or occupiers of land adjoining or in the vicinity of the caravan parking area by any person using the caravan parking area.

12. The holder of a Caravan Park License shall not permit more caravans to be parked in the area in respect of which the license is issued than the number of caravans specified in the license.

13. The Caravan Park License shall be in force for a period ending 30th day of April next following the date of issue of the license unless previously cancelled by the Perth Road Board.

14. A Caravan Park License shall not be issued:—

(a) In respect of an area on which a dwelling is erected unless such area exceeds one half of an acre; or

(b) In respect of an area where an adequate water supply is not available.

15. Nothing in these by-laws shall authorise any building being commenced or any building being constructed or altered without the plans and specifications thereof first being submitted to and approved by the Perth Road Board or otherwise than in accordance with the by-laws of the Perth Road Board.

Use of Roads.

16. Nothing in these by-laws contained shall prevent the normal use of public roads by caravans during the hours of daylight.

Reserves.

17. The Perth Road Board may from time to time by notice in the *Government Gazette* declare any reserve under the control of the Perth Road Board or part thereof to be a parking area for caravans and may impose such terms and conditions on the use of such reserve or part thereof as it deems fit.

Offences and Cancellation of Licenses.

18. Any person who commits a breach of any of the above by-laws shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £20.

19. If the holder of a Caravan License or a Caravan Park License fails to comply with any condition specified in the license or is convicted of a breach of any of the within by-laws it shall be lawful for the Perth Road Board to cancel such license.

20. The Perth Road Board may cancel any Caravan Park License or any Caravan License if in the area in respect of which the Caravan Park License is issued or if in or about the caravan in respect of which the Caravan License is issued:—

(a) There arises a nuisance within the meaning of the Health Act, 1911-1944; or

(b) Any nuisance or annoyance is caused to owners or occupiers of land within the district of the Perth Road Board; or

(c) There is any conduct which in the opinion of the Perth Road Board is of a disorderly nature.
