WHEREAS it is enacted by section 42 of the Native Administration Act, 1905-1941, that the Governor may by proclamation, whenever in the interest of the natives he thinks fit, declare any municipal district or town or any other place to be an area in which it shall be unlawful for natives, not in lawful employment, to be or remain; and whereas by a proclamation made under the said section and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 10th day of January, 1941, portion of the Northam Municipal District was declared to be such an area aforesaid; and whereas it is now deemed desirable and expedient to cancel the said proclamation and to issue this proclamation in lieu thereof; Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by the said Act, do hereby cancel the proclamation made under section 42 of the Native Administration Act, 1905-1941, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 10th day of January, 1941, and in lieu thereof do by this proclamation declare that all the portion of the State being portion of the Northam Municipal District and

portion of the Northam Road District more particularly defined and described in the Schedule hereunder, shall be an area in which it shall be unlawful for natives not in lawful employment to be or remain.

Schedule.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the South-Western boundary of Avon Location 2 with the Northern side of the Great Eastern Highway, and extending generally North-Easterly along said side of highway to the South-Western side of Robinson Street; thence North-Westerly along said side of street to a point in prolongation South-Westerly of the North-Western side of Kennedy Street; thence North-Easterly to and along the latter side of the South-Western side of Clarke Street; thence North-Westerly along the said side of Clarke Street and onward to the North-Western side of Suburban Road; thence North-Easterly along said side of road passing through a road angle post near the right bank of the Avon River and onward to the South-Western boundary of Northam Sub Lot N.6; thence South-Easterly to the North-Western corner of sub lot N.46; thence Easterly along its Northern boundary and onward to the South-Eastern side of road No. 112; thence North-Easterly along said side of road to a South-Western boundary of Avon Location P.1; thence South-Easterly along said boundary to the Northern side of York Road; thence Easterly along the said side of road to a point in prolongation North-Easterly of the South-Eastern side of Elsie Street; thence South-Westerly to and along said side of street to the North-Eastern side of East Street; thence South-Easterly along the latter side to the South-Eastern side of Throssell Street; thence South-Westerly along said side of Throssell Street to the South-Western side of Burn Street; thence North-Westerly along the latter side of street and onward to the left bank of the Avon River aforesaid; thence generally North-Easterly, downward, along said bank to the South-Western boundary of location 2 aforesaid; and thence North-Westerly along said boundary to the starting point.

WHEREAS by section 10 of the Native Administration Act, 1905-1941, it is provided that the Governor is empowered by proclamation to declare any Crown Lands to be Reserves for Natives; and whereas it is deemed desirable that a reserve for natives should be declared at Ongerup: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare an area of about 21 acres 2 roods, more particularly described in the Schedule hereto, to be a Reserve for Natives.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting at the North-Western corner of Kent Location 290, and extending Southerly along the Western boundary of the said location for a distance of 12 chains; thence West about 20 chains to the South-Eastern side of the Lake Grace Road; thence generally North-Easterly along the said side to the Southern side of the Ravensthorpe Road; and thence East along the latter side to the starting point.

(3) No material which is faulty or unsuitable for the purpose for which it is used shall be used in the construction of any building.

(4) Every part of a building shall be constructed and finished in a good and workmanlike manner, in accordance with plans and specifications provided and with the Council.

Perth Road Board—By-Laws Classifying Lawley Ward.

P.W. 791/44.

THE Perth Road Board, under and by virtue of the powers conferred on it in that behalf by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1946, and the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928-1944, and all other powers enabling it, doth hereby make and publish the following by-laws:—

1. Area Classified—The Lawley Ward of the Perth Road Board is hereby classified into districts as set out hereunder.

2. Residential District—The whole of the Lawley Ward with the exception of those portions of the Ward mentioned in the First Schedule hereto is hereby classified as a Residential District.

3. Uses—(a) No building or structure shall hereafter be erected, altered or used in a Residential District except for the purpose of a private dwelling house for not more than one family, or for a Road Board building or for a house of worship. (b) No person shall use any land in a Residential District for any business commercial or industrial purpose.

4. Flats—Notwithstanding anything contained in by-law 3 hereof a dwelling house situated within those portions of the Lawley Ward specified in the Second Schedule hereto on a lot or area of land exceeding 6,000 square feet may be altered so as to provide accommodation for not more than two self-contained flats subject to the following terms and conditions:—

(i) All alterations shall be of a permanent nature.

(ii) Not more than two rooms shall be added to the existing building and the additional floor space shall not exceed 300 square feet.

(iii) There shall be a dividing wall of at least nine inches in width without any openings between the portions of the dwelling house to be used by each family.

(iv) All additional rooms shall be built with walls either of brick, stone or of concrete.

(v) In the event of any portion of any existing dwelling not complying with the by-laws and regulations of the Perth Road Board in force at the time when any alteration is desired to be made, such portions of the building as do not so comply shall be altered in such a way so as to comply with the existing by-laws and regulations of the Perth Road Board.

(vi) Any person making any such alterations or additions shall comply with all the existing regulations and by-laws of the Perth Road Board.

(vii) Any dwelling house so altered shall be deemed a tenement within the meaning of the by-laws for Control of Tenement Houses passed at a meeting of the Perth Road Board on 26th day of May, 1936, and published in the *Government Gazette* on 17th July, 1936, at page 1098, and such by-laws shall apply to any such dwelling house.

5. Business and Residential District—Those portions of the Lawley Ward which are specified in the First Schedule hereto are hereby classified as Business and Residential Districts.

6. Uses—(a) No building or structure shall hereafter be erected, altered or used in a Business and Residential District for any purpose other than:—

(i) A private dwelling house for not more than one family.

(ii) A Road Board building, house of worship or a school.

(iii) A tenement house, a boarding house or a lodging house.

(iv) An office, a bank or an hotel (private).

(v) A shop, or combined shop and dwelling, or combined shops and offices.

(vi) Subject to by-law 7 hereof a workroom or workrooms connected with a retail business in which not more than fifty per cent. of the total floor area of such business is used as a workroom or workrooms.

(vii) A garage or service station and the necessary shops and stores connected therewith.

(viii) A theatre, cinema (but not including an open air picture theatre), public hall, dance hall, club, or place of amusement.

(ix) Such other purposes as the Board may determine but not including any industry, industrial purpose factory, manufactory or noxious trade as detailed in the Second Schedule of the Health Act, 1911-1944.

(b) No person shall use any land in a Business and Residential District for any industrial purpose.

7. No workroom mentioned in by-law 6 (a) (vi) hereof shall be used for any of the following purposes:—

(a) The killing of any bird or animal.

(b) Any work which causes any noise smoke fumes or hazard which in the opinion of the Perth Road Board is harmful or annoying to the residents in the neighbourhood.

8. (a) If at the date of publication of these by-laws in the *Government Gazette* any building or structure is being used for a purpose not permitted by these by-laws, such building or structure may continue to be used for that purpose, but no such building or structure shall be added to or altered unless special permission to do so is granted by the Perth Road Board.

(b) If at the date of publication of these by-laws in the *Government Gazette* any building or structure is being used for a purpose not permitted by these by-laws, and such use or purpose is afterwards discontinued or changed so that it conforms with these by-laws, such building or structure shall not thereafter be used for any purpose not permitted by these by-laws.

(c) No building or structure which has been damaged by fire or otherwise to the extent of more than seventy-five per cent of its value shall thereafter be repaired, rebuilt, altered, added to, or used for any purpose not permitted by these by-laws unless special permission to do so is granted by the Perth Road Board.

9. Any person who shall commit a breach of any of the above by-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

10. Claims for compensation by reason of the operation of these by-laws shall be made not later than six months from the date on which these by-laws are first published in the *Government Gazette*.

Interpretations.

In these by-laws the terms "library book" or "library books" shall mean unless the context otherwise indicates, books which are the property of the Gnowangerup Road Board, and which have been provided for the use of the public per medium of a Free Lending Library. "Board" shall mean the Gnowangerup Road Board. "Library" shall mean any room, building or place where "library books" are kept or stored. "Librarian" shall mean any person appointed by the Board to supervise or control the distribution and reception of "library books."

2. No person shall obtain or take away any library book from any library without the permission of the librarian and without having first given to the librarian a written and signed acknowledgment of having received such library book or library books.

3. No person shall retain in his or her possession any library book, or library books for a period exceeding twenty-one days from the date of receipt of such library book or library books.

4. No person shall deface, mutilate or destroy any library book, or obliterate any writing, numbering or printing on any library book.

5. No person shall retain in his or her possession more than two library books at any one time, and shall deliver up such library book or library books when required to do so by the librarian or other officer of the Board.

6. When any person loses, retains, defaces, mutilates, or destroys any library book the Board may at its absolute discretion require any such person to restore, replace, or to refund to the Board the cost of such library book.

7. Any person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter or thing contrary to any of these by-laws or commits or permits any breach thereof shall be guilty of an offence against these by-laws and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

Rockingham Road Board—By-laws Regulating Parking of Caravans and Similar Vehicles.

P.W. 221/41.

WHEREAS by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1946, the Road Board of any district is empowered to make by-laws for all or any purposes in the said Act mentioned, the Rockingham Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board, under and by virtue of the said Act and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following by-laws:—

1. No person shall park or allow to remain stationary for a period exceeding one-quarter of an hour on any road, reserve or public land within the district of the Board any caravan or vehicle designed or fitted as a habitation for any person or capable of being used for dwelling or sleeping purposes, except in areas particularly set aside by the Board for the parking of caravans.

2. Neither the owner nor the occupier of any land within the district of the Board shall permit, suffer or allow any caravan or vehicle as above described to park or remain stationary on such land at any time between the hour of sunset and the hour of sunrise, nor for any period during daylight exceeding eight hours.

3. Neither the owner nor the person for the time being in charge of any caravan or vehicle as above described shall permit, suffer or allow the same to be parked or remain stationary on any private land within the district of the Board, at any time between the hour of sunset and the hour of sunrise, nor for any period during daylight exceeding eight hours.

4. While any caravan is not being used for dwelling, sleeping, or habitation purposes, it may be garaged by the owner or person in charge thereof on private land owned or occupied by such owner or person, and the garaging thereof, while not used for dwelling, sleeping or habitation purposes on such private land, shall not be deemed to be a contravention of paragraphs 2 and 3 above of these by-laws.

5. The owner or person in charge of any caravan or vehicle as described in paragraph 1 of these by-laws shall not park or allow the same to remain stationary between the hour of sunset and the hour of sunrise, nor for any period during daylight exceeding eight hours in any area set aside by the Board for the parking of caravans, without first obtaining the written permit of the Board.

6. The Board may from time to time make and declare a schedule of charges for any such permits aforesaid, and define the period or periods of any such permit, and set aside areas in which caravans and other vehicles so permitted may park.

7. Any person offending against these by-laws shall forfeit and pay upon conviction a penalty not exceeding ten pounds for each offence.

Schedule.

ABATTOIRS ACT, 1909-1941.

Albany District Regulations.

1. These regulations shall operate and be in force in the Albany District as declared for the time being and from time to time under the Abattoirs Act, 1909-1941.

2. In these regulations—

“Act” means the Abattoirs Act, 1909-1941.

“The Abattoirs” means the land, buildings, and plant owned by the Government and established as an Abattoir Deepwater Jetty Albany.

“Controller” means the officer in control of Abattoirs appointed under the Act.

“Officer in Charge” means the person appointed by the Governor under and for the purposes of the Act.

“Minister” means the Minister of the Crown for the time being charged with the administration of the Act.

“Staff” means and includes every person engaged in and about The Abattoirs being an employee paid by the Government.

“Person” includes a body of persons whether corporate or incorporate.

“Stock” has the meaning prescribed by the Act, and includes sheep and lambs and equine animals.

“Large Stock” means and includes bulls, bullocks, cows, steers, heifers and calves over 150 lbs. dressed weight.

“Carcase” means the whole or any portion of the flesh, wool, skin, hide, bones, hair, hoofs and offal of any stock.

“Inspector” means any inspector appointed by the Governor under and for the purposes of the Act.

“Owner” includes any owner, consignor, consignee, whether joint or sole, or person in possession or in charge of any stock, meat, carcase, or any agent of such owner.

“Vehicle” includes every description of cart, wagon, carriage, motor and any other conveyance.

Hours of Business.

3. The Abattoirs shall be open for business on every week day (excepting Saturdays and holidays observed at The Abattoirs), business hours being from 8 a.m. to 12 noon, and from 1 p.m. to 5 p.m.

Slaughtering Orders.

4. Any person intending stock to be slaughtered at The Abattoirs shall give due notice to that effect to the satisfaction of the Officer-in-Charge.

All orders for slaughtering in respect of Monday in each week must be given to the Officer-in-Charge by noon on the previous Saturday, and all orders for slaughtering in respect of each day of the week except Monday must be notified not later than 2 p.m. of the previous day.

5. Persons submitting stock to The Abattoirs for slaughter shall brand their own stock with an identification brand approved and registered with the Officer-in-Charge.

No stock will be accepted for slaughter unless the identification brand is clearly defined thereon.

6. Any person bringing stock to The Abattoirs for slaughter shall correctly report to the Officer-in-Charge the number and description and the brands of such stock. The Officer-in-Charge shall direct such person where to place such stock and the owner thereof shall be responsible for their being placed where directed, and shall in all respects conform to the direction given, and the Officer-in-Charge shall thereupon take delivery of all such stock by the issue of a receipt for same.

7. The Officer-in-Charge will take all reasonable care of stock of which he has taken delivery, but will not be responsible for any injury to or for the death or escape of any stock not arising from the negligence or default of his staff.

8. Should any stock within The Abattoirs die other than by slaughter, notice thereof shall be forthwith given to the owner, and the carcase of any such stock shall become the property of the Government.

Provided that if the carcase is fit to be treated as a by-product an allowance of 3s. per 100 lbs. may be paid to the owner by the Controller.

9. No stock intended for slaughter shall remain for more than 24 hours in The Abattoirs without being fed. No pig shall be allowed to remain alive within The Abattoirs longer than three days and no calf for longer than two days.

10. No person shall remove or allow to be removed from The Abattoirs any carcase or meat of any stock slaughtered thereat, until the same has been inspected by an Inspector and branded fit for human consumption.

11. No person shall bring to The Abattoirs any vehicle, intended for the conveyance of meat, which is not in a satisfactory condition of repair, clean and duly registered with the appropriate authority to be used for the conveyance of meat.

Payment of Fees.

12. Every person shall pay to the officer appointed to collect Abattoir fees, the fees payable for slaughtering and inspection and the fees for storage in chilling rooms, and any other charges incurred, before the carcasses are removed from The Abattoirs and the Officer-in-Charge may at any time refuse to allow to be removed from The Abattoirs all or any carcasses, skins, hides, or fat belonging to any person until he shall have paid all such fees as are due by him.

Property in Viscera and Inedible Offal.

13. (1) All stock brought to The Abattoirs for slaughter shall be admitted to The Abattoirs only on condition that the viscera and inedible offal shall become and remain the property of the Government.

(2) For the purposes of this regulation, the viscera and inedible offal shall be:—

(i) of large stock and calves—All fat and trimmings, except caul and reed fat; lungs; intestines; third stomach or bible; horns; tail tips; paunch; paunch contents; blood; feet.

(ii) of lambs, sheep and goats—All fat and trimmings, except caul fat; paunch; paunch contents; blood; intestines; lungs; trotters;

(iii) of pigs—All fat and trimmings, except caul fat; paunch; blood; intestines; lungs.

Provided that owners of large stock slaughtered at The Abattoirs may purchase the paunch either scalded or cooked at rates to be agreed upon.

Fees.

14. The fees to be charged for the handling, slaughter and inspection of stock at The Abattoirs and for the preparation of meat therefrom (inclusive of 24 hours free chilling room storage) shall be as follows:—

Storage Fees.

15. The owner of stock slaughtered at The Abattoirs, the carcasses of which are left for a period in excess of the period of free storage allowed by the preceding regulation, shall pay to the Officer-in-Charge the following fees in respect of such period in excess:—

- For beef—6d. per quarter per day or part of a day.
- For calves—6d. per carcase per day.
- For sheep and lambs—3d. per carcase per day or part of a day.
- For pigs—6d. per carcase per day or part of a day.

Hides and Skins.

16. (a) Hides and calf skins will be salted, and stored for a period not exceeding six days, and sheep and lamb skins dried, and stored for a period not exceeding six days, but no responsibility will be taken for any damage to hides and skins so stored, not arising from the negligence of the staff.

(b) The fees to be charged for the salting of hides and calf skins and for the drying of sheep and lamb skins shall be as follows:—

Grading and Branding of Carcasses.

19. (1) All lambs and hoggets slaughtered at The Abattoirs shall be branded as such by an inspector at such Abattoirs in ink or stain in letters not less than one half inch in height, applied on the outside of the carcase in a continuous series of words in two columns from neck to rump.

(2) The carcases of lambs shall be identified by having their temporary teeth intact.

(3) The carcase of hoggets shall be identified by the two central permanent incisors showing.

Slaughtering of Stock except in The Abattoirs or Licensed Places Prohibited.

20. (1) A person shall not slaughter any species of stock within the Albany District as from time to time declared under the Act except (a) in The Abattoirs; or (b) in a place licensed by the Minister under regulation 21 of these regulations.

Provided that equine stock shall not be slaughtered at The Abattoirs.

(2) A person shall not slaughter in any licensed place referred to in subparagraph (b) of paragraph (1) of this regulation any species of stock other than that or those species of stock expressly specified in the license granted by the Minister in relation to such place.

Licenses by the Minister for Slaughtering Stock.

21. (1) The Minister may, upon payment of the fee prescribed hereunder, by license under his hand according to the Form No. 1 in the Appendix to these regulations, authorise the slaughtering of stock generally or of any one or more particular species of stock within the Albany District as from time to time declared under the Act at such place, other than The Abattoirs, as is expressly named and described in the license.

(2) Where the license does not authorise the slaughtering of stock generally it shall state expressly that or those species of stock, the slaughtering of which is authorised by such license.

(3) Every license shall operate and have effect for the period of 12 months from the date of the issue thereof unless such license is sooner revoked or suspended by the Minister.

(4) Every license shall contain a provision that it is granted subject to the condition that the requirements of the Health Act, 1911-1944, and of every other statutory enactment or regulation or by-law lawfully made and in force relating to slaughtering of stock and to the establishment and maintenance of places for slaughtering stock shall be duly observed and complied with with respect to the place in relation to which the license is granted and the slaughtering of stock therein, and that in the event of any non-observance of or non-compliance with any such requirement the license will be liable to be revoked or suspended by the Minister.

(5) The Minister may by writing under his hand served on the grantee of the license or sent or left at the licensed place, revoke or suspend for any period any license granted by him under this regulation in either of the following circumstances—(a) if a species of stock, the slaughtering of which is not authorised by the license, is slaughtered at the licensed place; or (b) if the grantee of the license or the occupier of the licensed place makes default or permits or suffers default to be made in the due observance of or in compliance with any condition subject to which the license is granted as provided for in paragraph (4) of this regulation.

(6) A license granted under this regulation shall be personal to the grantee named therein and shall not be transferable.

(7) The fee payable for a license under this regulation shall be one pound one shilling.

EDUCATION ACT, 1928-1943.

The abovementioned Education Act Regulations, 1944, are amended as follows:—

1. Regulation 29 is amended by deleting all the words in paragraph (d) of subregulation (1) after the word "year" first appearing in line 3 thereof.

2. Regulation 35 is amended by adding at the end thereof a new paragraph as follows:—

"(S) (i) A teacher who, as a result of the Reclassification published in the *Government Gazette* on the 18th day of October, 1946, automatically becomes a permanent member of the High School Service shall not thereby lose his place on the promotion list, but if at any time after this regulation shall come into operation he refuses an appointment which is offered to him in consequence of his place on such list, his name shall be deleted therefrom.

(ii) The name of a teacher permanently appointed to the High School Service as a result of any advertisement published after the 31st day of December, 1946, shall upon such appointment be deleted from the promotion list.

(iii) The name of a permanent High School teacher shall not be added to the promotion list after the 31st day of December, 1946."

3. Regulation 68 is amended by adding thereto after paragraph (1) the following new paragraphs:—

"(1a) A Tradesman Instructor may be appointed as such provided he has received a thorough training as a tradesman in a trade workshop and has passed or been exempted from the technical portion of the 3rd Class Examination.

(1b) In schools or manual training centres where at least four instructors are employed one of such instructors may be appointed Instructor-in-Charge."

4. Regulation 169 is deleted and the following new regulation inserted in lieu thereof:—

"169. The Minister may establish a High School in any locality where there is a reasonable prospect of an enrolment of not less than 150 children in standards 7, 8 and 9."

5. Regulation 170 is deleted and the following new regulation inserted in lieu thereof:—

"170. High Schools shall be classified on the basis of the average attendance for the September quarter in each year, as follows:—

Class 1. Average attendance of 400 or over with an average attendance of not less than 70 in the Upper School.

Class 2. Average attendance of 300 or over with an average attendance of not less than 40 in the Upper School or an average attendance of not less than 400 in the 1st, 2nd and 3rd years of the High School course.

Class 3. Average attendance of not less than 150 in the 1st, 2nd and 3rd years of the High School course."

6. Regulation 172 is deleted and the following new regulation inserted in lieu thereof:—

"172. The teaching staff, in addition to the headmaster, shall consist of first assistants, senior assistants and assistants."

7. Regulation 173 is deleted and the following new regulations inserted in lieu thereof:—

"173. (a) A senior assistant shall be responsible for the control and conduct of such activities as may be recommended from time to time by the Inspector of Secondary Schools and approved by the Director.

(b) The number of senior assistants, in addition to the first male and first female assistants, on the staff of any High School shall not exceed:—

- (i) in the case of a Class 3 High School—one.
- (ii) in the case of a Class 2 High School—three.
- (iii) in the case of a Class 1 High School—five.

Provided that in a High School where there is an Upper School one additional senior assistant may be appointed."

11. Regulation 196 is deleted.
12. Regulation 197 is deleted.
13. Regulation 199 is deleted.
