## Greeting.

KNOW you that I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice of the Execntive Council, do by this Conmmission moder my hand and the Public Seal of the said State, and by virtne of the provisions of the Agent General Act, 1895, appoint you, the said Honomrable William Henry Kitson, to be Agent General for the State of Western Australia in the United Kingdom, and I do authorise and empower yon to undertake, exercise and perform, on behalf of the State of Western Australia and the Govermment thereof, in the United Kingdom and elsewhere, in relation to Western Anstralia, all and every such duties as are prescribed by the said Act, and all powers incident thereto, as the same are usually exercised and performed in England by the Agents General of the States of the Anstralian Commonwealth, and generally to act in the premises on behalf of the said State for a period of three years from the date on which yon assume the administration of the office, or for any renewal thereof that may be arranged.

(1) IN pursuance of the provisions of section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1940, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Western Australia, do hereby prohibit
all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets in those portions of Western Anstralian waters described in Schedules A, B and C hereto, for the term of 12 months from list April, 1947, inclusive.
(2) In pursuance of the provisions of the section aforesaid, I prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets in that portion of Western Anstralian waters described in Schedule D hereto, during the periods commencing at 8 o'clock in the forenoon of Friday in each week and ending at 8 o'clock in the forenoon of the Monday next following for the term of 12 months from 1st April, 1947, inclusive.
(3) In pursuance of the provisions of section 9 of the Act aforesaid, I prohibit-
(a) The taking of all species of fish by means of nets, known as "pilchard nets" and "whiting nets,' 'as defined in paragraplis (c) and (d) respectively of the Proclamation dated 24th October, 1940, and published in the Government Gazette dated Ist November, 1940, in those portions of Western Australian waters described in Schednle E hereto, from lst October, 1947, to 31st March, 1948, both inchnsive;
(b) the taking of all species of fish by means of nets known as 'garfish nets'" as defined in paragraph (e) of the Proclamation aforesaid, in that portion of Western Australian waters known as Koombana Bay, from 1st Angust, 1947, to 31st March, 1948, both inclusive.

## Schedule A.

The whole of the waters of the entrance to Leschenault Yulet, npwards from its junction with Koombana Bay and of the waters of Leschenault Inlet (including all tribntaries) npwards to a line drawn from Turkey Point to the Northerumost end of the Turkey Point Channel, and thence to the North-Western comer of Leschenault Lot 1.

## Schedule B.

The whole of the waters of the Collie River and all its tributaries and all that portion of Leschenault Inlet lying within a radius of one-half mile of the Northernmost extremity of Bar Island.

Schedule C .
The whole of the coastal waters in the vicinity of Bunbury known as "Hungry Hollow,' being those waters lying between the Westerly extensions of Clifton Street and Beach Road, in the Mmicipality of Bunbury, and within a distance measured rectangularly from the foreshore of one-half mile.

## Schedule D.

The whole of the waters of Leschenault Inlet lying to the North of a line drawn from Turkey Point to the Northermmost end of the Turkey Point Chamel, and thence to the North-Eastern corner of Leschenault Lot 1.

## Schedule E.

The whole of the waters of Koombana Bay and of Leschenault Inlet lying to the North of a line drawn from Turkey Point to the Northermmost end of the Turkey Point Channel, and thence to the North-Eastern corner of Leschenault Lot 1.

WHEREAS by section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 19051940, it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever, in every or any specified portion of Western Australion waters, by means of fishing nets and fishing lines, or either of such means of capture, or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: Now, therefore $I$, the said LieutenantGovernor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, prohibit the taking, by means of fishing nets, of any fish whatsoever in the Western Australian waters of Sharks Lake, situated about eight (8) miles from the town of Esperance in the Esperance Land District for a period of three (3) years from 1st April, 1947, inclusive.

## CHARITABLE COLLECTIONS AOT, 1946.

Chief Secretary's Department, Perth, 28th March, 1947.
HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Comeil, acting pursuant to the powers conferred by section 21 of the Charitable Collections Act, 1946, has been pleased to make, under and for the purposes of the said Act, the regulations set forth in the Schednle hereunder.

## Scliedule.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Charitable Collections Regulations, 1947. Interpretation.
2. In these regulations unless the context otherwise requires:-
"The Act", slall mean the Charitable Collections Act, 1946.
"Approved" means approved by the Minister.
"Charitable organisation"' means any person, society, body or association, being the holder of a license under the Act.
"Collection" includes the soliciting of funds or contributions and the selling or offering for sale of any button, badge, token, or other similar thing for the parpose of raising funds or contributions.
"Collector"' means any person assisting or taking part in any collection.
"Branch organisation", means any branch of any charitable organisation approved as such by the governing body of that organisation.
"Executive Officers'" when used in reference to any charitable organisation, or to any branch organisation, shall include the Trustees, Chairman, President, Committee Member, Secretary or Treasurer or any other person holding any executive position by whatsoever name that position is given.

## Licenses.

3. Applications for a license mader the Act shall be made to the Minister in accordance with Form No. 1 in the Appendix to the Regulations.
4. Where a body incorporated in Western Australia makes application for a license, such license, when granted, shall be deened to apply to and include all branches in Westem Australia of such incorporated body, unless the contrary is expressed in such license.
5. A license when granted by the Minister under section 12 of the Act shall be in accordance with Forn No. 2 in the Appendix hereto.

Delegation of Authority.
6. (a) The governing body of any charitable organisation or any two executive officers of any branch organisation (hereinafter called the delegator) may, by notice of delegation in writing in accordance with Form No. 3 in the A.ppendix hereto, delegate to any person (hereinafter called the delegatee) the right of collecting for or in aid of such charitable organisation by means of some specific method or function, to be stated in the prescribed form of delegation.
(b) No delagatee shall in any circunstances whatsoever delegate to any other person the rights and powers conferred on such delegatee by the original notice of delegation.
(c) Every delegatee shall, within seven days from the approved specific collection or function for which a form of delegation was granted, subnit to the delegator a return in accordance with Form No. 10 in the Appendix hereto.
(d) Every delegator shall, within seven dars from the occasion of the approved specific collection or function for which a form of delegation was granted, obtain from the delegatee a return in accordance with Form No. 10 in the Appendix hereto.

## Revocation of License.

7. (a) The Minister may, in respect of any charitable organisation, by notice published in the Government Gazette, or by notice in writing to the licensee, at any time withdraw his license or vary or add to the conditions imposed at the time of issne and may in the same namer revoke or vary any such notice.
(b) Where the Minister has revoked the license previously issued by him under. the Act, he may give such directions to the license holder and take such other action as appears desirable for the purpose of winding up the affairs of the charitable organisation and for ensuring that any moneys or goods in the charity are disbursed in a proper manner.
(c) The powers granted to the Minister by this regulation are in addition to the powers which may be granted by Proclamation issued ander sections 16 and 17 of the Act.

Information to be Disclosed.
8. Any charitable organisation shall, if so required by the Minister, provide all requisite information with respect to such organisation or to any branch organisation thereof, including the mames and addresses of the executive officers and the date of creation of such charitable and branch organisations.
9. (a) The executive officers of a charitable organisation shall, in respect of the license held by them, prepare a summary of operations of the license for each quarterly period in each and every rear, in the Forms Nos. 5 and 6 in the Appendix hereto, and shall furnish the same to the Minister within 30 days of the close of the period to which the summary relates.
(b) A return showing particulars of the function for which a license has been granted pursuant to Regalation 13 shall be submitted by the holder thereof within 14 days from the date of such function in the Form No. 8 in the Appendix hereto.
(c) A return in accordance with Fom No. 7 in the Appendix hereto, showing the operations of every branch organisation shall be submitted by the executive officers of every such branch to the controlling loody of such charitable organisation within 14 days from the close of each and every month.
(d) The Minister shall be informed by the governing body of a charitable organisation of any change of executive officers of such organisation or of any of its branches.
10. (a) Where any person or any body, combination, or committee of persons-
(1) collects or has collected any moneys or articles for or in aid of any charitable purpose but with respect to which no application for a license under the Act has been made to or granted by the Minister under the provisions of section 12 of the Act and these regulations;
(2) receives or has received or has under or in his or its control, possession, order or disposition, any moncys or articles which has been collected for or in
aid of any charitable purpose referred to in the preceding paragraph and such person or any such body, combination or committee of persons neglects or refuses to make application for authority under the provisions of section 11 of the Act and these regulations, or to obey any lawful order or direction of the Minister, the Minister may, on the advice of the advisory committee, direct that any moneys or securities for moneys or any articles collected as aforesaid or a sum equivalent to the amome of moneys originally collected shall be-
(i) applied to purposes connected with the charitable purpose as if such moneys or articles had been collected by a charitable organisation;
(ii) vested in and transferred to a charitable organisation;
(iii) vested in and transferred to the Minister for allotment to a charitable purpose.
(b) Any direction issucd by the Minister under this regulation shall have the force of law, and payments and transfers shall be made to carry out the directions of the Minister. Penalty, twenty pounds.
(c) The provisions of this regulation and any direction given by the Minister hereunder shall not exempt any person from liability for any breach of the Aet or regulations.

## Bank Account.

11. (a) Any executive ofticer of any charitable organisation who collects or receives moneys for any charitable purpose shall, within seven days of the receipt thereof, pay the same to the credit of a bank account, to be opened for this purpose.
(b) Every person, other than an executive officer, who collects or receives auy money on belalf of, or belonging to, a charitable organisation, shall within fourteen days of the receipt thereof pay the same to the controlling body of the charitable urganisation.
(c) Where a charitable organisation is possessed of assets other than cash in hand or at a bank and the existence of such assets is not recorded in the books of account, then in every case a register of assets shall be kept in or to the effect of Form No. 9 in the Appendix thereto.
(d) Every Bank account of a charitable organisation shall be operated on only by cheque signed by the Treasurer of such organisation and countersigned by an executive officer.

Appeals for Support of a Charitable Purpose.
12. Any appeal for support of a charitable purpose shall, subject to regulation 13 hereunder, be authorised by the goveming body of the charitable organisation or by some officer thereof authorised in that behalf-
(a) in the case of collectors in any strect, road or public place, by the issue to the person making the appeal of a distinctive badge or armlet of an approved type;
(b) in any other case by the execntion and delivery to the person making the appeal of a written authority in or to the effect of Form No. 4 in the Appendix hereto.
13. A license to collect for any charitable organisation may be granted by the Minister to any other person, body or association, who, for the purposes of regulation 12, shall be cleemed to be the governing body.

## Collections.

14. The conditions under which persons may be permitted to make or cause to be made visits from house to house for the purpose of making appeals for support of any charitable purpose shall be as follows-
(a) the collector shall be in possession of a written authority referred to in regulation 12 (b) with any additions as may be necessary to comply with the requirements of this paragraph.

Every such authority shall clearly indicate thereon that the charitable purpose is licensed under the Act and specify the period it shall remain in force. No authority shall have currency for a period in excess of twelve calendar montlis. The authority shall be presented by the collector when making an appeal.
(b) Tickets or receipts shall be obtained by the collector from the governing body of the charitable organisation and be issued by the collector to persons giving money to the charity whether by means of contributions or by the sale of articles or otherwise.
(c) The governing body of the charitable organisation shall take such precautions as may be necessary to ensure that all moneys collected shall be properly and promptly accounted for by the collector.
(d) No person under the age of 16 years shall act or be permitted to act as a collector.
(e) No collector shall, in connection with any such appeal, visit any house on a Sunday or a public holiday, or before 9 a.m. or after $6 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{m}$. on any other day.
15. The conditions under which persons may be permitted to make or cause to be made in any street, road or public place, collections for any charitable purpose shall be as follows:-
(a) No person under the age of 16 years shall act or be permitted to act as a collector.
(b) The collector shall display a distinctive badge or armlet issued to him in accordance witl Regulation 12 (a). All such badges or armlets shall be consecutively numbered and a record of the persons to whom such badges or armlets are issued shall be kept by the person, society, body or association to whom or which the license is issued. Any such badge or armlet will be used by the person to whom it is issued and shall not be transferable.
(c) No collection shall be made in any part of the roadway of any public street, nor be made in any public street, to the obstruction or annoyance of any person in such public street.
(d) No collector shall use a box or other receptacle at the end of a pole intended to reach upper windows or the roofs of conveyances.
(e) Every collector shall carry and present to all contributors or purchasers for the reception of money contributions a box or other receptacle of approved type issued by the person to whom the license has been granted, numbered and securely closed and sealed in such a way as to prevent the same being opened or the money extracted without such seal being broken, and into this box or other receptacle all money received shall be immediately placed. All such boxes or receptacles slall be numbered consecutively. Forthwith, after he has ceased collecting, every collector shall deliver his boxes or other receptacles, with the seals unbroken, to the person to whom the license has been granted as being responsible for the proper application of the money received.
(f) A collector shall not carry any collecting box which does not bear displayed prominently thereon the name of the fund for which the collection is being made, with the date of the collection.

## Investments.

16. Except with the approval of the Minister, a charitable organisation shall not invest moneys belonging to any such organisation in any investment other than lodgment on fixed deposit in any company registered to carry on banking in Western Australia.

## Penalties.

1.7. Any person who acts in contravention of any of these regulations shall be guilty of an offence and liable, on summary conviction, to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

## THE HEALIH ACT, 1911-1944.

Municipality of Claremont-Health By-laws (Eating Houses).
WHEREAS under the provisions of the Health Act, 1911. 1944, a local authority may make by-laws and may amend, repeal or alter any by-laws so made; Now therefore, the Council of the Municipality of Claremont local health authority doth hereby make the following by-law.

## Eating Houses.

1. This by-law shall come into operation on the lst January, 1948.
2. In the construction of this by-law unless the context otherwise requires:-
"Act" ineans the Health Act, 1911-1944, and any amendment thereof.
"Local Authority"' means the Municipalty of Claremont.
"Medical Officer" means the Medical Officer of the local authority and includes any person acting in that capacity.
"'Inspector"' means any person appoiated by the local anthority to be a Health Inspector pursuant to the provisions of the Act.
"Lieense" neans a license to conduct an Eating House granted pursuant to the provisions of this bylaw.
"Registered premises" means any premises which are registered as an Eating House under this by-law.

The terms "food," "eating house," "owner," "prenises" and "proprictor" shall have the same meanings as they have under the Act.
"'Town Clerk"' means the Town Clerk or the Acting Town Clerk for the time being of the Municipality of Claremont.
3. No person shall oceupy or use any premises as an Eating House unless:-
(a) The premises are registered under this by-law by the local authority, and
(b) The proprietor of the said premises is the holder of a license issued by the local authority authorising him to conduct on the premises the business of an Eating House.
4. Before any premises are registered under this bylaw the proprietor thereof shall make application in the for'm preseribed in the First Schedule hereto and shall forward his application together with a plan of the premises in respect of which such application is made and the prescribed fee to the Town Clerk and if the application is approved the local authority shall issue to the proprictor a certificate of registration in the form preseribed in the Second Schedule hereto.
5. Before any license to any proprictor to conduct an Eating House is granted by the local authority under this by-law the proprietor shalì sign an application for the same in the form prescribed in the Third Schedule hereto and shall forward same together with the prescribed fee to the Town Clerk and if the application is approved the local authority shall issue to the proprictor a license in the form preseribed in the Fourth Schedule hereto.
6. Any person who makes a false statement in connection with any application under clauses 4 or 5 hereof shall be guilty of an offence.
7. Every certificate of registration of premises registered as an Eating Honse and every license issued to a proprietor shall be signed by the Town Clerk and shall be duly entered in a book to be provided by the local anthority for that purpose. Every proprietor of registered premises shall keep the certificate of registration and the license on the registered premises and shali when requested so to do by an inspector produce to him the certificate of registration and also the license issued to the proprietor in respect of such premises.
8. Every certificate of registration and every license shall be in force from the day of the date of the issue thereot until and inclusive of the 31st day of October then next ensuing unless the same be cancelled in the meantime in accordance with the provisions of the Act.
9. Applications for the renewal of certificates of registration and licenses shall be made amually during the month of October. Such applications shall be in the form preseribed in the Fifth and Sixth Schedules hereto respectively and slall be accompanied by the preseribed fee.
10. The fees to be paid to the local authority on the registration of premises, on the issuing of a license and on the renewal of any registration or license shall be as set out in the Seventh Schedule hereto.
11. So often as any person hohing a license issued pursuant to this by-law changes his phace of abote he shall within seren days next after such a change give notice thereof in writing to the Town Clers specifying in such notice his new place of abode and he shall at the same time produce such license to the Town Clerk, who shall endorse thereon and sign a memorandum specifying the particulars of such change:
12. If the owner of any registered premises sells or transfers or agrees to sell or transfer the said premises to another person he shall within fourteen days from the date of such sale or transfer or agrement notify the Town Clerk thereof in writing stating the full name, address and oecupation of such other person.
13. In all premises occupied or used or intended to be occupied or used as an Eating House:-
(a) The walls of all rooms therein shall be constructed of brick, stone or concrete suitably reudered and plastered and slall be tiled or oil-painted to a height of at least seven feet from the floor level so as to maintain a smooth, hard, duable and washable surface devoid of holes, cracks and crevices.
(b) The floors of all kitchens, sculleries, and food and regetable stores shall be constructed or adapted with concrete rendered with cenent, or provided with an approved surfacing which must be applied directly to the concrete without intervening air space.
(c) Every room therein shall be properly ceiled with stamped metal lath and plaster, fibrous plaster or asbestos sheets or other similar material and shall be constructed and maintained throughout its area and at the wall junctions free from holes, cracks and crerices.
(d) There shall be provided a suitable kitchen, larder, senllery, dry food store, and eupboards, and such kitchen (exclusive of all larder, scullery, dry food store and cupboards) shall have a floor area not less than 144 square feet. Where any larder, scullery, dry food store, or cupboards are permitted to be incorporated in the lay-out of any kitchen then the floor area occupied by such larder, scullery, dry food store, or cupboards shan not be deemed part of the floor area of the kitchen for the purpose of this clause.
(e) There shall be provided for the use of the employees sufficient and suitable lavatories, with wash hand basins and all necessary appurtenances, there shall also be provided for use therewith an adequate supply of water, soap, nail brushes and clean towels, no towel shall be provided for use in common.
(f) Separate sanitary conveniences shall be provided for each sex.
(g) All water closets or urinals situate on any registered premises shall be separated from the yard or building of such premises by a properly constructed ante-chamber or airlock not less than 30 square feet in area.
(h) Every room shall be properly lighted with a surface of clear glass exposed to the open air equivalent to not less than one-tenth of the floor area of the room. Where such matural lighting camot be reason. ably secured artificial lighting to the approval of the local authority shall be installed.
(i) Every room shall be provided with approved outlet ventilators corresponding with an allowance of not less than 1 square inch of airway for every 40 cubie
feet of gross air space of every such compartment or alternatively some mechanical system of rentilation shall be installed to the satisfaction of the local authority.
(i) The air space between the ground surface and the Hoor (ercept in the case of concrete or other solid thors) shan be efficiently wentiated to the satisfaction of the local authority:
(k) In every registered premises where wood, coal or coke is used as fuel, such wood, coal or coke shall be stored or kept in a properly constructed wood store with brick walls and concrete floor separating such store from the remainder of the premises.
14. The proprietor of every Eating House registered under this belaw shall:-
(a) Keep or cause to be kept scrupulonsly clean and in good condition and repair to the satisfaction of the inspector the floors, walls, ceilings and all portions of the registered premises and all fittings, stoves, ranges, utensils, implements, shelves, counters, bins, cabinets, fixtures, sinks, drain-boards, drains, grease traps, tubs, ressels, and things of the like description used on the premises or fin comnection with the preparation or storage of food thereon.
(b) Proside all such furniture, fixtures, comters, bins, sinks, drain-boards, grease traps, tubs, vessels, fittings, utensils, implements and things for use on the registered premises as the inspector may from time to thme deem necessary for the proper conduct of the business.
(c) Construct and armage or cause to be constructed or arranged all fumiture, fixtures, counters, bins, sinks, brain-boards, tubs, vessels, fittings, utensils, and things in every kitchen, serving room, scullery and fish-cleaning toom on the registered premises so that the floor in every such room or place may at all times be kept in a thoroughly dean and sanitary condition.
(d) Not keep or use any floor covering that is absorbent or in such a condition as to allow of the lodgment of dirt thereunder.
(e) Keep all tables and benches used for the preparation of food at least three inches from the wall and moveable to facilitate cleansing.
(f) Provide and properly maintain at all times suitable and effective means for keeping and keep every room or compartment on the registered premises free from dust, lats, mice, cockroaches, flies, spiders, bugs, ants, moths, and all other vermin, and if in the opinion of an inspector effective means and methods of cleansing and eradication of vermin from the premises cannot be done effectively while ordinary business of the establishment is carried on, then the local authority may order the temporary closure of the premises to the public until such time as such cleansing and eradication of vermin has been carried out to the satisfaction of the inspector.
(g) For the purpose of keeping the registered premises free from rats; provide and maintain at least six spring break-back rat traps, in good working order, properly set and baited at all times. The type and number of traps and kind of baits used and the position and locality of the traps set shall be as directed by an inspector.
(h) Keep all portions of the registered premises free from any uwholesome or offensive odour arising from the premises or the operations carried on thereon.
(i) Provide and maintain an approved hood over every wood, gas, or electric cooking fire, stove or boiler. The hood shall be so placed as to arrest all steam, effluvia, odours and smoke from the process of cooking or boiling. The underside of the hood shall not be more than three feet above the top or fire plate of the stove. The flue from the hood shall be at least seven inches in diameter and shall discharge to the open air at a height of not less than three feet above the eaves of any adjoming building. The front lower edge of the hood shall project out not less than two feet beyond the recess of the cooking stove.
(i) Provide an efficient chimney or flue to every wood, coal or coke cooking stove so that no smoke nuisance shall arise in or outside the premises.
( $k$ ) Provide and keep a sufficient number of suitable vessels or receptacles, with lids, constructed of galvanised iron or other non-absorbent and noncorrosive material to a design approved by the inspector on the registered premises for the purpose of receiving all garbage, waste matter and other refuse arising from the business and place and keep such vessels or receptacles in a properly constructed room with
concrete floor to be fly and rat proof and efficiently ventilated or in such positions as directed by an inspector.
(1) Forthwith after such garbage, waste matter and other refuse is produced place the same in such vessels or receptacles provided and kept in accordance with paragrapl ( $k$ ) bereof and remove or cause the contents of such vessels or receptacles to be removed from the premises at least once in every 24 hours.
(m) Thoroughly cleanse all such vessels or receptacles provided and kept in accordance with paragraph ( $k$ ) hereof once at least in every 24 hours and to the satisfaction of an inspector, and renew or repair any or all of the aforesaid vessels or receptacles as often as is necessary and when required by an inspector so to do.
(n) Provide and maintain a hot water installation of capacity to supply sufficient hot water and adequate sink facilities for the thorough eleansing of all drinking vessels, dishes, plates and other vessels, tableware, spoons, forks, knives and all other utensils used on the registered premises.
(o) Immediately after each occasion of use all such vessels and utensils referred to in clause (n) shall be thoroughly eleansed by means of washing in water at a temperature of not less than $150^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$. and immediately thereafter rinsed in clear hot water at a temperature of not less than $120^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$. and to the satisfaction in all things of an inspector.
(p) Not permit or suffer any table naplein which has been used as such or for any other purpose by any person to be placed on any table in the dining room on the registered premises used for serving meals for use by or to be used by any other person unless such table napkin slall have been thoroughly washed and cleansed since it was previonsly used by such first mentioned person.
(q) Remove or cause to be removed the whole of the canned or preserved food or any food contained in an hermetically sealed container (such container not being composed wholly of glass or stoneware) intended for use on the registered premises from such original can or container immediately after the same shall have been opened.
(r) Not permit or suffer any food which is unsound, unwholesone, putrescent or weevilled to be used for food, or for the preparation of food or meals.
(s) Cause any food which is or has become unsound, unwholesome, putrescent or weevilled to be innmediately withdrawn from sale, stock or use and placed in the waste food garbage bin.
(t) Provide adequate and efficient means of refrigeration of an approved type for the preservation of food.
(u) Remove or canse to be removed any food which may have been served to any person or placed on any table occupied by any customer on the registered premises and not then consumed or removed by him immediately after such person shall have finished his refreshment to the kitchen or serving room of such premises nor permit, suffer or allow any of such food so removed to any such kitchen or serving room to be again served to any person on the registered premises, and such food slall be immediately deposited in the waste food garbage bin. Provided that in this paragraph food shall not mean or include the following substances to wit, sugar, pepper, salt, mustard, vinegar, sauces, spices or condiments if such substances are contained in receptacles or containers of a design approved by the inspector and so constructed that the contents of such receptacles or containers camot be handled by any person. Provided further that in this paragraph food shall not include bread which is placed in a glass receptacle or container of a design approved by an inspector and so constructed that the contents are only handled as required.
(v) Not gut, clean or scale any fish on any portion of the registered premises umless such portion of the said premises slall have been constructed for such purpose and approved in writing by the Health Inspector and shall not store any fisl in any kitchen or pantry of the registered premises unless such fisl has already been gutted, cleaned, scaled and washed.
(w) Not allow, permit or suffer any live animal or bird to be kept in or upon any portion of the registered premises set apart for the accommodation of the public or in any kitehen or scullery or serving room or pantry or fish cleaning room on any such premises or in any room in which food intended for use on the registered premises is stored or prepared for use thereon (pro-
vided that a cat or cats may be allowed in such portions of the premises after all food has been covered and the premises are not open to the public) or allow or permit or suffer any animal or bird to be killed or any poultry, pigeons or game to be plucked in any such kitchen or scullery.
(x) Not permit, suffer or cause to be kept on any portion of the registered premises any live poultry, pigeons or game, or any lorse, cow, ass, mule, pig or goat.
(y) Provide and maintain a suitable change and cloak room approved by the inspector for the exclusive use of female employees, and an approved cloak room for male employees.
(z) Not allow, permit or suffer any clothing or wearing apparel to be placed, kept, hung or deposited in any dining room, kitchen, scullery, pantry or food store, provided that patrons may be permitted temporarily to hang hats and cloaks in a dining room.
(aa) Not keep or permit or suffer to be kept any hamper, basket, box, trunk, case, crate or barrel which has contained wet fish or other perishable food and which has not after the last occasion of such use been cleansed and rendered inoffensive upou any portion of the registered premises for a period longer than 24 hours or in such a manner as to become or likely to be or become offensive or a muisance.
(bb) Cleanse daily and at all times keep and maintain all water-closets, urinals, lavatories, catch-pits, grease traps and all other sanitary appliances on the registered premises in a clean and sanitary condition.
(ce) At all times provide and maintain a notice board on which is legibly inscribed, in letters one inch high, the mame of the person licensed to carry on business on the registered premises, and such notice board shall be fixed and maintained free from obstruction in a prominent position at the entrance of the dining roonn.
(d) Not use, keep or store or permit to be used, kept or stored any petrol, kerosene, benzine, naphtha, alcolnol, mineralized or methylated spirit or any volatile liquid (not being an article of food) in any kitchen on the registered premises.
15. No proprietor of any registered premises shall:-
(a) Permit, suffer or cause to be made or done to or on the registered premises any alteration, addition or other work for any purpose affecting or likely to affect in the opinion of the Health Inspector the suitability of the premises for the use specified in the license granted under this by-law in respect of such prenises without the previous consent in writing of the Health Inspector, or
(b) Permit or suffer any drain-pipe for carrying off faecal or sewage matter to have an opening or any gully trap to be within any roofed enclosures (not being a water-closet or urinal) on the registered premises; or
(c) Permit, suffer or cause any spittoon or article or thing for like use to be placed in any dining room or in any place where food is served or in any kitchen, scullery or fish cleaning room on the registered premises.
(d) Alter, suffer or permit any strnetural or other alterations to be made to any registered premises or portion thereof without first having obtained permission in writing from the local authority.
16. No person shall spit and no person shall chew or snoke tobaceo in any kitchen, serving room, senllery or fisll cleaning room or in any room wherein food is being prepared for use in the registered premises and every proprietor of such premises shall exhibit conspicuously and constantly maintain in a clean visible and legible condition in every such kitchen, serving room, seullery, fisl cleaning roon and room in which food is being prepared for use on the promises a notice printed in letters of not less than 48 points face measurement to the following effect:-rspitting or chewing or smoking tobacco in this room is an offence against the by-law. Penalty not exceeding £50 (Fifty Pounds).'’
17. Every person engaged on the registered premises shall when so engaged immediately before beginning work and immediately after visiting a sanitary convenience wash his hauds and every such person shall when so engaged keep and maintain his clothing and body clean; and every occupier of such premises shall provide and properly maintain at all times on such premises such means for maintaining personal eleanliness as in the opinion of the inspector shall be adequate and efficient.
18. No person who is suffering from any infectious, contagious or eruptive disease, suppurating wound or
sore, discharging abscess or gathering, chest complaint accompanied with expectoration, or malignant growth of any kind, slall enter the kitchen or take part in the preparation or liandling of food on any registered premises.
19. (1) Every proprietor of registered premises shall so soon as he becomes aware that any person engaged on the premises is suffering from any of the abovementioned diseases canse hin to cease to be engaged on and to leave such licensed premises without mmecessary delay and shall not allow hin to be again engaged on such premises until such person shall have obtained a certificate from a qualified medical practitioner that he has recovered from or is not suffering from any such condition as aforesaid and is wo longer a somrce of danger to others.
(2) The proprietor of registered premises shall fortlwith report in writing to the Medical Officer the suspension of any person engaged on the premises suffering from any disease mentioned in clanse 19 of this by-law and shall send a copy of any medical certificate obtained for the purpose of this clause to the Medical Officer before such person shall again be engaged on the premises.
20. Any person who shall commit a breach of any of the provisions of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence and upon conviction shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding fifty ponnds, and where such breach is of a continuing nature, to a daily penalty not exceeding two pounds.
