WHEREAS it is enacted by section 4 of the Vermin Act, 1918-1942, that "Vermin" means and includes any animal, bird, or insect mentioned in the Third Schedule to the said Act and such other animals, birds or insects the names of which the Governor may by proclamation add to the said Schedule, and that any proclamation

whereby the names of other animals, birds or insects are added to the said Schedule may be restricted in its operation to any portion of the State to be defined by the proclamation; and whereas it is deemed desirable and expedient that the bird of the parrot or cockatoo species "Kokatoe Rosiecapilla," commonly known as "Galah," shall be "vermin" for the purposes of the said Act within the boundaries of the Moora Vermin District: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do by this Proclamation add to the Third Schedule to the Vermin Act, 1918-1942, the name of the bird of the parrot or cockatoo species "Kokatoe Rosiecapilla," commonly known as "Galah," and declare that this proclamation shall apply and have effect only in that portion of the State which is comprised within the boundaries of the Moora Vermin District, as constituted under the said Act.

Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1944.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1944, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office approved by the Minister a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under this Act to all workers employed by him but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that he has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability the Governor may by Order in Council exempt such employer from the operation of the said section 10; and whereas Australian Iron and Steel Limited (Perth Branch) of 168 St. George's Terrace, Perth, is an employer within the meaning of the said Act and as such is subject to the provisions of the said section 10, and, having duly made application under and in accordance with the said Act and the regulations made and in force thereunder for exemption from the operation of the said section, has satisfied the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against its liability under the said Act to pay compensation to workers employed by it, and has deposited

or has duly arranged for the deposit at the Treasury of securities, to wit Commonwealth Treasury Bonds to the value of Five Thousand Pounds (£5,000) issued in relation to the Third Victory War Loan, charged with all payments to become due by it under such liability aforesaid; now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power conferred by section 10 of the said Act doth hereby exempt the said Australian Iron and Steel Limited (Perth Branch) from the operation of section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1944, for the period of two years commencing on the 25th day of January, 1947.

THE HEALTH ACT, 1911-1944.

The Municipality of Northam—Health By-laws
(Eating Houses).

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Health Act, 1911-1944, a local authority may make by-laws and may amend, repeal or alter any by-laws so made: Now, therefore, the Council of the Municipality of Northam, being a local health authority, doth hereby make the following by-law.

Eating Houses.

1. This by-law shall come into operation on the 1st May, 1947.

2. In the construction of this by-law, unless the context otherwise requires:—

“Act” means the Health Act, 1911-1944, and any amendment thereof.

“Local authority” means the Municipality of Northam.

“Medical officer” means the medical officer of the local authority and includes any person acting in that capacity.

“Senior inspector” means the senior health inspector of the local authority and includes any person acting in that capacity.

“Inspector” means any person appointed by the local authority to be a health inspector pursuant to the provisions of the Act.

“License” means a license to conduct an eating house granted pursuant to the provisions of this by-law.

“Registered premises” means any premises which are registered as an eating house under this by-law.

The terms “food,” “eating house,” “owner,” “premises” and “proprietor” shall have the same meaning as they have under the Act.

“Town Clerk” means the Town Clerk or the Acting Town Clerk for the time being of the Municipality of Northam.

3. No person shall occupy or use any premises as an eating house unless—

(a) the premises are registered under this by-law by the local authority, and

(b) the proprietor of the said premises is the holder of a license issued by the local authority authorising him to conduct on the premises the business of an eating house.

4. Before any premises are registered under this by-law, the proprietor thereof shall make application in the form prescribed in the First Schedule hereto and shall forward his application, together with a plan of the premises in respect of which such application is made, and the prescribed fee, to the Town Clerk, and if the application is approved, the local authority shall issue to the proprietor a certificate of registration in the form prescribed in the Second Schedule hereto.

5. Before any license to any proprietor to conduct an eating house is granted by the local authority under this by-law, the proprietor shall sign an application for the same in the form prescribed in the Third Schedule hereto and shall forward same, together with the prescribed fee, to the Town Clerk, and if the application is approved, the local authority shall issue to the proprietor a license in the form prescribed in the Fourth Schedule hereto.

6. Any person who makes a false statement in connection with any application under clauses 4 or 5 hereof shall be guilty of an offence.

7. Every Certificate of Registration of premises registered as an eating house, and every license issued to the proprietor, shall be signed by the Town Clerk and shall be duly entered in a book to be provided by the local authority for that purpose. Every proprietor of registered premises shall keep the Certificate of Registration and the license on the registered premises and shall, when requested to do so by an inspector, produce to him the Certificate of Registration and also the license issued to the proprietor in respect of such premises.

8. Every Certificate of Registration and every license shall be in force from the day of the date of the issue thereof until and inclusive of the 31st day of December then next ensuing, unless the same be cancelled in the meantime in accordance with the provisions of the Act.

9. Application for the renewal of Certificates of Registration and licenses shall be made annually during the month of December. Such applications shall be in the form prescribed in the Fifth and Sixth Schedules hereto, respectively, and shall be accompanied by the prescribed fee.

10. The fees to be paid to the local authority on the registration of premises, on the issuing of a license and on the renewal of any registration or license shall be as set out in the Seventh Schedule hereto.

11. So often as any person holding a license issued pursuant to this by-law changes his place of abode, he shall within seven days next after such change give notice thereof in writing to the Town Clerk, specifying in such notice his new place of abode, and he shall at the same time produce such license to the Town Clerk, who shall endorse thereon and sign a memorandum specifying the particulars of such change.

12. (1) If the owner of any registered premises sells or transfers or agrees to sell or transfer the said premises to another person, he shall within 14 days from the date of such sale or transfer or agreement notify the Town Clerk thereof in writing, stating the full name, address and occupation of such other person.

12. (2) Such other person shall within 14 days of such sale, transfer or agreement, make application in writing to the Town Clerk in the form of the Eighth Schedule, for the transfer of such license, and shall attach to such application the then current license, together with fees as prescribed in the Seventh Schedule.

12. (3) If such proposed transfer of the license is approved by the local authority, the Town Clerk shall thereupon endorse a memorandum to that effect and return such license to the transferee, whereupon the same shall remain current in such transferee's name for the unexpired period of such license.

12. (4) Any person who makes any false statement in connection with any application for transfer of a license as provided under subsection (3) shall be guilty of an offence.

13. In all premises occupied or used or intended to be occupied or used as an eating house—

(a) the walls of all rooms shall be constructed of brick, stone, or concrete suitably rendered and plastered, and shall be tiled or oil-painted to a height of at least seven feet from the floor level so as to maintain a smooth, hard, durable, and washable surface, devoid of holes, cracks or crevices;

(b) the floors of all kitchens, sculleries, and food and vegetable stores shall be constructed or adapted with concrete rendered with cement, or provided with an approved surfacing which must be applied directly to the concrete without intervening spaces;

(c) every room therein shall be properly ceiled with stamped metal, lath and plaster, fibrous plaster, or asbestos sheets or other similar material, and shall be constructed and maintained throughout its area and at the wall junctions free from holes, cracks and crevices;

(d) there shall be provided a suitable kitchen, larder, scullery, dry food store and cupboards, and such kitchen (exclusive of all larder, scullery, dry food store, and cupboards) shall have a floor area not less than 25 per cent. of the floor area of the dining room of such premises, but in no case shall such floor area be less than 144 square feet. Where any larder, scullery, dry food store, or cupboards are permitted to be incorporated in the lay-out of any kitchen, then the floor area occupied by such larder, scullery, dry food store, or cupboards, shall not be deemed part of the floor area of the kitchen for the purpose of this clause;

(e) there shall be provided for the use of employees and, when required by the local authority, there shall also be provided for customers, sufficient and suitable lavatories with wash-hand basins and all necessary appurtenances, or such other lavatory system as may be approved by the local authority, and there shall also be provided for use therewith an adequate supply of water, soap, nail-brushes and clean towels, but no towel or towels shall be provided for use in common;

(f) there shall be provided sanitary conveniences for the use of employees, and when required by the local authority, there shall also be provided sanitary conveniences for the use of customers, and in either case when considered necessary by the local authority, separate sanitary conveniences shall be provided for each sex;

(g) all water closets or urinals situate on any registered premises shall, where required by the local authority, be separate from the yard or building of such premises by a properly constructed anti-chamber or air-lock not less than 30 square feet in area;

(h) every room shall be properly lighted with a surface of clear glass exposed to the open air equivalent to not less than one-tenth of the floor area of the room. Where such natural lighting cannot be reasonably secured, artificial lighting to the approval of the local authority shall be installed;

(i) every room shall be provided with approved outlet ventilators corresponding with an allowance of not less than one square inch of airway for every 40 cubic feet of gross air space of every such compartment, or alternatively, some mechanical system of ventilation shall be installed to the satisfaction of the local authority;

(j) the air space between the ground surface and the floor (except in the case of concrete or other solid floors) shall be efficiently ventilated to the satisfaction of the local authority;

(k) in every registered premises where wood, coal, or coke is used as fuel, such wood, coal, or coke shall be stored or kept in a properly constructed wood store with brick walls and concrete floor, separating such store from the remainder of the premises.

14. The proprietor of every eating house registered under this by-law shall—

(a) keep or cause to be kept scrupulously clean and in good condition and repair to the satisfaction of the senior health inspector the floors, walls, ceilings and all portions of the registered premises and all fittings, stoves, ranges, utensils, implements, shelves, counters, bins, cabinets, fixtures, sinks, drain-boards, drains, grease traps, tubs, vessels, and things of the like description used on the premises or in connection with the preparation or storage of food thereon;

(b) provide all such furniture, fixtures, counters, bins, sinks, drain-boards, grease traps, tubs, vessels, fittings, utensils, implements and things for use on the registered premises as the senior health inspector may from time to time deem necessary for the proper conduct of the business;

(c) construct and arrange or cause to be constructed or arranged all furniture, fixtures, counters, bins, sinks, drain-boards, tubs, vessels, fittings, utensils, and things in every kitchen, serving room, scullery and fish cleaning room on the registered premises so that the floor in every such room or place may at all times be kept in a thoroughly clean and sanitary condition;

(d) not keep or use any floor covering that is absorbent or in such a condition as to allow of the lodgment of dirt thereunder;

(e) keep all tables and benches used for the preparation of food at least three inches from the wall and moveable to facilitate cleansing;

(f) provide and properly maintain at all times suitable and effective means for keeping and keep every room or compartment in the registered premises free from dust, rats, mice, cockroaches, flies, spiders, bugs, ants, moths, and all other vermin, and if, in the opinion of an inspector, effective means and methods of cleansing and eradication of vermin from the premises cannot be done effectively while the ordinary business of the establishment is carried on, then the local authority may order the temporary closure of the premises to the public until such time as such cleansing and eradication of vermin has been carried out to the satisfaction of the inspector;

(g) for the purpose of keeping the registered premises free from rats, provide and maintain at least six spring break-back rat traps, in good working order, properly set and baited at all times. The type and number of traps and kind of baits used, and the position and locality of the traps set shall be as directed by an inspector;

(h) keep all portions of the registered premises free from any unwholesome or offensive odour arising from the premises or the operations carried on thereon;

(i) provide and maintain an approved hood over every wood, gas, or electric cooking fire, stove or boiler. The hood shall be so placed as to arrest all steam, effluvia, odours and smoke from the process of cooking or boiling. The underside of the hood shall not be more than two feet above the top or fire plate of the stove. The flue from the hood shall be at least seven inches in diameter and shall discharge to the open air at a height of not less than two feet above the eaves of any adjoining building;

(j) provide an efficient chimney or flue to every wood, coal or coke cooking stove so that no smoke nuisance shall arise in or outside the premises;

(k) provide and keep a sufficient number of suitable vessels or receptacles, with lids, constructed of galvanised iron, or other non-absorbent and non-corrosive material to a design approved by the senior inspector on the premises for the purpose of receiving all garbage, waste matter and other refuse arising from the business, and place and keep such vessels or receptacles in a properly constructed room with concrete floor, to be fly- and rat-proof, and efficiently ventilated, or in such positions as directed by an inspector;

(l) forthwith after such garbage, waste matter, and other refuse is produced, place the same in such vessels or receptacles provided and kept in accordance with paragraph (k) hereof once at least in every 24 hours, and to the satisfaction of an inspector, and renew or repair any or all of the aforesaid vessels or receptacles as often as is necessary and when required by an inspector to do so;

(n) provide and maintain a hot water installation of capacity to supply sufficient hot water and adequate sink facilities for the thorough cleansing of all drinking vessels, dishes, plates, and other vessels, tableware, spoons, forks, knives and all other utensils used on the registered premises;

(o) immediately after such occasion of use all such vessels and utensils referred to in clause (n) shall be thoroughly cleansed by means of washing in water at a temperature of not less than 150 deg. F., and immediately thereafter rinsed in clear hot water at a temperature of not less than 120 deg. F., and to the satisfaction in all things of an inspector;

(p) not permit or suffer any table napkin which has been used as such or for any purpose by any person to be placed on any table in the dining room on the registered premises used for serving meals for use or to be used by any other person, unless such table napkin shall have been thoroughly washed and cleansed since it was previously used by the first mentioned person;

(q) remove or cause to be removed the whole of the canned or preserved food or any food contained in an hermetically sealed container (such container not being composed wholly of glass or stoneware) intended for use on the registered premises from such original can or container immediately after the same shall have been opened;

(r) not permit or suffer any food which is unsound, unwholesome, putrescent or weevilled to be used for food, or for the preparation of food or meals;

(s) cause any food which is or has become unsound, unwholesome, putrescent or weevilled to be immediately withdrawn from sale, stock or use and placed in the waste food or garbage bin;

(t) provide adequate and efficient means of refrigeration of an approved type for the preservation of food;

(u) remove or cause to be removed any food which may have been served to any person or placed on any table occupied by any customer on the registered premises and not then consumed or removed by him immediately after such person shall have finished his refreshment to the kitchen or serving room of such premises, nor permit, suffer, or allow any of such food so removed to any such kitchen or serving room to be again served to any person on the registered premises, and such food shall immediately be deposited in the waste food garbage bin. Provided that in this paragraph food shall not mean or include the following substances, to wit, sugar, pepper, salt, mustard, vinegar, sauces, spices or condiments, if such substances are contained in containers or receptacles of a design approved by the inspector and so constructed that the contents of such receptacles or containers cannot be handled by any person. Provided further, that in this paragraph food shall not include bread, which is placed in a glass receptacle or container of a design approved by an inspector and so constructed that the contents are only handled as required;

(v) not to clean, gut, or scale any fish on any portion of the registered premises unless such portion of the said premises shall have been constructed for such purpose, and approved in writing by the senior health inspector, and shall not store any fish in any kitchen or pantry of the registered premises unless such fish has already been cleaned, gutted, scaled and washed;

(w) not allow, permit, or suffer any live animal or bird to be kept in or upon any portion of the registered premises set apart for the accommodation of the public or in any kitchen or scullery, or serving room or pantry,

or fish cleaning room on any such premises, or in any room in which food intended for use on the registered premises is stored or prepared for use thereon (provided that a cat or cats may be allowed in such portions of the premises after all food has been covered and the premises are not open to the public), or allow or permit or suffer any animal or bird to be killed or any poultry, pigeons, or game to be plucked in any such kitchen or scullery;

(x) not permit, suffer, or cause to be kept on any portion of the registered premises any live poultry, pigeons, or game, or any horse, cow, ass, mule, pig or goat;

(y) provide and maintain a suitable change and cloak room approved by the senior inspector for the exclusive use of female employees, and an approved cloak room for male employees;

(z) not allow, permit or suffer any clothing or wearing apparel to be placed, kept, hung, or deposited in any dining room, kitchen, scullery, pantry, or food store: provided that patrons may be permitted temporarily to hang hats and cloaks in a dining room;

(aa) not keep or permit or suffer to be kept any hamper, basket, box, trunk, case, crate or barrel which has contained wet fish or other perishable food and which has not after the last occasion of such use been cleansed and rendered inoffensive, upon any portion of the registered premises for a period longer than 24 hours, or in such manner as to become or be likely to be or become offensive or a nuisance;

(bb) cleanse daily and at all times keep and maintain all water-closets, urinals, lavatories, catch-pits, grease traps and all other sanitary appliances on the registered premises in a clean and sanitary condition;

(cc) at all times provide and maintain a notice board on which is legibly inscribed, in letters one inch high, the name of the person licensed to carry on business on the registered premises, and such notice board shall be fixed and maintained free from obstruction in a prominent position at the entrance of the dining room;

(dd) not use, keep, or store or permit to be used, kept or stored any petrol, kerosene, benzine, naphtha, alcohol, mineralised or methylated spirit, or any volatile liquid (not being an article of food) in any kitchen on the registered premises.

15. No proprietor of any registered premises shall—

(a) permit, suffer or cause to be made or done to or on the registered premises any alteration, addition or other work for any purpose affecting or likely to affect, in the opinion of the senior health inspector, the suitability of the premises for the use specified in the license granted under this by-law in respect of such premises, without the previous consent in writing of the senior health inspector; or

(b) permit or suffer any drain-pipe for carrying off faecal or sewage matter to have an opening, or any gully trap, to be within any roofed enclosures (not being a water-closet or urinal) on the registered premises; or

(c) permit, suffer, or cause any spittoon or article or thing for like use to be placed in any dining room or in any place where food is served, or in any kitchen, scullery, or fish cleaning room on the registered premises;

(d) permit, or allow, or suffer a greater number of persons to be accommodated at any one time in any dining room on the registered premises than will allow of a ratio of one person to every 12 square feet of the available floor area of such dining room;

(e) alter, suffer, or permit any structural or other alterations to be made to any registered premises or portion thereof without first having obtained permission in writing from the local authority.

16. No person shall spit and no person shall chew or smoke tobacco in any kitchen, serving room, scullery, or fish cleaning room, or in any room wherein food is being prepared for use in the registered premises, and every proprietor of such premises shall exhibit conspicuously and constantly maintain in a clean, visible, and legible condition in every kitchen, serving room, scullery, fish cleaning room and room in which food is being prepared for use on the premises a notice printed in letters of not less than 48 points face measurement to the following effect:—“Spitting, or chewing or smoking tobacco in this room is an offence against the by-law. Penalty not exceeding £50 (Fifty Pounds).”

17. Every person engaged on the registered premises shall, when so engaged, immediately before beginning work, and immediately after visiting a sanitary convenience, wash his hands, and every such person shall, when so engaged, keep and maintain his clothing and body clean; and every occupier of such premises shall provide and properly maintain at all times on such premises such means for maintaining personal cleanliness as in the opinion of the inspector shall be adequate and efficient.

18. No person who is suffering from any infectious, contagious or eruptive disease, suppurating wound or sore, discharging abscess or gathering, chest complaint accompanied with expectoration, or malignant growth of any kind, shall enter the kitchen or take part in the preparation or handling of food on any registered premises.

19. (1) Every proprietor of registered premises shall so soon as he become aware that any person engaged on the premises is suffering from any of the abovementioned diseases cause him to cease to become engaged on and to leave such licensed premises without unnecessary delay, and shall not allow him to be again engaged on such premises until such person shall have obtained a certificate from a qualified medical practitioner that he has recovered from or is not suffering from any such condition as aforesaid, and is no longer a source of danger to others.

(2) The proprietor of registered premises shall forthwith report in writing to the medical officer the suspension of any person engaged on the premises suffering from any disease mentioned in clause 19 of this by-law, and shall send a copy of any medical certificate obtained for the purpose of this clause to the medical officer before such person shall again be engaged on the premises.

20. Any person who shall commit a breach of any of the provisions of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence, and upon conviction, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds, and, where such breach is of a continuing nature, to a daily penalty not exceeding two pounds.

BUSH FIRES ACT, 1937-1945.

By-laws of the Koorda Road Board relating to the Establishment, Maintenance and Equipment of Bush Fire Brigades for the Road District of Koorda.

Establishment of Brigade.

1. On the resolution of the Board to establish, maintain and equip a Bush Fire Brigade under the provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1937-1945, and regulations thereunder, the Brigade shall be formed in accordance with these by-laws; and a name shall be given to the Brigade and application, accompanied by a copy of these by-laws shall be made to the Minister for Lands for its registration accordingly.

A bush fire brigade may be established for the whole of the road district or for any specified area thereof. Provided that, unless the resolution of the Board establishing a bush fire brigade specifies therein only a part of the district as the area for which such brigade is established, the brigade shall be deemed to be established for the whole of the said road district.

Appointment of Officers.

2. The Board shall appoint a captain, a first lieutenant, a second lieutenant, and such additional lieutenants as it shall deem necessary to act as officers of the Brigade, and who, in the Board's opinion, have the necessary qualification and knowledge of the district required in such capacities.

3. The secretary of the Board or such other person as the Board may appoint, shall be the secretary of the Brigade.

4. The Board may appoint an equipment officer, who shall be responsible for the custody and maintenance in good order and condition of all equipment and appliances required by the Board for the purposes of the Brigade. Such officer may station such equipment at a depot approved by the captain where, if possible, motor trucks can easily be called upon. If there are more than one such depots in the area, the equipment officer shall appoint at each depot a person to look after the equipment and have it ready for immediate use when required.

5. The Board shall appoint bush fire control officers in accordance with the requirements of the district and may prescribe the area over which each such officer shall have jurisdiction. The employment, dismissal and payment for services of persons (other than officers) employed for duties under this Act shall be vested in the chairman and secretary of the Board conjointly.

Duties of Officers.

6. The duties of all officers appointed under these by-laws shall be as laid down in the provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1937-1945, and each officer so appointed shall be supplied with a copy of the Act and regulations. The captain shall have full control over the members

of the Brigade whilst engaged in fire-fighting and shall issue instructions as to the methods to be adopted by the firemen. In the absence of the captain, the first lieutenant; and in the absence of the first, the second lieutenant or senior officer of the Brigade present at the fire shall exercise all the power and duties of the captain. The captain shall, when so directed by the Board, instruct all land owners or occupiers to plough a break or breaks on all cleared land or land under pasture.

Membership of Brigade.

7. (1) The membership of a bush fire brigade may consist of the following:—(a) Subscribing members; (b) fire-fighting members, and (c) associate members.

(2) Subscribing members shall be those persons who, being interested in forwarding the objects of the Brigade, pay an annual subscription to the funds of the Brigade at the following rates:—

(i) Owner or occupier of land within the Brigade area—minimum subscription of	10 0
(ii) Other persons—a minimum subscription of	5 0

(3) Fire-fighting members shall be those persons, being able-bodied men over 18 years of age who are willing to render service at any bush fire when called upon, and who sign an undertaking in the form contained in the First Schedule to these by-laws.

(4) Associate members shall be those persons who are willing to supply free motor transport for fire-fighters or equipment, or are prepared to render other approved assistance, and who sign an undertaking in the form contained in the Second Schedule to these by-laws.

(5) No fees or subscriptions shall be payable either by fire-fighting or associate members, and the enrolment of persons as such members shall in every case be subject to the approval of the Board.

(6) A subscribing member shall be eligible for enrolment as a fire-fighting member.

Finance.

8. The expenditure incurred by the Board in the purchase of equipment, etc., payment for services and generally for the purposes of this Act, shall be a charge on the ordinary revenue of the Board, but the secretary shall keep a separate record of the expenditure incurred under this Act.

Meetings of Brigade.

9. As and when required.

These by-laws under the Bush Fires Act, 1937-1945, were passed by a resolution of the Koorda Road Board (a local authority under the provisions of such Act), at a meeting held at Koorda on 11th January, 1947.

IN pursuance of the powers in that behalf contained in the Road Districts Act, 1919-1946, the Sussex Road Board hereby repeals all by-laws heretofore made in reference to the several matters dealt with in the by-laws hereinafter set out and makes and orders the following by-laws:—

1. The proceedings and business of the Board shall be conducted according to the following regulations, which shall be called the Standing Orders.

Chairman.

2. In the construction of this by-law, unless the context otherwise requires, the word chairman shall include the vice-chairman, deputy or acting chairman and the member chosen to preside at any meeting of the Board.

3. The chairman shall, when present, preside at all meetings of the Board, and in his absence, or if, after being present, he retires, the vice-chairman shall preside; but if at any time neither of them is present, then the members present may choose out of their number a member, who shall preside and exercise, for the purposes of that meeting and until the conclusion or adjournment thereof, the powers of the chairman.

Quorum.

4. At any meeting of the Board a quorum shall consist of the major part of the number of members for the time being assigned to the Board. Every meeting shall proceed to business so soon after the time stated in the notice as there shall be a sufficient number of members in attendance to constitute a quorum.

Adjournment in Absence of Quorum.

5. If at any meeting a quorum be not present within half an hour of the time appointed for such meeting, the majority of the members present, or member, if there is only one present, or the secretary, if no member is present, may adjourn such meeting to another day, and notice of such adjourned meeting shall be given to each member.

Count out.

6. If at any time during any meeting of the Board a member shall call the attention of the chairman to the fact that a quorum is not present, the chairman shall thereupon suspend the proceedings of the meeting for a period of two minutes, and if a quorum be not present at the expiration of such period, the meeting shall be deemed to have been counted out, and the chairman shall adjourn it to some future date.

7. At all meetings at which there is not a quorum present, or at which the Board is counted out for want of a quorum, the names of the members then present shall be recorded in the minute book.

Open Doors.

8. The business of the Board shall be conducted with open doors, except upon such occasions as the Board shall by resolution otherwise decide, which resolution may be moved without notice.

Reporters.

9. At all meetings accredited newspaper reporters shall be permitted to attend in such part of the board room as may be appropriated for their accommodation, but they shall withdraw, upon a vote of the Board so requiring, during any portion or the whole of the meeting.

Disturbance by Visitors.

10. The admission of citizens, reporters, and visitors to the board room shall be under and subject to the regulations that no expression of dissent or approval, conversation, or interruption to the proceedings of the Board shall take place, and in the event of any breach of this regulation, the chairman may at his discretion, and without a vote of the Board, require the person or persons so offending to withdraw, and thereupon such person or persons shall immediately withdraw from the board room.

Removal of Disturbers.

11. Any person, not being a member of the Board, who interrupts the orderly conduct of the business of the Board, who does not, immediately upon being called upon by the chairman so to do, withdraw from the board room, may by order of the chairman be removed from the board room forthwith.

Business at Board Meetings.

Order of Business.

12. The order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as shall be practicable, but for the greater convenience of the Board at any particular meeting thereof it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (1) Confirmation of minutes.
- (2) Announcement by the chairman, without discussion.
- (3) Questions of which due notice has been given, without discussion.
- (4) Correspondence.
- (5) Petitions and memorials.
- (6) Tenders.
- (7) Reports of Committees.
- (8) Orders of the day, including considering and ordering upon any business left over from the previous meeting, and any business the chairman may think desirable to bring under the notice of the Board and may have directed to be entered as an order of the day.
- (9) Motions of which previous notices have been given.
- (10) Notices of motions for consideration at the following meeting, if given during the meeting.

Order at Special Meetings.

13. The order of business at any special meeting of the Board shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

Minutes.

14. The minutes of any preceding meeting, whether ordinary or special, not previously confirmed, shall be submitted as the first business at all meetings of the Board, in order to obtain their confirmation; and no discussion shall be permitted thereon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the said minutes shall then be signed by the chairman, as by section 140 of the Act required.

Questions.

15. Any member desiring to ask a question at any meeting of the Board shall give notice thereof in writing to the secretary, at least four hours before the hour fixed for the meeting.

16. All questions and answers shall be submitted as briefly and concisely as possible, and no discussion shall be allowed thereon.

Notices of Motion.

17. Any member may bring forward such business as he may consider advisable, in the form of a motion, of which notice shall be given in writing to the secretary, either at the meeting previous to the meeting at which it is intended to move the same, or at any time thereafter, being not less than three clear days before such last-mentioned meeting.

Motion to Lapse.

18. Every such notice shall lapse unless the member who gave the notice thereof, or some other member authorised by him in writing, be present to move the same when such motion shall be called on.

Deputations.

Reception of Deputations.

19. Deputations wishing to be received by the Board shall be requested, in the first instance, to send in a memorial in writing, and the secretary shall bring the memorial before the committee concerned, which shall be authorised, if it see fit, to receive the deputation and to report to the Board. If the committee is of the opinion that the memorial is one which should be brought before the Board, the committee shall so report, and, if the Board shall so order, the deputation shall be invited to attend.

Number of Deputation.

20. A deputation shall not exceed ten in number, and only two members thereof shall be at liberty to address the Board or a committee of the Board, except in reply to questions from members of the Board or committee, and the matter shall not be further considered by the Board or committee until the deputation shall have withdrawn.

Conduct of Debate.

Members to Address the Chair—Point of Order.

21. Any member moving a motion or amendment, or taking part in the discussion thereon, shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted, unless upon a point of order, when he shall resume his seat until the member raising the point of order has been heard thereon and the question of order has been disposed of, when the member in possession of the chair may proceed.

Nature of Motion to be Stated.

22. Any member desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment shall state the nature of the same before he addresses the Board thereon, and, if so required by the chairman, shall put the same in writing.

Motions to be Seconded—Enforcement of Standing Orders.

23. No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Board unless it be seconded, but a member may require the enforcement of any standing order of the Board by directing the chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

Use of Titles.

24. At the meetings of the Board, speakers in referring to others present thereat shall designate them by their respective titles of chairman or member, as the case may be.

Priority of Speakers.

25. If two or more members rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

Chairman to Speak.

26. Whenever the chairman rises during a debate, any member then speaking or offering to speak is to sit down, and the Board is to be silent, so that the chairman may be heard without interruption.

Member not to Speak Twice.

27. No member shall speak twice on the same question, except by way of explanation, or in reply, upon any original motion of which he may be the mover or as the mover of an amendment last carried; and no member shall speak to any question after the mover shall have been permitted to reply.

Calling to Order for Speaking Twice.

28. The chairman shall, without waiting for the interposition of the Board, call to order any member proceeding to speak a second time on the same question.

Mover or Seconder to be held to have Spoken.

29. A member moving or seconding a motion or amendment shall be held to have spoken thereon.

No Speaking after Notice Put.

30. No member may speak to any question after the same has been put from the chair.

Time Limit.

31. No member shall speak or address the Board upon any motion or amendment before the Board, or in reply, for a longer period than 10 minutes, without the consent of the Board, which shall be signified without debate.

Speaking in Reply.

32. It shall not be competent for any new matter to be introduced by the mover when speaking in reply, but he shall strictly confine himself to answering previous speakers.

Division of Complicated Resolutions.

33. The chairman, at his discretion, may, or the Board may by motion without debate, order a complicated motion to be divided and put in the form of several resolutions.

Withdrawal of Motion.

34. A motion or amendment may be withdrawn by the mover, with the consent of the Board, which shall be signified without debate, and it shall not be competent for any member to speak upon it after the mover has asked permission for its withdrawal, unless such permission shall have been refused.

Production of Documents.

35. Any member may of right require the production of any of the documents of the Board relating to the question or matter under discussion.

Reflection upon Vote of Board.

36. No member shall reflect upon any vote of the Board, except for the purpose of moving that such vote be rescinded.

All Members to Vote.

37. At all meetings of the Board, save where it is otherwise provided, all the members present shall vote, and the questions there considered shall be decided by open voting, and by the majority present. Each member, including the chairman, shall have one vote only, and, in the case of an equality of votes on any question, such question shall pass in the negative.

Digression from Subject—Personal Reflections.

38. No member shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, nor impute improper motives to any other member, and all personal reflections upon any member shall be considered highly disorderly.

Record of Words used by a Member.

39. Any member may require the secretary to take down any particular words used by a member immediately upon the same being used.

Chairman's Ruling.

40. The chairman, when called upon to decide a point of order or practice, shall give his decision, and no argument or comment shall be permitted thereon, and his decision shall be final in that particular case.

Withdrawal of Offensive Expression.

41. Any member who shall use any expression which in the opinion of the chairman reflects offensively on any member of the Board, shall, when required by the chairman, unreservedly withdraw such expression and make a satisfactory apology to the chair, and, if he decline, or neglect to do so, the chairman may refuse to hear such member further upon the matter then under discussion and call upon the next speaker, or may suspend or adjourn the sitting of the Board, or may direct the offending member to withdraw from the board room for the remainder of the then sitting of the Board.

Disturbance—Conversing Aloud.

42. No member shall make any noise or disturbance, or, except to raise a point of order, converse aloud whilst any other member is speaking or whilst any matter is being read or opened.

Continued Irrelevance.

43. The Chairman may call the attention of the Board to continued irrelevance, tedious repetition, unbecoming language, or any breach of order or decorum on the part of a member, and may direct such member, if speaking, to discontinue his speech, and thereupon such member shall cease speaking and resume his seat.

Crossing Board Room.

44. When the chairman is putting any question, no member shall walk out of or across the board room, nor shall any member, whilst any other member is speaking, pass between the speaker and the chair.

Chairman may call to Order.

45. The chairman shall preserve order, and may on his own motion call any member to order whenever in his opinion there shall be cause for so doing.

Infraction of Standing Orders.

46. Every member shall be entitled to direct the attention of the chairman to any infraction of the Standing Orders by any other member.

Definition of Order.

47. Any member who shall do anything or behave in any manner which is forbidden by any section of this by-law shall be deemed to be out of order.

Decision of Chairman on Point of Order—Member to Apologise when called upon.

48. Whenever it shall have been decided by the chairman that any motion, amendment or other matter before the Board is out of order, the same shall be rejected, and whenever any thing said or done in a meeting by any member shall be similarly decided to be out of order, such member shall be called upon by the chairman to make such explanation, retraction or apology, as the case may require.

Member to Withdraw from Board Room.

49. Any member who shall persist in any line of conduct which the chairman shall have decided or which by any section of this by-law is declared to be out of order, or who shall refuse to make any explanation, retraction or apology required by the chairman as aforesaid, shall, upon the request of the chairman, withdraw from the board room for the remainder of the then sitting of the Board.

Removal of Member from Board Room.

50. In the event of any member refusing or neglecting to withdraw from the board room when requested or directed by the chairman so to do, the chairman may order such member to be removed from the said board room, and to be excluded therefrom, during the remainder of the then sitting of the Board.

Disorder.

51. If disorder should arise at any meeting of the Board, the chairman, acting in his discretion, may as a matter of right quit the chair, and announce the adjournment of the meeting for a period of 15 minutes, when the Board shall reassemble and decide the question whether the business shall be proceeded with or otherwise, which question shall be put from the chair and decided without debate by a majority of the members present.

Order in Debate.

Motions and Amendments.

52. When a motion is under debate at any meeting of the Board, no further motion shall be received, except the following:—

- (1) That the motion be amended.
- (2) That the Board do now adjourn.
- (3) That the debate be adjourned.
- (4) That the question be now put.
- (5) That the Board do proceed with the next business.
- (6) That the Board do resolve into committee of whole.

1.—That the Motion be Amended.

Relevancy of Amendment.

53. Every amendment shall be relevant to the motion on which it is moved.

To be Read.

54. Every amendment shall be read before being moved.

One Amendment at a Time.

55. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but, if lost, another may be moved before the original question is put to the vote, but upon any amendment being carried it shall be competent for any member to move one other amendment thereon, but no more.

Substantive Motion.

56. Upon the adoption of any amendment such amendment shall be held to have quashed the original motion, and for all purposes of subsequent discussion the amendment so carried shall, subject to the last preceding clause, be treated as an original motion.

2.—That the Board do now Adjourn.

Time to Move.

57. A member may at the conclusion of the speech of any other member, or on the conclusion of any business, move without notice that the Board do now adjourn: provided that the mover may speak for not more than five minutes, the seconder shall not speak beyond formally seconding, and the mover of the question (if any) under debate, on the motion for adjournment being made, may be heard in reply for five minutes, but no further debate shall be allowed.

No Discussion—Procedure before Further Motion.

58. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the Board, but if on the question being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper, or any other that may be allowed precedence, shall be discussed before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained.

Question Adjourned to Next Meeting.

59. On a resolution for adjournment, the question (if any) under debate when the motion for adjournment was made shall stand adjourned to the next meeting.

One Motion Only.

60. At the same sitting no member may move or second more than one motion for the adjournment of the Board.

3.—That the Debate be Adjourned.

Time to Move.

61. Any member may, at the conclusion of the speech of any other member, move without previous notice that the debate be adjourned to a later hour of the same day or to any other day.

No Discussion.

62. No discussion shall be allowed upon a motion for the adjournment of a debate.

Mover to Speak First.

63. On resuming an adjourned debate, the member who moved its adjournment shall be entitled to speak first.

One Motion Only.

64. At the same sitting no member shall move or second more than one motion for adjournment of the same debate.

Resumption of Debate After Count Out.

65. If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the Board being counted out, such debate may be resumed at the next meeting at the point where it was so interrupted, on motion with notice.

4.—That the Question be now Put.

Time to Move—Put Without Debate.

66. A member may, at the conclusion of the speech of another member, move without notice that the question under consideration be now put, and upon such motion being seconded the same shall be immediately put without debate.

Two-thirds Majority.

67. A motion that the consideration of the question be now put shall not be decided in the affirmative or take effect without the consent of a two-thirds majority of the members present.

Speaking in Reply.

68. Whenever it is decided by the Board that the question under consideration shall be put, the mover of the question under consideration shall, if debate has ensued, and if otherwise entitled to do so, be permitted to speak in reply for not more than five minutes before the question is put.

Motion to be Put at Once.

69. Should the motion be carried, the motion or amendment under debate shall be put at once.

Question Includes Amendment.

70. Whenever it is decided by the Board that the question under consideration shall be put, the question to be so put from the chair shall be construed and taken to mean and include the main question as well as any amendment thereto.

5.—That the Board do Proceed to the next Business.

Time to Move.

71. It shall be competent for any member at the close of the speech of any other member to move without notice that the Board do proceed to the next business, and if the motion be seconded, it shall be put forthwith.

Question to be Dropped.

72. When a motion be carried that the Board do proceed to the next business, the question under discussion shall be considered as dropped.

Further Motion.

73. During the same debate, a second motion that the Board do proceed with the next business shall not be made within one hour.

6.—That the Board Resolve into Committee.

Decision of Board.

74. The Board may determine that any question shall be considered in committee of the whole, and a motion to that effect may be moved without previous notice.

Matters to be Considered by Committee.

75. Such committee shall consider such matters only as shall have been referred to it by the Board.

Conduct of Committees.

76. In committee of the whole the Standing Orders of the Board shall apply, except that members may speak more than once to the same question.

Adoption of Committee's Resolutions.

77. The chairman shall report the resolutions arrived at in committee of the whole to the Board at its next ordinary meeting, or upon the resumption of the Board, as the case may require, and such resolutions shall be dealt with as the Board may think fit.

Confidential Business.

78. All matters dealt with or brought before the Board in committee, or before any committee of the Board, shall be treated as strictly confidential, and unless and until the Board or a committee appointed by the Board otherwise determines, no information whatever in relation to the proceedings thereat shall be disclosed to any person outside the Board prior to the issue of the business paper containing the items to be submitted to Board for confirmation.

Rescission of Resolutions—Rescission.

79. No resolution of any meeting of the Board shall be revoked, rescinded, or altered at any subsequent meeting held during the financial year, except in manner provided in section 136 of the Act.

Repetition of Negatived Motion.

80. No motion to the same effect as any motion which has been negatived by the Board shall again be entertained within a period of three months, unless with the consent of at least six members of the Board.

Suspension of Standing Orders—How Moved.

81. In cases of urgent necessity any Standing Order or Orders of the Board may be suspended, on motion duly made and seconded without notice. Provided—

(a) that such motion shall be made and seconded only after all business appearing in the Notice Paper has been disposed of;

(b) that such motion shall be carried by a majority of not less than three of the members present.

Objects of Suspension to be Stated.

82. Any member moving the suspension of any Standing Order shall state the object of such motion, but no discussion shall take place thereon.

Voting—Method of Taking Votes.

83. The chairman shall, in taking the vote on any motion or amendment, put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative, and he may do so as often as is necessary, to enable him to form and declare his opinion from the show of hands as to which party has the majority.

Division.

84. The Board shall vote by a show of hands, but any member may call for a division upon any question, in which case the members voting in the affirmative shall, until the vote is recorded, stand up, and those in the negative retain their seats; all division lists shall be entered on the minutes.

Committees.

Standing Committees.

85. In addition to such special Committees as may from time to time be appointed, there shall be two Standing Committees appointed from among the members, namely—a finance, general purposes and staff committee, and a works, parks and reserves and health committee, each of which shall consist of not less than five members. Such committees shall be appointed each year at the first meeting of the Board which shall be held after the annual election.

Election of Committees.

86. The members of the said committees shall, in default of agreement, be elected by ballot.

Powers and Duties of Committees.

87. The powers and duties of committees shall be as under:—

Finance, General Purposes and Staff Committee—

1. To examine and check all accounts and generally supervise the collection and expenditure of Board revenue.

2. To inquire into and report to the Board from time to time upon all matters which they may consider to affect or be likely to affect the finances of the Board, or which the Board may by resolution direct them to inquire into and report upon.

3. To have control of all matters affecting the staff of the Board.

4. To exercise all powers conferred on the Board in respect to expenditure under section 219 of the Act.

Works, Parks and Reserves and Health Committee—

1. To have the general direction of all works ordered or sanctioned by the Board, and of all streets, roads, ways, drains, bridges, and other public places under the care and management of the Board.

2. To have the management and general direction of sweeping and watering, the resumption of land for the formation of new streets, and widening of existing streets, and the general administration of the building by-laws.

3. To inquire into and report to the Board from time to time upon such improvements and repairs as they may think necessary, or which the Board may by resolution direct them to inquire into and report upon.

4. To have the control of all parks, reserves and tree planting and of the Town Hall and other Road Board buildings.

5. To supervise the carrying out of the provisions of any Act of Parliament or by-laws affecting public health.

6. To deal with petitions and complaints from persons affected by these Acts or by-laws.

7. To deal with all matters relating to the collecting of nightsoil and refuse, the supervision of places of amusement, the sale of foods and drugs, the licensing of noxious trades, private hospitals, lodging houses, morgues, etc.; and general control all matters affecting the health of the citizens.

Special Committees.

88. Special committees may consist of any number of members, and may be appointed for the performance of any duty which may be lawfully entrusted to a committee, and for the performance of which, in the opinion of the Board, a special committee ought to be appointed. No standing committee shall interfere with any matter which may for the time being have been entrusted to any special committee. The appointment of a special committee shall be made by resolution of the Board, which shall state the duties proposed to be entrusted to such special committee, and may either state the number of members to be elected by ballot, or shall name the members whom it is proposed shall constitute such committee. Every standing committee shall hold office until the third Saturday in April following its appointment.

Convening Committee Meetings.

89. The secretary shall call a meeting of any committee when requested so to do by the chairman or any two members of such committee.

Standing Orders.

90. The Standing Orders of the Board shall be observed and apply in committees, except the order limiting the number of times of speaking, and except as to committees being conducted with open doors.

Quorum.

91. At a meeting of a committee a quorum shall consist of not less than three members. Every meeting shall proceed to business so soon after the time stated or there shall be a sufficient number of members in attendance to constitute a quorum.

Minutes.

92. Each standing committee shall keep a book, to be called the minute book, in which shall be entered minutes of all its proceedings and transactions. The minutes of each meeting shall be confirmed at the following meeting, and signed by the chairman thereof.

Miscellaneous.

Penalty.

93. Any member who shall be guilty of an offence against this by-law shall be liable on conviction before a court of summary jurisdiction to a penalty not exceeding £20.

Enforcement of By-laws.

94. Whenever any member shall have committed an offence under this by-law, the chairman may forthwith lay, or cause to be laid, any information before a Justice of the Peace for the purpose of summoning the offending member, and shall afterwards appear and prosecute the charge.

Duties of Secretary.

95. The duties of the Secretary shall be—

- (a) to attend all Board meetings;
- (b) to attend all committee meetings;
- (c) to take notes of minutes and prepare reports of committees;
- (d) to conduct all correspondence, and to give the other officials instructions, as directed by the minutes, and carry out the resolutions of the Board as contained in such minutes;
- (e) to answer all questions on the Board's business;
- (f) to see that the accounts are audited monthly, and balance sheet prepared and published in a newspaper circulating in the district or by circular to ratepayers, and other duties specified under the Road Districts Act, 1919-1942;
- (g) to prepare and place before the Board the monthly financial statement at the end of each month of the financial year;
- (h) to supervise the preparation of the ratebooks and the Board's electoral lists, to examine proof of the latter, and to arrange for the distribution of copies prior to the elections; also to attend all courts of revision or appeal, to make the necessary arrangements for the elections, to issue instructions to the supervisor in accordance with the Board's resolutions;
- (i) to summon the members to Board and committee meetings;
- (j) to keep all books up to date, in accordance with instructions issued by the Minister, and additional instructions of the Board;
- (k) to check all accounts sent into the Board, and to see that all accounts for works have stated in them the authority under which such works have been done, and to check all returns made by the collector or other of the Board's officers, and see that the counterfoils of the receipt book accompany all returns; to supervise and attend to the due payment of all moneys coming through the hands of the Board's officers and payable to the credit of the Board;
- (l) to report to the Board at its next meeting any officer neglecting to make his returns as provided, with the necessary vouchers attached thereto;
- (m) to pay into the bank weekly, or as much more often as is required, to the credit of the Board, all moneys received by him on behalf of the Board, when such moneys shall amount in the aggregate to the sum of £5 or more;
- (n) to act when required, as inspector in connection with the administration of all Statutes coming within the jurisdiction of the Board;
- (o) to see that no payment to the credit of the Board shall be made by any officer except through the Secretary, or such other officer as may be acting temporarily in that capacity;
- (p) obey readily and cheerfully all lawful commands or orders of the Board, and to attend to all matters affecting the finances and welfare of the Board and not herein specified;

(q) to see that all bonds and other forms of security to be taken from the contractors are prepared, and that the security required of servants is taken within due time, and report as to such matters to the Board;

(r) to report to the Chairman any servant of the Board who has been guilty of any neglect of duty, or who is incapable of performing the duties allotted to him;

(s) to exercise, subject to any directions given by the Board or Chairman, control over all servants of the Board;

(t) to see that no receipt is on any other than the forms prescribed by the Act and regulations under which authority is given for the issue of such receipts;

(u) to be responsible for the issue of receipts on the proper prescribed forms, and that all receipts issued are in proper sequence;

(v) to keep in the safe all current books and legal documents when not in actual use; to retain one key of the safe in his own personal custody, and to deposit the duplicate with the Board's bankers in the joint name of the Chairman and Vice-Chairman of the Board; and to lock in the safe at the end of each day such of the Board's moneys as remain unbanked; to enter in the bank deposit book full details of all cheques and other moneys, and to obtain a proper deposit receipt thereto.

Duties of Supervisor-Engineer.

96. The duties of Supervisor-Engineer shall be—

(a) The supervisor-engineer shall have the control of works, plant, and all property of the Board and shall issue instructions to the foreman, and shall see that the same are faithfully carried out. Should the foreman be guilty of insubordination or disobedience or be found incapable of performing the duties allotted to him, the supervisor-engineer shall report the matter to the Chairman, who shall inquire into the matter and, if necessary, shall suspend the foreman and report the matter to the next meeting of the Board.

(b) To prepare proper plans and specifications for all works and improvements as regards roads and culverts under the control of the Board; examine all materials to be employed in such works, and to see the same faithfully and properly executed and performed, and watch the progress and formation thereof; submit all specifications and plans to the Board before tenders are called.

(c) To see that the work of cleaning and repairing all public roads and footways is properly carried out.

(d) To see that no labourers are engaged but those that are able bodied.

(e) To see that all drains, sewers, culverts and bridges are maintained in a state of efficiency.

(f) To see that all servants under his control carry out their duties efficiently, and to report any departure therefrom.

(g) To attend all Board and committee meetings if required.

(h) To specially examine all roads throughout the district at least once each six months, or as required by the Board.

(i) To supply monthly, or as required, to the Board returns of all work completed or in progress with remarks thereon.

THE ROAD DISTRICTS ACT, 1919.

Form 90.—Notice of Presentation of Petition for Sale of Land for Non-payment of Rates.

In the Local Court at Perth.

In the matter of the Road Districts Act, 1919, and in the matter of an application by the Canning Road Board for sale of land for Unpaid Rates.

NOTICE is hereby given that a Petition has been presented to the Local Court at Perth by the Canning Road Board, praying that an order that the lands described in the Schedule to the Petition may be ordered to be sold for non-payment of rates.

12(a) The entrance fee for members (other than non-effective members) shall be a sum not exceeding £15 15s. Non-effective members shall not be required to pay any entrance fee.

(b) The annual subscription to the Club (except in the case of non-effective members) shall be £7 for members ordinarily residing within a radius of 30 miles of the G.P.O., Perth, and £5 for members ordinarily residing outside that radius.

(c) The annual subscription for non-effective members shall be £5.

(d) Upon payment of his subscription each member (other than non-effective members) shall be entitled to receive a ticket (which shall not be transferable) for his own use and two ladies' tickets.

(e) Upon payment of her subscription a non-effective member shall be entitled to receive a ticket (which shall not be transferable) for her own use and one lady's ticket.

(f) Subject to these by-laws, the tickets issued pursuant to paragraphs (d) and (e) shall during the currency thereof admit the holders to each meeting held by the Club on the Perth Racecourse.

(g) Any member (other than a non-effective member) may with his annual subscription pay a further sum of £4 and upon such payment shall receive a further ticket (which shall not be transferable) for his own use and two ladies' tickets.

(h) Any non-effective member may with her annual subscription pay a further sum of £2 10s. and upon such payment shall receive a further ticket (which shall not be transferable) for her own use and one lady's ticket.

(i) Subject to these by-laws, the tickets issued pursuant to paragraphs (g) and (h) shall during the currency thereof admit the holders to each meeting held by the Club on any race-course for the time being belonging to the Club other than the Perth race-course.

(j) All annual subscriptions as aforesaid shall be exclusive of any amusement tax payable thereon.

4. That by-law 14 be deleted and a new by-law inserted in lieu thereof as follows:—

14. The fiscal year of the Club shall commence on the first day of May in each year and annual subscriptions shall be payable in advance on that date.

5. That by-law 17 be amended by deleting all words after the word "thereafter" in line 5, down to the word "therein" in line 8, and inserting in lieu thereof the words "so long as his name shall be included therein he shall in lieu of the annual subscription for the time being payable under by-law 12 pay an annual subscription of £1.1s."

6. That by-law 18 be amended by inserting the word "shall" after the word "member" in line 1, and by inserting the words "with or" before the word "without" in line 11 thereof, and by inserting after the word "without" the words "as the Committee may see fit."

7. That by-law 18 (a) be deleted.

8. That by-law 18 (b) be deleted.

9. That by-law 20 be amended by deleting the word "the" in the second last line thereof and inserting in lieu thereof the word "any."

(b) The Secretary shall also forthwith on written application by any member who shall be ill or temporarily absent from his address shown in the Register of Members as aforesaid post to such member a ballot paper and a ballot paper envelope as aforesaid.

(c) Any member who desires to record his vote under the provisions of paragraphs (a) or (b) preceding and who has not already recorded his vote under the provisions of by-law 24 shall record the name or names of the candidate or candidates for whom he proposes to vote on the ballot paper sent him and shall then sign his name on the counterfoil to such ballot paper. He shall thereafter place the ballot paper in the ballot paper envelope, the counterfoil in the envelope provided for that purpose and duly fasten or seal such envelopes and then by pre-paid post forward the same in a sealed envelope addressed to the Secretary at the office of the Club so that the same shall reach the Secretary not later than 4 p.m. on the day of the general meeting.

(d) The Secretary shall keep a register of all ballot papers forwarded by him as aforesaid and the number against each member's name in such register shall correspond with the number placed on each ballot paper counterfoil and each ballot paper envelope. Forthwith on receipt of a ballot paper envelope from any member recording his vote under this by-law the Secretary shall place the same in the ballot box there to remain until the ballot box shall be opened by the Returning Officer on the day of election.

(e) Every member voting under this and the preceding by-law shall vote for as many candidates as there shall be vacancies to be filled by striking out the name or names of the candidates over and above the number required for whom he does not wish to vote and if he shall fail to vote in manner aforesaid his vote shall be informal and shall be rejected by the Returning Officer.

12. That by-law 25(a) be re-numbered 26 and that all subsequent by-laws be re-numbered as may be necessary by the deletion or addition of any by-laws hereafter.

13. That by-law 27 be amended by deleting the figure "14" in the second line and inserting in lieu thereof the figure "28."
